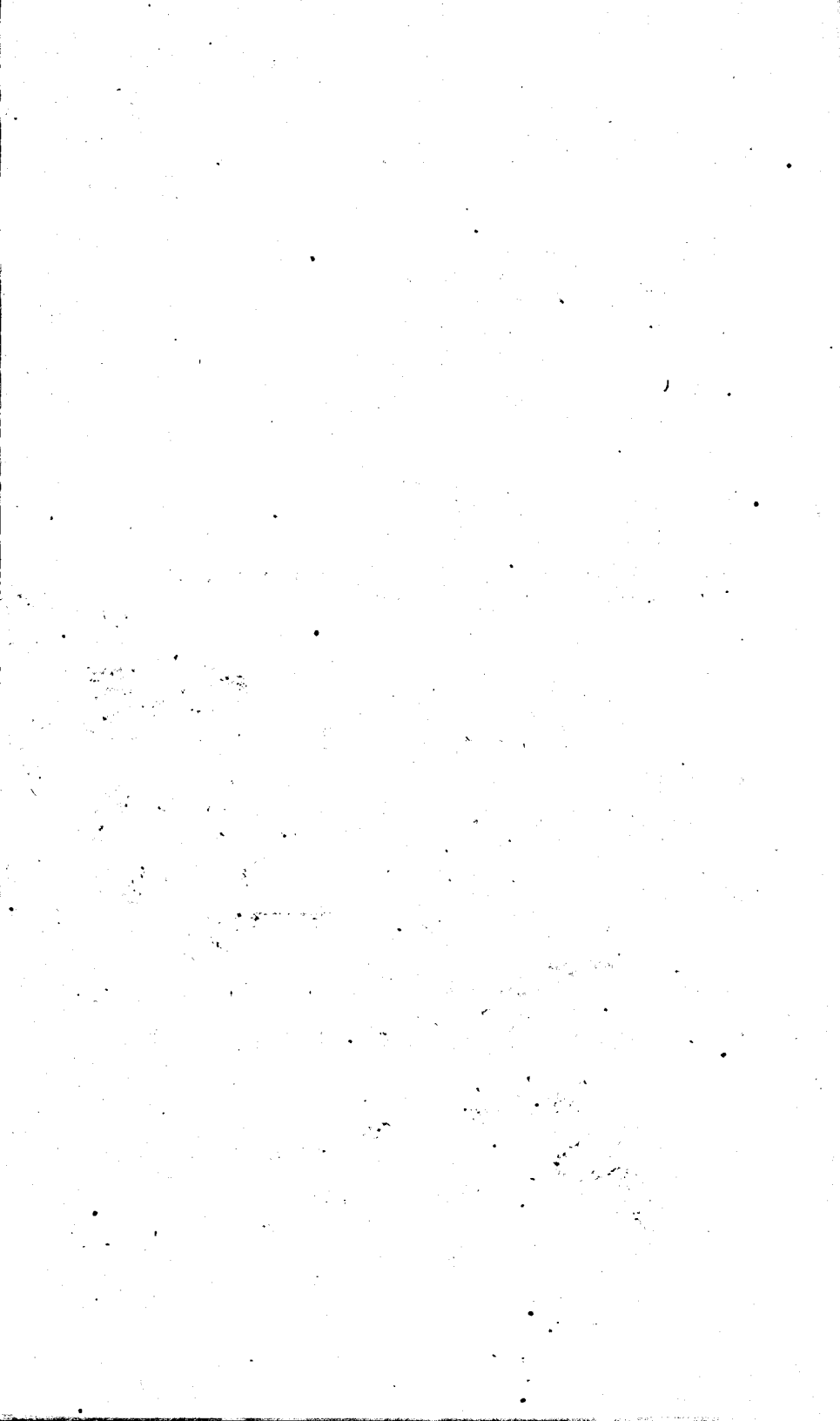

PROCEEDINGS

The Sixteenth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with the church at Sts. Delight, Craven county, N. C. October 18th, 1911.

