The Fortieth Annual Session of the Eastern Conference of the (original) Free Will Baptist of North Carolina, convened with the church at Deep Run, Lenoir County, North Carolina on October 23, 24, and 25, 1936.

Wednesday at 11 o'clock A. M. the conference opened with devotional service by the congregation and Eld. Duffy Toler preached. Text 2 Cor. 5:10. One hour was given for noon refreshments.

WEDNESDAY P. M.

At the hour appointed conference reassembled and was duly organized. Eld. Duffy Toler, Moderator, Eld. G. W. Kennedy, Asst. Mod., Eld. J. W. Alford, Clerk Pro-tem, and Eld. Lloyd Vernon Reading Clerk, N. P. Davis, Treasurer.

The list of ministers was called and absentees noted.

By motion the moderator appointed a committee of three to write a sketch of the life of Rev. H. C. Williams, same to appear in these minutes. Committee—Elds. R. C. Kennedy, Lloyd Vernon, and Sister J. R. Newton.

By motion W. C. Edwards be excommunicated from this conference and his license and credentials be demanded by the clerk.

Eighteen ministers were absent at the first roll call.

The Devotional Committee reported that Eld. J. P. Barrow preach tonight and Eld. Lloyd Vernon tomorrow at 11 A. M.

Elds. Wetherington, Kennedy, Manning and Edwards spoke in behalf of our church organ, and urged that the members take the paper and read it. Eld. Spencer led the discussion on the church budget and others spoke on the same line.

Eld. R. P. Harris asked for an offering for the Orphanage, which was taken and amounted to \$22.10.

By motion the Conference adjourned to meet at 9 c'clock A. M. in a thirty minute prayer service led by D. B. Garner.

Report of Grievance Committee

Edwards, Pastor of Beaufort Church had to say and reports from other members of said church and evidence in writing from Bro. William Loyd, the party accused of violating our church discipline, and after some discussion, motion made by Elder Duffy Toler and seconded by W. A. Gaskins that Elder W. C. Edwards go to Bro. William Loyd beg his pardon for anything that he had done or said in any way, shape, form or fashion about the matter, and that Brother William Loyd is to beg pardon with said W. C. Edwards and also that the roll of the said church remain as it was before this trouble came in said church or prior to March 31st, 1933. That all of the members that are now on the new list of said church shall, it they so desire, have their names placed on the old list by applying to the church in person and making their desire known.

Reverend Lloyd Vernon, Chairman, then asked, "Is there any further discussion? If not, the motion is, that this committee accept this proposition to do so as stated by him. All in favor of that, will let it be known by saying 'I'. Any to the contrary, by the same sign." The motion was carried, and there being no further business to come before the meeting, was adjourned.
