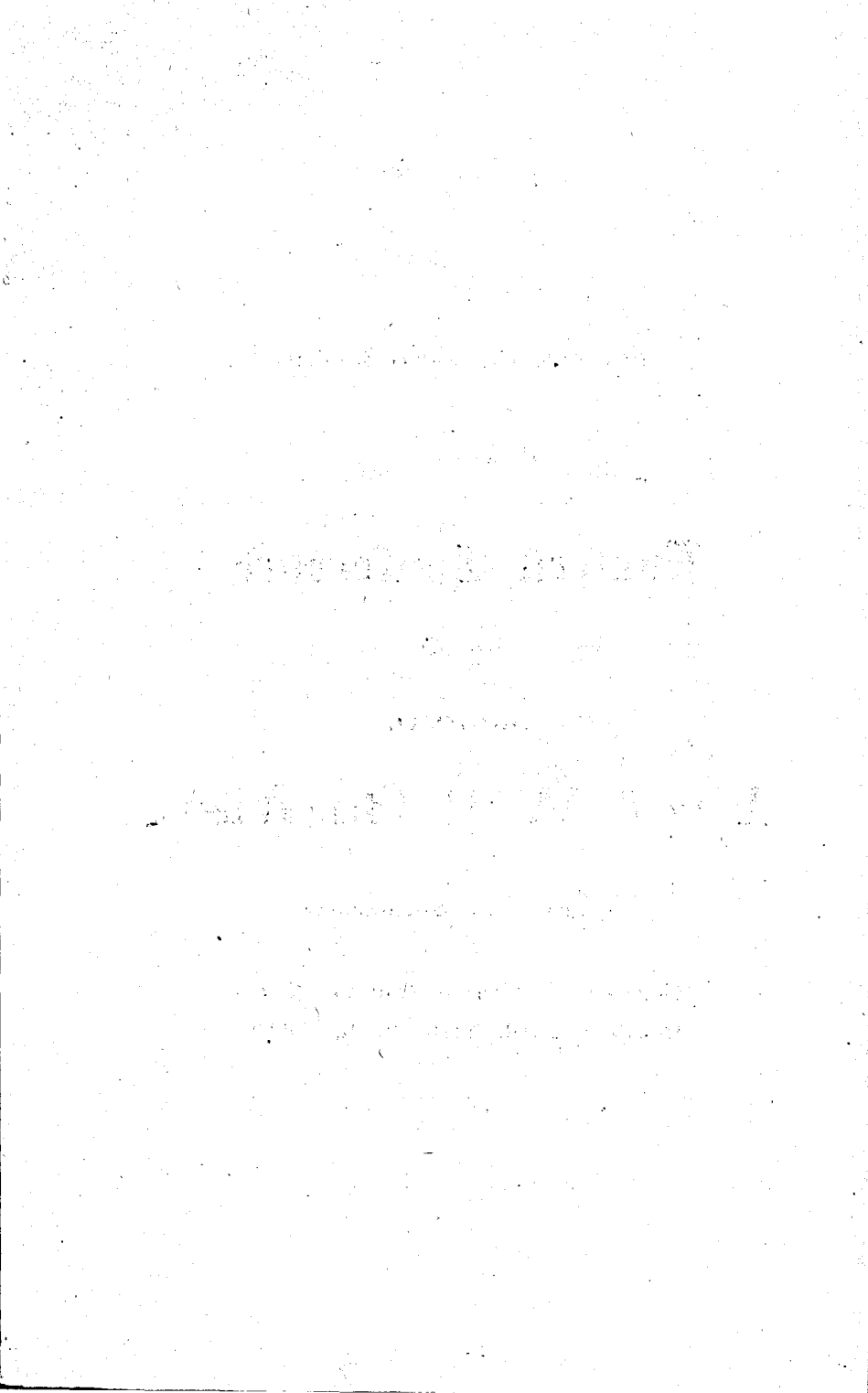

PROCEEDINGS

The Seventeenth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with the church at Core Creek, Craven county, N. C. October 23rd, 1912.

Eld. A. E. Rouse, who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, attended and preached. Text: Exodus, 14, 15.

After an intermission of one hour, we re-assembled and organized conference by electing the following officers:

After the election of the officers, prayer was offered by Eld. J. W. Alford.

On motion we call the list of ministers, and enquire into their christian standing.

On motion E. B. Coston be excommunicated for departing from the faith.

On motion H. J. Whaley be excommunicated for departing from the faith.

On motion E. G. Yarboro be excommunicated for departing from the faith.

On motion Bro. R. C. Kenedy be restored to his ministerial functions, and his name placed on the list of ministers.

Devotional committee reported as follows: Tonight, Bro. Luke Wetherington open Eld. J. E. Davis preach, Eld. A. E. Rouse close. On motion conference close until tomorrow 9:30 o'clock, to be opened with a thirty minutes prayer service, conducted by W. R. Sawyer.

Closing exercises by Eld. R. C. Kenedy.

Thursday Morning.

Conference opened at 9:30 o'clock with a thirty minutes prayer service by W. R. Sawyer.

