

PROCEEDINGS

The 32nd Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with the church at Arapahoe, Pamlico County, North Carolina, October 19, 1927. J. W. Alford who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon attended and preached. Text: John 2:5. "Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it." After the sermon, intermission of one hour was taken for dinner.

After dinner we re-assembled and the following officers were in the chairs:

Elder A. E. Rouse, Moderator; Elder J. W. Sewall, Assistant Moderator; J. W. Alford, Clerk; Elder Lloyd Vernon, Reading Clerk.

The following committees were appointed:

DEVOTIONAL.—Alex Bennett, Calvin Sawyer, A. J. Willis.

FINANCE.-W. A. Gaskins, F. Silverthorn, S. C. Keel.

EDUCATIONAL.—M. C. Prescott, Calvin Bennett, T. B. Allen.

SABBATH SCHOOLS.—Elders R. C. Kennedy, F. E. Jones, L. C. Garner.

TEMPERANCE.—Elder G. W. Kennedy, Cleveland Davenport, D. B. Sasser.

MINISTERIAL CHARACTER.—Elders J. W. Sewall, J. N. Edwards, Lloyd Vernon, D. B. Garner, J. R. Davenport.

TO APPORTION THE FUNDS OF THIS CONFERENCE, ALSO THE RETIRED MINSTERS FUNDS.—Elds. Luke Wetherington, W. W. Lewis, M. C. Prescott, W. A. Gaskins, T. B. Allen.

The organization being perfected, prayer was offered by Elder J. W. Sewall.

On motion the visiting brethren be invited to seats with us.

The following were enrolled:

CENTRAL CONFERENCE.—Elds. J. R. McCaskey, N. D. Wiggs, W. A. Dail, D. A. Windham, J. P. Woodard.

CAPE FEAR CONFERENCE.—Eld. J. C. Griffin.

Encouraging, inspiring and helpful remarks were made by each of the above brethren.

On motion the list of ministers were called.

On motion the moderator appointed a committee of three to draft resolutions in memory of Elder T. F. Wallace, deceased. Committee: Loyd Vernon, G. W. Kennedy, J. W. Alford.

On motion the Clerk be instructed to write Elder H. M. McAdams, inquiring about his affiliations, etc.

On motion W. B. Guthrie be excommunicated from our conference for departing from the faith.

On motion Elder W. Lupton be placed on the retired list at his request. Minutes of the executive committee were read as follows:

The Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference met in session at Kinston January 4, 1927. Having failed in the Conference to fill the vacancies on the committee, the moderator appointed Elders G. W. Kennedy and Lloyd Vernon to fill the vacancies.

It was ordered that the secretary write the chairman of the Executive Committee of the Central Conference, stating that the Central Conference has received Elders Outlaw and Cuthrell into that Conference, they being under charges of holding the Eastern Conference in contempt, and also request said committee to require these brethren to return to the Eastern Conference or appear before this committee, and get a proper disposition of said charges, and secure proper letters and present them to the Central Conference.

On motion we adjourn.

The Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference met in session at Kinston, July 18, 1927.

The object of this meeting was to have a joint session with the Executive Committee of the Central Conference. The chairman stated that he had notified and urgently requested the presence of the Central Conference Committee. Having waited until eleven o'clock and none of the said committee appearing, we entered into our deliberations. After discussing the attitude of the Central Conference toward our Conference, particularly regarding their action in receiving two of our ministers who had been silenced, without a hearing concerning the merits of the case; and further refusing an opportunity for a hearing of the facts, or even so much as requesting these ministers to get right with the Eastern Conference and then obtain a letter, presenting same in the regular way, we felt that we were compelled to adopt the following resolution:

Because of the action of the Central Conference in receiving A. H. Outlaw and W. W. Cuthrell, who were silenced by the Eastern Conference for insubordination and contempt, and said Conference through their executive committee, refuses to require them to make satisfaction with the Eastern Conference, and further refuses to meet with our committee today, in order that we may have a brotherly discussion of the matter, to the end that right and justice may prevail unhindered.

Therefore be it Resolved, That we withdraw recognition and fellowship from the said Central Conference, and instruct all of our ministers to accept no church in said Conference, and also instruct our churches that they are not to call as pastor any minister who is a member of the Central Conference, and the secretary be ordered to give this notice to our ministers and churches at once, and that he also give notice of this action through the columns of The Baptist.

Minutes read and approved.

On motion we adjourn.

The Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference met at Shady Grove on September 13, 1927. Elder A. E. Rouse presiding.

It being called to our attention that even though Elder R. F. Pittman.

chairman of the Executive Committee of the Central Conference had promised Bro. Rouse that he would notify the Central Conference committee to meet with us at Kinston on July 18th, he had failed to do so, according to his published statement, and since it is the sense of this committee that possibly we have done the Central Conference committee an injustice in our action taken that day, and also since Bro. Pittman agrees to have his committee meet us, and in order to pave the way for such meeting to be held harmoniously, it was agreed that we rescind our former action, and ask that this meeting of the two committees be held at Kinston, N. C., on Monday after the fourth Sunday in September 1927, Bro. Pittman to give personal notice to his committee.

