Minutes Of the Annual Meeting Of the First Kansas Quarterly Conference of Free Will Baptists Convening at First Free Will Baptist Church Hutchinson, Kansas January 18-19, 1991

The meeting opened with a welcome from Brother Bernard Roberts (Moderator). After the welcome, all ordained men present met at the altar to pray for the world situation (Persian Gulf crisis). The altar prayer was led by Brother Jerry Myers. Sister Terry Luman led singing, accompanied by Sister Pearline Roberts. Hymns sung were "When we all get to Heaven" and "Victory in Jesus". The evening offering was then taken. Brother Mike Luman gave the offering prayer.

After the offering, Brother Roberts called for representatives of each church (and visitors) to stand and be counted. The results were as follows;

Brother and Sister Roberts then performed special music. The selections they chose were "If that isn't Love" and "One-way Flight". Brother Jerry Rogers then brought the evening message (notes from Bro. Rogers' message are provided on an accompanying page).

Following Brother Rogers' message, Sisters Pearline Roberts and Terry Luman led the congregation in singing "What a Friend". Everyone stood and shook hands. The Moderator then asked Brother Jerry Myers to hand out copies of the October meeting's minutes. The Business Committee was then appointed-it consisted of Brothers Nick Hollis (Chairman), Troy Dobbs, and Don Jones.

The moderator then made the following announcements;

The Business Committee and Woman's Auxiliary will meet immediately after this evening's services are dismissed

Coffee and donuts will be served at 8:30 am Saturday morning, January 19

Brother Ray Hubbard led the prayer at the conclusion of the evening services.

Saturday, January 19, 1991

Brother Bernard Roberts welcomed everyone, then Brother Gene Molby opened the services with prayer. One new attendee was recognized from the host church. Sister Terry Luman led the congregation in singing "Where He leads, I'll follow". Sister Clara Hillis provided special music, singing "The Love of God" accompanied by Sister Pat Graves. Sister Hillis gave a short testimony, then she was joined by Sisters Pat Graves and Dollye Moore in singing "God Bless our Boys" (for our troops in the Persian Gulf).

Brother Nick Hollis gave the morning devotion (notes of Bro. Hollis' devotion are provided on an accompanying page).

After Brother Hollis' devotion, the business session was called to order by Brother Roberts. The Clerk read the names of the delegates. The Wellington church noted a substitution to their original delegate list. Motion was made to seat the delegates in conference. Motion was seconded. Motion carried.

Copies of minutes from the last Quarterly meeting were handed out to those who had not received them. A motion was made to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Motion was seconded. Motion carried.

New business was requested. Brother Nick Hollis read the Business Committee report, and the report was voted on item by item (complete contents of the Business Committee report are on an attached page). Item 1 recommended an honorarium and mileage be given to our speakers for the meeting. Item 2 recommended that the Quarterly meetings for the coming year be held in Ulysses (April 19-20), Wellington (October 18-19), and Hutchinson (January 17-18, 1992). Item 3 recommended changing the disbursement of quarterly fees to provide \$20 for the scholarship fund, \$10 to the emergency fund, and leave the representation fee at the current \$30. Item 4 recommended a standing vote of thanks to the host church. A motion was made to accept the Business Committee report and to vote item by item. Items 1 and 2 carried. Questions were asked as to whether item 3 provisions would be in effect for the next quarterly meeting (the answer was "yes"), and whether the emergency fund should continue to build, since the original goal was \$1,000 and the amount currently in the fund was \$1,348.18. A motion was made to amend the Business Committee report to place the current \$10 paid per church (designated for the emergency fund) into the scholarship fund unless the emergency fund falls below \$1,000 (in which case the \$10 would be returned to the emergency fund until it again reaches \$1,000). Item 3 was carried as amended. Item 4 was tabled until the end of the business session.

The next item of business was election of officers for the coming year. The following names were placed in nomination;

Moderator Bro. Jerry Myers Motion made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried.

Assistant Moderator Bro. Lupe Gonzales Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried. Clerk Bro. Ray Hubbard Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried.

Assistant Clerk Bro. Nick Hollis Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried.

Treasurer Bro. Bill Graves Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried.

Assistant Treasurer Sis. Pat Graves Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried.

Executive Committee Member Bro. Bernard Roberts Bro. Lupe Gonzales filled in temporarily as Moderator. Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion carried.

