



MINUTES.

The sixth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Orginal Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, was held with the church at Mt. Zion, Pamlico County, N. C. Oct. 24, 1901.

Elder R. F. Daughety, who was chosen by last conference to preach the Introductory sermon, attended and preached —Text 1 Cor. 3: 22, 23. After a recess, conference was organized by choosing Elder R. F. Daughety, Moderator, and Elder V. G. Brittam, Assistant. Elder T. A. Mozingo Clerk, and Elder L. C. Garner, reading Clerk.

The moderator appointed the following committees: On Devotional Exercises—A. E. Rouse, W. A. Jones and W. A. Gaskins.

Minute Fund-Warren Tuton, J. S. Robinson and J. W. Mallard.

Retired Ministers Fund—L. W. Wetherington, J. W. Dail and T. W. Price.

Mission Fund-W. J. Potter, W. H. Stilly and F. R. Smith.

On motion by Elder H. Cunningham, a committee was appointed on Education of C. K. Dunn, J. T. Lincoln and J. R. Calloway; also another committee on Temperance of J. F. Heath, George Dees and C. Swan.

Committee to apportion funds to the Retired Ministers—J. B. Lee, B. H. Andrews, T. J. Sawyer, A. E. Rouse and Bryant Simpkins.

On motion, Bro. Morris Alexander attend the stand and report the preachers text's to the clerk.

Conference being organized was opened with praise and prayer by Elder H. Cunningham.

On motion by Elder Cunningham, the delegates from the other conferences be invited to seats in this conference.

By order of Conference, clerk paid over to Eld. R. F. Stilley, for Elder Levi Stilley's widow, twenty eight dollars as assessments collected this day from twenty eight ministers.

On motion, Conference adjourn until tomorrow marning half-past nine o'clock.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference opened with praise and prayer by Jesse Bennett. Minutes of yesterday adopted.

On motion, the names of E. L. Merrill, M. H. Cuttrell, J. E. Lupton and J. J. Boyd be placed on our minutes as ministers of the gospel. A. E. Rouse and R. F. Stilley's names were added to the committee on ministerial character.

On motion, the list of churches be called. [See table of statistics.]

On motion. two new churches were received at this Conference; namely, Pamlico Chapel, Beaufort county, M. H. Cuttrell, pastor; J. D. Wilkins, clerk, Winsteadville. Sewell's Chapel, Carteret county, J. W. Sewell, pastor; C. L. Merriell, clerk, Morehead City.

On motion, the several committees retire, settle with the treasurer, the said treasurer report and the committees be discharged.

On motion, we take up the petition for the next General Conference, result of the vote taken upon two petitions, one from Core Creek, and one from Macedonia, gave the next conference to Core Creek, Craven county, N. C.

On motion, Elder L. C. Garner preach the Introductory sermon, and Elder A. E. Rouse be his alternate.

On motion, conference close until to morrow morning 9 30 o'clock. Praise and prayer by W. B. Avery.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met according to adjournment. Prayer by J. A. Hudson,

The moderator addressed the Conference in a plea for brotherly love and unity.

On motion, minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion, the clerk be requested to prepare the minutes for the press, and that he draw on the treasurer for \$8,00 as compensation for this service.

REPORT OF EDUCATIONAL COMMITTEE.—Realizing the great necessity of an educated ministry and laity and having the foundation of a good preparatory school, we your committee on education, do recommend, 1st. We would urge upon the pastors of the several churches in the Eastern conference to lay the necessity of the patronage of the Baptist Seminary, at Ayden, before their congregations.

2nd. That our young ministers and all those who expect to become ministers of the gospel be requested to attend the above named institution and to better qualify themselves for duties and responsibilities which are enjoined upon them.

3rd. That this conference take a stock of one hundred shares in our Seminary, at Ayden, and we request our membership to pay 10 cents per resident member annually to raise said amount.

A BRIEFSKETCH OF ELDER J. W. LINTON.

Elder J. W. Linton was born Aug. 29th, 1826. Shortly after he was twenty-one he married his first wife. Annie Hawkins, was married three times after her death. His last wife, formerly Annie E. Higson, is still living. There were born to him fifteen children, of whom eleven still survive. He joined the Free Will Baptist church in one of Elder B. B. Albritton's meetings probably in 1852. January 1869, he was licensed to preach by Pungo Creek church, and ordained in September the same year. As a pastor he held the care of several churches and generly for a long time—Warden's Grove, 15 years; Mt. Olive, 20 years; Union Chapel, 20 years; Head of Pungo, 15 years; and Jack's Creek Chapel, 24 years. As an evangelist he founded or assisted in founding most of the churches in the eastern part of Carteret County, to wit: Cedar Island, St. John's Chapel, Masons Chapel, Davis' Shore, and Cape Banks were at different times under his pastoral care. He also preached at other points in Carteret county. In Aug. 1897 he was stricken with paralysis while preaching at Sidney, and was obliged to withdraw from the ministry. He attended conference for the last time at Antioch in 1899, and was greeted with much affection by those with whom he had labored. In the first days of 1900 he was attacked by heart disease, and passed peacefully away January 9, 1900. Although he differed from his brother ministers on some minor points regarding the tenets of the church, yet he was endowed with remarkable zeal and undaunted courage in the administration of the word, and for the defence of the the gospel.
