

FELLOWSHIP ASSOCIATION YEARLY MEETING DOVER FRIDAY, JUNE 29, 1990

The meeting began with prayer by Bro. Lawnie Coffman.

Bro. Kenneth Summers led the congregation in singing "I'll Fly Away."

The Meeting was called to order by the moderator, Bro. Bo Coffman to conduct any business necessary.

Visitors, Bro. Terry Eagleton, Bro. & Sis. Keith and Barbara Johnson were recognized.

Bro. Doyle Coffman gave a devotional from Exodus 4:1-4.

Letters from the churches were read and delegates were seated by the moderator and assistant moderator.

Minutes of the last meeting and the financial report was read by the clerk and accepted.

Bro. Terry Eagleton representing Randall House Publications spoke with greetings from the national offices and told about the curriculum and a new program called plus ten to help support availability of curriculum in foreign languages.

Bro. Keith Johnson representing the Christian Supply Store in Conway gave a report from the bookstore. He stated that sales were up this year and a new catalog would be available soon. He also gave some suggestions of ways that the bookstore staff could help the churches.

The following committees were appointed by the moderator and assistant moderator: Bro. Pete Taylor, Bro. Dewey Hubbard, and Bro. Truman Coffman were appointed to the resolutions committee. The obituary committee consisted of Bro. Buster Barton, Sis. Louise Hubbard and Sis. Mary Williams.

FINANCE BOARD — 3-year term replacing Bro. Bill Haralson was Bro. Dick Barnett.

A motion was made by the executive board and accepted by the body to accept Bro. Lynn Beck into full fellowship into the association because the situations with his letter had been resolved.

The service was turned to the assistant moderator Bro. Lawnie Coffman to take charge of the worship service.

Bro. Kenneth Summers then led the congregation in singing "Come and Dine."

All of the ordained were invited into the alter for prayer.

Sis. Alene Coffman sang "Anywhere With Jesus."

Bro. David Bishop then preached from Acts 27:10-13.

The service was dismissed in prayer by Bro. Randell Williams.

SATURDAY, JUNE 30

Bro. Bob Alexander began the service by leading the congregation in singing "Leaning On the Everlasting Arms."

Matthew 27:18 was the text for a devotional by Bro. Lawnie Coffman on "What Shall I Do With Jesus."

A resolution was adopted to have lunch on Saturday of our yearly meeting.

A resolution was adopted to establish a scholarship fund was adopted:

Be it resolved that the Fellowship Association establish a Scholarship Fund for students attending any of our Free Will Baptist Colleges.

- 1. The amount of at least \$250 per year to be distributed through the Christian Education Board. This Board may alter the amount higher on any given year should the funds be available.
- 2. The above amount is to be given to students from churches in this association at the beginning of the fall semester.
- 3. Should there be a full semester in which no one from the Association is attending these schools, then the money would be sent to either Hillsdale or Free Will Baptist Bible College on an alternating basis to be given to a student the school feels most deserving.
- 4. The finance committee is to re-direct funds to create a percentage to be specifically used for that purpose.

The Executive Board Report was given by Bro. Randell Williams. He reported that over the past year the board had examined and recommended for acceptance the following ministers, Rev. Randell Williams, Rev. Bobby Alexander, Rev. Doyle Coffman and Rev. Lawnie Coffman. The Board also approved Bro. Blaine Beck to be licensed to preach from this association. A situation with a letter for Bro. Lynn Beck was resolved and he was recommended into full fellowship into the association. The Executive Board also contributed \$150 to the legal defense fund of the Woodlawn Church against the private club license applied for next to the church. A seal had also been purchased to seal all documents from the association.

Mission Board Report was given by Sis. Brenda Housley. This past year we sponsored an Evangelism Conference on February

2nd and 3rd at Harmony. The National Home Missions Department team of Bro. Roy Thomas and Bro. Trymom Messer were the speakers at the "Old Time Camp Meeting." With the offering we received at the meetings and money from our account we were able to give them \$750, pay for their motel room and give them \$50 expense money. I would like to thank the Woodlawn Woman's Auxiliary for the fruit that they took to the speaker's room. They really appreciated it.

Youth Board Report was given by Bro. Troy Coffman. He reported about a youth revival on April 12-13 with Bro. Jackie Brown State CTS director as the evangelist. This was held at Welcome Home Church with good results and attendance. A cookout was held last fall at the Old Post Road Park. Bro. Troy said that they hoped to have some more activities soon.

CTS competition yielded two national competitions. Troy Coffman, Welcome Home in 5th grade sword drill and Hollie Hubbard from Woodlawn with a piano solo.

A motion was passed to give Bro. Blaine Beck \$125 to help with this semester's fees to Hillsdale from the general fund.

A motion was accepted to encourage the youth board to give \$100 each to the two national competitors in CTS. Each church was then encouraged to take an offering for this purpose as well.

