

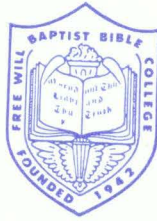

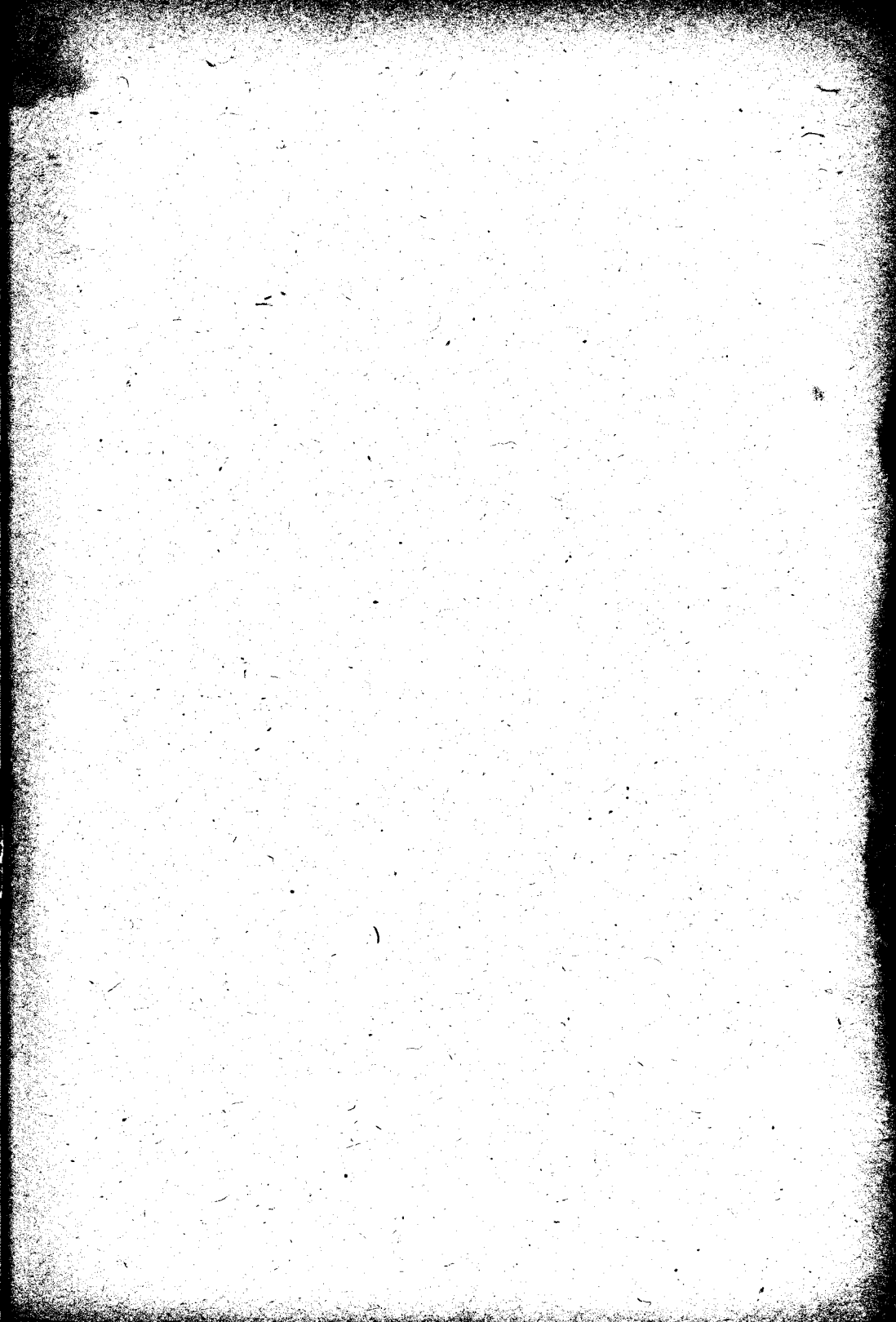

# PROCEEDINGS

The Twenty-fifth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Sts. Delight, Craven County, N. C., October 20th, 1920. Elder J. W. Alford who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached. Text: 1 Cor. 15:58, after which an intermission of one hour was taken for dinner. After dinner was served, we re-assembled for organization, and after prayer by Rev. F. L. Harris the organization was made as follows:

The various committees were appointed as follows:

Ministerial Character:—W. R. Sawyer, J. W. Mallard, Sr., G. D. Potter, R. E. Casey, I. T. Bishop.

To Apportion the Funds of this Conference for the various purposes:

The organization being perfected, prayer was offered by Bro. W. R. Sawyer.

On motion we invite visiting ministers and delegates to seats with us. The following were enrolled:

Central Conference:—Rev. W. H. Laughinghouse, J. A. Hudson, W. J. and Mrs. Braxton, B. Harper, J. W. Dixon, G. W. Dail, L. A. Arnold.

Western:—Rev. E. T. Phillips, R. F. Pittman, E. C. Morris, E. Poston.

