# PROCEEDINGS.

"And Jesus said unto them, Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men".

After the sermon, intermission was taken for dinner.

After dinner, we reassembled, and after a song and prayer by Eld. J. C. Griffin, the organization was perfected.

The Mod. appointed the following committee to write obituaries of Elds. S. S. Kirk and L. N. Downs, same to appear in these minutes: Elds. Duffy Toler, W. W. Cuthrell and T. B. Allen.

Letters From Elds. L. C. Garner, J. A. Ringold, B. W. Wells, A. C. Austin were read stating why they could not be with us.

The Mod. appointed Elds. J. W. Sewall, A. H. Outlaw and T. E. Beauman to write an obituary of Eld. K. F. Springple, same to appear in these minutes.

On motion we excommunicate F. L. Harris for departing from the faith.

On motion we appointed Eld. Duffy Toler on the Examining Board in the place of Eld. J. E. Sawyer.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow A. M. 9:30 o'clock. Thirty minutes prayer service to be conducted by Bro. E. C. Gaskill, beginning at 9 o'clock.

#### THURSDAY MORNING

Conference opened with thirty minutes prayer service by Bro. E. C. Gaskill.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

Eld. R. F. Daugherty was enrolled as being present today.

On motion the list of churches be called. (See Table.)

The Devotional committee reported as follows: Today 11 o'clock, Bro. E. C. Gaskill open, Eld. W. Lupton preach. At 2 o'clock, Eld. W. J. Moore open, Eld. A. H. Outlaw preach. Tonight, Eld. R. F. Daugherty open, Eld. J. W. Webb preach.

On motion a committee be appointed to investigate the title to the property of Mt. Olive church, Beaufort county, and if they think best, sell the property, and turn the proceeds over to the conference. It is understood that this committee has full power to act for this conference. Committee: N. T. Dixon, T. B. Allen.

On motion T. B. Allen be appointed to act with J. A. Hardy and T. W. Price in bringing about the sale of the property at Edward.

On motion the church at Jarman's Chapel be erased from the list.

On report of Eld. R. F. Daugherty concerning the organization at St. Luke's, and it appearing that the organization was not regularly made, a motion was made for Elds. R. F. Daugherty and A. H. Outlaw to go to Friendship, Craven county, and bring about a re-organization, and then if they see fit, make proper arrangements for moving to the new site now occupied by St. Luke's.

#### THURSDAY EVENING

On motion the Finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

The committee on Temperance made report as follows:

Whereas the Holy Scriptures enjoins us to be temperate in all things, and while realizing the great evil of the drink habit, we also realize the great evil which comes from other cases of intemperance, therefore be it resolved.

1st. That we as a body of godly men and women make strenuous efforts to overcome intemperance in our own lives.

2nd. That we discourage the use of intoxicants on all occasions, and do all in our power to live up to the true teaching of our Master when He said: "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you".

3rd. That we uphold with all our might, law enforcement, and to stand fast for temperance in habits, appetites and speech.

On motion the report was adopted.

The F. W. B. League Field Sec., made report as follows:

Organized two Senior Leagues and one Junior League. Re-organized two Senior Leagues. Collected from our leagues. General Conference dues, \$48.86. Expenses, Postage and stationery, \$4.35. Travelling expenses, \$3.75.

Report of the Christian Worker's Summer School:

A Summer School for all Christian Workers was held in the Seminary August 4-8. Courses in the Bible, Sunday School, Church Organization and Financing, Free Will Baptist Leagues and Evangelism. The Summer School has been established as a permanent institution, and we are asking the conference to endorse the same, and urge the ministers and church workers to attend the next session if they can conveniently do so. Thos. E. Beaman, Secretary.

On motion it be adopted.

Bro. C. K. Dunn being present was granted time, and he spoke several minutes regarding the Printing Co.

On motion we purchase thirty shares of stock in the F. W. B. Press, one half to be paid for at this session.

