RESOLUTION

The following Resolution was offered and adopted.

Whereas, about thirty-six years ago, there swept over North Carolina the Holiness movement, which crept into many of our churches, deluding and carrying away many of our people with its teachings and ideals, and

Whereas a division was caused in the Cape Fear Conference in this state, many of the Churches going away and into this said Holiness movement, and works with the control of the property and the control of

Whereas, those who went away persist in calling themselves "Free Will Baptist," and even call their conference by the name of "Cape Fear Conference" to the confusion of our loyal people and the general public as well, and

Whereas, these so-called "Free Will Baptist" are not a part of the original Free Will Baptists, nor can they even become members of the State Convention of original Free Will Baptists, therefore be it;

RESOLVED:

1st. That we declare to the world at large our adherence to the doctrines, practices and ideals of the original Free Will Baptist Church.

2nd. That the Eastern Conference of original Free Will Baptists this day place itself on record as condemning the attitude of those who went away for persisting in calling themselves by the name "Free Will Baptist" which is misleading and confusing to the world at large.

3rd. That we pledge our whole-hearted support to the original Cape Fear Conference, and the North Carolina State Convention of the Original Free Will Baptists, in any reasonable efforts they may make to have some legal distinction made in the name of these two different bodies, so as to save us and the public at large from the confusion we have experienced in the past.

Rev. J. C. Griffin made a statement concerning the balance due by N. C. for the Bible College, showing that for this year the state is still due \$1.579.00.

The committee on Sabbath Schools made the following report: Realizing that the church is facing one of the greatest crises, and is being given the most vital challenge in its history because of the great evils which threatens it. Jesus said "Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof." Certainly this is true of this day in which we live, and whereas, we owe to all men the best that is ours to give through our Lord Jesus Christ, in presenting to them through our Sunday Schools and other organizations of our church the fundamental principles of the christian religion.

Therefore Be it Resolved:

1st. That we give more earnest and prayerful consideration to their spiritual needs in the selection of the officers and teachers of our Sunday Schools; that they be men and women of deep consecration, with an appreciation of their responsibility in the teaching and training of the youth of the church.

2nd. That we study more diligently to "show ourselves approved workmen," in order that we may be able to lead others, and to be an inspiration to the youth to promote the cause of Christ and His righteousness.

3rd. That the officers and teachers of our Sunday Schools make an honest effort to instill in our youth the value of time, punctuality, prepared lessons, tithing, Bible study, co-operation, and that the Sunday School is an organization to teach and to train them in christian living and service.

4th. Above all else, may we live lives before our youth in the home, in the school and church, that will inspire them to have confidence in us and the church, and enable them to be obedient to the Christ who redeemed us.

On motion it was adopted.

The Committee on Temperance made report as follows:

Realizing the heart-aches and destruction that has been wrought by strong drink and intemperate habits, Be it Resolved:

1st. That we as a church body, the Eastern Conference, abstain from the use of intoxicants, and unite as a Christian body to eradicate this common enemy.

2nd. That the officers and church members of the various churches practice more temperate ways of living.

3rd. Realizing the important part that our Sunday Schools play in the behalf of our youth, we recommend that our Sunday School teachers teach with more force to our youth, the importance of abstaining from strong drink and other intemperate habits.

4th That our ministers and pastors preach with more emphasis, the necessity of a more temperate way of living.

On motion the report was adopted.

The Committee on Ministerial Character reported that there are no complaints against any of our ministers.

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On motion the report was adopted.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, the Treasurer make his report, and the committee be discharged.

Rev. J. A. Evans, Supt. of the Orphanage was recognized, and made a good report of the work of the Home, showing what this Conference did during the past year, and submitted the budget of \$75,000 for next year, which has been approved by the State Convention, and informed us that our proportionate part of the budget is \$15,000. Bro. H. M. Mallard also spoke for this as a member of the Orphanage Board.

On motion the report was received as information.

At 11:30 o'clock Rev. M. L. Johnson preached a very interesting sermon to us. A collection for the Orphanage was taken at the close of the sermon amounting to \$182.82, after which we called off for dinner.

A bountiful dinner was served, and when we re-assembled, devotions were conducted by Rev. D. W. Hansley.

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PROCEEDINGS

The Theme for the day was, "The Gospel of the GO YE."

The devotions were led by Mrs. Walter Rhodes, a former President.

The registration consisted of Ministers, delegates and officers.

The welcome address was given by Mrs. W. E. Lewis, the response by Mrs. J. C. Griffin. Committees appointed as follows:


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