First Oklahoma Association:—Mrs. McAdams.

Encouraging remarks were made by Rev. Laughinghouse, W. J. Braxton, J. A. Hudson, Mrs. McAdams, Rev. Poston.

The Devotional Committee reported as follows:

Rev. W. Lupton open, and Rev. L. Vernon preach tonight.....

Bros. H. M. McAdams, L. M. Herlan, J. W. Salter, W. C. Edwards, and H. C. Williams presented themselves for examination and enrollment on the list of ministers, and were referred to the Examining Board.

Resolution offered as follows:

Owing to the fact that the ministers of our denomination in North Carolina have, since the last session of our Conference, perfected a Ministerial Association to meet annually, and that the laity would not be interest-

ed, nor is supposed to hear the reports of the ministers of our church, therefore, be it resolved:

1st. That the resolution of our last session, held with the church at Deep Run, Lenoir County, N. C., relative to ministers reports be repealed, and that all ministers be required to make report of their work to the Ministerial Association on blanks prepared by said Association.

2nd. That hereafter the list of ministers be called as usual, and they who are present answer "Present," and they who find it impossible to attend be required to send a letter stating why they are absent, and said letter to be read by the Reading Clerk.

3rd. Any minister who fails to appear in person or by letter at any session of this Conference be referred to the Committee on Ministerial Character.

On motion it be adopted.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock. Prayer service to be conducted by Rev. W. H. Laughinghouse.

#### THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock, and was opened with prayer service as ordered. Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

Rev. J. A. Carroll, co-worker with Rev. B. F. McLendon was present, and made very encouraging remarks, after which Bros. Carroll and Pittman very beautifully rendered a duet.

On motion the list of ministers be called.

On motion the Moderator appoint a committee to write an obituary of Bro. Guion Eubanks, the same to appear in our minutes. Revs. R. F. Pittman and C. L. Merrill appointed.

Devotional committee reported as follows: This morning Rev. L. H. Wetherington open, and Mrs. McAdams preach.

On motion we accept the report of J. W. Sewall relative to the credentials of T. D. Noe, and he be discharged.

On motion the case of W. W. Lewis be continued until next conference.

On motion Rev. R. F. Daugherty be discharged in reference to Rev. G. W. Harrison, and Bro. Harrison be left in the hands of the committee on Ministerial Character.

On motion the list of churches be called. (See table.)

On motion the new church at Lanes Chapel, Craven county, be received and enrolled.

On motion the church at Washington be received and enrolled.

On motion we receive and enroll the church at Belhaven.

Bro. Wetherington, the Superintendent of the Orphanage was recognized, and he very clearly and effectively presented the Orphanage work to this body. Public collection amounting to \$117.41 was taken for the institution.

On motion we represent in the formation of a National Association,



which is to have its first meeting in Nashville, Tenn., beginning Thursday night before the second fifth Sunday in 1921.

On motion Revs. J. W. Alford and J. E. Sawyer be elected delegates.

The Song Book question was presented by Rev. R. F. Pittman for the committee appointed by the State Convention. His proposition was for five men from each conference to advance \$200.00 each, making a total of \$1000.00 from each conference, the same to be paid back with 6 per cent interest when enough books have been sold. Bros. R. O. Godley, Duffy Toler, J. C. Griffin, J. F. Robinson and M. C. Prescott made the loan requested.

The devotional committee reported as follows: Duffy Toler open and J. P. Woodard preach at 2.30 o'clock. J. W. Sewall open and R. C. Kennedy preach tonight.

The committee on Ministerial Character reported as follows: We recommend that a committee be appointed to wait on G. W. Harrison, and report at the next conference. Regarding the other five, we haven't sufficient evidence to justify us in recommending a committee to wait on them, and for lack of evidence, we could not act.

On motion report be adopted. Committee appointed in compliance with the report as follows: R. F. Daugherty, J. W. Mallard, Sr., J. W. Alford.

On motion this conference receive the offer of the property of Mt. Olive, Beaufort county, and appoint a committee to look into the matter, and report at the next conference. Committee appointed as follows: R. F. Daugherty, J. W. Webb, Calvin Bennett.

The Examining Board reported as follows: Rev. H. M. McAdams appeared before the Board, and it was unanimously agreed that his name be placed on the list of ordained ministers.

On motion the report be adopted.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

Petitions for the next conference were presented from Woodington, Washington and Friendship in Jones county. By vote it was ordered to be held with the church at Washington. Rev. A. H. Outlaw was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, and J. W. Alford on his failure.

On motion the same committee that has had Mt. Zion, Carteret county in hand be instructed to sell the property, and turn the proceeds over to the Treasurer of the Conference.

On motion we adopt the report of M. C. Prescott regarding the Printing Co., and we appoint a committee of one, to meet other committeemen from the other conferences relative to making the Printing Co., denominational property. J. C. Griffin was appointed said committee.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock. Rev. L. C. Garner was appointed to conduct the opening prayer service.

#### FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference met at the appointed hour, and was opened by prayer service as arranged.

Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

The Committee on Sabbath Schools made report as follows: Realizing that the Sunday School work is one of the arms for the development of the church, Therefore we submit the following:

1st. As the Sunday School work of the Eastern Conference has been given over to the Woman's Home Mission Convention, we insist that they represent each year to this Convention.

2nd. We earnestly request the co-operation of all our ministers in organizing and maintaining a Sunday School in each of their churches.

3rd. That each Sunday School be requested to use Free Will Baptist literature.

On motion it be adopted.

The committee on Education reported as follows:

(Their report was the same as offered by M. C. Prescott to the State Convention, and modified by the said Convention, in which it authorizes Bro. Prescott, the Financial Agent of the school, to wage a campaign for \$500,000.00, the amount raised to be divided as follows: Five per cent for the Printing Company, 20 per cent for the Orphanage, and 75 per cent for the school.)

On motion it be adopted.

The Devotional Committee reported as follows: W. J. Moore open, E. Poston preach today at 11 o'clock. C. L. Merrill open, R. F. Daugherty preach at 2 o'clock.

On motion the report be adopted.

On motion J. W. Alford be paid \$15.00 to reimburse him for the loss of an appointment in attending the Co-operative Association last December.

On motion we allow the Trustees of Belhaven church to sell the old lot, and place the proceeds on a new lot, and we return to them the amount in the Treasury received from the sale of the rubbish from the old building.

On motion this Conference endorse the Trustees of Belhaven church, empowering them to act fully for this conference in this sale.

On motion we empower the Trustees of Antioch church to sell the old church and site, and apply the proceeds to a new site and building.

On motion this conference elect Rev. L. Vernon to assist Rev. M. C.



Prescott in the campaign for the school in this conference, and the Executive Committee of this conference arrange with Bro. Vernon as to his salary.

The Committee to Apportion the Funds to the various purposes reported as follows:

We apportion the funds in the hands of the Treasurer as follows: For the college \$500.00, the Orphanage \$500.00, for stock in the Printing Co., \$300.00, R. M. fund \$100.00, for Church Extension \$100.00. Balance of \$312.76 in the hands of the Treasurer to be used for the Conference expense.

On motion the report be adopted.

On motion sister Cunningham be placed on the list of widows of Retired Ministers.

The Committee to Apportion R. M. funds reported as follows: For widow Vernon \$11.11, widow Slaughter \$11.11, widow Stilley \$11.11, widow Nobles \$11.11, widow Linton \$11.11, widow Brittain \$11.11, widow Davis \$11.11, widow Paul \$11.11, widow Cunningham \$11.12.

On motion it be adopted.

#### FRIDAY EVENING.

The Examining Board reported as follows: We find that Bro. L. M. Herlan has made a passing grade on his examination, and we therefore order his ordination.

On motion the report be adopted.

Ordaining Council appointed as follows: Revs. W. Lupton, D. B. and L. C. Garner.

Rev. A. E. Rouse reported that the committee appointed to dispose of old Holly Hill property had not done anything, and ask for another year.

On motion the report be accepted and the time granted.

On motion we have 1500 minutes printed, and the publisher distribute the same, and draw on the Treasurer for same.

On motion we elect the following as an Executive Committee for twelve months: R. F. Daugherty, Chairman; M. C. Prescott, Sec.; A. E. Rouse, J. S. Robinson, J. C. Griffin.

On motion we drop the Mission Board, and hereafter we direct our Mission efforts through the State Mission Board.

On motion the directors for the school for next year be J. W. Alford, J. C. Griffin, W. B. Everett and J. T. Linton.

On motion this conference return to this church and community a

hearty vote of thanks for their hospitality shown us while in session.

On motion conference close.

#### GUION EUBANKS.

Bro. Guion Eubanks was born in Carteret County, February 16, 1896. Grew up an obedient son. Though his health was not very good, he was always active in Christian work.

For several years he was a faithful member of Russell's Creek Free Will Baptist church. Feeling the divine call to the ministry he was licensed to preach by his church on December 8th, 1918.

With the idea of preparing himself for the work of the ministry he entered school at the F. W. B. Seminary in the fall of 1918, remaining there until his death, which occurred November 23, 1919.

He successfully passed the examination of the Eastern Conference in October before his death, and accordingly was ordained by the writer and others in the F. W. B. church in Ayden, N. C., shortly after the Conference convened.

Bro. Eubanks was a model student, was always striving to do his best. He was a consecrated Christian, at all times standing on the side of right. He was loved by the entire membership of the ministerial class, of which he was President. He had gone to Beaufort county to preach, accompanied by M. H. Mellette, a fellow student, at the time of his death.

The entire ministerial class attended his funeral at the home of his father, near Beaufort, N. C., conducted by the writer to a host of sorrowful friends. The class sang around the grave, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." This being the last song sung by the class before the Lord called him home.

We feel confident that Bro. Eubanks has fallen asleep in the arms of Jesus.
