Moderator would arrive.

With Larry Tuttle at the piano, Rev. Jim Christian led the congregation in singing "I Will Sing of My Redeemer", "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms", and "Would You Live For Jesus".

Special music was rendered by Cushing First Church. Rev. and Sis. Gallant sang "I Could Never Out Love The Lord", and "The Longer I Serve

Him''. They were accompanied by Sis. Faith Ramer at the piano.

Rev. West introduced Rev. Bert Rogers to introduce the speaker for the

introductory message.

The Speaker, Rev. Lonnie Davoult, State Executive Sec., gave a report on our state work before taking his text from Deut. 6:6-12, and II Tim. 3:14-17, from which he brought an informative and challenging message concerning the subject of: "Proclaim A Jubilee Because Of God's Provision".

Rev. S. L. Gober introduced the speaker for the morning worship hour, Rev. J.A. Franklin, who took his text from II Cor. 11:24-29, and spoke of "Proclaiming A Jubilee Because of God's Protection".

REPORTS

General Board Report

General board meeting was called for March 19, 1977, at Garden Heights Free Will Baptist Church, to organize the Executive Committee of the General Board and audit the Treasurer's books for 1976.

Three members were present. No business was conducted.

Trustee Board Report

The Trustee Board has continued to be very active. This is a hard working group of men for which the chairman has been thankful. We are thankful for the support that is being received for the Camp from our churches. Special thanks is offered to the Rev. and Mrs. Harry Staires. The idea for a Camp Booster Club has been received very well. The Staires family has been very unselfish in laboring for the Lord and our Camp this year. Outstanding work at the camp has been done by Rev. Gene Bishop, Rev. Leon Sheppard, Rev. Ed Jenkins, Rev. Ernest Harrison, Rev. Everett Keiffer, and Rev. Mervin Ramer. Rev. Vernon Smith and Rev. Charles Brazeal have been very helpful, when I called upon them for help at the Camp. Rev. Don Jones will not be serving as chairman in the coming year. So many of you have helped me and I am grateful. Jerry Mills has been the outstanding layman of the Association and he has served in many ways.

The most significant accomplishment this year has been the installation of a diswasher in the kitchen and the refrigeration room addition. All of us are very thankful to the Women's Auxiliary for their support of this project. The camp has passed first class with the Creek County Health Department. New plastic pipe has been installed for the two old wells to the main section

of the camp.

Recommendations

1. That we receive \$3,150.00 from Association Funds for the year of 1978.

2. That one-twelfth (1/12) of that amount be withheld from receipts each month.

This amounts to \$263.00 each month and will make our forwarding

amount to the State Office more consistent.

3. We suggest that the Tabernacle be repaired with a new roof, complete with new 1/2" deck and 240# Asbestos Shingles. The probable cost is about \$3,000.00. This is our suggestion for the Camp Booster Club in the coming year.

Also, for the Camp Booster Club Project of this coming year, we suggest that the wiring be brought up to date in the main Camp, including

Tabernacle, cabins, and caretaker's house.

The item approved by the Association in the last meeting as a supplemental report will be completed as the funds become available. This can probably be taken care of from the regular allocation, providing the Camp Booster Club is successful and each one contributes \$10.00

Namely: "...To make a recreation building of the old girls' dorm (Wooden Dorm). The top will be saved. Pipe supports will be placed to hold up the building. A concrete floor will be poured when funds are available."

Youth Camp Board Report

Your Youth Camp Board met several times this year to plan and evalute our youth camps and teen retreats. Two Teen Retreats were sponsored by this board. The interest and enthusiasm of our young people at these retreats was overwhelming, and our plans are to continue

sponsoring at least two each year. Attendance at the retreats averaged 95 teens and sponsors.

The 1977 Junior and Senior Youth Camps were successful in all areas

again this year.

The Junior Camp had 110 enrolled. Rev. Doyle Baker was the Director and Rev. David Bigger the evangelist. Sister Clara Kennedy and Sister Betty Brooks provided the 11:00 a.m. program each day with their puppet skits and songs. Forty-four young souls were converted at the Junior Camp

this year, which made it the great success it was.

The Teen Camp had 127 enrolled. One-hundred of these were teens. The largest number of high school seniors in recent years attended this year. There were several attending who had already graduated from school, but enjoyed camp so much that some left their jobs to come to Teen Camp. Rev. Don Patton was the Director. Rev. Gene Jackson was the evangelist. Rev. Vernon Smith filled in for Rev. Jackson on Sunday evening. No definite number of first time decisions for Christ are available, but almost every teen left camp more dedicated and enthusiastic about Christian service than when they came.

