PROCEEDINGS.

The Twenty-fourth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists, of North Carolina, convened with the church at Deep Run, Lenoir county, N. C., October 23rd, 1919. Rev. A. E. Rouse, who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached. Text: 1 Cor. 3:9. "For we are laborers together with God: Ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building." After which an intermission of one hour was taken for dinner. After dinner was served we re-assembled for organization, but owing to much rain, the delegates and preachers did not arrive, and the organization was deferred until night.

THURSDAY NIGHT.

We reassembled at 7 o'clock and perfected the organization as follows:

The various committees were appointed as follows:

Sabbath Schools.—Rev. J. W. Sewall, J. L. Slade, C. L. Gaskins.

Temperance.—Revs. Duffy Toler, G. W. Kennedy, Mrs. Alice Lupton.

Ministerial Character.—J. W. Hunnings, L. H. Mallard, R. R. Jones, J. C. Fulcher, G. E. Cox, Chairman.

To Apportion Retired Ministers Funds.—Daniel Gaskins, E. B. Thomas, J. W. Odum.

Committee on Resolutions.—Revs. L. H. Wetherington, F. L. Harris, J. C. Griffin.

Committee to Apportion the Funds of this Conference for the various Purposes.—W. A. Gaskins, R. O. Godley, J. E. Riggs, Revs. S. H. Styron, J. W. Sewall.

The organization being completed, prayer was offered by Rev. J. C. Griffin.

Devotional Committee reported as follows: This evening Rev. Vernon open; Rev. W. W. Lewis preach and close. Tonight Rev. A. A. Wells open, Rev. W. B. Everett preach and close. At Smith's School House, Rev. D. B. Garner preach. (The above report was made in the evening.)

On motion we invite the visitors and delegates from the various conferences to seats with us. The following were enrolled:

Western.—A. A. Wells.

Central.—J. E. Wooten, W. J. Braxton.

A letter of recommendation presented by Rev. J. C. Griffin from the Western Conference was read, and on motion he be received into this Conference, and his name placed on the list of ministers.

Bros. Guion Eubanks and J. R. Davenport presented themselves for examination and ordination, and was referred to the Examining Board.

At this point we called off for preaching, to reassemble Friday morning at 9:30 o'clock. Prayer service to be conducted by Bro. G. E. Cox.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9:30 o'clock and was opened as per arrangement. rolled from the Cape Fear Conference.

On motion the list of ministers be called.

The following were referred to the Committee on Ministerial Character: W. W. Lewis, T. D. Noe, B. W. Wells, J. F. Linton.

Rev. A. H. Outlaw was appointed to write an obituary of Rev. H. Cunningham, the same to appear in our minutes.

On motion the Moderator appoint a committee to dispose of the property of Holly Hill church, and report at next Conference. The committee was appointed as follows: Rev. A. E. Rouse, S. M. Waller, Lunda Williams.

On motion the proceeds of sale of the above property be appropriated to the new church of Long Ridge.

On motion the Trustees of Morehead City church be empowered to sell the old church lot at Morehead City, and apply the proceeds of sale to the purchase of the new lot.

On motion the church called "Atlantic" be changed to Morehead City.

On motion we accept the offer of \$200.00 made by the Episcopal church, for the old church property at Edward, and B. G. Prescott and T. L. Hardy the former committee make the deed for the conference.

Devotional Committee reported as follows: This evening Bro. Toler open, Bro. Styron preach, Bro. Daugherty close. Tonight, Bro. Outlaw open, Bro. Sewall preach, Bro. Griffin close. At Smith's School House, Bro. Harris open, Bro. Wetherington preach.

On motion we accept the report of Bro. Sewall relative to Mt. Zion, Carteret county, and the committee be continued, and authorized to sell land and house for not less than \$100.00.

FRIDAY EVENING.

Bro. Braxton, Treasurer of the Orphanage addressed us for several minutes on the needs of that institution, and his remarks were well received.

J. W. Alford, Field Secretary for the Seminary spoke for several minutes on the Bond Issue, the people being very attentive to his remarks.

On motion Bro. R. O. Godley be elected Treasurer pro tem.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

The Treasurer's report as follows: Balance on hand from last Conference; minute fund \$7.17; general fund \$18.50; total \$25.67. Received at this Conference \$1842.50, total on hand \$1867.17.