Credentials Committee Member Bro. Jerry Rogers

(Point of order was called (Bro. Rogers is currently in one-year provalship within this association, awaiting ordination). Nomination was withdrawn. Bro. Bernard Roberts' name was placed in nomination. Bro Lupe Gonzales filled in temporarily as Moderator. Motion was made to cease nominations and proceed to elect. Motion seconded and carried.

Brother Roberts called for reports. It was announced that the Jeff Turnbough family would be visiting the Bethel (Kansas City), Wichita, Salina, and Emporia churches on March 8-10. Brother Jerry Myers invited area churches to come and fellowship with the Turnboughs at Wichita on the 9th of March. Brother Roberts then reminded the congregation to be in constant prayer for Glenda Leatherbury and Jalayne Martens. Glenda has had to fill in as doctor for awhile, but the doctor has returned, and the pressure is now off. A videotape from them is available from the Hutchinson church.

Brother Jerry Myers gave a short report on the State Executive Board. The board has requested that each church send \$50 (or whatever they can take in as an offering) to the state to help with expenses for bringing in a speaker for the State meeting. Brother Myers also mentioned that the two students receiving the scholarship fund were now purchasing books, and the fund has helped tremendously. He went on to say that Hillsdale is again looking for an enrollment increase, even in the second semester. The college is doing an expansion survey (obtaining prices of land in the area, etc). He also stated that students do better at other colleges if they spend two years at Hillsdale.

Sister Pat Graves made an announcement in regards to the State treasury. Other than offerings, the state only receives 3% of any cooperative funds. If no money is designated by churches for this fund, the state gets nothing. Two churches in the association are designating money for the fund, and Sister Graves encouraged other churches to make a monthly commitment.

A short break was taken after announcements were given.

Following the break, the morning worship service began. Sister Terry Luman led the congregation in singing "We've a Story to Tell" and "Bring Them In". The offering was taken, and Brother Jerry Rogers gave the offertory prayer. Sister Terry Luman then provided special music, performing "Born to Die". Brother Guadalupe Gonzales brought the morning message (notes from Bro. Gonzales' message can be found on an accompanying page). Following the message, the altar was opened for a time of prayer.

After the morning message, the final business session began. The moderator called for the Treasurer's Report. Sister Pat Graves gave the following report;

The motion to adjourn was seconded. Motion carried. Brother Roberts closed with statistics on "why people attend church" (a complete list of these statistics can be found on an accompanying page). The host church prepared a delicious meal.

Brief outline of Bro. Jerry Rogers' evening message Friday evening, January 18, 1991

Bro. Rogers brought his message from Luke 11:1. The title was "Teach Us To Pray". Many Christians don't get results from prayers because they don't know how to pray. In the text, the disciples needed to know something from Jesus that troubled them-they needed to know **how** to pray. The disciples probably saw something in Jesus' life that they wanted to get hold of, because He knew how to pray. John the Baptist's disciples knew how to pray, because he taught them. Our prayers should not be like having a "conversation" with God (how's the weather, etc), or a Pharisee-like prayer (eloquent, but self-righteous). As Christians, we can go before God as if it were Jesus doing the talking (Luke 21:36). We can also live above sin, if we will "die daily" and allow the Holy Spirit to work effectively in our life.

God's will for us is that we live Holy, Righteously, and Godly in these days. But iniquity (as mentioned in James 4) keeps us from God. When He is close to us and we know our prayer is effectual, WATCH OUT-THINGS WILL HAPPEN! WE WILL START TO GET OUR HEARTS IN TUNE WITH GOD!

Why don't our children know how to pray? Because we don't pray with them!

Living "day to day" is the least important thing we can do. The most

important things we can do are to

Win the lost
 Feed God's sheep

If we win lost souls, we will grow.

We keep close to God by effectual prayer in Christ. Victory begins in prayer. Too many times, we are "defeated Christians". We need to realize that we are not losers! Defeat is "not getting up again"-defeat is "staying down".

Who do we go to to learn how to pray? We go to Jesus! We need to pray THROUGH! Stay on our knees until we get results-until we are sure that God is "going to receive it". We don't like to make a phone call and get a busy signal-God is <u>never</u> busy. He tries to get through to us, but many times, we give Him the "busy signal". We need to stop doing this.

Whatever Jesus prayer for, He received. He got exactly what He wanted every time He prayed-even the prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane. We can make a mark for Jesus-we can make a mark for Free Will Baptists (it's a disgrace that we have such a small denomination)-with prayer, something of great importance.

