

The General board met on July 10, 1979 at the campground to plan the program for the yearly meeting.

Budget committee met on July 10, 1979 at the campground to hear the Treasurer's report for 1979 and propose a budget for 1980.

TRUSTEE BOARD REPORT

The Trustee Board met 4 times during the year, taking care of the upkeep of the campground. Some of the work done through the year was repairing old girls dorm for recreation room, tied all 3 wells together, fixed trailer hook-ups, done some electrical work, hooked up vent in kitchen, replace pump, replaced dishwasher motor, bought riding lawn mower, installed speakers in tabernacle.

We would ask everyone who can or will help work at the campground every Tuesday and Saturday. Lightning struck the southwest corner of the dining room, received from insurance company \$824.73 for lightning stricking pump and storm damage to kitchen roof.

Many items of business for the improvement of the compground were discussed and approved.

- 1. We the trustee Board recommed to the First Mission Association that all money received from rent of campground, be used by the trustee board for upkeep of campground and retirement of indebtness.
- 2. We the trustee board recommend 4 feet chain link fence put up around cemetery. Amendment to include any portion of land agreeded upon by trustee board.
- 3. We the trustee board recommend that we hire the Vo-Tech School to bury existing garbage and provide a sanitary landfill. Clean the small pond and dig a large pond with the idea of using for swimming, ammendment added that the trustee board check further into this matter including pump, filtering system, and whatever to make it sanitary be included.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Reaffirmation of Stand

Whereas,

The spread of liberal thinking has influenced many church people across America; and

Whereas,

The constituency of this denomination is a grass roots people across America; and

Whereas.

The spiritual well-being of our people is threatened by the spread of a humanistic philosophy as propagated by a dominately liberal media, a humanistic educational system and many governmental agencies; therefore,

Be it resolved:

That the National Association of Free Will Baptists reafirm its position opposing the following:

1) abortion on demand, 2) homosecuality, 3) religious cults, 4) the charismatic movement, and 5) the Equal Rights Amendment.

Be if further resolved:

That the pastors and leaders of our denomination be urged to inform their people through teaching and preaching on these important issues and to avail themselves of the materials availabel through the Comission of Theological Liberalism.

2. Separation of Church and State

Whereas,

There is an increasing threat to the historic and constitutional principle of separation of church and state; and

Whereas.

This threat is becoming more and more evident by the pressures being exerted on churches in their various ministries, such as the Christian

day school ministry, through local, state, and federal governments; and Whereas.

Legal decisions related to this principle are being considered at the present time and at varying levels and in the courfs of our land; therefore,

Be it resolved:

That the National Association of Free Will Baptists go on record as supporting the constitutional principle of separation of church and state and the biblical principle of rendering unto Caesar the things that are Caesar's and encourage our churches and pastors to continue to stand against the intrusion of the government in the affairs of the church.

3. Support of Religious Enterprises

Whereas,

An increading number of religious programs, personalities and institutions are drawing the support of Free Will Baptists; and

Whereas,

Some of these teach viewpoints and use methods of raising money that are inconsistent with biblical standards; therefore

Be ir resolved:

That the National Association of Free Will Baptists encourage pastors to warn their congregations against supporting such.

4. Equal Right Amendment

Whereas,

The so-called "Equal Rights Amendment" failed to be ratified by the original ratification deadline of March 22, 1979, and;

Whereas.

The refusal of the number of states required to ratify the amendment in the allotted time evidently speaks the will of the people, and;

Whereas,

Five states since their original ratification of the amendment have rescinded their previous action, and;

Whereas,

Free Will Baptists have believed from the very inception of the "Equal Rights Amendment" that the passage of the amendment would serve no good purpose for our womanhood, but would rather serve to affect our nation in an adverse way politically and morally, and;

Whereas.

The 40,000 member "National Women's Political Caucus" has requested a summit meeting at Camp David with President Carter to discuss the "Equal Rights Amendment", therefore,

Be it resolved:

- 1. That the 250,000 member National Association of Free Will Baptists go on record opposing the summit meeting proposed by the 40,000 member National Women's Political Caucus.
- If indeed, President Carter grants the proposed summit, that this body shall expect a similar summit for all opponents to the "Equal Rights Amendment" so that all views may be thoroughly heard and considered.
- 3. That this 250,000 member body again go on record as opposing the

ratification of the "Equal Rights Amendment".

4. That we go on record as opposing the president's influence being exerted for the passage of the "Equal Rights Amendment" inasmuch as it is his responsibility to fairly consider all segments of our society and not just small interest groups.

5. That a copy of this resolution be telegraphed to both the president and vice-president of the United States and be given to all interested

news agencies immediately.

