

PROCEEDINGS.

The Ninth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with the church at Antioch, Craven County, N. C. Ott. 19th, 1904.

Eld. H. Cunningham, who was appointed by last Conference to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached—Text: Isaiah 9th,, chapter and the

middle clause of 6th, verse.

After a recess of one hour, Conference was organized by choosing Eld. H. Cunningham, Moderator; Eld. R. F. Daughety, Assistant; C. K. Dunn, Clerk, and Eld. T.

A Mozingo, Reading Clerk.

The Moderator appointed the following committees: On Devotional Exercises—J. T. Linton, I. S. Roberson, and T. W. Price. Finance—D. J. Hall, J. W. Dail and J. B. Lee. Education—J. T. Linton, W. A. Jones and A. B. Swindell. Temperance—L. C. Garner, A. E. Rouse and R. F. Stilley. —Ministerial Character—D. H. Andrews, A. E. Rouse, G. W. Holland, L. J. B. Davenport and R. F. Daughety.

To apportion Retired Minister's Fund—Leroy Dixon, A. E. Rouse, E. F. Oglesby, R. F. Daugliety and

Emanuel Daughety.

Text Recorder—C. L. Bennett.

Conference being organized was opened with prayer

by Eld. C. S. Churchill.

By motion, we rescind the motions previously passed by this body creating a treasurer of the Mission Educational, and Retired Ministers Fund, and have one General Conference treasurer, also that we appoint only one finance committee.

By motion the delegates from sister conferences were invited to seats with us. The following were present: Elders J. R. McCaskey and W. H. Laughinghouse from the Central; C. S. Churchill and S. W. Jones from the Western, and D. R. Stafford from the Cape Fear.

The Moderator appointed a committee composed of J. T. Linton, C. K. Dunn and A. E. Rouse to draft an order of business and present it to this body for ac-

ceptance.

By motion, the list of ministers was called.

The Moderator appointed T. A. Mozingo, R. F. Stilley and J. T. Linton to write an obituary of Eld. M. Linton, R. F. Daughety, A. E. Rouse and J. S. Robinson to write an obituary of Eld. I. Taylor and C. J. Voliva, J. R. McCaskey and W. J. Cuthrell to write an obituary of Eld. M. H. Cuthrell. These obituaries to appear upon our minutes.

By motion, this Conference excommunicated Eld. L. C. Taylor for drunkness and disorderly conduct and dropped his name from the list of ministers also empowered Eld. A. E. Rouse to demand and accept his

license and credentials.

Howard, L. M. Downs, C. J. Voliva, J. W. Sewell, T. A. Mozingo, S. S. Kirk and T. F. Wallace.

By motion, the following named ministers were accepted as members of this Conference and their names entered upon the list: J. A. Ringold, R. C. Kennedy, L. W. Wetherington, C. J. Voliva, C. S. Churchill and B. W. Wells.

Devotional committee reported: R. Grice open and J. R. McCaskey preach tonight; E. B. Coston open and

D. R. Stafford preach tomorrow at 11 o'clock.

By motion, conference closed to meet again Thursday at 9 a.m. Singing by the congregation. Prayer by Eld. Brittain.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference was opened with one half hours prayer service conducted by Eld. Rouse.

By motion, the minutes of yesterday were read and adopted.

By motion, the "Order of Business" presented by the committee was adopted.

By motion, the list of churches was called. (See table of statistics.)

By motion, the new churches of Atlantic, Carteret

Co., and Pilgrim's Rest Pamlico Co., were received and

entered upon the list.

Devotional committee reported. W. W. Lewis open and J. E. Howard preach this afternoon at 2 o'clock. R. F. Daughety open and C. S. Churchill preach tonight. J. J. Boyed open and A. E. Rouse preach Friday at 11 a. m.

By motion, we allowed Bro. C. L. Gaskins to con-

tinue selling confectioneries upon the grounds.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON.

By motion, Eld. T. A. Mozingo was appointed treasurer, pro tem.

By motion, the finance committee retired and settled with the treasurer made his report and the committee

was discharged.

By motion, we donated \$5.00 from the treasury to the Triennial General Conference as a minute fund and paid the expenses of the delegates attending it by public collection.

The Treasurer reported: Received for minutes \$49.20 for Honorary Ministers \$121.24; for education \$7.70; for missions \$5.00. Also received from former treasurer of mission fund \$15.90.

By motion, the report was received.

The committee on ministerial character reported as follows: After investigating the charges preferred against Eld. J. W. Dowty, we find that they are not sustained and therefore recommend that he be restored to his ministerial functions. After further investigating the case of Eld. C. Miller, and having received satisfaction, we recommend that his case be dismissed.