We will receive forgiveness as we give it. If we don't have it, we won't <u>get</u> it. The world checks external credentials (social security, outward appearance, etc), but Jesus slices through the "ceremonial robes" and gets

right to the <u>heart</u>! We have the greatest power on Earth-a <u>heart</u> that is willing to serve-but it only comes with a GREAT DEAL OF PRAYER!

Brief outline of Bro. Nick Hollis' devotional message Saturday morning, January 19, 1991 Title: Giving Account in His Ministry

Brother Hollis brought the message from 1 Corinthians 4:1-4, also reminding us to continue praying for the Mideast crisis.

He went on to say that the one thing that must back up prayer is the life we live. Many times, we say our prayers like "table grace". We do it in a hurry. We needs to take time to sacrifice time unto the Lord.

We must back up our faith with faithfulness. We need to be reminded of our accountability before God. Complacent lifestyles have permeated peoplewe are apathetic-we need to be happy, but we also need to be serious when we pray!

We need to know that God cares, and God understands (if He was willing to give his Son when we were sinners, He is willing to hear our prayers).

It's not what I think, nor what you think about me. It's what God thinks of me that matters.

Many times we love ourselves so much that we don't care about others. we need to think of ourselves less, but think more about the needs of the world.

We are accountable

We are in His ministry

we are **responsible**

because others are watching!

(Brother Hollis closed his devotion with a word of prayer)

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Brief outline of Bro. Lupe Gonzales' morning message Saturday Morning, January 19, 1991 Title: Is not My word like a fire?

Brother Gonzales brought his message from Jeremiah 23:29, stating that God's word is like a fire, and the hammer that breaks down sin. If we were physically "on fire", we would undoubtedly draw attention. in Revelation 3:16, we find that God "spues the lukewarm out of His mouth". He would rather that we be hot! Remember David running for the Ark, leaping for joy? The people thought it was shameful, but David said no-he was on "fire for the Lord".

God wants our BEST- NOT SECOND PLACE! A lukewarm Christian is a "smoulderer". A fire of this type makes an ugly mess, stinks, contains no fire, and becomes a stumbling block. A lukewarm Christian gets in the way, puts on airs, and pretends. They actually become God's enemy by saying they are "good" (a lot of "good" people are going to Hell). If their prayers stop at the ceiling, people are a hindrance to the Lord.

We have become "comfortable" and "doubtful" in prayer. God doesn't hear that-He has more important things to do, such as listening to one with a broken heart-ones who are concerned.

In Matthew 3:5-11, Jesus sets the perfect example for us. These verses mirror

the life of Jesus! This was the way He lived! We need to be more like Him if we want to see the kingdom of Heaven-then God will bless, and bless, and bless! When we realize that we are weak, poor, and need more spirituality, then God will hear us!

David prayed three times daily. He broke down and humbled himself. Jesus knew that He was poor in spirit, and went to the Lord- and He was our Savior!

We wouldn't be Christians if we did not feel compassion for others (an example of this is the Gulf War-do we feel compassion for those involved?).

If we hunger and thirst for righteousness (and we will until we go home to the Father), someday we will be filled!

Blessed are the "pure in heart". We are ALL wicked and sinners, working towards purity!

Blessed are the peacemakers...they are called the children of God. We ARE the children of God! Therefore, WE ARE THE PEACEMAKERS!

Blessed are the presecuted- one day, we won't be persecuted anymore. It is painful when people say things against us, and we know different. Jesus says to us, "Let Me handle it".

Brother Gonzales then referred to Daniel 3:17-18. Too many people, he said,

live for Satan six days a week, then come in to Sunday services "praising God". This cannot be- we either serve one or the other. As in Exodus 2:3,4, you and I are the "burning bush". We can be the fire of God. We can be be like Shadrack, Meshack, and Abednego. Who is in the midst of the fire? GOD IS!

In Daniel 3:24, the King was astounded! The fourth figure in the fire had the form of the Son of God! God's children were not consumed by the physical fire, because they were full of the spiritual fire.

Fire will have the following effect on us-

.it will possess you

.it will enhance you

.it will increase you

.it will make you noticeable to others

We, too, can be in the "midst of the bush". to do so, we have to learn to walk by the standard that has its eyes on God. We have the God-given right to choose! we will either;

- 1. Go into the furnace with God
- 2. Walk around the furnace

3. Waive all rights, and let the Savior make all the decisions

Lot chose to keep his rights and lost everything

Abraham chose to waive his rights, and gained everything.

