The following minutes of the Executive Committee were read:

The Executive Committee of the Eastern Association of Free Will Baptists of N. C. met in session in Bridgeton on January 27, 1938. Present, J. R. Bennett, Chairman, J. W. Alford, Sec., Lloyd Vernon, Duffy Toler. Prayer was offered by Elder Toler.

The following report from the Examining Board was read: The Examining Board was called to meet in Kinston, N. C. on May 27, 1938, at 10 o'clock.

We examined Brother S. A. Smith of Beulaville church, and recommend his ordination. This was by unanimous vote.

The Chairman ordered his ordination to take place at Beulaville church on 3rd Sunday night in June at 8 o'clock p. m., by Elders G. W. Kennedy, R. C. Kennedy, Lloyd Vernon. Elder Lloyd Vernon to preach the ordination sermon.

All the above subject to the approval of the Executive Committee of the Association.

On motion the report was adopted.

On motion the Executive Committee adjourn. Prayer. by Elder Vernon.

On motion these minutes of the Executive Committee were adopted.

The Moderator called for licensed ministers to stand who desired to go before the Examining Board. Brother W. B. Grady presented himself.

Attention was called to the condition of Elder J. C. Griffin, Sister H. Pipkin, J. A. Ringgold, Sister Lou Vernon, Sister Connie Wetherington, and Elder E. T. Phillips. Elder R. C. Kennedy personally requested prayer for himself. Many other requests were made for prayers for friends and families. Special prayer for all the above was made by Elder R. B. Spencer.

The Moderator appointed Elder S. A. Smith to conduct 30 minutes devotions for the opening of tomorrow's session to begin at 9 o'clock a. m.

The question of Trustees for this Association was discussed, and a motion was made that we elect a Board of three members, as Trustees for this Association.

After further discussions, a motion was made that we postpone the question until tomorrow at 10:30 o'clock.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow a. m. 9 o'clock.

#### THURSDAY MORNING

The Association met at the appointed time, and was opened by Elder S. A. Smith with thirty minutes prayer service.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion Elder J. A. Ringgold be placed on the list of Retired Ministers.

At 10:30 o'clock the special order of the hour was taken up: A motion to appoint a Board of three as Trustees of the Association.

On motion the original motion be tabled until proper legal authority can be contacted, and something more definite drawn up and presented.

A letter from Elder W. Lupton was read and referred to the Apportioning committee.

A special offering for Eld. J. C. Griffin, after an appeal by Eld. Duffy Toler, amounted to \$43.73.

The Moderator called on Elder J. A. Evans, Moderator of the Western Association to lead in prayer.

The Examining Board reported as follows:

The Examining Board met, and Brother W. B. Grady came before us, and finding him without proper cerdentials, we cannot examine him. By the Board.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Sabbath Schools made report as follows: Realizing the great work that can be accomplished through the Sunday Schools in our churches, for both adult and youth, we recommend that this Association carnestly insists that the Pastors and Leaders make a special effort to have a Sunday School established and held every Sunday in their churches, and that they use their influence in helping to render more efficient service. We also recommend that the Sunday Schools as a whole, co-operate whole-heartedly with the State Sunday School Board, set up the State Association at its last session.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Temperance made the following report:

Realizing the great need of temperance, and knowing that temperance teaches us to place due restraint on our minds, passions and affections, which govern our whole being, we therefore offer the following: 1. The scriptures teach us that temperance is not an end in itself; but is a means that may be used to bring the physical man under the dominion of the spiritual or the formation of a character that is led and governed by the Spirit of God.

- 2. Temperance includes all things which are lawful for Christians, or in keeping with the Holy Scriptures, and which are for the good of the physical and spiritual welfare of all men. We should be temperate in habits. dress, food, speech, pleasures and recreations, thus building strong bodies, minds and characters.
- 3. We ought to stand against all laws and rulings which advocate the use of alcoholic beverages in any form.
- 4. We urge our ministers to live clean and holy lives, and preach against all forms of intemperance, and thereby teach the doctrine as set forth by our Lord.

On motion the report was adopted.

### THURSDAY AFTERNOON

A very bountiful dinner was served by the ladies, which was much enjoyed by all.

The opening prayer was held by Elder M. E. Tyson.

A letter from Elder L. C. Garner was read, and referred to the Apportioning Committee.

The Devotional Committee reported: Tonight Elder Duffy Toler will preach.

On motion the Finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, and the Treasurer make his report.

Elder M. E. Tyson, Superintendent of the Orphanage presented the matter of the Orphanage, and the campaign being waged in its behalf. A collection was taken for the same, which amounted to \$105.52.

Mrs. J. R. Bennett who attended the Eastern Association of the U. S. held at Smithville, Mississippi as proxy for Elder J. R. Bennett, made a very interesting report of that session.

The committee on Education reported as follows:

- 1. Realizing that we are unable to accomplish much sectionally, resolved that we as an Association stand behind the National Educational program, as outlined by the National Board.
- 2. That we add to our educational fund now in the Treasury, thirty-five dollars, (\$35.00) all of which is to be held subject to the call of the National Treasurer, whenever he shall have real property in which to invest it; said money to be paid out only by the approval of the Executive Committee.

On motion the report was adopted.

Only one church petitioned for the next session of the Association: Union Chapel, Beaufort County. On motion the next session be held with the church at Union Chapel. J. W. Alford was selected to preach the introductory sermon, and Elder Clifton Rice alternate.

On motion the Chairman and Secretary of the Examining Board be instructed to issue a certificate to Elder R. C. Proctor, showing him to be an ordained minister of this Association, and had lost his credentials in a fire.

On motion we adjourn until tomorrow a. m. 9 o'clock. Elder B. F. Ringgold was appointed to conduct thirty minutes prayer service for the opening.

The session of the day was closed by the anointing service for Elder R. C. Kennedy, conducted by Elders J. R. Bennett, L. B. Manning, C. B. Thompson and W. B. Everett. Closing prayer by Elder W. E. Anderson.

#### FRIDAY MORNING

The Association met at the appointed hour, and was opened by Elder B. F. Ringgold according to the appointment of yesterday.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

On motion we omit from the minutes the two pages showing the time of annual meetings of the churches.

Elder Duffy Toler offered his resignation as a member of the Examining . Board.

On motion his resignation was rejected. .

The committee on Ministerial Character reported as follows: We are happy to be able to report that so far as we can ascertain, our entire Ministerial group are in peace and harmony, and the majority of them, who are physically able, are doing pastoral work.



It was voted on that our next Convention be held with Core Creek Church. The Convention was dismissed with prayer.


