

### THURSDAY MORNING

Conference met at the appointed time. Rev. Solomon Duff attending and prayer service held after which conference was called to order by the Moderator.

On motion the list of churches was called. (See table.)

At 11:30 A. M. Rev. S. H. Styron preached a most inspiring sermon. Dinner.

### THURSDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon session was opened with song service and special music by Mrs. N. D. Wiggs and Rev. R. F. Pittman.

Revs. R. F. Pittman and J. C. Moye put up a proposition for the school and a committee was appointed to confer with Pittman and Moye, who are owners of the school property. The committee was: Rev. A. E. Rouse, W. B. Everett, C. K. Dunn.

Bro. C. K. Dunn of the F. W. B. Press was recognized by the Moderator and spoke very earnestly in the interest of the paper, Sunday School and League Literature, asking the support of the entire denomination.

Petition for the next conference was from Arapahoe, Pamlico county, N. C., This being the only petition, vote was taken and made unanimous for Arapahoe.

Rev. Duffy Toler was appointed to preach the introductory sermon, Rev. J. W. Alford, alternate.

The financial condition of Rev. W. E. Rolison was put before the conference by Rev. J. W. Sewell. A collection was taken for him, amounting to \$9.80.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow A. M. 9:00 o'clock. Rev. R. C. Kennedy was appointed to open the conference with thirty minutes prayer service.

#### FRIDAY MORNING

Conference met at the appointed time and was opened according to arrangements of yesterday.

The committee on Sunday School made the following report:

First: We respectfully ask all preachers having the care of churches within the bounds of the Eastern Conference to double their efforts in behalf of the christian training of the young people in their churches and communities.

Second: We ask the union meetings of the Eastern Conference to appoint a Field Worker to promote our Sunday School work, said worker to report to the Auxiliary Convention of the Eastern Conference, the expenses to be paid by the union meeting.

Third: Realizing the young people of today are facing the most trying situation in the way of divers temptations, such as drinking, dance pavilions, bathing beaches, etc, we earnestly implore our preachers and christian workers to do all in their power to help them to steer clear of such evils and to encourage them in their efforts for good.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Temperance made the following report:

Realizing the great evil of intemperance, and seeing the tendency of the people to be slack towards the enforcement of the prohibition law, There-

fore we recommend that our members abstain from the use of intoxicants and use their influence to discourage the use thereof. We have two powers or forces and man's power is less than either, and if we be God's true children by Grace we will be able to overcome. On one occasion he told Paul His Grace was sufficient for thee.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Ministerial Character made the following report:

The committee on Ministerial Character begs to report that no complaints have come before us regarding the character of any of our Ministers. We beg to recommend that our churches do not allow any Minister who is not well known for his piety and sound doctrine to preach in the church. And that in all cases where another minister wishes to visit or hold meetings in our churches, it shall be with the consent of the majority of the church and the pastor as well.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Education made the following report:

We, your Committee on Education, realizing the condition in which we are placed, and the distress that will ultimately follow, as a result of having no Educational Program, make the following recommendations: That this conference co-operate in every way possible with the General Conference of the Free Will Baptist of the United States, in establishing at some central point, location to be determined by the said General Conference, an Educational Institution, said School to be owned and controlled by the General Conference.

This report was tabled until the 1933 session of Eastern Conference.

Rev. J. R. Bennett, Superintendent of the F. W. B. Orphanage, spoke in behalf of the Institution. A collection was taken, following the message, amounting to \$20.55.

By motion a vote of thanks be extended to Friendship Church and community for entertaining the conference in such a splendid manner, both in their homes and table nourishments on the ground.

The following Resolution was submitted by Rev. E. C. Gaskill:

Old Resolution: "That each church in the Eastern Conference be assessed \$1.00 for each male member and 50c for each female member, annually, the same not being applicable to the destitute, if the church sees fit to release them of the obligation, and assume the responsibility."

On motion the clerk be instructed to send copies of resolution adopted by conference of 1917 to the clerk of each church and request that, as near as possible, this resolution be carried out.