Brother Gonzales closed with 1 Peter 5:7, "Casting all your care upon Him; for He careth for you". The altar was then opened for prayer.



Brief outline of Bro. Bernard Roberts' message, 4-19-91 "Falling out of Love" 9

Bro. Roberts used Rev. 2:1-5 as his opening text, then prayed. He brought out that we need to give heed to a convicting Spirit. We are in a time when love means very little-the words of this passage are for us TODAY!

The #1 problem in fundamental churches today is that we will defend truths, but the love is gone or going.

We need to know three things;

- 1. Our works are not hidden from Christ
- 2. What the lost love really is
- 3. That failure to correct a church near death will result in souls dying, lost in sin
- 1. Bro. Roberts reread verse 2, "I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience, and how thou canst not bear them which are evil: and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars". Many times church members say "I don't know what they are going to to" (referring to other church members). We need to remember that the church is we, not they.

Sometimes, churches live in a "fantasy world". We pretend so much, we tend to think things are <u>real</u>. Even STRONG Christians have a problem with this. It is time to stop pretending! No matter how hard we try to convince ourselves of what a good job we are doing, God knows <u>exactly</u> what we are doing. Our churches are not producing like we should.

We are seeing today that Jesus' words are true. Matt. 24:12 tells us "And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold" (if we aren't motivated by love, we will get cold and quit). The reason so many people "church-hop" is that they are looking for something different. We should be looking for Christ!

2. What is "lost love" (Rev. 2:4)? What substance is missing? What causes people not to attend church? The "first love" is evangelism, motivated out of a love for Christ (Acts 2:41-42, 46,47). The early church's desire was to carry the message that "Jesus loves us".

In Matt. 9:12 (as Jesus ate with publicans), he answered the Pharisees who saw Him "They that be whole need not a physician, but they that are sick". No preacher can please all of the people. Are we going to church to "please the pastor"? Jesus came for "those that were sick" (the lost). He died for sinners! we must hate sin and love sinners if we are to grow.

Mark 16:15 states "and He said unto them, Go ye into all the world, and

preach the gospel to every creature". If we are to go, we must have a burden for the lost. If we lose our burden for the lost, our zeal for evangelism dies. No matter how hard our pastor tries, he cannot bring people in as fast as they will leave- UNLESS WE HELP HIM! If we are to win the lost, we must win them where they are.

- 6 -

We are challenged to;

Go to one lost person per week Go with a burden for the lost Pray for some individual <u>daily</u>.

Psalms 126:6 tells us "He that goeth forth and weepeth, bearing precious seed, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bearing his sheaves with him". We may have to evangelize differently now, but we still have to do it!

3. Rev. 2:5 indicates that there will be a church when Jesus returns ("Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent"). Just because the Church is built on the Rock (Matt. 16: 17-18), doesn't mean that the individual church cannot die. Several fundamental churches close every hour. If we don't repent of our coldness, God will remove US!

Do we still get thrilled at the thought of a soul being saved? We need to remember that there is someone we can reach, with our personalities, for Christ!

(After Bro. Robert's message, and altar call was given)

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Brief Outline of Bro. Lupe Gonzales' devotion, Saturday, April 20, 1991

Bro. Lupe used Psalms 130 as his text, saying that forgiveness from God is the best news we can have-it means something great, it is appreciated, and it is ours. Only God can bring true forgiveness, because He understands what we need.

When a person is starving or dying, even a piece of moldy bread becomes <u>precious</u>. With God, it doesn't matter who we are-the forgiveness of God is the same, whether we are president or beggar.

The "whosoever" in John 3:16 means <u>us</u>. God delights in giving us mercy-He understands, and He wants to forgive.

The purpose of forgiveness is that we may <u>fear</u> Him. People don't fear God anymore. we need to come to Him now and ask for forgiveness.

II Corinthians 6:2- "(For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the say of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)". TODAY IS THE DAY!

Brief Outline of Bro. Jerry Myers' message-Saturday, April 20, 1991 "Revival, and Lost Opportunities (by the saved and the lost)"

Jeremiah 8:20-"The harvest is past, the summer is ended, and we are not saved", and Jeremiah 7:1-3-"The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord, saying, Stand in the gate of the Lord's house, and proclaim there this word, and say, Hear the word of the Lord, all ye of Judah, that enter in at these gates to worship the Lord. Thus saith the Lord of hosts, the god of Israel, amend your ways and your doings, and I will cause you to dwell in this place".

