PROCEEDINGS.

The Twenty Eighth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with the church at Christian Chapel, Lenoir county, N. C., on October 24th, 1923. Rev. J. C. Griffin who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached. Text: Matt. 27:22. "What shall I do with Jesus which is called the Christ?" After a most instructive sermon, we called off one hour for dinner.

After dinner we re-assembled and the following officers were in the chairs:

Rev. J. C. Griffin, Moderator; Rev. A. E. Rouse, Assistant Moderator; J. W. Alford, Clerk; Rev. L. H. Wetherington, Reading Clerk. Prayer was offered by Rev. D. B. Garner. The following committees were appointed:

Devotional.—Parker Howard, J. K. Hartley, J. A. Small.

Finance.-C. L. Gaskins, J. W. Tyndall, F. R. Williams.

Education.—S. H. Styron, W. B. Smith, R. O. Godlev.

Sabbath Schools.—R. C. Kennedy, W. A. Gaskins, D. B. Garner.

Temperance.-G. W. Mobley, Solomon Duff, J. R. Davenport.

Ministerial Character.—A. E. Rouse, G. W. Kennedy, A. H. Outlaw, J. W. Sewall, J. W. Smith.

To apportion the funds of this conference, also the Retired Minister's funds.—A. H. Outlaw, W. H. Caroon, Jasper Hill, W. A. Gaskins, L. F. Edwards, S. C. Keel.

The organization being perfected prayer was offered by Rev. G. W. Kennedy.

The Moderator invited the visiting brethren to seats with us. The following were recorded:

Western Conference,-Revs. W. M. Howell, R. N. Hinant.

Central Conference.—Bro. W. A. Dail.

Bro. Howell reported his conference as progressing nicely, also a good session of the same last week.

Bro. Dail spoke of his joy in being with us.

The Executive Committee made report of its meetings as follows: The Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference met in session at Kinston November 20th, 1922. Prayer was offered by Rev. A. H. Outlaw.

The matter of selling a part of the Spring Hope church lot to the Charitable Brotherhood was presented to the committee.

On motion the conference sell 1-4 acre of the Spring Hope church lot to the Charitable Brotherhood for \$20.00 with the distinct understanding that should the Grand Lodge ever revoke their charter, then the property goes back to the Conference.

On motion the Chairman, J. C. Griffin be appointed as agent of this conference to make the deed for this property.

On motion we turn over the property of Holly Hill church to the Trus-

tees of Long Ridge church for them to sell, and they report their action to the next conference.

On motion the Trustees of Sarecta church be empowered to sell the old church lot, and secure one closer the village, with the consent of the church.

Rev. A. H. Outlaw was appointed as corresponding Secretary for the Eastern Conference, to secure the books for the correspondence course for the young preachers.

The Examining Board reported that Bros. L. J. Potter, H. C. Williams, and G. E Peede had passed satisfactory examinations, and recommended their ordination.

On motion it was adopted that Bros. Potter and Williams to be ordained at the Third Union Meeting. Revs. G. W. Kennedy, Lloyd Vernon and A. E. Rouse to ordain them. Bro. Peede to be ordained at the Fifth Union Meeting. Revs. Duffy Toler, A. H. Outlaw and M. C. Prescott to ordain Bro. Peede.

On motion we adjourn.

The Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference met in session at Mt. Mt. Zion, Pamlico county, April 26th, 1923. Prayer was offered by Rev. A. E. Rouse.

On motion we appoint Rev. J. C. Griffin to give applicants for ordination the examination on the first years home study course, that he grade the papers, and furnish the applicant to present this certificate to the Examining Board of the Eastern Conference when applying for ordination, and said applicant must grade at lest 80 before he shall be ordained.

On motion we require ten questions on each book for each year.

Bro. Outlaw presented bill of \$41.23 expenses as Field Secretary of the F. W. B. L. On motion we authorize the Treasurer to pay him \$25.00, and he present the balance of bill to the Conference.

On motion we adjourn.

The Devotional Committee reported for tonight, Bro. Rouse open, and Bro. Sewall preach.

On motion we adjourn until 9 o'clock A. M. tomorrow. Bro. W. B. Smith to conduct thirty minutes prayer service in the opening.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock and was opened according to previous arrangement.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

The following ministers were enrolled as present today: J. W. Webb, Wesley Price, Lloyd Vernon, L. J. Potter, G. E. Peede, F. L. Harris, G. E. Cox, Duffy Toler, J. N. Edwards, H. C. Williams, R. F. Daugherty.

A letter from Rev. W. W. Lewis was read explaining his absence.

The moderator appointed T. W. Price, W. H. Caroon, J. W. Webb, A. E. Rouse and L. H. Wetherington as a committee to investigate new churches asking admission to this Conference.

