



#### THE DEVOTIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTED

For tonight, Eld. L. H. Wetherington open, Eld. W. M. Ferrell preach. Tomorrow, Eld. G. W. Kennedy open, Eld. W. H. Laughinghouse preach.

On motion the list of ministers was called.

The Mod. appointed Elds. G. W. Kennedy and Clifton Rice to write a sketch of the life of Eld. W. B. Smith, same to appear in these minutes.

On motion hereafter we dispense with vouching for the character of preachers at the roll call, and only require the preacher to answer present in person.

Eld. Clifton Rice stated that he represented this conference in the General Conference, and we are due the Treasurer of said conference the sum of ten dollars as a representation fee.

On motion the Treasurer be instructed to send the ten dollars to the Treasurer of the General Conference.

On motion Eld. N. D. Wiggs be received as a minister in this conference, coming to us from the Central Conference.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow A. M. 9:30 o'clock, conference to be opened with thirty minutes prayer service to be conducted by Bro. N. P. Davis.

#### THURSDAY MORNING

Conference met at the appointed time, and was opened according to the arrangements of yesterday.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion Eld. F. R. Williams of the Western Conference be received into this conference as an ordained minister. (At this time the hand of fellowship was extended to Wiggs and Williams).

#### THURSDAY P. M.

The evening session was opened with prayer by Eld. R. F. Pittman.

Eld. R. F. Pittman was recognized by the Mod., and he spoke to us several minutes on the urgency of our rallying to the support of the endorsers of the note against the school property.

Eld. J. R. Bennett, the Supt. of the Orphanage, was recognized by the Mod., and he made an earnest appeal for the loyal support of the Home. An offering was taken for the Home amounting to \$45.86.

Bro. C. K. Dunn of the F. W. B. Press was recognized by the Mod., and

he spoke earnestly for the interest of the paper, asking for our steadfast support.

#### THE DEVOTIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTED

For tonight: Eld. F. R. Williams open, Eld. N. D. Wiggs preach. Tomorrow: Eld. E. C. Gaskill open, Eld. R. F. Pittman preach.

On motion the Finance committee retire, settle with the Treas., the Treas., make his report, and the committee be discharged.

Petitions for the next conference were from Sarecta, Duplin county and Friendship Jones county.

By vote the next session will be held at Friendship, Jones county. Eld. Clifton Rice was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, Eld. N. D. Wiggs alternate.

On motion hereafter we cut the salary of the clerk from \$35.00 to \$10.00 per year, and the difference be given to the Orphanage.

On motion Eld. M. C. Prescott be elected clerk.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow A. M. 9:30 o'clock. Bro. Felix. Jones was appointed to open the conference with thirty minutes prayer service.

Closing prayer by Eld. J. C. Griffin.

### FRIDAY A. M.

Conference met at the appointed time, and was opened according to arrangements of yesterday.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

The committee on Temperance made the following report: Realizing the great evil of intemperance, and seeing the tendency of the people to be slack towards the enforcement of the prohibition law, Therefore we recommend that our members abstain from the use of intoxicants, and use their influence to discourage the use thereof. We further urge our preachers to preach at lest one sermon during the year in each of their churches on the subject.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Sabbath School made the following report:

1st. We ask all pastors to urge the organization of a Sunday Schoolin each of their churches.

2nd. We ask the Union Meetings of the Eastern Conference to appoint a Field Worker to promote our Sunday School work, said Worker to report to the Auxiliary Convention of the Eastern Conference.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Education made report as follows: We, your Educational committee, realizing with much regret the loss of religious strength as a denomination, beg to submit the following request to our delegates and

preachers: That they exert every effort within their reach with the membership of the denomination to stand loyally by Bro. Pittman in his efforts to liquidate the obligation on our school property, and to reinstate the same to activity as early as possible, and for Divine guidance, we spend much time on our knees, imploring God in whom we trust, for leadership, and that we accept the admonition of Paul in 2 Timothy 2:15. "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of thruth," and again by James 1:5. "If any man lack widsom let him ask of God that giveth to all men liberally and upbraideth not, and it shall be given him." Also Prov. 4:7. "Wisdom is the principal thing, therefore get wisdom, and with all thy getting, get understanding." We think if we will get more understanding from the great throne of Grace with which to apply our wisdom, we will be able to make more attainments in our Master's cause.

The report was referred to a special committee consisting of Elds. Everett, Prescott and Toler.

This special committee resubmitted the above report with the following recommendation: That this conference subscribe the amount of \$2,000.00 same to be apportioned to our churches, by committee to be appointed by the Moderator.

On motion the report and recommendation were adopted.

The Examining Board made the following report: We have examined Bro. D. W. Hansley, and recommend to his church at Folkstone that they call a Presbytery of three ordained ministers of our conference, and have him ordained whenever they see fit to do so. This is done on the condition that he finish his high school course, and he is not to be ordained until arrangments for the same are made.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Ministerial Character made a verbal report that no complaints had been made to them.
