
YOUTH CAMP AND

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His

will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow-in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and

the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

BY - LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the Association into conference.

2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.

3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.

4. Visiting brethern are invited to seats as advisory

members.

- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflection shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition of motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.

9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when

not carried on in a Christian spirit.

10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled

by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

- 11. Any minister opposed to any of the enterprises endorsed by the Association will not be entitled to a seat in conference and we will not seat any minister in this Association that teaches the baptism of the oly Ghost separate from regeneration or birth of the Spirit.
- 12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church

13. At each Association arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