The Woman's Auxiliary Report was given by Sis. Geneva: Coffman. The Woman's Auxiliary now has 82 members. In July there was a meeting at Woodlawn with 31 present. Sis. Anna Coffman spoke on the subject "The Way of Blessedness." The October meeting was at the Dover Church. The theme was "Go and Do Thou Likewise." There were 44 present with Dardanelle joining with 21 members. Sis. Bessie Richards Missionary to the Ivory Coast was the speaker. We gave Bessie a personal shower and a money tree with \$118. We were also able to send \$506.38 to the Richard's account. The January meeting was at Union Grove. The theme was "Living by the Truth." The speaker was Sis. Mary Chronister and there were 40 present. The April meeting was at the Welcome Home Church. The theme was "Spring Forth and Grow." The speaker was Sandra Bishop, missionary to Japan. We gave her a personal shower and a total gift of \$457. There were two fund raisers that yielded \$698.88 for the Richard's account and \$808.35 for the Bishop's Account.

Officers for 1990-91 are President, Geneva Coffman; vice president, Louise Hubbard; secretary, Brenda Housley; treasurer, Barbara Taylor; field worker, Georgia Haralson; Mission Study, Vicki Hubbard; Mission prayer, Stella Laffoon, and Mission Action, Kelly Rowland.

FELLOWSHIP ASSOCIATION BY-LAWS

- 1. The moderator or, in his absence, the Assistant Moderator or Clerk shall call the Association into conference.
- 2. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer. Each meeting shall be closed with prayer.
- 3. It shall be the duty of the Clerk to enroll the elected delegates to the Association. These delegates shall present themselves with the proper credentials of their right to be seated. These elected delegates and other boards and members mentioned in the Constitution compose the Association and quarterly meeting. Should there be a questionable representation, the case will be referred to the Parliamentarian.
- 4. The following committees shall be appointed by the moderator and/or the assistant moderator: Obituary and resolution.
- 5. Any person not a member of this Association may be invited to a seat as advisory council and by permission from the Moderator, speak. But in no case shall he, or they, be allowed to vote.
- 6. It shall be the duty of all members of this association and quarterly meeting to be present at the appointed time for each meeting and worship service.
- 7. The Moderator shall not allow discussions that are not carried on in a Christian spirit or when the discussion casts reflection on another person or church.
- 8. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to their feet and address the Moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," and shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.
- 9. No one shall speak more than once on the same subject without permission from the moderator.
- 10. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present except Constitutional questions which require a two-thirds majority.
- 11. Each church of the association will host the quarterly and/or yearly meeting according to alphabetical order on a rotation basis.
- 12. Desiring to be consistant within the denomination, we will abide by the laws and Constitutions of the State and National associations, should any question of discipline arise.
- 13. These By-Laws may be altered at any regular meeting of this association by a majority vote of members present.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FELLOWSHIP ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist Churches of this district, having been baptized by immersion upon profession of our faith in Christ as Savior and Lord, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among our churches do, for the purpose of co-ordinating our efforts for the extension of the kingdom of God, ordain this constitution and its affixed By-Laws for the betterment of our Association.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be called the "Fellowship Association of Free Will Baptists," affiliated with the State Association of Free Will Baptists of Arkansas which is a member of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, with headquarters in Nashville, Tenn.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The objective and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of its various boards and churches composing this Association and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Gospel of Christ in connection with the various boards, auxiliaries and churches, or those that may hereafter be represented therein.

ARTICLE III

COMPOSITION: This association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches within the local area (a suggested thirty (30) mile radius from Russellville, Arkansas) as subscribed (agree) with the doctrine and practices as stipulated in the Treaties of the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptist, (favoring the various enterprises as endorsed by the State Association and denomination proper) by its Association Officers, Standing Boards, the duly appointed delegates of the local churches, all ordained ministers, deacons and church clerks who are in good standing with their local church.

ARTICLE IV

REPRESENTATION: Section 1. Each local church shall be represented by three (3) elected delegates or their alternates. A letter from each church shall accompany said delegates as requested by this body.

Section 2. In the event only part of the elected delegation is present from a church, they together may, in consultation with their pastor, fill said vacancies with other members who are present from said church. Said delegates to be approved by this body.

Section 3. New churches desiring membership in this body shall send delegates bearing a petitionary letter. If the petitioning church, upon examination by the Executive/Examining Board, is found to be properly organized and willing to adhere to the Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptist as specified in the Treaties and are willing to adhere to the Constitution and By-Laws of this Association, they shall, by vote of this body, be received into full fellowship.

ARTICLE V

DISCIPLINE: This Association shall act only in an advisory capacity. Should there arise in the local church any question on doctrine, practice or discipline, the Bible and the Treaties of The Faith and Practices of Free Will Baptist shall be considered the final authority. This body, when in session, may be majority vote of members present, withdraw the hand of fellowship from said church or churches until such time they have set their house in order.

ARTICLE VI

FINANCE: This Association shall receive its support from each church contributing one per cent of its monthly gross income to the Association. This contribution may be sent monthly or quarterly to the Clerk/Treasurer.

