CONSTITUTION

From the long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist Church of God, being regularly baptized upon a procession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, we therefore ordain this constitution for better church government.

- 1. This association shall be composed of members chosen by different churches in our union, not exceeding three delegates from each church and on producing letters shall be entitled to seats.
- 2. Letters from different churches are to express the number in fellowship, the number received by experience of grace, number by letter of recommendation, the number dismissed, excluded, restored, and those who have died since the association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened, to be denominated the Eureka Association of Free Will Baptist, being composed of sundry churches in the Eureka Association—the Association having no power to lord it over God's heritage nor to have any ecclesiastical power over any church becoming disorderly.

4. The association to have a Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer who are to be chosen by the sufferage of the mem-

bers present.

5. Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the association if they are found to be orthodox and orderly they may be received into the association, the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.

6. No question from any church shall come under consideration of the association unless it has first been discussed in its own

church.

7. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the association, except when it is withdrawn by the

member who made it.

8. The association is to endeavor to furnish the church with minutes of the association in proportion to the number of members in each church, distribution being at discretion of the association.

9. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the

minutes of the association for that purpose.

10. The minutes of the association shall be read and corrected if needed and signed by the moderator and clerk before the close of the association.

11. Amendments to the constitution may be made when it is

necessary, by a majority of the members present.

12. Be it resolved that an ordaining council for ministers be composed of three (3) ordained ministers in good standing in association.

13. Be it resolved that all money be sent to the treasurer of

the association.

14. Money other than allocated funds shall be divided, 75 percent to the Co-op Plan and 25 percent kept in the association.

15. The Examining Committee of the association shall examine ministers for license at the request of the church of which candidate is a member.

16. The examining committee shall examine at the end of one year, licensed ministers for ordination at the request of the church of which the minister is a member. Request shall be made to association or the 5th Sunday meeting.

17. The voting power of the association shall be ordained ministers, their wives, deacons and their wives, church clerk and duly elected delegates from each church. The above shall be in good

standing with the association.

1961 SESSION

18. Be it resolved that all resolutions adopted by the Eureka association be printed in conclusion with our constitution and be carried in print from year to year as a part of our Rules and Laws.

19. Be it resolved that we adopted the rule that when a church selects deacons, that they be set aside on trial for 12 months, before being ordained. The deacon acting during the 12 months, but

not ordained before the 12 months are up.

20. Be it resolved that the Constitution be amended giving the Executive Board control over the Youth Camp. This resolution was adopted, 1961. Rev. C. E. Kennedy, Rev. Major Followwill, Bro. Leamon Harrell, Bro. Vanis King, Bro. Abb Wallen, Committee.

1963 SESSION

21. Resolutions—Rev. Bailey Thompson, Bro. Otho Williams, Bro. Bernard Williamson. Articles of Faith—No. 10—to be replaced to read as follows: 1963 SESSION: We believe that baptism, (The Immersion of Believers in Water), The Lord's Supper, and Feet Washing, are divine ordinances of the Gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers, at night, and to be followed by the ordinance of feet washing, which teaches humility of

universal obligations, to be practiced by all believers. Mark 14:22,

John 13:4-14, Matt. 28:19-20, Tim. 5:10.

22. As we are all interested in our youth, and we all have a part in youth camp, be it resolved that we form a committee, composed of one delegate from each church in the association, to meet with the Executive Board, at a time and place designated by the Executive Board, to work out plans, policy, changes, etc. Each church elect its own delegate.

1964 SESSION

26. Be it resolved that our Treasurer receive an honorarium of \$35.00 for his services of our Association each year.

27. Be it resolved that the Eureka Association authorize the Yard Committee to floor the tabernacle with concrete as money is available starting at the East end.

28. Be it resolved that our Clerk receive an honorarium of \$35.00 and our Assistant Clerk \$25.00 for their services of the Association each year.

29. Be it resolved to alter item No. 17 of the Constitution by inserting the word, Ordained, before ministers.

Whereas, the Free Will Baptist Church of Sallisaw, Oklahoma has requested dismissal from the Eureka Association of Free Will Baptist and, whereas a minority group of that church has appealed to the Association not to grant the request, and whereas the records available to the Association show that the pastor of the Sallisaw Church to ave been illegally ordained and therefore, not recognized by Free Will Baptists anywhere as being a regularly ordained Free Will Baptist minister.

Be it resolved that the Eureka Association of Free Will Baptists go on record as standing with the minority group of the church, and be it resolved that the Association notify the Sallisaw Church that the calling of this minister for the Pastor of their church is

out of order and illegal.

Be it further resolved that this Association notify the court clerk of Sequoyah County that this man is not recognized as a regularly ordained Free Will Baptist minister.

Be it further resolved that this Association request the Antioch Association in Arkansas, of which the men are members, who improperly ordained this man to revoke their action, and take steps to obtain the papers given to him by the illegal council.