We wish to thank Rev. Baker and Patton for spending their time and energy as Directors. A special "thank you" goes to Rev. Bigger and Rev. Jackson who so ably served as evangelists. We thank Rev. Vernon Smith for filling in for Bro. Jackson on Sunday night. Again our teaching staff was very capable and eager to serve, and we thank them for taking time out to help. We couldn't have done without our sponsors to help keep things in line. Some of the sponsors served in both camps. We thank all of those who stayed in the dorms with the campers. Sis. Juanita Dobson and Sis. Verla Smith did an outstanding job as our cooks again this year. We also appreciate all the ladies, and some men, who came each day to help prepare and serve the meals.

We would like to give a special thanks to the Women's Auxiliary for their response to the needs in the kitchen. The dishwasher saves about 6 hours per day in washing dishes. The tea towels, cups, and glasses were all needed and used. Thank you, ladies, for your kindness. Thanks also to the Central Area CTS for paper dispensers, brooms, and wastebaskets. Individuals donated much needed refrigerator and washing machine for the cafeteria. Bro. Jerry Mills loaned us his ice maker which saved a lot of

money.

Our costs have increased some this year. We did not choose to get commodities this year, due to the increased demand the government is putting on church camps who do. We felt it was worth the additional cost to retain full control of our camp. Our insurance increased, and of course food prices have increased some since last year. Even with these increases we anticipate being able to give the general treasure some profits this year.

Our camp was inspected by the County Health Department and given a report with no complaint whatsoever. We received the highest rating of any

of the 6 camps in the county.

Some of the needs we see now are an ice-maker, a large electric grill, a clothes dryer, more chairs, floor covering for kitchen area, an upright freezer, and recreational equipment.

We thank you for allowing us to serve you and our youth.

Constitution and By-Laws

of the

Ministers and Deacons Conference

of

FIRST MISSION ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

CONSTITUTION Article 1

This conference shall be called the First Mission Association of Free Will Baptist, Ministers and Deacons Conference, it shall be composed of ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers and Deacons who are regular members of Free Will Baptist Church in good standing with the First Mission Associstion, and who have paid ther annual dues of \$2.00.

Article 2

The Officers of this conference shall be: President, Vice President, Clerk-Treasurer and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer, all who shall be elected annually in November.

Article 3

This Conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

Article 4

Every Ordained minister and deacon should be a member of this conference and report at each session in person or by letter. Every member shall be required to carry a card of identification from this conference, this card shall be issued annually.

Article 5

This Conference shall meet quarterly in November, February, May, and July, on the first Thursday night of the month.

Article 6

The Credentials Committee shall be composed of three members elected annually, they shall serve with the Officers of the Conference and the Pastor of the host church to plan the program for the meeting.

Article 7

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

BY-LAWS OF MINISTERS AND DEACONS CONFERNCE

Article 1.

The clerk or assistant clerk or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers and deacons into conference. If a quorum of 15 is present the President, or in his absence the Vice President, shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these is present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

Article 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers and the deacons of the conference. Ministers and Deacons shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionabel representation the case under question shall be referred to the credentials committee.

Article 3

It shall be the duty of each minister and deacon belonging to this conference, to be active (disabled and retired.) Any minister or deacon belonging to this conference is expected to report at each session in person or by letter.

Article 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and the session shall be closed with prayer.

Article 5

Roberts Rules of Order shall govern all business procedure.

Article 6

These by-laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of members present.



Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conference, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able to promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligation, and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth

as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, the support of missions, the success of Sunday School and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Permanent Resolutions

1. Be it resolved that all our By-Laws and Resolutions which are now in effect, be printed in our Minutes.

2. That our Churches not send any Minister up for Ordination until

he has been licensed for one year from date of examination.

That the examination of candidates for Ordination and License question and answer be recorded and filed with the Associational Clerk.

4. That no person can be an active Deacon or Minister in the Asso-

ciation who does not pay and teach tithes.

- 5. That the letter of all Quarterly Meetings be in the hands of the Associational Clerk at least one week before conference convenes.
- 6. The churches having candidates for ordination or license or ratification send request to Quarterly Conference in session prior to examination.
- 7. That all of our Churches use the letter forms furnished by our Clerk.
- 8. That since we have grown to such proportions, and the demands of service are heavy, that no member of this Association be permitted or required to serve on more than one board at any time.

That no Minister be received into the Association from another Denomination or Association unless accompanied by a letter or recom-

mendation.

