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PROCEEDINGS

"I, Gaston Clary, a minister in good standing in the Texas District Association of Free Will Baptists and a member and Pastor of Good Hope Free Will Baptist Church, make the following charges against Noah G. Tuttle and Huey Gower and request this association to deprive them of their credentials as Free Will Baptist Ministers if these charges are found to be true.

1. They are advocates of a second work of Grace to which our church is definitely opposed.

2. They brought in individuals who are not licensed to or ordained to preach and are not Free Will Baptist and are advocates of doctrine contrary to Free Will Baptist belief and practice and sponsored their appearance in several of our churches.

3. They are teaching and preaching that Divine Healing is Co-equal with Salvation and was provided for in the bruised body of Christ to the extent that those who believe can grow limbs that have been severed from the body.

4. That Infirmary in the Christian is caused by sin and if they would not sin they would not be sick.

5. Through preaching of doctrine contrary to Free Will Baptist belief they have caused reproach on the Free Will Baptist denomination and have caused irreparable damage to the Texas District Association and to Free Will Baptists of this Area."

CONSTITUTION

We, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, having been baptized upon a profession of faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; To protect the Free Will Baptist Doctrine as set forth by the Free Will Baptist Treatise; And promote the spreading of the Gospel of Christ, do ordain and establish this Constitution.

ARTICLE I

NAME—This organization shall be known as the East Texas District Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE—The purpose of this association shall be to bring unity among the Churches and to bring them together in such a manner that they will be able to plan work that will result in the spreading of the Gospel.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP—Membership in this organization shall be limited to regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Churches which accept and teach Free Will Baptist Doctrine as set forth in the Treatise of Faith and Practices of The Free Will Baptist of the National Association. Any church, meeting the above requirements, may upon proper application become a member by a majority vote of the Association.

ARTICLE IV

COMPOSITION—This Association shall consist of all ordained and licensed ministers and ordained deacons, who are Free Will Baptist in good standing and members of churches of the association. Also delegates appointed or elected by member churches.

ARTICLE V

REPRESENTATION—Each church composed of fifty members or less shall be entitled to two delegates. Churches having more than fifty members shall be entitled to one additional delegate for each additional fifty members or fractional part thereof.

Amendment—No church shall be entitled to more than five delegates, regardless of size of membership.

ARTICLE VI

FINANCE—The work of this association shall be financed by the churches of which it is composed. Each church entitled to two delegates shall send four dollars together with a written report, approved by the association to the Clerk one week in advance of each regular session. Churches entitled to more than two delegates shall send an additional dollar for each additional delegate.

Section 2. The Clerk shall receive Ten Dollars (\$10.00) annually for service.

Amendment—The item on Clerk's salary shall be changed to read Twenty-Five Dollars annually.

Section 3. The duties of the Clerk shall be to make records of all association business, do necessary correspondence, and to prepare Manuscript of Minutes for printing .

Section 4. The duties of Assistant Clerk shall be to assist Clerk.

ARTICLE VII

QUORUM—Representation from five churches of the association shall be declared a quorum at any regular or called session of the association.

ARTICLE VIII

DISCIPLINE—This association shall have power to discipline member churches and to withdraw fellowship from any church when its action is inconsistent with the Doctrine of Free Will Baptists as set forth in the Free Will Baptist Treatise.

ARTICLE IX

MINISTERS—Section 1. Every pastor who holds membership in this association should be a member of a church under his care.

Section 2. When a church desires to license or ordain one of its members to preach the Gospel, it should request the association to examine same through its Ordaining Council, and should agree to abide by the recommendation of its Ordaining Council.

Section 3. A Minister, who is a member of this association and who is subject to discipline for unChristian or unsound doctrine or doctrine contrary to Free Will Baptist belief as set forth in the Free Will Baptist Treatise of the National Association, shall be brought to trial by the Church of which he is a member; or by this East Texas District Association. The Ordaining Council must sit in the conference in an advisory capacity.

Section 4. All Ministers of this association shall make annual reports in writing to the Annual Session of this association.

ARTICLE X

OFFICERS—The officers of this association shall be a Moderator, an assistant Moderator, a Clerk-Treasurer and an assistant Clerk. These officers shall be elected at each annual session by vote of the body. They shall serve as an Executive Committee of the Association and shall have power to transact business between sessions. This committee shall make written report to each regular session of all business transacted between sessions.