Bro. T. W. Price reported for the committee to sell the property at Edward that so far no sale had been made. The committee was ordered continued.

The Devotional Committee reported as follows: Today Rev. S. H. Styron. Tonight Rev. R. F. Daugherty open and Rev. Duffy Toler preach. On motion the list of churches be called. (See table.)

On motion the name of Gales' Creek church be changeed to Sound View. Rev. D. B. Garner was excused on account of the sickness of his son.

Rev. J. C. Griffin, who was appointed by the Executive Committee to make deed for a part of the Spring Hope church lot reported that no sale had been made.

The committee on Education made report as follows:

Realizing the necessity of a literary training for our ministry in order that the pulpit may be elevated above the pew, and whereas this Conference has provided a Home Reading Course for all ministers desiring the advantage of the same, and whereas we (the Free Will Baptist church) are now operating a school at Ayden, N. C.,

Be it Resolved, 1st. That all ministers not having taken a theological or homiletical course be required to avail themselves of the opportunity offered in the above mentioned Home Reading Course as provided by this Conference, or attend our school at Ayden for a period of not less than one year, in order that their Biblical training may be as thorough as is possible for them to have before ordination.

2. That we, the Eastern Conference of North Carolina, join hands with the Financial Agent and other conferences in the special October and November campaign to raise the necessary money for the inclosing and completion of our College building, and especially to enclose the same to protect it from the weather which will cause the deterioration of certain materials which is now exposed, and which in the near future will be a great loss to our denomination. We further recommend that our conference require each minister upon his return to his churches to put forth special efforts to raise money for the above named purpose, and that these ministers are to co-operate with the financial agent in his plans of management for the campaign.

On motion the report was adopted.

The Committee on Temperance made report as follows:

The Committee on Temperance recommend the former resolution on temperance and that it be put into effect.

On motion the report was adopted.

The Committee on Sabbath Schools reported as follows:

We the Sunday School Committee recommend that we hold to the report of the committee of the last conference as it now stands. But we do recommend that the classes be graded according to their grade in the every day school.

On motion the report was adopted.

On motion Bro. J. F. Linton be placed on the list of Retired Ministers. Rev. R. N. Hinnant made a good inspiring talk for the Orphanage, followed by J. C. Griffin, after which an offering for the same was taken amounting to \$30.27.

Bro. C. K. Dunn, of the Baptist office spoke concerning the Publishing House, asking for the co-operation and support of our folks in the work of the Publishing House.

On motion the finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

On motion the petitions for the next Conference be taken up. The following churches petitioned: Sandy Plain, Duplin county; Woodington, Lenoir county; Arapahoe, Pamlico county; Friendship, Jones county. By vote it was ordered to be held with the church at Sandy Plain, Duplin county. Rev. S. H. Styron was appointed to preach the introductory sermon. Rev. Duffy Toler, alternate.

On motion we retain the same representatives to the meetings of the stockholders of the Publishing Company.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference met at the appointed hour and was opened according to previous arrangement.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

A letter from Rev. L. C. Garner was read explaining his absence.

The committee on ministerial character made report as follows:

We recommend that B. W. Wells be restored, with the understanding that he hereafter attend conference and union meetings, and take an active part in the work of the ministry. Owing to a statement from Bro. Cox that he would not stand for the doctrine as it is now preached, and that he would not stand for the institutions of learning, we recommend that he be dropped from the conference.

We recommend that I. W. Russell be placed on the Retired Ministers' list, not to receive aid, at least for the time being.

We recommend that J. E. Sawyer, A. C. Austin, H. M. McAdams, W. W. Cuthrell and W. Lupton be excused for this time, and that hereafter if they do not answer either by letter or person they will be dealt with severely.

On motion the report was adopted.

The Field Secretary for the F. W. B. League made report as follows:

Put 25 days in the service; travelled approximately 650 miles and visited 21 churches (several Leagues were organized while enroute to attend to other things.) Kept a lot of foreign correspondence, and in this way assisted in organizing several Leagues in other conferences and states. Sold to Leagues in and out of the district \$70.23 worth of literature, The Young People's Friend.

Statistical Report.

Leagues operating at last conference: Seniors 5; Juniors 5; Primaries 9; total 19. These had an enrollment of: Seniors 112; Juniors 96; Primaries 182; total 390.

Organized since last conference: Seniors 14; Juniors 12; Primaries none; total 25. These have an enrollment of: Seniors 207; Juniors 229; total 436.

Ceased to operate: Seniors 6; Juniors 5; Primaries 1; two Primaries

have joined higher grades; total 14. Leagues now operating 30.

The Leagues now have an average attendance of: Seniors 180; Juniors 160; Primaries 78; total 318.

Money raised for all purposes for the: Seniors \$484.10; Juniors \$251.50: Primaries \$156.28; total \$891.88.




