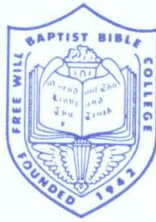

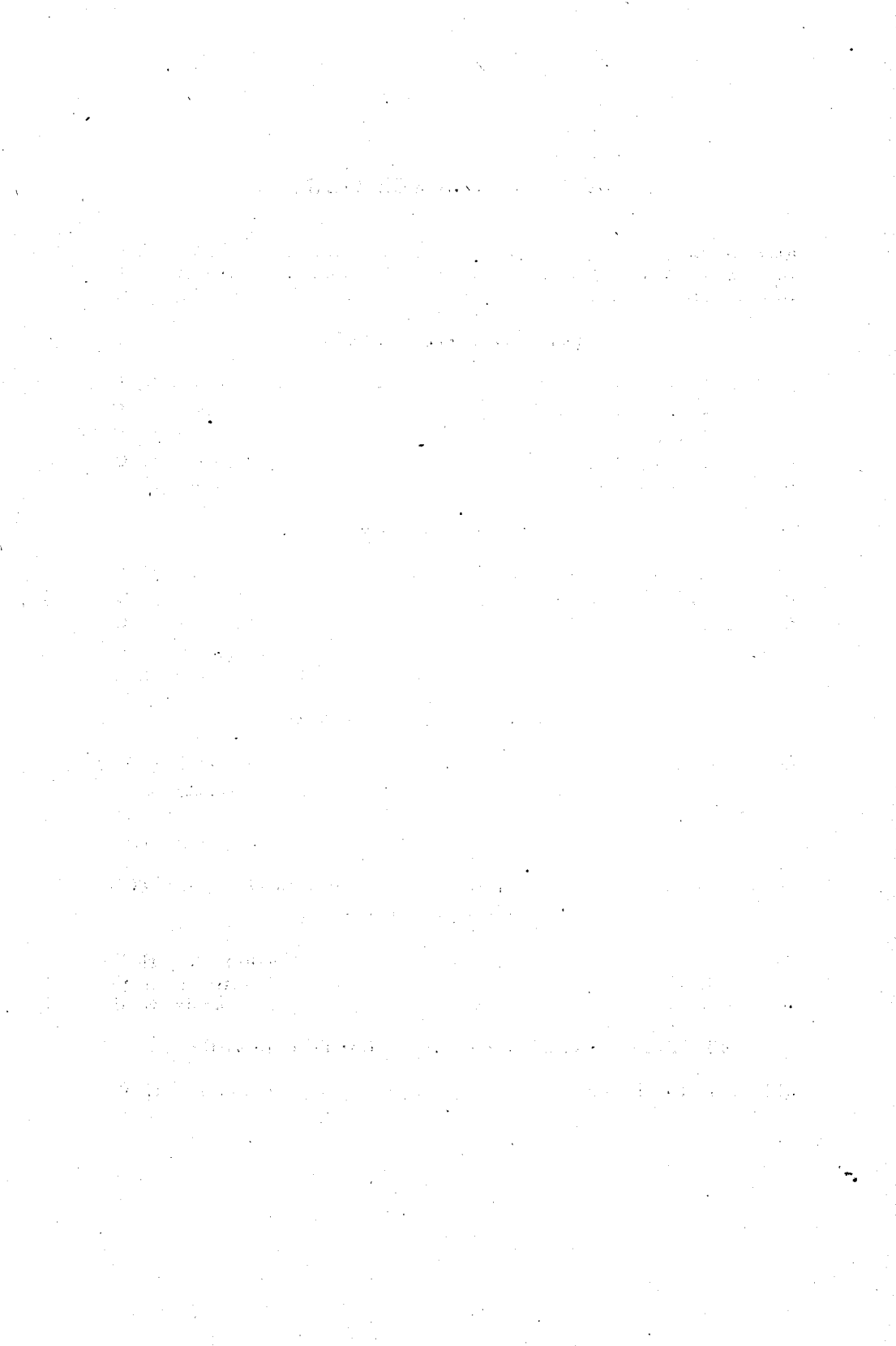

PROCEEDINGS

The 33rd Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, met with the church at Friendship, Jones County, N. C., on October 24th, 1928. J. W. Alford who was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, attended and preached. Text: Gal. 6:14. After the sermon, an intermission of one hour was taken for dinner.

After dinner we reassembled and the following officers were in the chairs:

Eld. A. E. Rouse, Moderator; Eld. J. W. Sewall, Assistant Moderator; J. W. Alford, Clerk; Lloyd Vernon, Reading Clerk.

Prayer was offered by Eld. J. R. McCaskey.

The following committees were appointed:

On motion the visiting brethren be invited to seats with us. The following were enrolled.

CENTRAL CONFERENCE.—Eld. J. R. McCaskey.

SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION.—Rev. Wm. H. Crofts.

Each of these brethren made helpful and inspiring remarks.

A committee to examine the manuscript of Treatise and Discipline was appointed as follows: J. W. Alford, Lloyd Vernon, G. W. Kennedy, W. E. Rolison, W. Lupton.

On motion the list of ministers was called.

On motion J. E. Sawyer be excommunicated for departing from the Faith, and his license and credentials be demanded by the clerk.