- 6. That inasmuch as we hold this is definitely a moral issue that we actively engage in attempting to influence our legislators of vote against the ratification of the "Equal Rights Amendment" on both state and national levels.
- 2. Be it resolved that the First Mission Association obtain Free Will Baptist Hymnals for the campground.
- 3. Be it resolved that the First Mission Association of Free Will Baptists believe in the Diety of Jesus Christ, and whereas we believe in the purity and sinless life of Jesus Christ, be it resolved that the film which display Jesus Christ as a Homesexual that is being considered to be produced be objected to by this body. Be it further resolved, that a letter stating the same be sent to Modern People News, advising them of our objection.
- 4. Whereas the common goals of the Tulsa Area Quarterly Meeting and the Central Area Quarterly Meeting are the same: Proclamation of the Gospel, Evangelism of the world, Futherance of the kingdom of God, Commonwelth of the Free Will Baptist Denomination and Whereas the two Quarterly meeting comprise the First Mission Association of Free Will Baptist.

Whereas the margin for mis-communication would be eliminated and the fellowship of the brethren would be greatly enlarged, be it further resolved that the two Executive Boards or committees of the Quarterly Meeting meet as required to work out details such as monies, legal matter, etc., and report to Quarterly Meeting and be it further resolved that these two committees after Godly deliberations call a special meeting of the First Mission Association to finalize this item of business.

5. Be it resolved that all boards and committees give annual statistical report including finance, pertaining to their areas of work.

There were 50 present representing 12 local auxiliaries. The theme for our meeting was "Knowing and Growing," Ephesians 4-15b.

Rev. David Bigger Pastor of Ponca City brought as inspiring message for our worship service.

During our business session we voted to:

- 1. Give \$50.00 to Rev. David Bigger Family for school supplies.
- 2. That local auxiliary give honor to women 70 years and older.
- 3. That each local auxiliary give their Thanksgiving offering to the Rev. David Bigger Account to help them become self-supporting.
- 4. MMSC that we fix the ice-maker out of the \$310.00 and the balance will be applied towards a commercial mixer.

Constitution and By-Laws

of the

Ministers and Deacons Conference

of

FIRST MISSION ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

CONSTITUTION Article 1

This conference shall be called the First Mission Association of Free Will Baptist, Ministers and Deacons Conference, it shall be composed of ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers and Deacons who are regular members of Free Will Baptist Church in good standing with the First Mission Association, and who have paid ther annual dues of \$2.00.

Article 2

The Officers of this conference shall be: President, Vice President, Clerk-Treasurer and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer, all who shall be elected annually in November.

Article 3

This Conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

Article 4

Every Ordained minister and deacon should be a member of this conference and report at each session in person or by letter. Every member shall be required to carry a card of identification from this conference, this card shall be issued annually.

Article 5

This Conference shall meet quarterly in November, February, May, and July, on the first Thursday night of the month.

Article 6

The Credentials Committee shall be composed of three members elected annually, they shall serve with the Officers of the Conference and the Pastor of the host church to plan the program for the meeting.

Article 7

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

BY-LAWS OF MINISTERS AND DEACONS CONFERNCE

Article 1.

The clerk or assistant clerk or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers and deacons into conference. If a quorum of 15 is present the President, or in his absence the Vice President, shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these is present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

Article 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers and the deacons of the conference. Ministers and Deacons shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionabel representation the case under question shall be referred to the credentials committee.

Article 3

It shall be the duty of each minister and deacon belonging to this conference, to be active (disabled and retired.) Any minister or deacon belonging to this conference is expected to report at each session in person or by letter.

Article 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and the session shall be closed with prayer.

Article 5

Roberts Rules of Order shall govern all business procedure.

Article 6

These by-laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of members present.



Church Covenant

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conference, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able to promote the success of the church and of the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligation, and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprise, the support of missions, the success of Sunday School and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Permanent Resolutions

1. Be it resolved that all our By-Laws and Resolutions which are now in effect, be printed in our Minutes.

2. That our Churches not send any Minister up for Ordination until

he has been licensed for one year from date of examination.

3. That the examination of candidates for Ordination and License question and answer be recorded and filed with the Associational Clerk.

4. That no person can be an active Deacon or Minister in the Asso-

ciation who does not pay and teach tithes.

5. That the letter of all Quarterly Meetings be in the hands of the

Associational Clerk at least one week before conference convenes.

- 6. The churches having candidates for ordination or license or ratification send request to Quarterly Conference in session prior to examination.
- 7. That all of our Churches use the letter forms furnished by our Clerk.
- 8. That since we have grown to such proportions, and the demands of service are heavy, that no member of this Association be permitted or required to serve on more than one board at any time.