- 32. We, the Resolution Committee would like to urge each Pastor, to look into, and obtain information, on the steps to incorporate their churches as Free Will Baptists.
- 33. We, the Resolution Committee, suggest that the names of the Ministers, who have moved or are deceased, be removed from the list of ministers in the minutes.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe in one true and living God, Father, Son and Holy Ghost and these three are one in divine essence, power and glory. Romans 1-2; 1st John 1:7; John 17:21.
- 2. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the inspired Word of God and the only infallible rule of faith and practice. Second Timothy 3-16; Matthew 5-18.
- 3. We believe that God created man good, and gave His holy commandments whereby he should live holy, but man voluntarily fell under the just condemnation of the same, whereby all mankind are sinners, not by constraint, but by choice, being partakers of the sinful nature attained by the fall and that man is unable to save himself with his own power, but we see Jesus for suffering of death crowned with glory. That He by the grace of God should taste death for every man. Gen. 3:17; Heb. 2:9
- 4. We believe that Christ by His death, suffering and ressurection purchased our pardon and offered it freely to all mankind upon principles of repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. He now commands all men everywhere to repent therefore he sayeth, "Look unto Me and be saved, all ye ends of the earth, for I am God and there is none else." Matt. 4:17; Isaiah 45:22: Acts 20:20.
- 5. We believe that adult persons must be regenerated and born of the Spirit of God, to inherit eternal life. John 3:3; 1st Peter 1:23.
- 6. We believe that infants and idiots are saved upon the merit of the Son of God. Jonah 4:11; Mark 10:14; Duet. 1:39.

- 7. We believe that all Christians must preserve in grace and be faithful to the end if they may have right to the tree of life and enter through the gate into the city. Rev. 22:14; Matt. 24:13.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation: The conditions of salvation are:
 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of
 it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as
 Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things.
 In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy
 Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God.
 3. Continuance in faith and obedience unto death.
- 9. We believe that God in His goodness displays His power of grace in great degree in calling and qualifying His servants by teaching of the Holy Ghost and by instruction of His word to go forth and nothing prevents the salvation of any but their stubborn rebellion and sinful refusal to come. I Cor. 12:13; Eph. 3:7; Rev. 22:17.
- 10. To replace No. 10—In Articles of Faith, 1963 change. We believe that Baptism, (The Immersion of Believers in water). The Lord's Supper and feet washing, are divine ordinances of the Gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers at night, and to be followed by the ordinance of feet washing, which teaches humility of universal obligation, to be practiced by all believers. Mark 14:22; John 13:4-14; Matt. 28:19-20 and 1st Tim. 5:10.
- 11. We believe that none have a right to baptism only those who have a living hope in the Lord Jesus Christ, and none have the right to administer the same only those who have come under the hands of the presbytery of Elders, and each church ought to have a pastor, deacon and clerk chosen by the church, who hold office during the good pleasure of same; dealing with disorderly members, reference should be had to the 18th chapter of Matthew and other Scriptures relative to dealing with disorderly members, and then it must be unanimous. Titus 1:5; Acts 14:23; II Corinthians 6:6.
- 12. We believe it is the duty of each church to assemble themselves together once a month and that it is the duty of the pastor of the church in the setting forth of the Lord's Supper and washing of the Saint's feet to let everyone examine himself and so let him eat. I Cor. 11:28: John 13:14.
- 13. We believe that sanctification and holiness is a Bible doctrine that immortality is God dwelling in the lives so when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption and this mortal shall have put on immortality then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to singly engage to

promote the honor and glory of God. Gal. 6:10, I John 2:9.

. 14. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, of both the just and unjust; the just to glory and immortality in the presence of God; the unjust to everlasting shame and banishment from the presence of God. Matt. 24:31; Cor. 16:42; Thes. 1:10; Rev. 20:12-13.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having been brought, as humbly trust, by divine grace to embrace the Lord Jesus Christ as our Savior and having thus obtained justification by faith in His name, we as members of several churches that constitute the Eureka Association of Free Will Baptist adopt the following as our covenant.

1. To watch over each other in love, to pray for each other as members of a common faith ever striving to keep the unit of spirit in the bond of peace.

2. We will not speak evil of each other nor will we persecute or expose the faults of the weak members of our churches; but we will endeavor to be governed by Paul's instruction to Timothy, "That we will reprove, rebuke and exhort" each other as members of a common brotherhood.

3. We are commanded to do good unto all men, especially to those of the household of faith. But we should remember that our relations to each other are closer and the obligations more binding than that of a common hand of Christian charity. In adopting this covenant, we become as a family and assume in a Christian sense the care and responsibility that the members of a family shall feel for each other.

4. We will attend the stated meetings of our churches unless we are providentially hindered, or uncontrollable circumstances prevent us. And we will contribute of our means as the Lord has prospered us for the support of our pastor and other necessary expenses of our own church to that of any other and we will pray for our pastor while he is preaching the word of God to us.

5. We will not neglect secret and public prayers and those of us who are heads of families will strive to dedicate our households to the service of God by teaching our children the great necessity of the Christian religion as the only hope of happiness after death. We will adopt the Covenant of Joshua, the servant of the Lord, and say, "But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."
