

At the 11 o'clock hour, a quartett composed of Elds. R. N. Hinnant, M. E. Tyson, Chester Pelt and Mrs. Pelt sang very beautifully "I Want to Be Like Jesus in My Heart."

The sermon by Eld. Harris was well received, and he emphasized Decision, Character and Perseverance. After the sermon the Moderator took an offering for the Orphanage amounting to \$41.36.

THURSDAY P. M.

A bountiful dinner was served, and we re-assembled for business at 1:30 P. M. Prayer by Eld. Clarence Bowen.

Eld. R. N. Hinnant made a statement concerning the condition of Eld. S. H. Styron and took an offering for him, which amounted to \$29.25.

Eld. M. E. Tyson, Superintendent of the Orphanage, was called, and he spoke to us appreciatively in the behalf of the Home, pleading for continued support of the Home. He called for the three members of the Board present to come forward, and Bros. Levi Hill and W. A. Jackson each spoke in behalf of the campaign for the Building Fund.

On motion the Finance committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, and the Treasurer make his report.

The committee on Sabbath Schools reported as follows: Whereas many of our Sunday School officials have been setting an improper example before the children and enticing them to indulge in worldly and indecent practices by having Sunday School picnics at public bathing places; Therefore be it resolved,

1st, That we ask our people to present to our youth forms of entertainment which are constructive, rather than destructive, to Christian character.

2nd, That we encourage the election of consecrated Christian officers and teachers, so far as possible, to operate our local Sunday Schools.

On motion the report was adopted.

The Devotional committee reported for tonight Eld. L. J. Potter open, and Eld. L. B. Manning preach.

The committee to draft resolutions of respect to the memory of Eld. D. B. Garner submitted the following:

RESOLUTIONS OF RESPECT

Whereas our Heavenly Father, on the 21st day of June, 1939, saw fit to take the spirit of His faithful servant, and our beloved brother Elder D. B. Garner from this life of labor to that of rewards, and whereas, we do, and shall continue to miss him in our Association, as a wise counselor and faithful worker, and co-laborer with God, be it therefore resolved:

First. That we as an Association of the Original Free Will Baptist of the Eastern District of North Carolina do hereby, bow our heads in humble submission to the will of our Heavenly Father, Who doeth all things well, in the removal of the spirit of our esteemed Brother Garner from this life to that beyond this vale of tears.

Second. That we pray God's richest blessings to rest upon his widow and children, his grandchildren and many friends; that each and every one may strive to reach that high standard of living which our beloved, and now deceased, Brother taught in his life and precepts, and by the Gospel of Christ which he preached.

Third. That a copy of these resolutions be placed on our records, a

copy be sent to the family and a copy be published in our church paper, the Free Will Baptist published at Ayden, N. C.

On motion the report was adopted.

A resolution was offered by Eld. R. C. Proctor as follows:

Whereas many of our churches have been resorting to things of the world and worldly entertainments to provide financial support for our churches: Therefore be it resolved,

1st, That we resent such practices which have a tendency to demoralize our Christian stewardship, and

2nd, That we adhere to the Gospel method of support as described in the scriptures, such as Duet. 16: 10; 1 Cor. 16:2; Lev. 27:32.

On motion it was adopted.

The committee on Temperance made report as follows: We your committee on Temperance beg to submit the following recommendations:

1st, Whereas our people are prone to over indulge in things of the world, such as fine and frivilous clothing, fancy foods, novelties, and such like, we recommend that the members of our church refrain from over doing these things.

2nd, We recommend that all members who frequent the worldly places of amusement be dealt with according to our Discipline.

3rd, We recommend that our church members stay away from questionable places such as filling stations, stores, beer joints etc., where there are ungodly things carried on.

4th, We recommend that all members do not attend Sunday amusements of the world at all, and those who persist in doing so be dealt with.

5th, We recommend total abstinence from all alcoholic beverages by our church members, because the scriptures teach this, and a person under its influence is beside himself.

6th, We recommend that all Christians plan to avoid making purchases of any kind on Sunday.

On motion the report was adopted.

One petition for the next session of the Association, it being Arapahoe, Pamlico County.

On motion the next session be held with the church at Arapahoe. J. W. Alford was selected to preach the introductory sermon, and Eld. Duffy Toler alternate.

The election of officers was taken up with the following results:

On motion we extend to the retiring Moderator a rising vote of thanks, and that the Treasurer be instructed to pay him \$25.00 in recognition of his wonderful work as our past presiding officer.

He stated that there were so many needy calls coming to them that they could not answer. The orphanage Director reported that very few reports were sent to her—and urged us to set aside one month for Orphanage work.