Eld. W. W. Lewis who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached. Text: Acts, 28: 15. "He thanked God, and took courage." After the sermon, intermission of one hour was ordered for dinner.

After intermission, conference was organized by electing the following officers:

Eld. W. W. Lewis, Moderator.

Eld. H. Cunningham, Assistant Moderator.

J. W. Alford, Clerk.

Lloyd Vernon, Reading Clerk.

After the organization, prayer was offered by J. W. Alford.

Delegates from the various conferences were enrolled as follows:

Central—Eld. J. T. Butler.

Western—Elds. W. B. Everett and J. H. Whitley.

South Georgia Association—Eld. E. L. StClaire.

Eld. Butler made an encouraging report of the work of the Central Conference.

Eld. Everett also made a good report of the work in the Western Conference.

Eld. StClaire made a good report of the Georgia Associations.

The various committees were appointed as follows:

Devotional—L. A. Foy, J. B. Morton and E. L. Riggs.

Finance—J. S. Robinson, Fred Silverthorn and L. L. Springle.

Educational—J. T. Butler, F. E. Jones and H. Cunningham.

Sabbath Schools—A. E. Rouse, J. W. Sewall and W. J. Moore.

Missions—W. B. Everett, Fred Silverthorn and R. W. Merritt.

Temperance—W. R. Sawyer, A. E. Rouse and D. B. Garner.

To Apportion R. M. Funds—W. R. Sawyer, D. B. Garner, Daniel Gaskins, John I. Taylor and B. G. Prescott.

Ministerial Character—W. W. Lewis, W. J. Moore, W. A. Gaskins, F. Davenport and E. A. Forest.

Text Recorder—W. A. Banks.

On motion the list of ministers be called and enquire into their work and character.

On motion Eld. W. W. Denny be placed on the retired list.

On motion J. E. Howard be excommunicated for departing from the faith of the Original Free Will Baptists.

On motion R. C. Kenedy be excommunicated for departing from the faith of the Original Free Will Baptists.

On motion this conference give letter of commendation to Eld. L. W. Wetherington for the purpose of uniting with the Central Conference.

On motion H. J. Whaley be referred to the committee on ministerial character.

On motion E. G. Yarborough be referred to the committee on ministerial character.

On motion E. B. Coston be referred to the committee on ministerial character.

Devotional committee report as follows:

Eld. D. B. Garner open, Eld. A. E. Rouse preach to-night.

On motion conference close until tomorrow A. M. 9:30 o'clock, to be opened with thirty minutes prayer service.

Closing exercise by Eld. J. T. Butler.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference opened by Eld. J. W. Sewall with thirty minutes prayer service.

Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

On motion list of churches be called. (See table.)

On motion all money for incidental expense be added to the R. M. funds.

Devotional committee report as follows:

Eld. W. J. Moore open, Eld. J. T. Butler preach today at 11-o'clock. Eld. L. C. Garner open, Eld. R. F. Daugherty preach this p. m. at 3 o'clock.

On motion we drop the church at Beache's Grove for departing from the faith.

On motion Haskin's Chapel be dropped, as the organization has gone down.

On motion Boyd's Chapel be dropped from the list.

On motion we send a preacher to Folkstone and instruct him to set the church in order.

On motion we send Eld. W. W. Lewis to Folkstone twice, and he report the result of his trips to the Executive committee.

On motion the license and credentials of J. E. Howard and R. C. Kennedy be demanded and Eld. T. F. Wallace be appointed the agent of the conference in this matter and he be instructed to advertise them in the Baptist paper, should they refuse to give them up.

On motion Eld. Wallace also inform the churches where they hold their membership that they are no longer members of the Free Will Baptist church and instruct them to erase their names from their lists.

On motion we cut off the church at Free Will Union for departing from the faith.

Committee on ministerial character made report as follows:

We your committee on ministerial character, on investigation, find that Eld. H. J. Whaley is guilty of violating the laws of the Eastern Conference by filling

the appointments of J. E. Howard and partaking with the unknown tongue sect. Therefore we recommend that he be placed in the hands of the Executive Committee for further investigation. We also recommend that you place E. B. Coston in the hands of the Executive Committee. We find him advocating the unknown tongue.