On motion the name of H. M. McAdams be dropped from our list of ministers; it appearing that his membership is with the Co-Operative Association, and the clerk notify him of our action.

A letter from Eld. L. C. Garner was read stating reasons for his absence and requesting prayer and aid. A collection was taken for Bro. Garner amounting to \$28.70, and was held open for further increase later.

On motion the name of W. W. Lewis be placed on the list of retired ministers.

The Devotional committee reported as follows: Tonight, Eld. J. W. Sewall open, Elder R. C. Kennedy preach and close.

On motion conference adjourn until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock to be opened by Elder W. Lupton with thirty minutes prayer service.

THURSDAY MORNING.

Conference met at 9 o'clock, and was opened according to previous arrangements.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion the list of churches was called.

On motion Newport be dropped from the list of churches.

On motion the new church, Mt. Zion, Onslow County, be placed on our list.

Elder L. R. Ennis of the Cape Fear Conference was welcomed, and he made encouraging remarks.

At 11 o'clock Rev. Crofts of the Southern Baptist Convention, was presented to the Conference, and he made a most earnest plea in the behalf of Missions in China.

After Bro. Crofts' address, a motion was made to endorse him as our missionary to China. After some discussion, a further motion to table the proposition until Friday morning 9 o'clock was made. Motion to table was carried.

THURSDAY EVENING.

Time was granted Prof. L. R. Ennis of Eureka College, and he spoke appealingly to us in behalf of the College.

The Devotional Committee reported as follows: This evening at 2 o'clock, Elder D. B. Garner open, Elder Duffy Toler preach and close. Tonight, Elder M. C. Prescott open, Elder E. C. Gaskill preach.

Bro. C. K. Dunn, Manager of the Printing Company, was present and spoke very interestingly about the Printing Company.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report and the committee be discharged.

The committee on Treatise and Discipline reported unfavorably.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Temperance reported as follows:

Seeing the great need of Temperance, we recommend that this conference go on record as being vigorously opposed to the liquor traffic, and that both ministers and laymen do all that is within their power to stop the use of the same. We further urge a strict observance of the church covenant in regards to the use of strong drink.

On motion it was adopted.

The committee on Education made report as follows:

In view of the very broad field of education, it is difficult to decide just what is the best thing to do. The church school must pay attention to the development of its youth. Everything that adds to the normal development of

the body, mind and soul should be taken into consideration if we are to have better people and churches.

We recommend that our people give themselves to the study of the Bible, and remember that Biblical knowledge is the soul of a nation. What we would have in the church, we must put in the mind of the people by means of Christian education. We also insist that our preachers, together with the laity, do all they can to raise the amount asked for by the Executive Board of our school.

On motion it was adopted.

The committee on Ministerial Character reported as follows:

We recommend that Bro. J. A. Ringold be silenced until our next conference, and he be required to come before this committee and answer the charges that have been filed against him.

We also recommend that Bro. Luke Wetherington be silenced until he appears before the Executive Committee, and answers the charges against him.

On motion it was adopted.

The committee on Sabbath Schools reported as follows:

We heartily endorse the resolutions adopted last year, and urge our ministers to get behind these resolutions and push them.

On motion it was adopted.

On motion the Apportioning Committee be instructed to set aside the sum of fifty dollars for the equal benefit of the four ministerial students in the College. An offering was also taken for these young men, amounting to \$16.00.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow morning 9 o'clock, conference to be opened by 30 minutes prayer service by Elder W. E. Rolison.

Closing exercise by Elder C. L. Bennett.

FRIDAY MORNING.

Conference was opened at nine o'clock according to previous arrangement.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

The special order of the hour was taken up, it being the matter of endorsing Rev. Crofts as our Missionary to China, with the following result:

A substitute motion was made by the author of the original, that a committee be appointed by this conference to further investigate this proposition, and report to the Executive Committee.

On motion we table the substitute motion, and take action on the original. The result was that the original motion was lost.

The Treasurer made report as follows.

On motion the report was adopted.

A collection was taken for Elders W. Lupton and C. L. Merrill, amounting to \$36.00.

On motion this collection, together with the special collection taken Wednesday for Elder Garner, be equally divided between Elds. Lupton, Merrill and Garner.

The Examining Board made the following report:

We, the Examining Board, having examined Bro. Clifton Rice, recommend his ordination. We also recommend that this conference have 100 ordination blank credentials printed for the use of this Board.

On motion the report was adopted.

Bro. Duffy Toler was appointed as Chairman of the Presbytery, to ordain Bro. Rice. Bro. Toler to call such assistance as he desires, and decide time and place for the ordination.

On motion the Moderator appoint a committee of three to work out some plan by which we can keep the needs of the Retired Ministers continually before our churches, with a view of creating a fund that will be always available.

The following were appointed said committee: M. C. Prescott, Lloyd Vernon, J. W. Alford.

The apportioning committee reported as follows:

For interest on College endowment, \$300.00. Reserved for expenses, printing, etc, \$302.17.

On motion it was adopted.

By vote the next session was ordered held at Antioch. Eld. Lloyd Vernon was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, J. W. Alford, alternate.