Received from J. W. Alford from sale of Belhaven church wreckage and credited to building fund, \$136.00.

On motion the report be adopted.

The following resolution was offered and adopted:

In every session of our Conference about the time we get into the business, a large number of the ministers are compelled to leave and go to their churches for their appointment before the Conference adjourns.

Therefore, be it Resolved, That from now on this Conference hold its regular meetings Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, before the 4th Sunday in October, instead of Thursday, Friday and Saturday as at present, so that all pastors may be able to stay until all the business has been transacted intelligently, and then be able to reach their appointment after Conference adjourns.

The following resolution was adopted:

Finding that there are many homes where there is no family altar, Therefore, be it Resolved, That we as a denomination insist that every home set up a family altar. (By request of a lady.)

Rev. J. C. Wooten made report of his work at Brices Creek, and bill of \$113.76 for same was ordered paid.

A letter from Rev. L. C. Garner was read, and due attention paid to same. A collection was taken for him, and \$53.28 raised, which was placed in the hands of Rev. K. F. Springle.

The Sunday School Committee reported as follows:

We see the need of a better Sunday School work, and therefore ask our people to put forth a greater effort to make an evergreen Sunday School at each of our churches. We also ask each Sunday School to set aside the first Sunday in each month as Orphanage Sunday, and all funds collected for the same be forwarded to the Treasurer, W. J. Braxton.

On motion it be adopted.

The Temperance Committee reported as follows:

Realizing the great evil of intemperance, not only from alcoholic drinks, but in various forms of the appetite, including the indulgence in harmful amusements, etc., we your committee beg to submit the following:

1st. That our ministers give more earnest heed to the little "no-harm" things with which the churches of today are having to do, and that they do their best to suppress every form of intemperance that comes to their notice.

2nd. That the laity co-operate with the preacher in the suppression of this evil, and seek to obtain a more definite knowledge of what intemperance really is. On motion it be adopted.

Petitions for the next Conference were presented from the following churches: Core Creek, Sts. Delight and Whaley's Chapel. By vote it was ordered to be held with Sts. Delight, Craven county. J. W. Alford was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, and Rev. Lloyd Vernon, alternate.

The election of officers was taken up with the following result: Rev. J. C. Griffin, Moderator; J. W. Alford, Clerk.

On motion we pay the clerk \$30.00 per year.

On motion we extend Rev. M. C. Prescott, the retiring Moderator, a vote of thanks, and make him a present of \$25.00.

On motion R. O. Godley be elected Treasurer of this Conference, and

the former Treasurer be requested to turn over all money he has on hand to the new Treasurer.

On motion we pay the former Treasurer \$5.00 to cover his expenses.

On motion conference close until tomorrow 9:30 o'clock. The morning prayer service to be conducted by Bro. Guion Eubanks.

SATURDAY MORNING.

Conference met at appointed time. Prayer service conducted by Rev. F. L. Harris. Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

The committee on Education reported as follows:

We, your Educational Committee beg to submit the following:

We urgently request that all the people of the Eastern Conference continue a vigorous effort in the sale of bonds as was submitted by the committee at our last session. We further ask that our people patronize our own school and not the schools of other denominations.

On motion it was adopted.

The committee on Ministerial Character reported as follows:

The Committee on Ministerial Character upon investigation of charges against W. W. Lewis, find them true. We also find that he has obtained pardon from the parties concerned. We therefore recommend that he be required to ask pardon of this Conference in person at the next session. We also investigated charges against T. D. Noe, and find reason to believe that he has denied the faith. We therefore recommend that his name be dropped from the list of ministers, and his credentials demanded. Charges against B. W. Wells were carefully investigated, and we find he has reformed and will probably be of more service than before. We deferred the case of J. F. Linton for lack of evidence.

On motion we accept the report relative to W. W. Lewis.

On motion we accept the report relative to T. D. Noe, and Rev. J. W. Sewall be appointed to demand his credentials.

On motion we accept the report relative to Wells and Linton.