Section 2. Committees, as necessary shall be appointed by the Moderator, unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed, or until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE XI

SESSIONS—The regular sessions of this association shall be on Saturday before the second Sunday in January, April, and July and on Friday and Saturday before the second Sunday in October, at a place designated by vote of the association at its previous regular session. Adjourned sessions may be called by the Moderator or by a majority of the Executive Committee. The Executive Committee must call an adjourned session at the request of as many as three churches, if the requests are in writing.

Section 2. The association shall receive written reports from the churches of which it is composed on approved forms and such other reports that do not violate this Constitution. These reports shall be received quarterly and shall cover the preceding church quarter, except the report to the annual session in October which shall cover the entire Church year.

ARTICLE XII

COUNCIL—The Ordaining Council shall consist of five members, whose term of office shall be one year. Each member of the Council shall be re-elected or replaced at each annual session.

Section 2. The duties of the Ordaining Council shall be: to examine each applicant for license to preach the Gospel, or ordination; Make appropriate recommendation on the basis of such examination; to examine the Ministers' reports, and make proper recommendation on basis of findings; to sit in Church Conference or Meetings (regular or adjourned) of this association in an advisory capacity when ministers are on trial for reasons set forth in Art. IX, Section 3; And to serve as a Credentials Committee at each session.

ARTICLE XIII

BOARDS—The Board of Trustees of the Student Loan Fund shall be composed of five members. The members are to be elected on the following basis: two members for a term of one year; two members for a term of two years; and one member for a term of three years. After which all members shall be elected to serve three year terms.

Section 2. The duties of The Board of Trustees of the Student Loan Fund shall be to supervise and promote this enterprise. The Board shall have power to organize itself and devise its own government in harmony with principles of this association.

Section 3. The Board shall make a written report of work and funds to each annual session of this association.

ARTICLE XIV

AUXILIARIES—The East Texas District Womans Auxiliary Convention and other organizations shall be recognized as subordinate organizations. They shall organize at their own discretion, and have power to adopt their Constitution and By-Laws, and to maintain complete management of the work for which they are constituted. The scope and character of the work of these organizations shall conform to the general program and plans of this association. They shall report their accomplishments annually to the association.

ARTICLE XV

This Constitution may be amended at any regular session of this body, provided the proposed amendment is presented to the body in writing at the session immediately preceding the one in which the vote is taken. Any recess of activities of association shall be considered sufficient to declare a new session for this purpose.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

Each session and adjourned session of this association shall be called to order by the Moderator and shall be opened with prayer. Each session shall be closed with prayer. In the absence of the Moderator, the body may be called to order by any member of the Executive Committee.

ARTICLE II

This association shall hold correspondence by Messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies as it may deem advisable.

ARTICLE III

Conference will sit with open doors except when it goes into committee of the whole.

ARTICLE IV

Any person, not of this conference, may be allowed to take part in discussion with permission of body. However, voting power is granted only to standing and duly elected or appointed delegates.

ARTICLE V

It shall be the duty of the Clerk to maintain a permanent record of all activities and business transactions of the body. These records are to be produced by the Clerk upon request of the association.

ARTICLE VI

The conference may determine the time when its daily sessions begin and close.

ARTICLE VII

It shall be the duty of all the members of the association to be present at the time appointed for each daily session; and anyone wishing to retire must first obtain leave of the Moderator.

ARTICLE VIII

A member wishing to make a motion or to speak in conference shall first rise, address the Moderator and be recognized by him, before proceeding. A member may second a motion without rising or addressing the Moderator.

ARTICLE IX

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one person or member on any committee, provided the one nominated be elected.

ARTICLE X

No person shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes at any one time, nor more than twice on any one subject without leave of the conference.

ARTICLE XI

The following committees shall be appointed at each sitting of the association: Resolutions, at the annual session three additional committees shall be elected: Program, Obituary and Nominating.

ARTICLE XII

The program of each session of the association shall be prepared by the regularly elected or appointed Program Committee. Programs to be distributed not less than two weeks in advance of date of association session.

ARTICLE XIII

The Minutes shall be carefully read and corrected before adjournment.

ARTICLE XIV

The Constitution and By-Laws of this Conference shall be read at each annual session of this association.

ARTICLE XV

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the members present at any regular session, providing the proposed amendment has been presented to the body in writing at session immediately preceding the one in which the vote is taken. Any recess of the association shall be considered sufficient to declare a new session for this purpose.