On motion we adjourn.

The Executive Committee of the Central Conference met in the Free Will Baptist church, Kinston, N. C., September 26, 1927, for the puprose of considering the matter of Elders Outlaw and Cuthrell entering the Central Conference. After lengthy discussions, it was proposed by the chairman, Rev. R. F. Pittman, that since they were ordered before the Ministerial Character Committee of the Eastern Conference on a doctrinal point relative to the laying on of hands, and because they did not appear before said committee as ordered, that the committee of the Central Conference apologize to the Executive Committee of the Eastern Conference for accepting them as we did. Bros. Outlaw and Cuthrell also apologize to the Eastern Conference committee, and the Exectuive Committeee of the Eastern Conference apologize to Bros. Outlaw and Cuthrell for the publication of the matter, and the Central Conference committee agrees that the said Conference will not again receive a minister of the Eastern Conference without a letter showing that he has been properly dismissed. After this agreement a general handshake was had and the entire matter settled.

On motion these minutes were adopted.

The devotional committee reported as follows: Eld. L. H. Wetherington open, Elder Lloyd Vernon preach tonight. Tomorrow at 11 o'clock, Eld. J. W. Sewall open, Eld. M. C. Prescott preach.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock. Conference to be opened by Bro. D. B. Sasser with thirty minutes prayer service.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock, and was opened according to previous arrangement.

Minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion the list of churches was called. (See table).

On motion we grant White Oak Grove church a letter of commendation to the Cape Fear Conference.

On motion we grant Union Grove church a letter of commendation to the Central Conference.

On motion Washington be dropped from the list of churches.

Bro. T. B. Allen reported as a committee to see about the property at Mt. Olive, Beaufort County, that the members of the church refuse to deed the property to the conference. He recommends that the church be dropped from the list.

On motion we adopt his report and recommendation.

On motion we receive the new church at Pilgrim's Home, Jones County. Bro. M. B. Prescott spoke several minutes for Eureka College and asked that we pledge ourselves for a \$5000 endowment.

On motion we pledge ourselves for the \$5000 endowment.

THURSDAY EVENING.

The committee to sell the property of Holly Hill church reported that they had sold the property for \$100.00, and after all expenses were paid, it leaves a balance of \$80.00.

On motion the report was adopted.

The devotional committee reported as follows: For tonight, Eld. R. C. Kennedy open, Eld. J. R. Bennett preach, Eld. J. R. Davenport close. Tomorrow at 11 o'clock, Eld. Duffy Toler open, Eld. L. C. Garner preach and close.

Petitions for the next conference were taken up, and Friendship, Jones County, being the only petitioner, on motion the next session be held with that church.

J. W. Alford was appointed to preach the introductory sermon. Eld. Lloyd Vernon, alternate.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

Bro. C. K. Dunn spoke to us about the necessity of buying a home for the Printing Co., and outlined a proposition.

On motion we invest \$300.00 in the Printing Co., stock, and we loan to them for 60 days the \$300.00 which will be appropriated to the Orphanage, the \$300.00 to be sent to the Orphanage at the maturity of the note.

Prof. R. B. Spencer of Eureka College spoke to us several minutes regarding the work and possibilities of the school.

C. K. Dunn offered his resignation as Director for the College.

On motion his resignation be accepted, and we extend to him a vote of thanks for his services in the past.

On motion we elect W. A. Gaskins, G. W. Kennedy and Lloyd Vernon as members of the Executive Committee.

On motion we elect the Examining Board to succeed themselv	es.

On motion we appoint a committee to clear up and settle the question as to title of Spring Hope property. Committee appointed as follows: Neal P. Davis, W. C. Edwards, Duffy Toler.

The committee to apportion the funds of this Conference, also the Retired Ministers' Funds reported as follows:

Retired ministers.—W. Lupton, L. C. Garner, C. L. Merrill, J. F. Linton. Widows.—Mrs. R. F. Stilley, Mrs. V. G. Brittain, Mrs. Annie E. Linton, Mrs. Bettie Nobles, Mrs. Lou Vernon, Mrs. J. L. Davis, Mrs. H. Cunningham, Mrs. T. F. Wallace, \$10.00 each. F. W. B. Printing Co., stock, \$200.00, Orphanage, \$225.00, College, \$225.00, Bills and minutes, \$297.85.

We recommend that the stock in the Printing Co., be \$200.00 instead of \$300.00, and loan to the Printing Co., the Orphanage and school money for 60 days.

On motion it was adopted.

A collection was taken for Bro. Owen Fulcher, who just suffered the loss of his home by fire, amounting to \$23.92.