ARTICLE VII

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk/Treasurer, Assistant Clerk/Treasurer and Parlimentarian. These officers shall be elected annually on the last day of the Association, at the close of the business period. They shall also serve for each Quarterly Meeting of the Association and may succeed themselves.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The Standing Boards of this Association shall be: The Executive/Examining Board, The Christian Education Board, The Mission Board, The Youth Board and The Finance Board. The Executive/Examining Board shall be made up of five (5) members (ministers and deacons). These members will serve terms of 5,4,3,2,1 year. The other Standing Boards shall be made up of three (3) members each and may include men and women. Terms of these boards will be 3,2,1 year. An individual who leaves a Standing Board at the completion of his/her term may not succeed themself, but may be elected to another board.

The District Women's Auxiliary shall be considered auxiliaries of this body. Each of the above named boards and auxiliaries are requested to report to the yearly meeting of this Association.

ARTICLE IX

DUTIES AND RULES OF BOARDS: All boards are to organize when elected at the beginning of each associational year. They shall have a Chairman, Assistant Chairman, and when funds are entrusted to the board, a Secretary/Treasurer. Each board shall keep a written report of each meeting, the receiving and disbursement of its funds, etc., and shall make a written report to this body of its work done during the year, or as requested by the body.

Section 1. The Executive/Examining Board is delegated the power to act in behalf of and for the Fellowship Association or its Quarterly Meetings, when either of these bodies are not in session.

Section 2. It shall be the duties of the Executive/Examining Board to examine all ministers for license and/or ordination at the request of the local church. If the candidate is approved, he will be licensed for at least one (1) year and not ordained until a full-time work or a field of work is accepted.

Section 3. The Executive/Examining Board will use "The Doctrinal Questionaire for Ministers" provided by the Arkansas State Association to examine new ministers. Ministers coming from other states, associations or denominations shall be examined by the same document. It is the duty of the local church to request this examination.

Section 4. The millenium view-point of the minister being examined, ordained, or accepted into the fellowship of the Fellowship Association will not be a test of fellowship among us, thereby granting every minister or pastor the liberty to preach his convictions and views concerning the Second Coming of Christ, as long as those convictions and views are in total agreement with the aforementioned doctrinal statements contained in the Free Will Baptist Treatise and the Free Will Baptist Articles of Faith.

Section 5. Missions Board: It shall be the duty of this board to work in conjunction with the State and National Home and Foreign Missions Boards in arranging an active Missionary Program for this Association.

Section 6. The Christian Education Board: It will be the duty of this board to work in cooperation with the State and National Sunday School Departments in arranging Sunday School conferences and workshops, teacher's training courses, Bible/Preaching conferences and/or Revivals, and in recommending methods and materials for the Sunday Schools of this Association.

Section 7. The Youth Board: The Youth Board shall work in cooperation with the State and National C.T.S. Boards to assist churches in this Association with youth oriented teaching and training workshops and programs. This board shall sponsor associational youth activities as it deems advisable.

Section 8. The Finance Board: The Finance Board shall recommend to the Association the disbursement of Associational

funds. The Board shall recommend the percentage of the gross income of the Association that each Standing Board will receive to carry out its work. It will be the responsibility of the Finance Roard to insure that funds are available to meet our State Association requirements and to print the Association Minutes.

ARTICLE X

RULES FOR CONDUCTING BUSINESS: Roberts Rules of Order shall be used as a guide in all business transactions, parliamentary usage, etc.

ARTICLE XI

MEETINGS: Section 1. The church year of this Association will be from July 1 through June 30.

Section 2. The yearly meeting will be on Friday night before the last Saturday in June and the following Saturday morning. The elected delegates will be seated at the Friday night service.

Section 3. The quarterly meetings will be on a Thursday/Friday night before the last Saturday in September, January, and March. The elected delegates will be seated at the Thursday night service.

Section 4. The times of all evening services will be 7:30 p.m.

Section 5. Each church will use the National Association of Free Will Baptist form of reporting to the quarterly and yearly meetings. The Clerk/Treasurer will use the same form to report to the Arkansas State Association.

ARTICLE XII

The constitution may be amended or altered at any yearly session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided amendments or alterations are presented in writing with the proposed change or alterations to be placed on the table no later than Friday night and to be taken up no earlier than Saturday morning.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. THE BIBLE. The scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- 3. CHRIST. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified and is our ever present Savior and Lord.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT. The Scriptures assign to the Holy

Spirit the attributes of God.

5.THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD. God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE TERMS OF SALVATION. The conditions of salvation are:
- A. Repentenance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.
- B. Faith or the unreserved commital of one's self to christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God.
 - C. Continuance in faith and obedience unto death.
- 9. ELECTION. God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.
 - 10. FREEDOM OF THE WILL. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
 - 11. SALVATION FREE. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
 - 12. PERSERVERANCE. All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
 - 13. GOSPEL ORDINANCES: Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. Feet Washing an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
 - 14. TITHING. God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "upon the first day of the week let

everyone of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (I Cor. 16:2a).

- 15. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 16. RESURRECTION, JUDGEMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."