Sister Lupton offered the following resolution which was adopted:

Realizing that the women of our church have it in their power to wield a great influence in the promotion of Christian Education, training the young for christian service, and in many ways helping to promote the work of the kingdom, therefore be it resolved.

1st. That we urge our good women to band themselves together in Aid and Mission work by organizing themselves in one or both these societies, and do their best to co-operate with and support every auxiliary of the church.

2nd. That our preachers and pastors put forth a greater effort than ever before to help us carry out our part in the five year program, i. e., that we have these societies in 90 percent of all our churches during the next five years.

The following resolution offered by Bro. D. B. Sasser was adopted: Realizing that the observance of the Lord's day is being broken down more and more by the American people, and that the automobile is one of the strong instruments in sabbath desecration, in that we are using this machine for all kinds of worldly purposes on the Lord's day, and more, we are encouraging all kinds of merchandizing with the excuse that sales of gasoline, oil and fixtures are necessary, Therefore be it resolved that we discourage the use of the automobile on Sunday for all purposes when we cannot use it in keeping with the spirit of Sabbath observance, and we ask our people to make the necessary purchases of gas, oil and supplies for Sunday use during the week, just as we do other necessities, such as food etc.

The Sabbath School committee made the following report:

We your committee on Sabbath Schools recommend that the Eastern conference co-operate with the state S. S. Convention in its work, also the Dist. S. S. Convention, and we urge the pastors in this conference to urge upon their churches to represent by delegate and contribution to the District Conventions, thereby making them a real success in the promotion of Sunday School work. On motion it was adopted.



Petitions for the next conference were presented from Core Creek and Palmetto Chappel, Craven county, and Friendship Jones county. By vote is was ordered to be held with the church at Core Creek. Eld. A. E. Rouse was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, Eld J. C. Griffin alternate.

On motion the Treasurer be instructed to pay to the Treasurer of the General Conference, 10.00 for representation in the 1924 session.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow A. M. 9:30 o'clock. Bro. J. J. Blizzard was appointed to conduct a thirty minutes prayer service beginning at 9 o'clock.

Realizing that our denomiation has been greatly handicapped for the lack of trained workers, and that this lack has been more extensively great owing to the lack of a well equipped College, and other methods of educational knowledge, Therefore be it Resolved.

1st That we put on the every member canvass, as per plans already outlined, beginning with the first drive on the first of November this year, and annually thereafter.

2nd. That we preachers preach one or more sermons at each of our churches each year on Christian Education.

3rd. That we urge that attendance and support be given the Teachers and Workers Institute.

4th. That we work the Four Year course for ministers in conjunction with the course taught at the Seminary, so far as the same studies are used.

5th. That all our preachers who possibly can do so, make an effort to attend the Bible Institutes whenever held at the Seminary.

6th. That we talk, pray and pay, until our College buildings are erected, which are now scheduled. On motion is was adopted.

We Your committee on Ministerial Character beg to submit the following:

We have heard from all the preachers except J. E. Sawyer and H. M. McAdams, and recommend that they be excused for this time, we not knowing their condition. We also recommend the change of last years report of committee on Ministerial Character to the following: That all ministers who do not attend the conference in person or send letter or word by some person, shall be censured by the conference.

Realizing some practice the order of hands in one light, and others in another, we ask this conference to set a time and place, asking our ministers to report, and by reasoning, become united on the matter if possible and same be reported to the next conference.

On motion the report was adopted.

According to the recommendation of the committee on Ministerial Character, the conference orders all ministers of this conference to meet at Bridgeton Thursday before the 3rd Sunday in April 1925, to discuss and reason together concerning the order of laying on of hands.

Several ministers made good remarks on various subjects concerning our future growth.

On motion we send Eld. G. W. Kennedy to the Association of the Union Baptists to be held tomorrow near Wallace, and inform them that we will be glad for them to cast their lot with us, they accepting our doctrine and practice, and their ministers to be admitted without further examination.

On motion we have 1500 minutes printed and distributed as usual.