A committee of three was appointed to examine the booklet, "The Upper Room Ought," as to its worth as a doctrinal tract. Committee: Duffy Toler, D. B. Sasser, Mrs. A. E. Rouse.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning nine o'clock. Conference to be opened by Elder J. W. Sewall with thirty minutes prayer service.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock, and was opened according to previous arrangement.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

The committee on Ministerial Character made the following report, which was adopted:

We have examined the character of our ministers so far as we have information, and find them all good.

The Temperance Committee made the following report, which was adopted:

1st. We do earnestly request our churches and preachers to co-operate with civil authorities in all law enforcement, especially in the enforcement of the prohibition law.

2nd. We request our people to be temperate in all things we as Christians are permitted to take part in, and abstain from all appearance of evil.

The committee on Sabbath Schools made the following report and it was adopted:

1st. We urge our preachers and leaders to use all reasonable means and energy to have a good Sunday School in each church, because we realize the Sunday School is one of the strongest auxiliaries of our work, since it deals mostly with the young life of our church, and therein rests one of our greatest opportunities.

2nd. We endorse the Sunday School report and work outlined by the General Conference of 1927.

The Educational committee reported as follows, and it was adopted: The Committee on Education notes with genuine pleasure the increased interest in the field of general education, and particularly, the trend toward a better educated ministry, to the end that we may have spirit filled men, who are thoroughly able to preserve the doctrines and ideals of the Free Will Baptist church to the world.

We wish to discourage any idea or effort to divide our educational efforts until we have thoroughly equipped the College at Ayden, N. C. We insist that this conference recommend and assist the young men entering the ministry, to attend and obtain training at the above named college.

We also endorse the budget plan suggested by Eureka College for the maintenance of the same.

We urge all our people to read all the Free Will Baptist literature available to them, giving particular regard to Sunday School and Young People's literature.

The Examining Board reported as follows, and it was adopted:

We, the Examining Board have examined Bros. C. T. Rice, W. E. Rolison and F. E. Jones, and recommend the ordination of Bros. Rolison and Jones, and ask Bro. Rice to further prepare himself for another year, and then come before the Board.

Elders G. W. and R. C. Kennedy and Lloyd Vernon were appointed as a Council to ordain Bro. Jones; Elders Duffy Toler, J. R. Bennett and W. Lupton were appointed to ordain Bro. Rolison. Each to be ordained at the next session of their respective Union Meeting.

On motion Bro. Calvin Bennett be allowed to go before the Examining Board today.

On motion we grant a letter to Elder R. E. Tripp to the Central Conference:

Duffy Toler, Lloyd Vernon and C. J. Heath offered their resignation as directors for the College, which was accepted.

On motion Bros. W. J. Swan, W. H. Holton, Elders C. L. Bennett and J. R. Davenport be elected directors for the College.

On motion Elders J. R. Bennett, W. B. Everett and J. W. Alford be elected to represent this conference in the meetings of the Printing Co.

On motion Elder J. R. Bennett be elected Field Secretary of the Free Will Baptist League.

Elder M. C. Prescott offered his resignation as a member of the Examining Board, which was accepted.

On motion Elder Lloyd Vernon be elected to fill the vacancy.

FRIDAY MORNING.

The Examining Board made final report as follows, which was adopted: The Examining Board has examined Bro. C. L. Bennett, and find him absolutely orthodox, and recommend his ordination.

On motion Bro. C. L. Bennett be ordained at the next Union Meeting by the same Council appointed to ordain Bro. Rolison.

On motion we request the President of the State Convention to give this conference a representative on the Orphanage Board, since we have been without a representative for one year, and we nominate J. W. Alford for that place.

On motion we extend a vote of thanks to this community for their hospitality and kindness while we have been in session.

On motion we extend a vote of thanks to the Christian church for the use of their building and other kindness shown.

Bro. Griffin spoke to us about the Orphanage, and appealed for a liberal support in the form of our next Thanksgiving offering.

On motion we have 1500 minutes printed and distributed as usual.

The committee appointed to examine the booklet, "The Upper Room Ought" reported that they endorse it. On motion the report be adopted.

On motion we adjourn. Closing exercise by Eld. J. W. Sewall.

IN MEMORIUM.

Elder T. F. Wallace was born January 18, 1844. He died March 28, 1927, making him 83 years, two months and 10 days old. When he was about 25 years old, he united with the Free Will Baptist church at Probability, and was baptized by Elder Haskell Jones. In July 1872, he was licensed to preach the Gospel, and in July 1874 he was ordained at his home church; Eld Haskell Jones, Robert Merritt and Everett Nobles being the Ordaining Council officiating.

On March 24th, 1880 he was married to Miss Louisa Williams, and to this union six children were born, of which four are now living.

During his ministry he served faithfully and well the churches to which he was called; in some remaining as pastor for a period of thirty years, which testifies of the high esteem in which he was held, and the great confidence his flock had in him.

Bro. Wallace has gone, but his work lives on, and many there are who bless and receive his memory. He died in the faith: his reward is sure.
