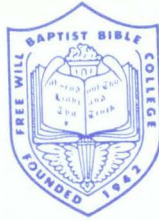

PROCEEDINGS

The 31st Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Morehead City, Carteret County, North Carolina, on October 20, 1926. Eld. J. C. Griffin preached the introductory sermon. Text: 2 Timothy 4:2. "Preach the word." After the sermon, we recessed one hour for dinner.

WEDNESDAY MORNING.

After dinner we reassembled, and after prayer by Elder I. W. Russell, the following officers occupied the chairs:

The following committees were appointed:

EDUCATIONAL.—Elders J. C. Griffin, R. C. Kennedy, B. W. Wells.

SABBATH SCHOOLS.—Eld. A. C. Austin, S. W. Jones, F. E. Jones.

TEMEPRANCE.—Eld. G. W. Kennedy, T. B. Allen, A. T. Garner.

MINISTERIAL CHARACTER.—Elders J. W. Sewall, G. W. Kennedy, D. B. Garner, Duffy Toler, J. N. Edwards.

On motion we invite the visiting brethren to seats with us. The following were enrolled:

The above visitors made good reports of the work in their Conferences.

On motion the list of ministers be called, and we enquire into their character.

The Devotional reported for tonight:

J. C. Griffin preach at Gale's Creek.

R. C. Kennedy preach at Holly Springs.

R. E. Tripp preach at Franklin M. E. Church.

E. C. Morris preach at Morehead City church.

On motion the name of J. W. Webb be dropped from the list of ministers at his own request.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning at 9 o'clock, Conference to be opened with thirty minutes prayer service to be conducted by Elder R. C. Kennedy.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at the appointed hour, and was opened as per previous arrangement.

Rev. C. M. White, pastor of Franklin M. E. Church, was welcomed by the brethren.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion the list of churches be called.

The Devotional Committee reported for today at 11 o'clock Elder L. H. Wetherington preach at Franklin M. E. church.

Bro. T. B. Allen reported regarding the property at Edwards, that he had sold it for \$50.00.

On motion the report be accepted, and the Moderator and Clerk be instructed to execute deed for the same.

On motion the Moderator appoint a committee of three to look after the sale of old Holly Hill property, and report at the next Conference.

Committee appointed as follows: Abe Tyndall, Felix Jones, Weldon Bell.

On motion we empower the Trustees of Spring Hope property to sell the same, and if necessary the officers of the Conference will sign the deed with them, they to devote the proceeds of the sale to the repair of the property being purchased.

On motion this Conference appoint Trustees for the property at Edwards, and they make deed for the property instead of the Moderator and Clerk.

Trustees appointed as follows: J. U. Edwards, Duffy Toler, T. B. Allen.

The Clerk made report of the session of the General Conference held at Nashville, Tenn., also the session of the French Broad Association, stating that both sessions were very good.

The Clerk presented a bill for the purchase of a new record for the Minutes, amounting to \$6.00.

On motion it be paid.

The Committee on Education made report as follows:

Introduction.—Seeing the need of a broader and deeper intelligence of the fundamentals of the Christian religion and doctrine of the church of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the need of more unified knowledge among our people of the same,

Be it Resolved, I. That we endorse the Summer School at Ayden, and encourage the same by our co-operation.

II. We recommend for our young ministers who are not in position to attend school at Ayden the reading course previously prescribed by this Conference, the same to be in keeping with the college course by the use of the same subjects.

III. We recommend that the Free Will Baptist church organ be subscribed for in every home, and that our ministers keep the people reminded of this duty.

IV. That we go on record and continue to keep before our people and the public our disapproval and condemnation of the teaching of any theory in our public and private schools that links man with the lower animal creation, or denies the inspired word of God, and that we aid the Anti-Evolution League in petitioning the Legislature of North Carolina to prohibit such theories from being taught in our public schools.

V. That we encourage and insist on our young ministers attending school at Ayden, and that we as a church patronize the school by sending our own children when possible to the same. Furthermore that we seek to endow as well as maintain the College, so that we may have an A1 institution.

VI. Last, but not least, we urge that every home that has no family altar begin at once to teach in the home those things of our Lord, thus, reading the Bible, praying with and encouraging our children to live for God; thus educating them "in the nurture and admonition of our Lord" instead of Jazz and the pleasures of ungodliness.

On motion it was adopted.

