PROCEEDINGS.

The 30th Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, convened with the church at Core Creek, Craven County, N. C., October 21, 1925. Elder A. E. Rouse who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached. Text: Josh. 1:9. After a very encouraging and inspiring sermon we recessed one hour for dinner.

WEDNESDAY EVENING.

After dinner we reassembled, and after prayer by Elder J. W. Sewall, the organization was perfected. The following officers were in the chairs:

Elder A. E. Rouse, Moderator; Elder G. W. Kennedy, Assistant Moderator; J. W. Alford, Clerk; Neal Davis, Reading Clerk.

The following committees were appointed:

Finance.-L. C. Davenport, W. W. Wells, C. J. Heath.

Education.—M. C. Prescott, J. C. Griffin, J. A. Ringold.

Sabbath Schools.—A. C. Austin, B. G. Hardy, L. H. Mallard.

Temperance.-J. W. Webb, Daniel Gaskins, L. J. Carter.

Ministerial Character.—J. W. Sewall, G. W. Kennedy, Duffy Toler, D. B. Garner, C. L. Gaskins.

To Apportion the Funds of this Conference, also the Retired Ministers' Funds.—W. Lupton, M. C. Prescott, J. C. Griffin, W. A. Gaskins, H. L. Grimsley.

The organization being perfected, prayer was offered by Elder T. E. Beaman.

On motion we invite the visiting brethren to seats with us. The following were enrolled:

CENTRAL CONFERENCE.—Elds. W. H. Laughinghouse, T. E. Beaman, J. A. Hudson, R. F. Pittman.

FRENCH BROAD ASSOCIATION.—Eld. C. H. Matthews.

These brethren made encouraging remarks.

On motion the list of ministers be called, and their character inquired into.

On motion a former resolution of this Conference be rescinded, requiring the ministers to answer present at the roll call, and we go back to the old custom of the brethren vouching for the character of the ministers.

The Moderator appointed Elds. M. C. Prescott, J. C. Griffin, and Bro. J. J. Blizzard a committee to write an obituary of Elder R. F. Daugherty, same to appear in these minutes.

J. R. Bennett, E. C. Gaskill and W. B. Guthrie appeared for ordination and were referred to the Examining Board.

On motion, Eld. G. W. Kennedy be appointed to fill the vacancy on the Examining Board caused by the death of Elder Daugherty.

Minutes of the meeting of the ministers as ordered by the last Conference were read as follows:

According to the order of the 1924 session of the Eastern Conference, the ministers of the Conference met at Bridgeton church, May 5, 1925, for the purpose of discussing the order of Laying on Hands.

The following ministers were present:

A. E. Rouse, J. W. Sewall, R. C. Kennedy, G. W. Kennedy, Duffy Toler, J. W. Webb, M. C. Prescott, A. H. Outlaw, W. W. Cuthrell, H. C. Williams, J. A. Ringold, J. W. Alford, C. L. Merrill, Luke Wetherington, L. J. Potter, J. C. Griffin.

Visiting ministers from the French Broad Association.—L. E. Ballard, C. H. Matthews.

Western Conference.-W. G. Boykin.

After devotional exercises by the Moderator of the Conference, the work of the day was taken up.

A vote was taken as to how we stand on the question. Eleven voted for, three against.

On motion the visiting ministers be welcomed, but not entitled to vote. Elder J. W. Sewall spoke for adherence to the Bible and the Discipline.

Elder M. C. Prescott stated the position of the opposition as follows: We do not practice the laying on hands for the laity to receive the Holy Ghost.

The proposition was discussed by Elder Toler for the affirmative. The negative side of the question was discussed by Elder Prescott.

At 12 o'clock we called off for dinner.

At 2:00 P. M., we reassembled and resumed business.

Bro. Prescott again read his argument, and after an exchange of questions and answers. Bro. Sewall made a plea for us to stand by the doctrine.

On motion further consideration of the question be deferred until next Conference.

A substitute motion was offered as follows: That each minister present pledge his loyalty to the Discipline and Articles of Faith, until those who are in authority authorize a change in the same. Eleven pledged. The following refused to make the pledge: M. C. Prescott, J. C. Griffin, A. H. Outlaw, W. W. Cuthrell.

On motion we adjourn.

On motion the above minutes were adopted.

On motion the brethren mentioned above who did not pledge to abide by the Discipline be required to go before the committee on Ministerial Character, and the committee investigate their attitude, and make recommendation to this Conference.

Minutes of the Executive Committee were read as follows: The Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference met in session at Bridgeton May 5, 1925.

A. H. Outlaw, R. F. Daugherty reported regarding the church at St. Luke's, and they recommended that the church be received into the Conference, but the name of the same is to be changed to New Haven.

On motion the report be adopted and the committee be discharged.

