

The Fifty-Third Annual session of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened with the church at Macedonia, Craven County, N. C., on October 20, 1948. Devotions were conducted by Rev. A. C. Auston. Prayer was offered by Rev. Ralph Osborne.

Prayer was offered by Rev. M. L. Johnson.

The following visitors were present and recognized: Revs. R. N. Hinnant and M. L. Johnson.

On motion we send J. W. Alford to Nashville, Tenn., to be advisor and consultant to Rev. R. N. Hinnant in the revision of the Treatise. Rev. Lloyd Vernon was elected his alternate.

On motion we pay the expense of whichever one goes to Nashville, Tenn., said expenses not to exceed \$100.00.

The Secretary was ordered to issue membership cards to all ministers in good standing.

The minutes were read and approved.

On motion we adjourn.

Dismissed by Bro. H. M. Mallard.

On motion the minutes were adopted.

On motion the list of churches was called.

At 11:15 o'clock Rev. R. N. Hinnant of the western Conference preached the introductory sermon, Text: Acts 17:16.

After the sermon, we adjourned for dinner.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON

The minutes of the Examining Board were read as follows:

The Examining Board of the Eastern Conference of the Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina, met in Kinston, N. C., June 24th, 1948. Members present: J. R. Bennett, Lloyd Vernon, D. W. Hansley, J. W. Alford.

The Chairman, J. R. Bennett, called the meeting to order and presided.

Prayer by D. W. Hansley.

The list of questions was checked and revised.

Bro. Lloyd Vernon was appointed to conduct the examination.

The meeting was closed by Lloyd Vernon.

The Examining Board met at Macedonia Church October 19, 1948, at 10 o'clock A. M., and examined all candidates who were in line, and recommend the ordination of the following: E. E. Edwards, Chocowinity, N. C.; W. E. Stilley, New Bern, N. C., R-1, J. T. Forrest, LaGrange, N. C., R-1, and W. H. Willis, Dover, N. C., R-1, the ordination to be in Bridgeton Church, October 27, 1948, at 7:30 P. M. Rev. Duffy Toler is requested to preach the ordination sermon, J. R. Bennett to lead the service, present the Bible and deliver the charge, and these two be empowered to select the third member of the presbytery. We request the Conference to authorize the Chairman of the Examining Board to call a special meeting of the Board soon, to examine certain brethren who came before us at this time; but did not have the necessary recommendations required by the Discipline; and we further request that if these brethren pass the examination, the Board be empowered to proceed with their ordination.

On the statement of J. W. Alford, that his Credentials have become greatly marred because of age and the poor grade of paper used, we request that this Board be authorized to issue him a duplicate Certificate.

On motion the minutes were adopted.

On motion the name of T. C. Smith be dropped from the list of licensed ministers at his request, and a letter be issued stating the same.

On motion the name of Russell Millard be dropped from the list of licensed ministers at his request, and he be given a letter commending his Christian character, addressed to Whom It May Concern.

Rev. R. N. Hinnant stated that Rev. J. A. Evans has resigned as Super-intendent of the Orphanage.

On motion we extend to Rev. J. A. Evans a rising vote of thanks for his faithful service at the Orphanage during the past years.

The Devotional Committee reported: Tonight, Rev. S. A. Smith open; Rev. D. W. Alexander preach. Tomorrow: Rev. D. W. Hansley preach.

On motion we accept the petition of Dailey's Chapel for the next Conference. Rev. Duffy Toler was selected to preach the introductory sermon; Rev. J. C. Griffin to be his alternate.

The Conference was recessed until tomorrow A. M., 9:30 o'clock, to be opened by Rev. G. W. Gaskill.

Closing exercise by Rev. J. C. Griffin.

THURSDAY MORNING

The Conference was opened as arranged.

The minutes of yesterday were read and approved.

The committee on Sabbath Schools reported as follows:

Recognizing the fact of the Sunday School being the most potent force in the land in the teaching of the word of God, we recommend Paul's admonition to Timothy on preparing to teach on the part of our teachers in the churches of our Conference: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of Truth."