On motion this conference appoint a special committee to investigate the charges against H. J. Whaley and E. B. Coston and if found guilty, demand their license and credentials, and if they refuse to give them up, then advertise them through the BAPTIST.

Committee appointed as follows: A. E. Rouse, J. W. Webb, W. J. Moore and T. F. Wallace.

On motion the church at Atlantic demand Eld. Frank Saltér to appear before the examining board for enrollment at next conference, or surrender his license and credentials.

On motion the finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer and he make his report.

On motion the matter sent us for our consideration from the Union Conference, be referred back to that body.

On motion the \$25.00 set aside last year for the widow Dunn, be paid to the heirs.

On motion the widows of the late Elds Noble, Birtain and Stilley be placed on the list to share in the R. M. funds.

Devotional committee report as follows:

Eld. J. W. Alford open, Eld. E. L. StClaire preach tonight. Tomorrow a. m. Eld: J. H. Whitley open, Eld. R. W. Merritt preach. Tomorrow p. m. Eld. Luke Wetherington open, Eld. J. H. Whitley preach.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow a. m. 9-o'clock. Conference to be opened by 30 minutes prayer service by Eld. J. W. Webb.

Closing exercise by Eld. J. H. Whitley.

FRIDAY MORNING.

(The morning hours were used by the Woman's Home Missionary Society.) See minutes elsewhere.

FRIDAY EVENING.

Minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion we take up the petitions for the next conference. By vote, it was ordered to be held with the church at Core Creek, Craven Co.

On motion Eld. A. E. Rouse preach the introductory sermon and Eld. Duffy Toler be his alternate.

On motion the bill of Sister L. M. Peden sent down from the Union Conference, as a delegate to the Triennial Conference from N. C., be paid. (Motion was lost, as we had already instructed the Clerk to represent us by letter, which he did, and Sister Peden had not been made our representative.)

On motion the Eastern Conference of N. C. withdraw from the Triennial or General Conference.

On motion Bro. J. T. Linton be made a trustee of the Seminary for the Eastern Conference.

3rd, That we ask our preachers to insist on their people to obey the injunctions of the Master, remembering "it is more blessed to give than to receive."

On motion it be adopted.

Committee on Temperance reported as follows:

We your committee on Temperance beg to submit the following: Resolved first, That we request every member of the Free Will Baptist churches in the Eastern Conference to abstain from intoxicating liquor in any form.

2nd, That we do all in our power to assist the state in carrying into effect the prohibition laws.

3rd, That each preacher be requested to preach at least one temperance sermon a year.

On motion it be adopted.

Committee on Sabbath Schools made report as follows:

We your committee on Sabbath Schools wish to submit the following: Resolved first, That all the ministers and delegates composing this conference do all they can to build up the Sabbath Schools now in existence.

2nd, That they organize in every available place.

3rd, That we use the literature published at Ayden so far as we can and supplement with other literature only when absolutely necessary.

On motion it be adopted.

Committee on Education made report as follows:

We your committee on education beg to make the

following report: 1st, We recommend as a means of education the reading of God's Word and family prayer.

2nd, We recommend to every Free Will Baptist the reading of our Discipline, that they may educate themselves in the government of the church and thus learn their duty as church members.

3rd, We recommend a liberal patronage of the public schools. We also recommend that all Free Will Baptist parents sending their children off to school, patronize our own school at Ayden, N. C.

4th, We recommend that all money sent in for education at the last conference be used to pay off the debt on the girls' dormitory.

On motion it be adopted.

Examining council reported as follows:

The examining council have been in session and find Bros. Lloyd Vernon and J. N. Edwards prepared for ordination, and recommend that they be ordained and their names placed on the list of ministers.

We also recommend that the name of J. F. Linton be placed on the list of ministers.

On motion it be adopted.