- 7 -

God is Lord over all of us. Winter will come, and there will be no opportunity for growth (corn can't grow in Winter). We are at the end of Summer in time-people coming to the Lord will be by the "skin of their teeth".

Christians have an incorruptible treasure in Heaven (Bro. Myers referred to the parable of the laborers coming in late and receiving the same wages as those who had worked all day). Those who "come to God's family" late still get blessings like others who served Him for years, but they will admit that they are sorry they waited.

Jeremiah 7:16-"Therefore pray not thou for this people, neither lift up cry nor prayer for them, neither make intercession to me: for I will not hear thee". The "door had shut" on man's opportunity, If God isn't drawing us to an altar of repentance, nothing will happen. Godly sorrow <u>only</u> comes with convicting power.

John 5:28-"Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice"- <u>all dead</u> will hear Christ's voice, and many will be left unsaved.

God is an optimist-we need to be, too. We should never say "that person will never get saved". With that attitude, they <u>never will</u>! Never give up! It isn't easy, but "He that endureth will be saved". He that endureth in his church will see results!

What is the world holding on to, that is worth going to Hell over?

Noah preached for 120 years, and only 8 souls were saved. Even a small congregation still needs to hear God's word preached. Like the parable of the ten virgins-when the door is closed, God won't reopen it.

There will be a lot of "almost" saved people in Hell. The devil himself trembles, but he won't be in Heaven.

Our churches should strive for revival every single service!

No burden = no one saved. No prayers for the pastor = no power. If we will encourage the preacher, we'll "preach him to death" (Bro. Myers related a story about starting a 2-ton truck by building a fire under it to soften the oil). Sometimes preachers get "thick oil". They need encouragement!

We are in a spiritual battle with Satan, but we serve a Savior that has already won the victory. Revelation tells us that we have <u>already won</u> (Christians can "cheat" by reading the ending). We will win the prize if we will stick in the ring with Satan, and not give up!

The Lord is good-He has provided a way for us. When we do what God wants us to do, and we feel his "stamp of approval", He has been good to us and has blessed us.

(The message ended with an altar call-the hymn "Pass Me Not" was played)

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



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Brief outline of Bro Troy Dobbs' message, 10-18-91

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Bro. Dobbs brought his message from 1 Samuel 21:8, emphasizing "the King's business required haste". As David spoke to Abimilech, he mentioned the king so the priest would know that the message was important. The "King's business must be #1 in our lives, today. We need to "live and talk like we've been to Calvary". We need to stay ready to go to Heaven, or we won't be going.

This urgent message from David was received while he was doing his business. sometimes we need to get involved with other things to do the Lord's business.

We can all be subjects in God's kingdom. The word of God tells us that He doesn't want any of us to perish (2 Pe 3:9), that grace appeared to all men (Titus 2:11), and that all souls are God's. He has no pleasure in the death of the wicked (Ezekiel 18:4).

Our King is Jesus! (King of Kings, Lord of Lords-Rev. 19:16). Luke 2:49 tells us that Jesus was "about My Father's business".

What is the King's business? To seek and to save that which is lost (Luke 19:10)

Jesus doesn't save us in our sins, he saves us from our sins. 2 Cor. 5:17 tells us we are a "new creature" (or else we're not saved).

There are 2 phases to the King's business- Provision and Proclaiming.

Provision was made by Jesus (born of a virgin, died a cruel death, did all for us).

Gal 3:13- He redeemed us, by being made a curse for us (just for unjust)

Colossians 1:13- He delivered us from the power of darkness (if we bypass Jesus, we bypass Heaven)

Proclaiming is made by the King's subjects (us)- Acts 1:8 ("Ye shall receive power"). We get one baptism, but many fillings. People need to be told that they are going to Hell without Jesus.

The hour is late-Jesus is coming. We will give an account for what we didn't do. We need to glorify God in all we do (1 Cor 10:31) and not do it for show. Either glorify God, or correst it!

We need to "get with the program". John 15:8 tells us to "bear much fruit". If we don't, we aren't known as a disciple.