By motion, the report was received.

By motion, the order of business was suspended and the petitions for the next session of Conference taken up. According to a vote the next session will be held with the church at Friendship, Jones county, N. C. Eld. L. C. Garner is requested to preach the introductory sermon; Alternate, Eld. A. E. Rouse.

By motion conference is ordered to convene Thursday before the 4th Sunday in Oct. instead of Wednes-

day.

By motion conference adjourned to meet again Friday morning at 9 o'clock.

Conference was closed by Eld. W. W. Lewis.

FRIDAY.

Conference was opened with one half hour's prayer service led by Eld. Pipkin.

By motion, the minutes of yesterday were read and

adopted.

By motion, the subject of Eld. Valentine's letter in regard to the Stock Co., organized in the Western Conference was tabled.

The devotional committee reported: I. H. Pipkin open and S. W. Jones preach this afternoon at 2 o'clock.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

We your committee on temperance beg leave to submit the following report: Seeing the great necessity of temperance, we therefore ask our brethren to abstain from intoxicating drinks. We further ask the ministers to impress the great importance of temperance upon their congregations by preaching at least one sermon to each of their churches during the ensuing year upon this subject.

REPORT ON EDUCATION.

We your committee on education present for your consideration the following report: From the history, both of men and of nations, we learn that education is the greatest necessity of modern civilzation. The most powerful ally of the church of God, and the most useful means of extending the bounds of the kingdom of Christ. We learn, however, that among many highly educated people crime, corruption and skepticism have increased, showing that such peoples have not been rightly educated and that education of the heart is of even greater importance than cultivation of the mind. We, therefore, recommend these as the best means we can devise for attaining true education among the people of our denominations:

1. That every family take and read the organ of our

denomination, "THE FREE WILL BAPTIST."

2. That the head of every family should earnestly encourage Bible reading and the reading of solid instructive books and clean moral newspapers in his

family and that he discourage trashy novels, cheap magazines, and sensational papers.

3. That every family of this conference give support to our Seminary at Ayden, both with money and patronage, thereby doing our part to make it a success and a blessing to the whole denomination.

1. That our people watch strictly the public schools in which their children are educated, and that they insist that the teachers who teach said schools shall be of the best moral character.

5. That our conference put itself on record as favoring Bible reading and prayer in the public schools.

That each pastor, church officer, and church worker use their best efforts to establish a Sabbath School in each church in our conference. That each church at the next sitting of conference shall report by separate letter the growth and condition of its Sabbath School if such school has been organized. That such information be tabulated and appear on the minutes, and that the churches be requested to make a small increase in the minute fund they send up, that the extra cost of such minutes may be covered.

7. That we as a conference strive earnestly and persistently for an educated ministry by doing all we can to help the younger ministers to attain a thorough education, and by encouraging those older ministers, whose circumstances are such that they are unable to pursue a course of study, to read and study at home such books as may be helpful to them in their work of expounding the word and bringing souls to Christ.

By motion, the reports on temperance and education were received. The committee to apportion the retired ministers fund reported as follows: Elders D. P. Miller, \$30.49, J. Bennett \$15.00, G. W. Dunn \$15.00. Widow of R. Gaskins \$12.00, of J. A. Miller \$8.00, of W. H. Slaughter \$12.00, of E. C. Nobles \$8.00. of H. Jones \$8.00, and J. Vernon \$12.00.

By motion the Clerk was requested to prepare the minutes for the press and draw on the treasurer for

\$8.00 as compensation for his services.

By motion, The Free Will Baptist Publishing Co., was requested to publish 2000 minutes, send 50 each to the Central, Western, Cape Fear and S. C. Confer-

ences: distribute the remainder among the churches of the Eastern Conference and draw on the treasurer for expenses.

By motion, W. A. Jones and C. K. Dunn were appointed delegates to represent the Eastern Conference for one year in the meetings of the stockholders of the

Free Will Baptist Theological Seminary.

The moderator appointed Eld. R. F. Stilley, W. R. Sawyer and W. A. Jones as delegates to the Central; R. Grice, J. D. Grice and J. Jones to the Cape, Fear; J. W. Sewell, B. W. Wells, and A. E. Rouse to the Western; and C. S. Churchill, J. W. Sewell and R. F. Daughctv to the Union Conferences.

By motion, thanks were extended to the people of this community for the kindness and hospitality shown during the sitting of this Conference also to the officers of this body for the faithful discharge of their duties.

By motion, conference closed until Thursday before the 4th, Sunday in Oct. 1905. Prayer by Eld. W. W. Lewis.
