Minutes

The Eastern Quarterly Meeting of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptist, met in regular session, with East Nashville Free Will Baptist church, Saturday April 7, 1962.

Brother W. B. Hughes, the moderator presided. Brother Harold Teague directed the congregation in singing "Blessed Assurance". Brother Dub Elliston led in prayer. Brother Teague then directed the song "To The Work". Brother Dale Burden gave the welcome and conducted the devotional. He read Ephesians 6: 10, for his scripture reading and closed the devotional with prayer. The response was given by Brother Fred Hawkins.

Brother Hughes read a letter of resignation from Brother Ketchum who was called to a church in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Nominations were declared in order for some one to fill this vacancy. Those nominated were Brother Fred Hawkins and Brother John Gibbs. Brother Hawkins was elected. Brother Haas made a motion that the Quarterly Meeting send a letter to Hill Brothers shoe store, in protest of their opening their store on Sunday. Motion adopted.

Brother Ray Turnage spoke in behalf of the League program. He began by directing the congregation in singing "Walking In Sunlight", and "Every Day With Jesus". He told of the lack of support from the churches for the League work, and challenged us to a closer cooperation with the League Board.

Brother Turnage gave a report for the treasurer of the Master's Men". Brother Reed reported that he had received \$ 134.25 to date for the National Association expenses. Brother Elliston reported for the Youth camp board, and gave the encampment dates as, July 22-28 for Juniors, July 29-Aug. 4 Intermediates, Aug. 5-11 for Seniors.

Brother Hughes asked for visiting ministers to stand, and Brother Lee from the Progressive Association was recognized and welcomed. Brother Lee was called to pastor the Blue Springs church.

Brother Teague directed the congregation in singing "Blessed Be The Name"; and Brother B. J. Crumley led in prayer. The congregation then sang "Glory To His Name". Brother Hughes directed a testimony service, followed by the congregation singing "Amazing Grace".

Brother Phillips, pastor of Trinity Free Will Baptist church brought the morning message. He spoke on the second coming of Christ, after reading Hebrews 9: 24 he led in prayer. He closed his remarks with prayer.

Brother Burden made the necessary announcements for lunch and Brother Stanley Outlaw dismissed with prayer. Lunch was served in the basement of the church.

The afternoon service opened with congregational singing directed by Brother Hughes. We sang "Loyalty To Christ", and Brother Bob Hill led in prayer. Brother Teague then directed the song "He Brought Me Out".

Brother Luther Reed made a motion that the executive committee of the Cumberland Association and the trustees of the Master's Men meet at once and make the necessary changes in the deed of Hillmont Assembly grounds to give it to the Cumberland Association, and also make the necessary loan to get the money to pay Brother Price. Ministers, Deacons, and Delegates were recognized and seated as the voting body.

The registration report was received and Olivet's church asked for the next meeting. The resolutions report was read, and a motion was adopted to receive it in its entirety. A motion to adjourn was made by Brother Tom Johnson, and we were dismissed with prayer to meet with Olivet on July 7.

MINUTES

The Eastern quarterly meeting of the Cumberland Association of Free Will Baptist met in regular session, Saturday July 7, 1962. Brother Fred Hawkins, assistant moderator, opened the meeting. Brother Bobby Jackson directed the congregation in singing, "Faith Of Our Fathers". Brother Reford Wilson led in prayer. Brother Jackson then directed, "Give Of Your Best To The Master". Brother Tommy Hughes conducted the devotional, using as his scripture reading Acts 10: 1, 4. At the close of his remarks, he led in prayer.
