MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 9, 2016 MEETING

WELCOME AND DEVOTION

Host Pastor Steven Cantrell welcomed attendees to the annual meeting of the East Central District Association at First FWB Church, Decatur. He led the congregation in singing "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus." His devotional message was from Psalm 106:32 concerning the boldness of Moses. Gabby Boomer from Decatur Church gave her testimony and spoke about her upcoming e-Team trip to Panama this June. She spoke of how Emily Petty's e-Team testimony last year really influenced Gabby to go on e-Team.

BUSINESS SESSION

Moderator Richard Brown asked Clerk Susan Burgess to call the meeting to order. Then the standing delegates were recognized. The clerk read the quarterly and annual letters from seven churches. There was a motion and second and carried (MSC) to approve the reports and to seat the delegates sent from churches.

The minutes of the October meeting were presented in typed form for everyone to keep. MSC to accept the minutes as printed.

The treasurer's report was given by Treasurer Kathy Hayes. The ending balance today was \$985.42. MSC to accept the treasurer's report.

Illinois State

There was no promotional secretary report since David Shores was in New Mexico.

Illinois Missions

Ernie Lewis gave the update on missions connected to the state. He handed out a brief description of each work and commented on some. In Marana 293 attended Christmas Eve services and a realtor was saved. The Davidsons in France are signing up new learners for classes. IL Missions purchased a popcorn machine for their center. Joel and Lydie Teague are in the States preparing to be career missionaries after their 2-year internship in France. They are scheduled to speak at the IL WAC State meeting.

Jamie Lee was introduced as a new church planter in Champaign, and he has resigned Calvary Church in Salem. Jamie testified of his and his wife Heather's calling to the new work. In addition, IL Missions gave \$300 to each of the eTeam. Tyler Penn reported on International student work at the University of Illinois this past Fall. One of his English conversation classes turned to a Bible study. He has had several opportunities to witness.

Illinois Master's Men and Women Active for Christ

Tim Hayes gave a Disaster Relief report regarding two days helping at National Director Ken Akers' request in flooding relief in Missouri. They assisted four businesses and five families and handed blankets made by Pleasant View Church Vacation Bible School children. Ernie Taylor added details of a project where Calvary Church and Masters Men and Salem area churches worked to rebuild a burned house in Salem.

Delegates were appointed for the Illinois State Meeting in March at Calvary Church, Salem. Suzanne Lewis, Kathy Hayes, Marie Rutger, and Paula Hayes were named as our district delegates. MSC for Moderator to appoint others attending the meeting as delegates.

Decatur First Church Report

Steven Cantrell came as a new pastor to the church in May. He is praising the Lord that a man was saved a couple of weeks ago. Wednesday night they have a bus route and are feeding the kids who attend.

Mt. Vernon Church Report

Phillip Kennedy reported four new members and several new attendees. Pastor David Shores is in New Mexico for a few days. Several new faces are on the van, a ministry Phillip provides for all services. New young active members are encouraging. They are serving a meal on all Sunday nights, which excites the youth. They have had kids' days with activities, lessons, and videos as outreach. From VBS they gained children and older youth. Two of the teens' fathers are finally coming on Sunday and Wednesday nights after several years.

WORSHIP SERVICE

Worship service opened in prayer by Moderator. During the offering, the Decatur girls' choir sang beautifully.

Mark King, English Language Institute teacher in Tibet, a country of 3,000,000 people. He showed slides from Tibet and Mount Everest. He has eight coworkers in the city of Lhasa (500,000 population). When he goes back, his new team will only have six members. Approximately 20 people from countries other than Tibet or China are in the city. He requested prayer for the Friendship Club, which meets at The Yellow Restaurant. This discussion group discusses serious topics and are led by a man from Tibet.

Mark's message was from Mark 1:16-20. He described how Tibetans leave their nets as the disciples did. Sarah Malone, ELI, wrote an article in One Magazine discussing how identity, security and comfort can equate to nets today. Mark added ignorance as a big net for Tibetans that they need to leave. To be Tibetan is to be Buddhist, their identity. China says those in Tibet are Chinese. But the Tibetans do not like Chinese taking their culture. They do not have the entire Bible in Tibetan. Their security is monetary. They need the Chinese to make a living. They believe in karma, an influencing, impersonal force. What they need is the Gospel of forgiveness and grace, which is confusing to them; so they go back to rituals. For comfort, it is family. There is not a Christian community there. It usually takes years for Tibetans to become Christ followers and leave their "nets." The Chinese church has reached out to Tibetans for Christmas.

More people are needed to in Tibet. The Government had shut down the English program where Mark and another teacher worked, but Lhasa wants the program back and will be there in June. Mark needs \$1,000 per month to work in Tibet. Mark thanked us for twenty years of support in China and Tibet.

MSC to adjourn the meeting. The next district meeting will be April 9 at the First FWB Church, Mt. Vernon. Closing prayer and blessing on our lunch by David Burgess.

WELCOME AND DEVOTION

Phillip Kennedy brought the devotional message from Philippians 2:12-16 regarding murmuring and complaining. How is your attitude? Prayer by Phillip Kennedy.

BUSINESS SESSION

Moderator Richard Brown asked Clerk Susan Burgess to call the meeting to order to do business for our Lord. Then the standing delegates were recognized and seated. The clerk read the quarterly reports from seven churches. Clarification that standing delegates are ordained ministers, deacons and district officers. There was a motion and second and carried (MSC) to approve the reports and to seat the delegates sent from churches.

The minutes of the October meeting were presented in typed form for everyone to keep. MSC to accept the minutes as printed.

The treasurer's report was given by Treasurer Kathy Hayes. The ending balance today was \$534.42. MSC to accept the treasurer's report. Moderator appointed Charlie King and Marie Rutger to fill vacancies on Business Committee. Karel Smith and Steven Cantrell filled in on Youth Committee.

Illinois State

Promotional Secretary David Shores reviewed the Illinois State Association. Curtis Smith was elected new moderator and Tyler Penn, the assistant. Camp Hope will be working on big projects after summer camping season, including new bathroom addition to the girls' dorm and remodel of manager's home. The CTS competition will be held the last weekend of April at Ina FWB Church. He is checking on who needs additional funding for eTeam and College Missions Program.

Bro. Shores indicated that 14 men are being trained as carpenters in Cuba. They will come to the U.S. to donate a month of work on the new Welch College President's house. "The Gratitude Team" needs prayers for visas, travel funds, etc.

Illinois Missions

Ernie Lewis gave the update on missions connected to the state. He handed out a brief description of each work and commented on some. One of the prisoners stepped up to be executed for taking the shovel so that all would not be shot. Later it was found that the shovel had been misplaced. This helps illustrate that Jesus was willing to die for all even though He was innocent.
