  - 7. A motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on any subject without special permission of the Moderator
- 9. The Moderator shall have the authority to object to any discussion not carried on in a Christian spirit.
- 10. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.
- 11. No member shall absent himself or herself without special leave of the Moderator.
- 12. Minutes shall be leisurely read and corrected before the close of the Association.
- 13. The Rules of Order shall be distinctly read from the Chair immediately after organization of the Association.
- 14. Alterations shall be made in these rules at any regular session of this Association.

### CHURCH ORDER OF BUSINESS

- 1. Called to order by Moderator.
- 2. Called into conference, or vote, to go into conference
- Call for peace of the Church, (all who are at peace with God and with each other, hold up your right hand).
- Visiting brethren invited to seat in Council (Visiting members from other Free Will Baptist Churches).
- 5. Reading of minutes of last conference.
- 6. Reading of Treasurer's report.
- 7. Unfinished business.
- 8. New business.

### CONSTITUTION -

From the long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist Church of God, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and being convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate a union among us and to preserve and maintain correspondence with each other, we therefore ordain this constitution for better church government

- 1. This association shall be composed of members chosen by different churches in our union, not exceeding three delegates from each church and on producing letters shall be entitled to seats.
- 2. Letters from different churches are to express the number in fellowship, the number received by experience of grace, number by letter of recommendation, the number dismissed, excluded, restored, and those who have died since the association.
- 3. The members thus chosen and convened, to be denominated the Eureka Association of Free Will Baptist, being composed of sundry churches in the Eureka Association—the Association having

no power to lord it over God's heritage nor to have any ecclesiastical power over any church becoming disorderly.

- 4. The association to have a Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and Treasurer who are to be chosen by the sufferage of the members present.
- 5. Newly constituted churches may be admitted to the association if they are found to be orthodox and orderly they may be received into the association, the moderator giving the right hand of fellowship.
- 6. No question from any church shall come under consideration of the association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 7. Every motion made and seconded shall come under the consideration of the association, except when it is withdrawn by the member who made it.
- 8. The association is to endeavor to furnish the church with minutes of the association in proportion to the number of members in each church, distribution being at discretion of the association.
- 9. It shall be the duty of the clerk to keep a regular file of the minutes of the association for that purpose.
- 10. The minutes of the association shall be read and corrected if needed and signed by the moderator and clerk before the close of the association.
- 11. Amendments to the constitution may be made when it is necessary, by a majority of the members present.
- 12. Be it resolved that an ordaining council for ministers be composed of three (3) ordained ministers in good standing in association.
- 13. Be it resolved that all money be sent to the treasurer of the association.
- 14. Money other than allocated funds shall be divided, 75 percent to the Co-op Plan and 25 percent kept in the association.
- 15. The Examining Committee of the association shall examine ministers for license at the request of the church of which candidate is a member.
- 16. The examining committee shall examine at the end of one year, licensed ministers for ordination at the request of the church of which the minister is a member. Request shall be made to association or the 5th Sunday meeting.
- 17. The voting power of the association shall be ordained ministers, their wives, deacons and their wives, church clerk and duly elected delegates from each church. The above shall be in

good standing with the association.

- 18. Be it resolved that we adopt the Free Will Baptist Treatise as our rule, Faith and Practice.
- 19. Be it resolved that we adopt the Church Covenant found in our Free Will Baptist Treatise.

### 1961 SESSION

- 20. Be it resolved that all resolutions adopted by the Eureka association be printed in conclusion with our constitution and be carried in print from year to year as a part of our Rules and Laws.
- 21. Be it resolved that we adopted the rule that when a church selects deacons, that they be set aside on trial for 12 months, before being ordained. The deacon acting during th 12 months, but not ordained before the 12 months are up.
- 22. Be it resolved that the Constitution be amended giving the Executive Board control over the Youth Camp. This resolution was adopted, 1961. Rev. C. E. Kennedy, Rev. Major Followwill, Bro. Leamon Harrell, Bro. Vanis King, Bro. Abb Wallen, Committee.

#### 1963 SESSION

- 23. Resolutions—Rev. Bailey Thompson, Bro. Otho Williams, Bro. Bernard Williamson. Articles of Faith—No. 10—to be replaced to read as follows: 1963 SESSION: We believe that baptism, (The Immersion of Believers in Water), The Lord's Supper, and Feet Washing, are divine ordinances of the Gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers, at night, and to be followed by the ordinance of feet washing, which teaches humility of universal obligations, to be practiced by all believers, Mark 14:22, John 13:4–14, Matt. 28:19–20, Tim. 5–10.
- 24. As we are all interested in our youth, and we all have a part in youth camp, be it resolved that we form a committee, composed of one delegate from each church in the association, to meet with the Executive Board, at a time and place designated by the Executive Board, to work out plans, policy, changes, etc. Each church elect its own delegate.

Be it resolved that the Eureka Association of Free Will Baptists go on record as standing with the minority group of the church and be it resolved that the Association notify the Sallisaw Church that the calling of this minister for the Pastor of their church is out of order and illegal.

Be it further resolved that this Association notify the court clerk of Sequoyah County that this man is not recognized as a regularly ordained Free Will Baptist minister.

Titus 1:5; Acts 14:23; II Corinthians 6:6:
- 12. We believe it is the duty of each church to assemble themselves together once a month and that it is the duty of the pastor of the church in the setting forth of the Lord's Supper and washing of the Saint's feet to let everyone examine himself and so let him eat. I Cor. 11:28; John 13:14.
- 13. We believe that sanctification and holiness is a Bible doctrine that immortality is God dwelling in the lives so when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption and this mortal shall

have put on immortality then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to singly engage to promote the honor and glory of God. Gal. 6:10, I John 2:9.

14. We believe in the resurrection of the dead, of both the just and unjust; the just to glory and immortality in the presence of God; the unjust to everlasting shame and banishment from the presence of God. Matt. 24:31; Cor. 16:42; Thes. 1:10; Rev. 20:12-13.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify as wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

### ROBBERS CAVE STATE PARK

- 1. Do not leave the campground without permission of Director. The campground boundaries are the fence on the east, the last dormitory at the north, the dormitories and rest rooms on the west, and the last dormitory on the south.
- 2. Do not leave the tabernacle during service unless absolutely necessary, then only after telling your sponsors.
  - 3. Stay under lights at night.

- 4. Boys stay south and girls stay north of kitchen after 6 p.m.
- 5. No boys in girls cabins nor girls in boys cabins at any time.
- 6. No holding hands, hugging, or bodily contact between boys and girls at any time.
- 7. No short, slim jims, tights or spaghetti strap dresses at any time.
- 8. Girls may wear loose slacks or pedal pushers (below the knees) at recreation time only
- 9. Horn will be honked each night for bedtime and lights out.
- 10. Dormitory sponsors are responsible to see that the bunks are made up, and dormitories are swept each morning before classes begin.
- 11. No use of tobacco of any kind at Camp.
