

## **CHURCH COVENANT**

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

## **ARTICLES OF FAITH**

- **1.** *The Bible*. The Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.
- **2. God.** There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and Righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.
- **3. Christ.** Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our ever present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. The Holy Spirit. The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.
- **5. The Government of God.** God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.
- **6. The Sinfulness of Man.** Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherits a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- **7. The Work of Christ.** The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free, and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are:(1) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it. (2) Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith, the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin, and becomes a child of God (3) Continuance of faith and obedience unto death.

- **9. Election.** God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence, by faith in Christ men become His elect.
- 10. Freedom of the Will. The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit, or to resist them and perish.
- **11. Salvation Free**. God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- **12. Perseverance.** All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.
- **13. Gospel Ordinances**. BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are the ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel. FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility, is of universal obligation, and is to be ministered to all true believers.
- **14. Tithing.** God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store, as God hath prospered him" (1 Cor. 16:2a).
- **15.** The Christian Sabbath. The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements, for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- **16.** Resurrection, Judgment, and Final Retribution. The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. Those who have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life.

## Constitution and By-Laws Of the First Mission Association of Free Will Baptist

## **Constitution**

Article 1. This Association shall be called the First Mission Association, and shall be composed of such regularly organized and well disciplined Free Will Baptist Churches, conveniently located, as may embody themselves under this constitution.

Article 2. The Conference of this Association shall consist of all Ordained Ministers, Ministers wives, Ordained Deacons, Church Clerks, and three delegates from all duly organized Free Will Baptist Churches of the First Mission Association. Each church shall represent by letter.

Article 3. The officers of this Association shall be: (1) A standing clerk and treasurer and a moderator who shall be chosen at the yearly session of the Association, with assistants as may be found necessary. (2) The Associational General Board shall be composed of the Association Officers and the Chairman of the Associational Boards. The Association Moderator, Clerk and the Chairman of the Associational Boards shall compose the Associational Executive Committee. (3) A Trustee Board so elected as to require two to be elected each year. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association and shall sign legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so. This board shall consist of no less that ten members. This board shall also serve as planning board. (4) All Association Boards to be paid traveling expenses at the current allowable rate of the IRS.

Article 4. Any well organized and well regulated Free Will Baptist Church who will conform to the practice, endorse the enterprises, and prove themselves orthodox in doctrine may at any time on application by vote of this body, become a member thereof.

Article 5. This Association shall have power to discipline the Churches of which it is composed and to exclude them for disorderly walk if labor proves unsuccessful, but in no case to reverse their decisions, not to interfere with any of their internal regulations.

Article 6. The sessions of this Association shall be held quarterly on the Saturday following the second Sunday of February, May, August, and November and the place shall be decided upon by the Association. At which time the Association shall act upon such questions and topics as may be referred to it by its respective churches and transact such other business not repugnant to this constitution, nor to the practices of the denomination, but such as may in their judgment promote the cause of Christ and the interest of the churches within the limits of this Association.

Article 7. This Association shall have the power to adopt and regulations or by-laws, not inconsistent with this constitution, which may be deemed essential to the further regulation of its sessions.

Article 8. This Association shall not license, ordain or receive from any other association any person to the ministry or as a deacon who has more than one living wife. Let it be known also, that any ordained personnel in the Association who shall remarry and have two living wives shall forfeit his credentials. Let it also be known, if they marry someone with a living companion, they shall forfeit their credentials.

Article 9. This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the members present and voting, provided proposed amendment of alteration be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

**Article 10.** Any church of the Association which does not send in their letters of report filled out and does not pay the associational dues for one year shall be dropped from the membership of the Association.

## **Permanent Resolutions**

- 1. Be it resolved that all our By-laws and Resolutions which are now in effect be printed in our minutes.
- 2. That our churches not send any Minister up for Ordination until he has been licensed for one year from date of examination.
- **3.** That the examination of candidates for Ordination and License question and answer be recorded and filed with the Associational Clerk.

- **4.** That no person can be an active Deacon or Minister in the Association who does not pay and teach tithes.
- **5**. That the letter of all Churches be in the hands of the Associational Clerk at least one week before conference convenes.
- 6. That all of our Churches use the letter forms furnished by our clerk.
- 7. That all the churches having candidates for ordination or license or ratification send request to the Association in
- **8.** That since we have grown to such proportions, and the demands of service are heavy, that no member of this Association be permitted or required to serve on more than one board at any one time.
- **9.** That no Minister be received into the Association from another Denomination or Association unless accompanied by a letter of recommendation.
- 10. That the Moderator with his Assistant appoints all committees.
- 11. That the Treasurer be in charge of all insurance business.
- 12. That the Associational Moderator be Chairman of the General Board.
- **13.** That no Ordained Minister or Deacon be recognized as active in the Association until a recommendation had been received from the Credential Board and approved by the Association.
- **14.** That the First Mission Association have a printed program.
- 15. That the Associational Officers serve as the Associational Program Planning Committee.
- **16**. That no two persons from the same church be elected to serve on the same board of this association, with the exception of the Trustee Board which may have two persons from the same church.
- **17.** That the Credential Board be urged to act as quickly as possible on candidates for license or ordination. Be it further resolved that if the board cannot reach a decision at the Association, that they be allowed to wait three months.
- 18. That no one be licensed or ordained by First Mission Association who uses tobacco and no one will be accepted as a Deacon or Minister into this Association who uses tobacco.

- **19.** That sister churches which withdraw fellowship from the Association because of failure to meet requirements of good standing as prescribed by the Association not be accepted back into fellowship until such time as a church acknowledge the error of their way, and agree to abide by the Executive Boards recommendation as approved by the Association.
- **20.** That no church, no Preacher, or Deacon be voted on or accepted into this Association unless they are present at that meeting with a petitionary letter and recommendation from the Credential Board unless excused by the Credential Board.
- **21.** That licensed ministers by actively involved in pastoral or evangelistic ministry before being approved for ordination.
- **22.** That this Association faithfully adopts and follows the Free Will Baptist Treatise as is currently published by the National Association of Free Will Baptists.
- **23.** That this Association has the explicit authority to discipline, reprimand or withdraw fellowship from churches that call and or retain pastors who will not appear before the Credential Board or who, for doctrinal, moral, spiritual, or non-recommendation reasons cannot be recognized or accepted into our fellowship.
- 24. That Roberts Rules of Order be our guide and directive in conducting business.
- **25.** That our Pastors not attending our Associational meetings be strongly encouraged to attend all meetings as possible, since this is a part of the work of the lord.
- 26. That we give a standing vote of thanks to the Host Church for the meal and hospitality.

## **BY-LAWS**

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest Minister present, shall call the Association into conference.
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- **3.** Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- **6.** I any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points; it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
- 7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
- No one will speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the Moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian Spirit.
- **10.** The ruling of the Moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
- 11. Any Minister opposed to any of the enterprises, organized Sunday School, CTS, Master's Men, Woman's Auxiliary, endorsed by the Association will not by entitled to a seat in Conference and we will not seat any Minister in this Association that teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghost separate from regeneration of the birth of the Spirit.
- **12.** No question from any church shall come under consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- **13.** At each Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