Jesus did the work of <u>reconciliation</u> (2 Cor 5:19), we need to do the <u>proclamation</u>. "CAN'T NEVER DID ANYTHING!" We need to proclaim it "with haste" (Ps 119:6) and "to every creature" (Mark 16:25), because of the cries of Hell. Luke 16 is an example to follow. NO man diest to himself (Ro 14:7). The rich was a missionary in Hell. The Bible says more about Hell than Heaven, and it is a real place. The night is coming (John 9:4). When Jesus comes, it will be too late to work. The cults are at work now. there is no better time than the present to win people!

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Brief outline of Jason Balthazor's devotion October 19, 1991

Bro. Balthazor used Genesis 22:1-19 as his text, talking about submitting to the Lord's will.

Abraham's answer in verse 1 was immediate. Sometimes today, we quench the Spirit when we ignore His call or fail to respond immediately. How can we grow in God if we ignore His voice?

In verse 3, Abraham didn't hesitate to act on God's command - he immediately responded by giving back his son.

In verse 8, Abraham told Isaac that God would provide a sacrifice. This demonstrated a leap of faith for him to do this.

In verses 9 and 10, Abraham was ready to obey to the end. He utterly submitted to God's command, ready to pay the price.

In verse 17, Abraham was blessed by faithfulness. So will we if we are obedient to Him and submit to His will. To grow, we must submit. If we shun Him, we are in effect saying "leave me alone - you're not important in my life". He needs to be the most important thing in our lives! If we truly want

strength and courage, God will give it to us.

Brief outline of Tom Hollis' devotion October 19, 1991

Bro. Hollis brought his devotion from 1 Cor. 6:20, rejoicing and glorifying unto God. The Spirit and body are Gods's and we are to use it to glorify the Lord. Many people forget this today.

Ps 113:3 tells us that God's name is to be praised. Sometimes, circumstances might not make us feel like praising the Lord, but if we don't glorify Him, we give Satan the victory.

Matt 5:16 tells us to let our light shine among men. Hiding our light will eventually be our downfall. We need to have a prayerful attitude all day long. Faith has to be in our witness, or no one will believe us.

Even in bad circumstances, there are always things that can be worse. We need to get rid of the continuous "little" sins (that we think are hidden), before they condemn us and we have to account for them.

God's word tells us we are "bought with a price". Jesus paid the price by dying for us on the cross.

We are to "praise God openly" (Bro Hollis related a story of an evil spirit in their house in Arkansas. The family prayed throughout the house and got rid of the demon. God received the glory. On another occasion, the family needed a specific amount to pay a bill. The next day, the exact amount needed to pay the bill was given to them).

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Brief outline of Larry Haggard's Message October 19, 1991

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Bro. Haggard brought his text from Isaiah 6, "a_prime example of worship". With no congregation, no preaching, and little singing, Isaiah still got his prayers answered.

Situation; Isaiah, a prophet, sees a vision of God in His temple. He recalls it as real, lifeike, and vivid. Isaiah talks about the "year King Uzziah died" (probably a lament for a righteous man). The king was dead, but the King of Kings is alive!

1. True worship <u>always talks of the Savior</u> (verse 1 = "I saw the Lord"). We need to exalt the Lord in all parts of worship-lift him up for who he IS! His "train filled the temple" (talking of the <u>totality</u> of God). today, the filled temple is our lives.

The <u>distance</u> between us and God is not the problem - the <u>difference</u> between us is the problem (God is only a prayer away). We are unholy. We need to ask the "holiest of holies" to bring us back.

Verse 5, an example of true worship, humbled Isaiah's heart. God is holy, and we need to live holy lives before Him.

2. True worship <u>always points out our sinfulness</u>. Isaiah was the "best of the blessed", but was still a sinner before God. He "dwelled in the midst of a people of unclean lips". He was casual in his heart concerning God.

We treat God loosely when we get "comfortable, complacent, and condoning". A view of our innermost (and "sinnermost") self makes us realize our sin before God. Sometimes we need a "new touch from the master" (v 6,7)

3. True worship <u>always brings revival</u>

4. True worship propels us to service (verse 8) We have to serve, or worship will end, people will quit being saved, excitement will wane. We need to "enter to worship, depart to serve". We are in a good place to serve God today (little persecution). The rest of the world doesn't have that opportunity.

Isaiah volunteered to go (v 8). Verse 9 (according to Bro Haggard) is interpreted "You're a bunch of blind, dumb people". There are a lot of lost people in the world. we need to go and tell them before its too late.