That no Minister be received into the Association from another Denomination or Association unless accompanied by a letter or recom-

mendation.

10. That the Moderator with his Assistant appoint all committees.

11. That the Treasurer be in charge of all insurance business.

- 12. That the Associational Moderator be Chairman of the General Board.
- 13.—That-no-ordained-Minister or Deacon be recognized as active in the Association until they have appeared before the Credential Board.

14. That the First Mission Association have a printed program.

15. That the Associational Officers serve as the Associational Pro-Program Planning Committee.

16. That no two persons from the same church be elected to serve on the same board of this association.

Articles of Faith

1. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infalliable Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice. II Timothy 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21.

2. That there is but one true and living God and in the God Head of

Divine Essence, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Gen. 17:1, I John 5:7.

3. That we are fallen and deprayed creatures and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature. Eph. 5:1-19.

4. That salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are by life, death, resurrection, ascension and intercession of

our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Acts 4:12; Titus 3:5.

5. That the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal. Matt. 25:46.

6. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation. Mark 13:13, Rev. 2:10.

7. Baptism (the immersion of believers in water), the Lord's Supper and Feet Washing are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers at night, is followed by the ordinance of feet washing, which teaches humility, of universal obligation, to be practiced by all believers. Baptism: Matt. 28:19; Col. 2:12. Lord's Supper: Mark 14:17; Matt. 36:34; I Cor. 11:23,34; Feet Washing: John 13:4.5; I Timothy 6:10.

8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week or the Lord's Day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in public worship of God, and that on it, we should abstain from our worldly concerns except in

cases of Necessity and mercy. Ex. 31:15; Deut. 5:12; Matt. 12:12.

9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both the just and unjust, but every one in his own order; those who have done evil to the resurrection of damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. I Cor. 15:34, John 5:28; I Thes. 3:16.

10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to singly

engage to promote the honor of God. John 13:35; Gal. 6:10.

11. We believe that Jesus Christ, by grace of God, tasted death for every man; yet none can partake of His divine benefit only by His repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, infants and idiots excepted. Acts 20:21; I Tim. 2:5-6; John 3:14-16; I Peter 3:21.

12. We believe that the Lord's people are one in Him, and therefore

should be one at His table. I Cor. 1:1-11, 27-28; John 17:11.

Constitution for First Mission Association

Article 1. This yearly meeting or Association shall be called the First Mission Association, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well-disciplined Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

Article 2. The Conference of this yearly meeting of association shall consist of all Ordained Ministers, Ministers wives, Ordained Deacons, Church Clerks and three elected delegates from all duly organized Free Will Baptist's Churches from each Quarterly Meeting of the First Mission Association. Each church shall represent by letter.

Article 3. The officers of this Association or Yearly Meeting shall be: (1) A standing clerk and treasurer and a moderator who shall be chosen at every session of the Association, with assistants as may be found necessary. (2) The Associational General Board shall be composed of the Associational Officers, the Chairman of Each Quarterly Meeting Board, and the Chairman of the Associational Boards. The Association Moderator, Clerk, and three members to be elected from the General Board shall compose the Associational Executive Committee. (3) A Trus-

tee Board so elected as to require two to be elected each year. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association and shall sign legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so. This board shall consist of not less than ten members. This Board shall also serve as planning board. (4) All Associational Boards to be paid traveling expense at the rate of fifteen cents per mile.

Article 4. Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Quarterly Meetings who will conform to the practice, endorse the enterprises, and prove themselves orthodox in doctrine may at any time on application by vote of this body, become a member thereof.

Article 5. This Yearly Meeting or Association shall have power to discipline the Quarterly Meetings of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case to reverse their decisions, nor to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

Article 6. The sessions of this Yearly Meeting or Association shall be held annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association. At which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective Quarterly Meetings or churches and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, nor to the practices of the demonination, but such as may in their judgment promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches and quarterly meetings within the limits of this yearly meeting or association.

Article 7. This Yearly Meeting or Association shall have the power to adopt any regulations or by-laws, not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its sessions.

Article 8. This Association shall not license, ordain or receive from any other association any person to the ministry or as a deacon who has more than one living companion. Let it be known also, that any ordained personel in the Association who shall remarry and have two living companions shall forfiet his credentials. Let it also be known, if they marry someone with a living companion, they forfiet their credentials.

Article 9. This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-third (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

By-Laws

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the Association in to conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
 - 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
 - 7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one will speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian Spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- 11. Any Minister opposed to any of the enterprises, organized Sunday School, C. T. S., Master's Men, Woman's Auxiliary, endorsed by the Association will not be entitled to a seat in Conference and we will not seat any minister in this association that teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration of the birth of the Spirit.
- 12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- 13. At each Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