On motion minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

Devotional committee reported as follows: This A. M. at 11 o'clock Eld. L. C. Garner open, Eld. J. R. McCaskey preach, Eld. W. J. Moore close. This P. M. at 2:30 o'clock Eld. L. L. Smith open, Eld. W. Lupton preach, Eld. R. C. Kenedy close. Tonight: Eld. Lloyd Vernon open, Eld. G. C. Vause preach, Eld. J. W. Alford close.

On motion the list of churches be called. (See table.)

On motion the baptism of the converts at South River be declared irregular and we require them to be baptized by a regular ordained minister before recognizing them as members of the Free Will Baptist church.

Thursday Afternoon.

On motion we continue the names of Edwards and Beaufort on the list of churches for the present.

On motion the Finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, and the Treasurer makes his report, and the committee be discharged.

Committee on Ministerial Character reported as follows: We your committee on Ministerial Character beg to say that we have not heard anything against any of our ministers.

On motion the report be adopted.

On motion we receive the resolutions presented by Eld. J. E. Davis of the Western conference, for consideration.

The committee on Sabbath schools made report as follows:

Resolved 1st, That our members use their influence in favor of Sabbath Schools by attending.

2nd, That our pastors try to keep the S. S. running in all their churches.

3rd, That our schools use F. W. B. literature, as far as possible, and use others only to fill places where ours will not.

4th, That our pastors impress the duty of the old, leading the young upon their members.

On motion it be adopted.

On motion conference close until tomorrow 9:30 o'clock.

Closing exercises by Eld. L. L. Smith.

Friday Morning.

Conference opened with a thirty minutes prayer service by Prof. J. E. Sawyer.

On motion the minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion the report of the S. S. committee be reconsidered.

On motion we strike out in the 3rd section, beginning at "as far as possible," the remainder of the section, and it be left to read: That our schools use Free Will Baptist literature.

The Temperance committee made report as follows:

We your committee on Temperance wish to report the following: Seeing the great evil that exists on the account of intemperance, we request every minister to teach and live temperance by precept and example.

2nd, Resolved that every layman abstain from the use of alcohol, and intemperance in every form.

3rd, Resolved that our denomination encourage every movement to prevent the evil in our country.

On motion it be adopted.

Educational committee made report; but same was tabled.

Devotional committee reported as follows: Today at 11:30 o'clock Eld. I. H. Pipkin open, Eld. L. L. Smith preach Eld. R. F. Daugherty close.

Mission committee made report as follows:

As we look over the Eastern conference, and seeing

so much need of mission work, therefore be it resolved 1st, That every minister and member of the Freewill Baptist church do all they can in said work.

2nd, that the W. H. M. Society of the Eastern conference, and the Little Workers League be encouraged to do all they can.

3rd, that the pastors of each church be urged to comply with the resolution requiring them to take morning collections in their churches.

On motion it be adopted.

On motion the educational money of the future be sent to the seminary to help relieve any indebtedness on the institution.

Delegates from the various churches pledged for their churches for education as follows: Friendship, Jones county, \$5.00; Bethel, \$25.00; Trent, \$25.00; Kinston, \$10.00; Whaley's Chapel, \$5.00; Gethsemane, \$15.00; New Bethlehem, \$5.00; Wintergreen, \$5.00; Daley's Chapel, \$5.00; Northeast, \$5.00.

On motion the following resolution was adopted:

Resolved that we, the Eastern conference, the Central and Western conferences concurring therein, amend our Discipline by changing sub sections 1 & 2 of section VI. to read as follows:

1. No member of our connection shall take upon himself the public ministry of the word, except he feels himself divinely called. After receiving such call, he shall report to the church of which he is a member, and should the church be satisfied with the qualifications and call of such person, then the church may grant to said person license, signed by the pastor and clerk, to preach the gospel for one year. But if any doubt shall exist as to the fitness of said person for such work, then the church may grant to him license to exercise his gifts in exhortation. In either case, such license may not be granted for more than one year.

2. After said licentiate or exhorter shall have exercised his gifts for one year, if he is found useful and well qualified in the ministry, the church may recommend him to the conference, of which the church is a member for ordination. The conference having received said recommendation, shall order the candidate to appear before the examining board of said conference, who shall examine him as to orthodoxy and other qualifications. Having passed a satisfactory examination, the candidate shall be ordained in the regular manner by an ordaining council, composed of three ordained ministers appointed by said conference. Said ordaining council shall perform the ordination by fasting, prayer, and the laying on of the hands of the presbytery.

On motion the church at Atlantic be requested to demand the license and credentials of Frank Salter, and the pastor of the church be the agent of the conference to receive the same, and should he refuse to surrender them, he be advertised in the Baptist.

On motion we table the resolutions concerning the orphanage for one year

On motion we have 1500 minutes printed and we send 25 copies to each of the following conferences: Western Central and Cape Fear, and the rest be distributed among our churches.

On motion the minutes for the Cape Fear conference be sent to Eld J. F. Hill, Goldsboro, N. C., and he distribute same among the churches of his conference.

On motion the clerk prepare the minutes for the press, and he be allowed \$10.00 for his services.

Friday Afternoon.

On motion we take up the petitions for the next conference. By vote it was ordered to be held with the church at White Hill, Beaufort county.

On motion Eld. H. Cunningham preach the introductory sermon, and Eld. R. F. Daugherty be his alternate.