The Committee on Temperance made report as follows:

We your Committee on Temperance beg to make the following request: Seeing the great evil of intemperance, we request all our members to do all in their power against said evil, also abstain totally from same themselves, as we realize that so many little children are left destitute, and thrown on charity each year as a result of this evil.

On motion it was adopted.

THURSDAY EVENING.

On motion we appoint Bro. T. B. Allen to secure a deed to the Eastern Conference for the Mt. Olive church property, and bring to the next Conference.

On motion next Conference be held with the church at Arapahoe, Pamlico County. J. W. Alford was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, Elder M. C. Prescott, alternate.

The following, offered by Elder M. C. Prescott was adopted: 1. Knowing as we do that our people do not take our church organ as they should, and that it is the only medium by which our membership, as a whole, can keep in close touch, we deem it necessary to put forth an effort to give the Baptist a wider circulation among our brotherhood.

2. The Cape Fear Union conceived the idea recently that the way to give the Baptist a broader circulation would be to offer \$5.00 in gold to the minister who secured the greatest number of subscribers by the next sitting of the Union. The plan has created interest and is working well.

3. Therefore we are asking this Conference to offer a premium of \$10.00 in gold to the minister who secures the greatest number of subscribers during the next 12 months on a basis of one year subscription. That is, one year counts one, two six months counts one, and four three months counts one.

4. That this Conference request and urge that all co-operate in giving

the Free Will Baptist, our church organ a Five Thousand circulation by 1928.

The resignation of R. O. Godley as Treasurer of the Conference was offered. On motion it be accepted.

On motion Bro. Neal P. Davis of Morehead City, be elected Treasurer.

On motion this Conference donate \$25.00 to Bro. R. O. Godley the retiring Treasurer.

The Committee on Sabbath Schools made the following report which was adopted:

Realizing the growing indifference to Sunday School work among our people, and also realizing the indifference to religious training in the homes at large, we do earnestly recommend,

1st. That this Conference urge upon its members the necessity of having a Sunday school in every church or community.

2nd. That each minister laboring in the bounds of this Conference be asked to make every possible effort to put a Sunday school in every church during the coming year.

3rd. That steps be taken to put some Sunday school machinery into our denominational organization.

The Finance Committee was instructed to retire, settle with the Treasurer, and he make his report.

On motion we have 1500 minutes printed and distributed as usual.

Elder J. C. Griffin spoke several minutes regarding the Orphanage campaign during the month of November. He was followed by several brethren who spoke encouragingly about the institution.

The Committee on Ministerial Character made a partial report as follows, which was adopted:

We recommend that owing to certain rumors concerning Elder Luke Wetherington that this Conference appoint a committee of three to go to the communities where these rumors started, bringing Bro. Wetherington and

his accusers face to face, and should this committee find sufficient ground for these rumors, they be empowered to silence him, and they make full report to the next Conference. Committee appointed as follows: Elders J. R. Davenport, W. B. Everett, Abe Tyndall.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference met at the appointed time, and was opened as per previous arrangement. The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

A collection taken in last night's service for Elder C. L. Merrill was reported, amounting to \$11.53.

The Examining Board made the following report, which was adopted: We, the Examining Board, beg leave to submit the following:

1st. That Bros. R. E. Tripp and W. C. Edwards have passed satisfactorily to the Board, and we request that their ordination be ordered.

2nd. That Bros. Jones and Rolison come before the Board at its next sitting.

The Apportioning Committee made the following report, which was adopted:

We give to the following: L. C. Garner, J. F. Linton, C. L. Merrill, T. F. Wallace, W. Lupton, and the widows of R. F. Stilley, V. G. Brittain, J. A. Paul, Annie E. Linton, Bettie Nobles, Lou Vernon, J. L. Davis, and H. Cunningham \$10.00 each. To J. W. Alford for services as Clerk and expenses, \$132.82; to R. O. Godley, \$25.00; to Young People's Work, \$10.00; for minutes and expenses, \$75.20; Eureka College, \$250.00; Orphanage, \$400.00.

The committee on Ministerial Character made final report as follows, and it was adopted:

We, your Committee on Ministerial Character beg to make the following report: That Rev. W. W. Cuthrell and Rev. A. H. Outlaw be silenced from preaching until they go before this Conference or the Executive Committee of same and make the necessary apologies for their attitude, and the Clerk be instructed to notify them of the action of this Conference.

On motion we extend a rising vote of thanks to the people of this church and city for their hospitality and kindness shown us while in session.

