It was motioned at this time the roll call of our ministers was heard. Those present responded with an impressive report of their year's work, and paid one dollar each to the Conference.

On motion, all visiting brethren were given a seat, voice and sincere welcome in our Conference. Bro. Norton and others gave an inspiring comment. Next was given consideration to petition of new churches, etc.

Muddy Creek Church in Florence County, through her delegates to this session, asked for and was granted admittance into our Conference. The Deed to her property was read in our hearing. After due consideration, on motion, said Church was formally received by extending to her delegates the right hand of Christian fellowship.
