

#### CONSTITUTION

From the long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist Church of God, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, do therefore ordain this constitution for our better church government.

- 1. This Association shall be composed of members chosen by different church in our union, not exceeding three delegates from each church and on producing letters shall be entitled to seats.
- 2. Letters from different churche are to express the number in fellowship, the number received by experience of grace, number

by letter of recommendation, the number dismissed, excluded, re-

stored, and those who have died since the Association.

3. The members thus chosen and convened to be denominated the Eureka - Association of Free Will Baptists being composed of sundry churches in the Eureka association—the association having no power to Lord it over God's heritage nor to have any ecclesiastical power over any church becoming disorderly with neither corner ainta 4. The assoc ation to have a Moderator, Clerk, and Treasurer, who are to be chosen by the suffrage of the members present.

7. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the association except when it be withdrawn by

the member who made it.

The Association is to endeaver to furnish the church with minutes of the Association in proportion to the number of members in each church, distribution being at discretion of the association.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the Association for that purpose.

11. Amendments to the constitution may be made when it is necessary by a majority of the members present.