Elder W. B. Everett spoke several minutes in the interest of the school.

On motion we grant Elder J. C. Griffin a letter of commendation to the Cape Fear Conference.

On motion Elder R. E. Tripp be apointed to give examination on the Reading Course to the future applicants for ordination.

Elders T. E. Beaman, J. C. Griffin and W. B. Everett were appointed to ordain Bros. R. E. Tripp and W. C. Edwards.

The Devotional Committee reported that Elder J. C. Griffin would preach at 11 o'clock.

On motion Conference close.

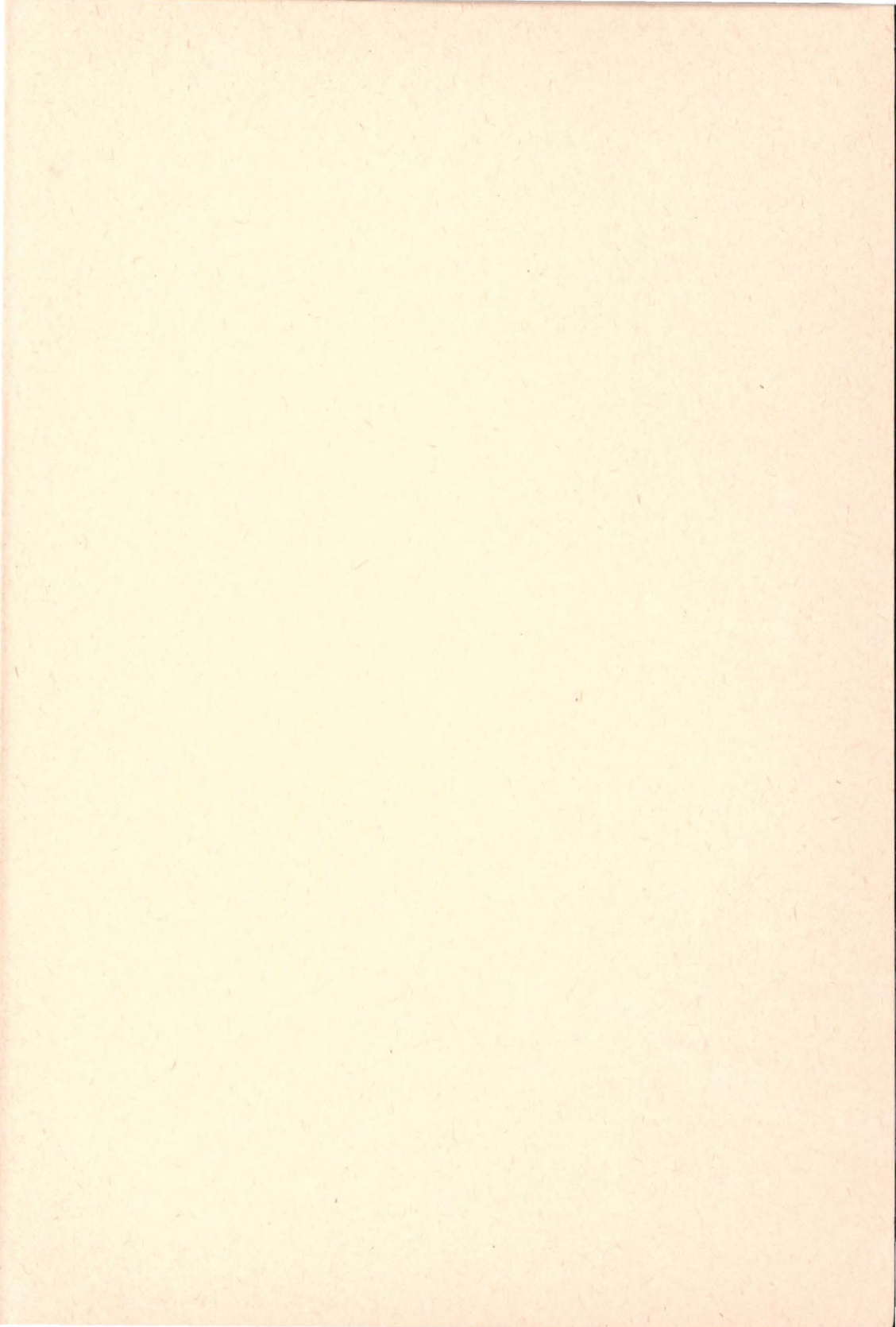