Committee to apportion Conference funds reported as follows:

The committee advises that the money on hand be distributed as follows:

Orphanage, \$500.00; Seminary, \$500.00; Publishing House, (loan) \$300.00; Missions, \$120.00; Widows of deceased ministers, \$120.00. The balance to be kept for Conference expenses.

On motion it be adopted.

The following resolution was offered and adopted:

Seeing the awkward position we are placed in often when calling the list of ministers in our Conference, and desiring to give everyone justice, Therefore, be it Resolved, 1st. That we enforce the resolution requiring our ministers to make written report of service rendered during the year.

2nd. That instead of some one answering to the standing of the minister when calling the roll, the report of said minister be read by the Reading Clerk.

3rd. That the Clerk get out suitable blanks and forward to each minister in time to make report.

4th. That every preacher who does not make report of his work automatically be declared subject to the dealing of the Ministerial Character Committee, to show just cause why such report has not been made.

The Examining Board reported that Bros. Guion Eubanks and John Davenport have been before the Board, and they having passed a satisfactory examination, we therefore recommend their ordination.

On motion it be adopted.

On motion the widows of Elders C. Smith and Jesse Paul be placed on the list of widows of deceased ministers.

Delegates were appointed to the various conferences as follows:

Central.—W. B. Everett.

Western.—F. L. Harris.

Co-operative General Association.—J. C. Griffin, J. W. Alford.

On motion the delegates to the Co-operative Association draw on the Treasurer for their expenses.

Devotional Committee reported as follows: This morning Rev. Wooten open, Rev. Toler preach and close. This evening Rev. Vernon open, Rev. Griffin preach and close.

Committee to Apportion R. M. Funds reports as follows:

Widow Vernon, \$12.00; widow Slaughter, \$12.00; widow Miller, \$12.00; widow Stilley, \$12.00; widow Nobles, \$12.00; widow Linton, \$12.00; widow Brittain, \$12.00; widow Davis, \$12.00; widow Smith, \$12.00; widow Paul, \$12.00.

On motion it be adopted.

W. A. Gaskins offered his resignation as a Director for the Seminary.

On motion it be accepted and B. G. Prescott be elected in his place.

On motion a vote of thanks be extended to the people of this community for their hospitality shown us while in session.

Bros. Braxton and Wooten made good, cheering remarks, and invited us to their coming session of the Central Conference.

On motion we close until next session, to be held with Sts. Delight, commencing on Wednesday before the fourth Sunday in October, 1920.

IN MEMORIAM.

Rev. H. Cunningham died at his home in Lenoir county, North Carolina, the 11th day of August, 1919, after a long illness. He was 76 years of age and leaves to mourn his loss one son and two daughters, 29 grandchildren, and 42 great grandchildren.

Mr. Cunningham was ordained to preach the gospel in July 1869 at the home of Mrr. Nathan Hill, by Rev. Haskell Jones and several others, and he filled the office of the ministry faithfully until a year or two before his death, when ill health prevented his going longer. The remains were laid to rest in the family burying ground amid many sorrowing friends.

Brother Cunningham is no more dead than he ever was; no more dead than he was when he stood up and said that "he had rather wear out than to rust out; no more dead than he was when he rode for miles and miles to carry the gospel of Jesus Christ. It was not hands or lips that for nearly fifty years fought for the Free Will Baptists and the principles that have played a great part in making her great; it was nothing that you can lay away and bury that battled for honesty and truth. It was a spirit, made vicual in a certain combination of flesh and bone and blood which we came to love and to honor. That shape has vanished. The earth has it. One of these days it will be dust. We possess the better part, and no death can rob us of it. For we have the spirit. That which was really Uncle Henry, as most everybody called him, endures and will endure. You cannot bring it low with fever, it lives in the hearts of hundreds who knew him. Mr. Cunningham is dead, they say; and as we listen for the thunder of his voice, and listen, it seems, in vain; and cry out for his wonderful denominational leadership, and cry out, it seems, in vain—it is hard not to believe that he is really dead, silenced forever, laid away forever on that quiet hill overlooking his beautiful country home, and the fields round about which he loved. He was so vivid, and wherever he was, so near, not to the friends only who saw him once a day or once a year, but to hundreds who never saw him at all, that it is hard not to believe that he has dropped utterly off this tumultuous earth, of which he was so important a part.