Further, we wish to recommend the Preliminary Training course of the Evangelical Teachers' Association as the most practical approach to the training of our teachers for efficiency in teaching the Word of God in our church schools.

On motion the report was adopted.

The committee on Temperance reported as follows:

We recognize the whiskey traffic as being one of the chief causes of homicide, suicide and insanity in the home life of the U. S. A., and that it destroys wisdom and principle in our State life, Therefore we recommend that

First—Our people as a body spend more time in pursuit of the eradication of the sale and use of all intoxicants in any form.

Second—That we follow more closely the teaching of God's Word in relation to intemperance in any form, whether physical or in the form of intoxicants.

On motion the report was adopted.

A Resolution committee was appointed as follows: J. C. Griffin, W. E. Stilley, J. K. Hartley.

J. W. Alford presented the proposition of helping to purchase a car for Miss Barnard, our Missionary to India. Mrs. Alice Lupton also spoke for the proposition.

On motion we authorize the committee on Appropriations to allocate such amount as they find themselves able, for the purchase of a car for Miss Barnard, said allocation limited to \$75.00.

Rev. J. R. Bennett, Chairman of the Examining Board made a statement concerning the examination of young preachers, and made a plea for co-operation instead of so much criticism.

The committee on Ministerial Character reported all ministers in good standing.

On motion the report was adopted.

Rev. M. L. Johnson reported for Superannuation as follows:

The Resolutions Committee offered the following:

Realizing the destructive force of alcoholic beverages on the physical and spiritual welfare of man, and that the wishes of the churches and all temperate minded people of N. C. have been denied their lawful right in expressing their wishes, we therefore go on record as being opposed to the past procedure of the State Legislature, and hereby petition the Governor and 1949 Legislature to provide for a state-wide referendum on the liquor question in North Carolina.

On motion the resolution was adopted.

On motion the Finance Committee retire, settle with the Treasurer, and he make his report.

At 11:15 o'clock we called off for the sermon by Rev. D. W. Hansley, who brought a very inspiring message. After the sermon an offering was taken for the Orphanage which amounted to \$108.62.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON





MINUTES OF EASTERN AUXILIARY CONVENTION

Cabin Church, Thursday, March 25, 1948

The Convention opened at 10:00 A. M., with devotions by Mrs. L. E. Ballard, who gave the Theme for the day, "Conqueror's with Christ," and placed great emphasis on the need for a more united effort on the part of all Christians to place Christ and His kingdom work first in all their activities for a greater church.

The President recognized the Ministers who were present and gave them a cordial welcome.

The minutes were read, that memories might be refreshed regarding the work of the last Convention.

Greetings were given by Mrs. Flave Mercer, with response by Mrs. Louise Bedsworth.

The President's message on "Conqueror's with Christ through the field of Preparedness," was very inspirational and informative. She urged that the delegates take notes of the proceedings and take them back home to their auxiliaries.

Committees were appointed as follows:

Resolution-Mrs. Clyde Banks, Mrs. Nelson Kornegay, Mrs. J. W. Wiggins.

Petition-Mrs. Arthur Kennedy, Mrs. Hazel Mason.

Mrs. J. R. Bennett, 2nd Vice-President, gave her report, and made a very impressive talk on "Conqueror's with Christ in working with our Youth."

Report of 1st Vice-President, Mrs. J. J. Blizzard.

A talk by Mrs. J. C. Griffin, on "How to become Conqueror's with Christ, through clean, wholesome literature in the home, church libraries and in Bible study was stressed, and parents were urged to be on their guard concerning the literature their children were reading, and to lead them to see the need of using their young minds in study and preparation for Christian service.

"Conqueror's with Christ through the field of Sacrifice, Worship and Burden-bearing—No Cross, no Crown," given by Mrs. W. F. Thigpen, in behalf of our Retired Ministers, was very impressive, and her appeal for greater interest in the cause was emphasized because of the need of these worthy men who had given their all in years gone by for the promulgation of the gospel of Christ. Her report showed some growth over the one rendered previously.

