COMMITTEE REPORTS

at the lating a particul Resolutions occurves on more energies

- No. 1. Resolved that: Each Mission send in a full report each year of their work and include all sick calls and grocery showers and the cost of grocery showers, also the number of prayer meetings and conversions.
- No. 2. Resolved that: We recommend that each Mission circle have a special visiting committee and that we encourage our Mission workers to go into homes where people cannot go to church and pray with them and make a special effort to get souls saved.
- No.3. Resolved that: We meet at our churches once a year and have a day of prayer for all Missions.
- No. 4. Resolved that: Every Mission band have for their motto: "Salvation of Souls." Second: Visit and provide for the poor and needy. Third: Raising finance for the work.
- No. 5. Resolved that: Our women Mission workers wear their uniforms while in special services and if any member is unable to buy a uniform, that the circle furnish this member with one, and all uniforms be made with long sleeves.
- No. 6. Resolved that: Each Mission have the same order of business as they need in their work each week, and this order of business to be placed in the minutes.
- No. 7. Resolved that: Each Mission meet a week or ten days before our regular Association and make out their report, and we insist that the report be sent to the Association.
- No. 8. Resolved that: Our ministers give a written report of their yearly work at each Association and that this report be listed in our minutes each year.
- No. 9. Resolved that: We include all resolutions passed in our quarterly meetings in associational minutes.
- No. 10. Resolved that: We place the order of business in our minutes.
- No.11. Resolved that: Article No. 6 of our Constitution be changed to read:

"This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association, also meet in regular quarterly meetings and at such quarterly meetings shall have power to transact all business of the Association, except to change the Constitution.

No. 12. Resolved that: Whereas we are in great need of finance for Associational purposes we request each church to send in to Association Treasurer five cents per member for our Associational work.

No. 13. Resolved that: We will not seat any minister in this Association that teaches the baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration or the birth of the Spirit. This is to be added to Article 11 of the By-Laws.

No. 14. Resolved that: Whereas this Association has seen fit to elect an Associational Sunday School Superintendent for the purpose of working with each Sunday school within our bounds, and sponsoring Associational rallies: Be it resolved, that each church give him their full co-operation.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Whereas the Sunday School is the training school for our future church: Be it resolved, that we endorse our denominational literature. Be it further resolved, that our Associational Clerk be instructed to send a copy of this resolution to cur publishing house.

MISSIONS

We, your Committee on Missions, request that the uniforms be all alike and of same materials. That all previous patterns be disregarded and, in order to be uniform, we get our uniforms through the office of our Associational Superintendent and that she also have our emblem on each uniform, and that we still hold to our regular uniform caps, our regular day for Missions and night for programs.

TEMPERANCE

We, your Committee on Temperance, beg leave to report as follows: We believe in being temperate in all things.

We believe intoxicating drink to be one of the worst curses of our nation. It not only robs people of the necessary things of life, but also of their souls. It causes many souls to spend eternity in hell. May we, as Christians, do all we can to be temperate in all things while in this life, that we may spend eternity with God.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience we are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate our union and to maintain a correspondence among our churches.

Therefore we have adopted the following Constitution and By-Laws for our government.

- 1. This shall be called the First Mission Association.
- 2. This Association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches, maintaining Gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this Association.
- 3. The acting members of this Association shall be the ministers, deacons, and the church clerks belonging to any church composing this body, also three delegates from each church chosen by the members of their respective churches.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Board composed of five members. The board members to be elected so as to require one to be elected each year. All officers shall hold office until their successors are elected.
- 5. The property of any church in this Association that should go down until they could not transact business because they are disorganized, shall become the property of this Association and the Executive Board has power to execute legal papers for the property.
- 6. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association, also meet in regular quarterly meetings and at such quarterly meetings shall have power to transact all business of the Association, except to change the Constitution.
- 7. This Association may be called together by the Moderator, by giving the churches ten days' notice of such meetings.
- 8. This Constitution may be changed at any yearly meeting by a two-thirds majority of members voting.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the Association into conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
 - 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
 - 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the Moderator may be overruled by a twothirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. Any minister opposed to any of the enterprises endorsed by this Association will not be entitled to a seat in Conference, and we will not seat any minister in this Association that teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration or the birth of the Spirit.
- 12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 13. At each Association arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