- 10. That the Moderator with his Assistant appoint all committees.
- 11. That the Treasurer be in charge of all insurance business.
- 12. That the Associational Moderator be Chairman of the General Board.
- 13. That no ordained Minister or Deacon be recognized as active in the Association until they have appeared before the Credential Board.
 - 14. That the First Mission Association have a printed program.
- 15. That the Associational Officers serve as the Associational Pro-Program Planning Committee.

Articles of Faith

1. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infalliable Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice. II Timothy 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21.

2. That there is but one true and living God and in the God Head of Divine Essence, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Gen. 17:1, I John 5:7.

3. That we are fallen and depraved creatures and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature. Eph. 5:1-19.

4. That salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are by life, death, resurrection, ascension and intercession of

our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Acts 4:12; Titus 3:5.

- 5. That the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal. Matt. 25:46.
- 6. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation. Mark 13:13, Rev. 2:10.
- 7. Baptism (the immersion of believers in water), the Lord's Supper and Feet Washing are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers at night, is followed by the ordinance of feet washing, which teaches humility, of universal obligation, to be practiced by all believers. Baptism: Matt. 28:19; Col. 2:12. Lord's Supper: Mark 14:17; Matt. 36:34; I Cor. 11:23,34; Feet Washing: John 13:4,5; I Timothy 6:10.

8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week or the Lord's Day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in public worship of God, and that on it, we should abstain from our worldly concerns except in cases of Necessity and mercy. Ex. 31:15; Deut. 5:12; Matt. 12:12.

9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both the just and unjust, but every one in his own order; those who have done evil to the resurrection of damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. I Cor. 15:34, John 5:28; I Thes. 3:16.

10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to singly

engage to promote the honor of God. John 13:35; Gal. 6:10.

11. We believe that Jesus Christ, by grace of God, tasted death for every man; yet none can partake of His divine benefit only by His repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, infants and idiots excepted. Acts 20:21; I Tim. 2:5-6; John 3:14-16; I Peter 3:21.

12. We believe that the Lord's people are one in Him, and therefore

should be one at His table. I Cor. 1:1-11, 27-28; John 17:11.

Constitution for First Mission Association

Article 1. This yearly meeting or Association shall be called the First Mission Association, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

Article 2. The Conference of this yearly meeting of association shall consist of all Ordained Ministers, Ministers wives, Ordained Deacons, Church Clerks and three elected delegates from all duly organized Free Will Baptist's Churches from each Quarterly Meeting of the First Mission Association. Each church shall represent by letter.

Article 3. The officers of this Association or Yearly Meeting shall be: (1) A standing clerk and treasurer and a moderator who shall be chosen at every session of the Association, with assistants as may be found necessary. (2) The Associational General Board shall be composed of the Associational Officers, the Chairman of Each Quarterly Meeting Board, and the Chairman of the Associational Boards. The Association Moderator, Clerk, and three members to be elected from the General Board shall compose the Associational Executive Committee. (3) A Trus-

tee Board so elected as to require two to be elected each year. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association and shall sign legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so. This board shall consist of not less than ten members. This Board shall also serve as planning board. (4) All Associational Boards to be paid traveling expense at the rate of fifteen cents per mile.

Article 4. Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings who will conform to the practice, endorse the enterprises, and prove themselves orthodox in doctrine may at any time on application by vote of this body, become a member thereof.

Article 5. This Yearly Meeting or Association shall have power to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case to reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

Article 6. The sessions of this Yearly Meeting or Association shall be held annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association. At which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Quarterly Meetings or churches and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, nor to the practices of the demonination, but such as may in their judgment promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches and quarterly meetings within the limits of this yearly meeting or association.

Article 7. This Yearly Meeting or Association shall have the power to adopt any regulations or by-laws, not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its sessions.

Article 8. This Association shall not license, ordain or receive from any other association any person to the ministry or as a deacon who has more than one living companion.

Let it be known also, that any ordained personel in the Association who shall remarry and have two living companions shall forfiet his credentials. Let it also be known, if they marry someone with a living companion, they forfiet their credentials.

Article 9. This constitutionmay be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-third (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

By-Laws

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the Association in to conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
 - 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
 - 7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one will speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian Spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- 11. Any Minister opposed to any of the enterprises, organized Sunday School, C. T. S., Master's Men, Woman's Auxiliary, endorsed by the Association will not be entitled to a seat in Conference and we will not seat any minister in this association that teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration of the birth of the Spirit.
- 12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- 13. At each Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
