RULES GOVERNING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Article I.

This corporation shall be known as The First Mission Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article II.

The principle place of business shall be at Tulsa, but branch churches may be maintained at such other places as the trustees may from time to time determine.

Article III. — Directors

The control of this association shall be vested in a Board of Trustees, composed of five members, each of whom hold membership in said association.

Section 1. The trustees shall be elected by the congregation and shall serve for a period of five years, and until their successors are elected, one of whom shall be elected each year.

Section 2. The trustees shall have general control of the property and business of the Association. They shall elect from their number the following officers to serve one year and until their successors are chosen: President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer; provided, that the offices of the Secretary and Treasurer may be held by the same person. The trustees may appoint such managers of branch churches and departments as may become necessary from time to time.

Section 3. Meetings of the trustees shall be held annually immediately after the annual congregational meeting. At such meetings the trustees shall elect officers for the ensuing year, receive reports of officers, and trans-

act such other business as may come before them. A majority of the trustees shall constitute a quorum, and the votes of a majority of those present shall constitute a binding act of the corporation. Meetings of the trustees may be held either at the principle place of business or at any branch office.

Section 4. The compensation of the officers shall be fixed by the trustees. Vacancies in the Board of Trustees or in any office may be filled by the Board. The Board shall have power to remove an officer by a two-thirds vote of the trustees.

Section 5. Trustees, as such, shall not receive any stated salary for their services, but by resolution of the Board a fixed sum and expenses of attendance, if any, may be allowed for attendance at each regular or special meeting of the board; provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any trustee from serving the corporation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefore.

Section 6. In addition to the powers and authorities by these by-laws expressly conferred upon them, the Board may exercise all such powers of the Ass'n and do all such lawful acts and things as are by statute, or by the certificate of incorporation, or by these by-laws directed or required to be exercised or done by the association.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant. We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid the appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world; from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit," in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of souls, and the conversion of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the Association into conference.

2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.

3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.

4. Visiting brothers are invited to seats as advisory members.

5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflection shall be avoided in all debates.

6. If any proposition of motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.

10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

11. Any minister opposed to any of the enterprises endorsed by the Association will not be entitled to a seat in this conference and we will not seat any minister in this Association who teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration or birth of the Holy Spirit.

12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.

13. At each Association arrangements shall be made to ensure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