The Moderator called attention to the fact that Bro. L. J. Potter had been silenced by his church. After hearing statements from his pastor and others regarding the case, a motion was made that Bro. Potter be released from the charges.

A bill of \$3.00 was presented by A. H. Outlaw for League work. On motion it be allowed.

On motion the members of the committee present their bill for expenses in attending this meeting, and the same be allowed.

On motion we adjourn.

On motion these minutes be adopted.

Devotional committee reported for tonight: Eld. M. C. Prescott open, and E. C. Gaskill preach.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock. Conference to be opened by thirty minutes prayer service, to be conducted by W. M. Wells.

Closing exercises by Eld. G. W. Kennedy.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at the appointed hour and was opened according to previous arrangements. Minutes of yesterday read and approved.

On motion the list of churches be called. (See table.)

On motion the name of Fornes Chapel be changed to Oak Grove.

On motion the new church at White Oak Grove, Lenoir county, be received into the Conference.

On motion the new churches at Newport, Harker's Island and Edward's Chapel, Carteret county, be received into the Conference.

On motion the church at Belhaven be dropped from the list, as they wish to take membership in the Central Conference.

Devotional Committee reported for today: Elder W. B. Everett open, and Eld. R. F. Pittman preach.

THURSDAY EVENING.

On motion we grant Elder S. H. Styron a letter to the Western Conference.

The Examining Board reported as follows. We, the Examining Board recommend Bros. W. B. Guthrie, E. C. Gaskill and J. R. Bennett to this honorable body for ordination. On motion it be adopted.

The Moderator appointed Elds. Toler, Lupton and Sewall to ordain the applicants tomorrow at 11 o'clock. Bro. Toler to preach the ordination sermon

On motion Elds. T. F. Walace and C. L. Merrill be placed on the list of Retired Ministers.

On motion this Conference require its preachers, and all preachers who pastor churches in this Conference to practice laying hands on the laity as a part of their reception into the church.

The Committee on Temperance made report as follows:

We, your Committee on Temperance beg leave to adopt the same resolution offered last year, seeing that we cannot improve on the same. On motion it was adopted.

The Committee on Education reported an endorsement of last year's report. On motion it was adopted.

Devotional Committee reported for tonight: Eld. R. N. Hinnant open, Eld. J. C. Griffin preach.

Bro. T. B. Allen reported on the Edwards church property that so far no sale had been made, but there is a prospective buyer.

On motion Bro. Allen be empowered to sell the property for what he can get out of it.

Bro. Allen also reported concerning the property at Mt. Olive, that he had investigated the title, and finds that we have no title.

On motion the members of the above church be authorized to sell the property and donate the proceeds to the Orphanage.

Bro. L. H. Mallard for the Sunday School Committee recommended that we endorse the report of last year. On motion it be adopted.

Petitions for the next Conference were received from Arapahoe, Mt-Zion and Morehead City. By vote it was ordered to be held at Morehead City. J. W. Alford was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, and Eld. J. C. Griffin, alternate.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock. Eld. B. W. Wells was appointed to conduct a thirty minute prayer service in the opening.

A collection for Elder L. C. Garner was taken, amounting to \$29.45. Closing exercises by Elder L. H. Wetherington.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference was opened according to previous arrangements.

Minutes of yesterday read and aproved.

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It was reported that at last night's service a collection was taken for Eld. A. C. Austin, amounting to \$28.87.

A bill of \$6.50 from E. C. Gaskill, Field Secretary of the F. W. B. L. was ordered paid. Also bill for \$15.00 for printing Constitutions and By-Laws for the League was ordered paid.

A bill for \$12.00 presented by J. C. Griffin for work in preparing and giving the examination to the candidates on the Home Reading Course was ordered paid.

Elder M. C. Prescott made remarks concerning the Stockholders of the Printing Company.

On motion the Finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

Eld. W. B. Everett was given time, and he spoke concerning the College building, and begged for the co-operation of the folks. A collection was taken for the same, and together with pledge, it amounted to \$168.00.

The Committee on Ministerial Character made the following report:

The Committee on Ministerial Character begs to make the following recommendations:

- 1. That M. C. Prescott, J. C. Griffin, A. H. Outlaw and W. W. Cuthrell go before the committee on Ministerial Character at the next Conference and show why they did not go before this committee at this Conference, as ordered by the Conference, and for the charge as laid against them.
- 2. The report against W. Lupton regarding doctrine has been looked after the best we could. After considering Bro. Lupton's condition in various ways, and as he has asked forgiveness for the same, we therefore let him off with the understanding and promise that he will be careful about the doctrine of the church.

On motion it was adopted.

On motion Bro. J. C. Griffin and M. C. Prescott be forgiven as they made proper apologies for their attitude.
