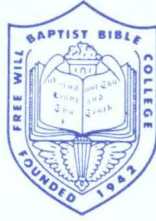

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Sunday School report read and adopted as follows:

Realizing the great value of the Sunday School as a means of education in moral and spiritual matters, we make the following recommendations:

1. That all our ministers and lay leaders actively engage in the activities of the Sunday School and thereby lead the way for the entire membership.

2. That the best teachers, considering moral and spiritual as well as educational ability, be obtained for the various classes and especially for the younger children.

3. That an effort be made through group arrangements of our Sunday Schools to give courses of training to all teachers and to those showing fitness for such needed service.

4. That our Sunday Schools be so conducted as to make them, not only institutions through which proper moral and spiritual knowledge may be imparted, but as institutions of devoted service in every field of Christian Activity, teaching our boys and girls the full duties in Christian life and living.

5. That every Sunday School be used to instruct its members in the necessity of fully supporting the church and all institutional work which it may undertake.

6. At this time we especially urge that every Sunday School take an active part in supporting our Orphanage at Middlesex, giving to it regularly a certain percentage of its receipts.

Temperance committee's report read and adopted as follows:

Seeing and realizing the age in which we live and what we as a Christian nation are facing: Be it resolved:

1. That this conference go on record favoring the retaining of the 18th Amendment.

2. Knowing that this great act has not been a failure by any means we further urge that on the 7th of November we, as a church, vote in favor of the 18th Amendment.

3. As we vote may we have in mind the protection and preservation of the faith of our fathers.

Educational committee's report read and adopted as follows:

Whereas at the last session of the State Convention a proposition was submitted to the convention from the Smithfield church, for the convention to take over the property of the church and pay off the debt of the same, and use the property for a Bible school; and; whereas the Eastern Conference is a member of the State Convention and recognizes its responsibility to that body, which accepted the above named proposition without a dissenting voice, and wishing to have a share and do its part in this needful and worthy undertaking:

Therefore be it resolved that we request each church in this conference to raise the small sum of one dollar each month, and send the same to Bro. W. C. Willis, treasurer of the State Convention, New Bern, N. C., who is authorized by the Convention to make the monthly payments.

By motion the clerk serve notice on every church clerk and preacher of our churches in said conference of the Educational report and draw on the treasurer for expences of same.

Ministerial Character committee's report read and adopted as follows:

The committee on ministerial character begs to report that because of certain charges against Eld. G. E. Peed and statements reported that he has made, we recommend that he be excommunicated, and his license and credentials be demanded.

We further recommend that Eld. W. E. Rolison be silenced, and required to come before the committee next conference and clear up, if possible, certain allegations made to this committee.

By motion that Bro. Peed surrender his license to N. D. Wiggs.

By motion the clerk notify Bro. Rolison of the action of the conference.

By motion E. C. Gaskill be placed on the list to represent the Printing Press in the place of W. B. Everett.

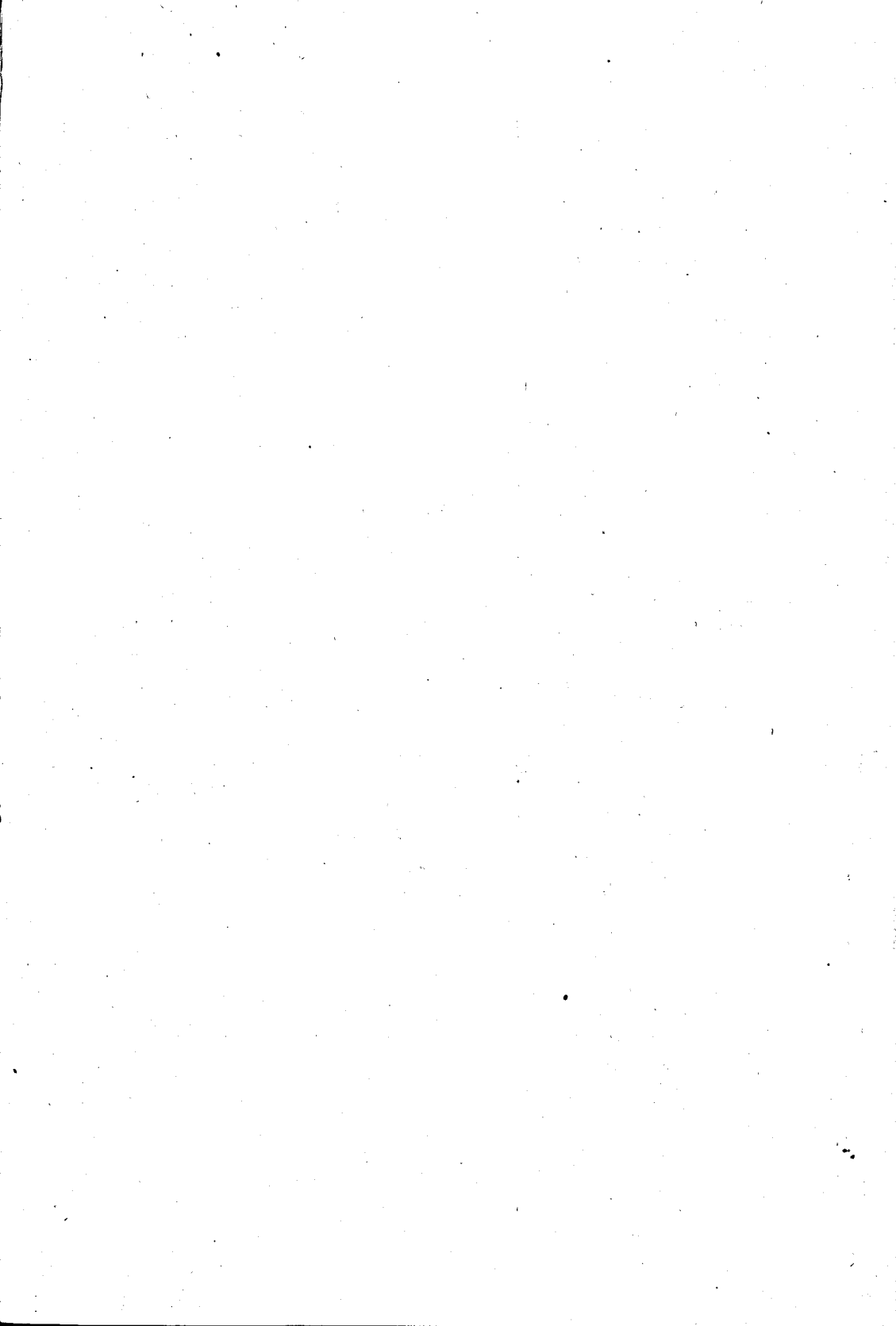