News from the Mission Field by Mrs. Ballard, was of much interest. She spoke very feelingly of Miss Barnard and the Woolsey's, in India, and of their work with the natives, also of the Willey's in Cuba, and the pro-

gress they are making in soul-winning and other phases of the work, that was very encouraging.

Congregational singing was rendered, after which Miss Zalene Lloyd, our prospective Missionary to India, spoke to us right out of her heart, on "Conqueror's with Christ through the preaching and teaching of the Gospel of Christ." "They went everywhere preaching the Word."

News from Cragmont, by Mr. Teasley, Superintendent, was given at this time. He spoke of the preparations that are being made for the various assemblies during the summer, giving as the opening day, June 6th. August 16th through the 23rd, is to be designated as "Woman's Conference Week." He said that he hoped to have Mrs. Willey, of Cuba, to meet with the women that week. He also gave information regarding the rates.

An offering was taken for the Orphanage, amounting to \$42.00.

Rev. Jas. A. Evans announced that he had brought all of the children from the Orphanage that had been adopted by the Eastern Convention, and that when their names were called, he would like for some one representing the Auxiliary that had adopted the child, to step forward and take charge of him, or her through the dinner hour. This was done, and brought much joy to the various women claiming the children.

Announcements were made regarding the dinner hour by the pastor, Rev. Jernigan, after which Rev. E. G. Holland gave the benediction.

The lunch hour was from 12:30 to 1:30 P. M.

AFTERNOON SESSION

1:30—After a bountiful dinner, the convention re-assembled for the afternoon session.

Praise and Prayer service was led by Mrs. J. H. Oglesby, who spoke very impressively on "Conqueror's with Christ through Obedience."

The minutes of the morning session were read at this time, and were approved as read.

Visitors and delegates from the Central and Western Auxiliaries were given a welcome, these were as follows: Mrs. Ben McCoy and Mrs. C. A. Eubanks, from the Central; Mrs. E. G. Holland from the Western; and Mrs. L. E. Ballard, President of the Albemarle Convention.

The following delegates were appointed to the various Auxiliary Conventions: Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, Albemarle; Mrs. L. E. Ballard, Central; Mrs. J. H. Oglesby, Western; Mrs. Marie Gaskins, Cape Fear; Mrs. Walter Rhodes, Pee Dee. Mrs. Louise Bedsworth was appointed to go, or send greetings to the French Broad Convention. Mrs. Rom Mallard was named delegate to the State Auxiliary Convention, which meets in annual session in May, at Kenly, N. C.

Mr. Evans gave a very interesting talk in behalf of the Orphanage, and some worthwhile things which had been accomplished with Coupons, together with proceeds from the Young People's Friend. He urged a greater effort in securing subscriptions to the Orphanage paper. In his remarks, he said that with present prices, and the pressing needs at the Orphanage,

he would expect us to do more than we ever had before. He also asked that, when prayers were made for the children in the Home, that those who were caring for, and training them, be remembered also.

Miss Edgerton made some remarks regarding the sending of money. She asked that the sender give, not only her own name and address, but the name of the Auxiliary, name of Church and County, and the Conference District. She said that many churches have similar names to those of the various Conference districts, and they cannot give proper credit to the church deserving it, unless this request is complied with. She also asked that all monies be "ear-marked," whether for clothing, Chapel Fund, or for furnishings of one kind or another, or for General uses. She also said that the girl's dormitory had no reception, or living room, and that the aim is to furnish such a room during the coming year, and that the cost would be approximately \$5,000. It was moved and carried that this Convention assume the responsibility of raising \$1,000 of this amount, and the 5th Vice-President be asked to give it all the publicity possible, together with solicitations to the various auxiliaries in raising this sum.

The Secretary made her semi-annual report, after which the Finance Committee made report. Treasurer's report was given, and on motion was received, as read. The Resolution and Petition Committees made reports. (See reports.)

The minutes were read and approved, after which a rising vote of thanks to the local church and community was given, for their hospitality, co-operation and service in the promotion of the Lord's work in behalf of this Convention.
