MINUTES OF THE FIRST MISSION ASSOCIATIONAL MEETING:

TUESDAY EVENING

The Thirty Eighth Annual Session of First Mission Association of Free Will Baptists convened at the Old Ministers Home and Camp Ground, August 17, 1965 for the introductory service. The theme "The Sure Foundation" Ephesians 2:20. Rev. John H. West, Moderator in charge.

Special Music: Rev. and Mrs. Ernest Kennedy sang, "I Have Just Heard From Heaven", Mrs. Laverla Nichols, pianist. Congregation was led in the singing of "I Love Him" after which Rev. Ernest Kennedy brought the morning message. Rev. Kennedy used as his text Ephesians 2:15-21. Rev. Homer Young led in Prayer. The theme for the message was "The Church and the Sure Foundation". The message was concluded by the congregation singing "Amazing Grace". Benediction and blessing on noon meal by Rev. N. R. Smith.

We ask the churches to prayerfully consider contributing to a fund whereby prospective Bible College students may make application to aid them in attending Free Will Baptist Bible College or Oklahoma Bible College.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

Partial Report Part #1 Item number 8 of our constitution to read "This association shall not license or ordain any person to the ministry or as a deacon (or accept a minister or deacon from another Association) who has more than one living companion.

Partial Report Part #2 Item number 1. . . Whereas a new constitution has been adopted and no provisions stated guiding the Credential Board. . Be it resolved that this association shall not license, ordain or receive from another association any person to the ministry or as a deacon who has more than one living companion. Item #2. Because of our stand in regards to the separation of church and state be it resolved that we do not use commodities given to us by the state to be used for our Youth Camp.

CREDENTIAL BOARD REPORT

We the Credential Board met at the Silver City Free Will Baptist Church on October 19th. however the men to be examined did not show up and for that reason no business was conducted.

Bailey and found him sound in doctrine of the Free Will Baptists and that he holds credentials with the General Baptist and has a letter of good standing from their association: therefore we recommend that he be received into our association and be ordained as a Free Will Baptist Deacon.

Bro. Harold Day Boston, Owasso Church, was examined and found sound in the Faith of Free Will Baptist and we recommend that he be ordained as a Free Will Baptist Deacon.

PERMANENT RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Be it resolved that all our By-Laws and Resolutions which are now in effect, be printed in our Minutes.
- 2. That hereafter the Nov. Quarterly meeting begin Thursday night before the Third Sunday, because of Thanksgiving Holidays.
- 3. That our Churches not send any Minister up for Ordination until he has been licensed for one year from date of examination.
- 4. That the examination of Candidates for Ordination and License question and answer be recorded and filed with the clerk of the Association.
- 5. That no person can be an active Deacon or Minister in the Association who does not pay and teach tithes.
- 6. That the Letter of all Churches be in the hands of the Assn. Clerk at least one week before conference convenes.
- 7. The Churches having candidates for ordination or license send request to Quarterly Conference in session prior to examination. Examination date to be set at a date between sessions of the Quarterly Conference by the Credential Board.

CONSTITUTION FOR FIRST MISSION ASSOCIATION

Article 1. This yearly meeting or Association shall be called the First Mission Association, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

Article 2. The conference of this Yearly Meeting or Association shall consist of all Ordained Ministers, Ministers Wives, Ordained Deacons and Church Clerks, having been duly accepted by the Association, and delegates from the different Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed, each

Quarterly Meeting being entitled to one delegate, each Quarterly Meeting containing five hundred members to two delegates, and one additional delegate for every additional five hundred members, each church may send three delegates which have been approved by the Quarterly Meeting.

Article 3. The Officers of this Association or Yearly Meeting snall be: (1) a standing clerk and treasurer and a moderator who shall be chosen at every session of the association, with assistants as may be found necessary. (2) A General Board which shall be composed of the executive board of each quarterly meeting. The chairman, clerk and a third member appointed will serve as an executive committee for the General Board. (3) A Trustee Board so elected as to require one to be elected each year. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association and shall sign legal papers when authorized by the association to do so. This board shall consist of not less than five members. This board shall also serve as planning board. (4) Mission Board of not less than three members. This Board will be elected so as to require one to be elected each year. (5) Credential Board of not less than five members. This board will be elected so as for one to be elected each year. This board shall be paid travleing expense and shall meet the last Friday night of each quarter.

Article 4. Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings who will conform to the practice, endorse the enterprises, and prove themselves orthodox in doctrine may at any time on

application by vote of this body, become a member thereof.

Article 5. This yearly meeting or association shall have power to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case to reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

Article 6. The sessions of this Yearly Meeting or Association shall be held annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association. At which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Quarterly Meetings, and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, nor to the practices of the denomination, but such as may in its judgment promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches and Quarterly Meetings within the limits of this Yearly Meeting or Association.

Article 7. This Yearly Meeting or Association shall have the power to adopt any regulations or by-laws, not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its sessions.

Article 8. This Association shall not license, ordain or receive from any other association any person to the ministry or as a deacon who has more than one living companion.

Article 9. This constitution may be altered or amended by a vote of the Yearly Meeting or Association at any regular session: notice of such intended alteration having been given in writing, and recorded at the next previous session.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the Association in to conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
 - 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
 - 7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one will speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian Spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- 11. Any Minister opposed to any of the enterprises, organized Sunday School League, Master's Men, Woman's Auxiliary, endorsed by the Association will not be entitled to a seat in Conference and we will not seat any minister in this association that teaches the Baptist of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration or the birth of the Spirit.
- 12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- 13. At each Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
