The financial condition of the churches is generally good, and the income is sufficient to meet the needs of the church and its various departments. The churches are well equipped with modern buildings and have a large number of members. The income is derived from the contributions of the members and the sale of the church property. The churches are well managed and the financial condition is sound.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and adopted the Work of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, and from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences; public worship; and the observance of the ordinance of the gospel, not fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bond of peace, to be careful for one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able to promote the success of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions and the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the

world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Bible: The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God, and are infallible rule of faith and practice.

2. God. There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver, and righteous Governor of the Universe; and in the scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore, and obey.

3. Christ. Christ is God manifest in the flesh; in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our present Savior and Lord.

4. The Holy Spirit. The scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God.

5. The government of God. God exercises a wise and benevolent proficience over all beings and all things by manifesting the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the highest welfare of men requires.

6. The Sinfulness of Man. Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability sin, and become guilty before God.

7. The Work of Christ. The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. The Terms of Salvation. The conditions of salvation are:

1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it.

2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God.

3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. Election: God determined from the beginning to save who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ men become His elect.

10. Freedom of the Will: The human will is free and is self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the spirit, or to resist them and perish.

11. Salvation Free: God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. Perseverance: All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have promise of eternal salvation.

13. Gospel Ordinances: BAPTISM, or the immersion of believers in water, and the LORD'S SUPPER, are ordinances to be perpetrated under the Gospel; FEET WASHING, an ordinance teaching humility, Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23) and of universal obligation, and to be ministered to all true believers.

14. Tithing: God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament. The Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (Cor. 16:2).

15. The Christian Sabbath: The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employments and amusements for rest, worship, holy works, and activities, and for personal communion with God.

16. Resurrection, Judgment and Final Retribution. The scriptures teach the resurrection of all men on the

last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence the oldest minister present, shall call the association into conference.

2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.

3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such a quorum is present.

4. Visiting brethren are invited to sit as advisory member.

5. Those who speak shall arise and address the moderator. Personal relections shall be avoided in all debates.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and a vote taken on the separate parts.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded unless it is on a question previously tabled.

8. No one shall speak more than once on the same subject without special permission of the moderator.

9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.

10. The ruling of the moderator may be over-ruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.

11. At each meeting of the association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises, each day.

First New Mexico Association

FREE WILL BAPTIST

-PREAMBLE-

From experience, we, the members of the Churches of God and Christ, commonly known as Free Will Baptist, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group which desires to support and promote every phase of our State and National Enterprises, do hereby ordain this Constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better Association government.

ARTICLE I

Name

This organization shall be known as the First New Mexico Association of Free Will Baptist of New Mexico.

ARTICLE II

Section 1: The purpose of this Association shall be to bring into a union such churches of New Mexico as desire the enterprises of the State of New Mexico and National Association.

Section 2: It shall not be the purpose of this Association to usurp authority over the churches, but to recommend such measures as would promote the unity of action among the churches, to harmonize the efforts of individual churches among each other in their efforts to accomplish good, and make each other more

proficient in their undertakings to advance the cause of Christ.

ARTICLE III

Membership

Section 1: This Association shall be composed of churches commonly known as Free Will Baptist, who maintain gospel order, and shall subscribe to the Constitution and By-Laws and Articles of Faith as adopted by this said Association.

Section 2: Any church desiring membership in this Association shall agree to contribute to the associational and denominational enterprises a minimum of ten percent of its gross income. This amount is to be paid monthly to the associational treasurer, and any church which shall be delinquent three months in paying its tithes shall not be considered in good fellowship, nor have voting rights in the association until its arrears are made up.

Section 3: All duly constituted churches may be received into this association by their messengers presenting a petitionary letter from their respective churches, if they shall be found orderly and orthodox. Such reception shall be manifested by the moderator, or his assistant, giving the right hand as a token of fellowship.

ARTICLE IV

Representation

Section 1: Standing delegates to this association shall be ordained ministers, ministers' wives, ordained deacons, church clerks, and church treasurers who are members of churches in good standing in this association.

Section 2: In addition each church shall represent by sending five delegates to each meeting of the asso-

Section 2: In addition each church shall represent by sending five delegates to each meeting of the association. The church may elect one alternate for each delegate, who will be seated in the absence of the regular delegate.

Section 3: Each church shall send a letter to the associational clerk at least ten days before the time set for the regular meeting of the association. These letters shall set forth the names of the delegates and alternates; and the names of ministers and deacons belonging to the church. These letters shall be written on the forms provided by this association.

ARTICLE V

Officers

The officers of this association shall consist of a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a promotional secretary-treasurer. They shall be elected annually at the close of the yearly meeting, and shall act as a program committee to plan the programs of all meetings of the association.

ARTICLE VI

Section 1: The standing boards of this association shall consist of three members each, having staggered terms, so that one member is elected each year at the close of the annual association.

These boards shall be as follows:

- a. The Executive Board
- b. The Credential Board
- c. The Board of Trustees
- d. The Superannuation Board
- e. The Christian Board
- f. The Missions Board

The association shall pay travel expense of members on these boards when engaged on association business.

iness; the amount of reimbursement shall be set by the association.

Section 2: The Executive Board shall act for the association when the association is not in session, and render a report to each sitting of the association for approval or rebuke.

Section 3: The Credential Board shall examine candidates for licensing or ordination, and shall pass on all ministers and deacons coming into this association. This board shall also review every minister and deacon belonging to this association every three years and report its findings to the association for action.

This association shall adopt a set of rules for this board, and a set of questions for examining candidates, and the clerk of the board shall keep a file of all persons examined.

Section 4: The Board of Trustees shall receive and assign all associational property as directed by the association.

Section 5: The Superannuation Board shall plan programs for the aged ministers of this association, and in cooperation with the State and National programs.

Section 6: The Christian Education Board shall oversee the Sunday School League, and other Christian Education programs of the Association, and shall cooperate with the State and National programs.

Section 7: The Missions Board shall be responsible for the extension of the Free Will Baptist work in New Mexico and, in cooperation with the State and National programs, "to the uttermost parts of the earth."

Section 8: Other Boards and Committees may be chosen as needed.

ARTICLE VII

Discipline

Section 1: This association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine, or

practice that may properly come before it from any of the churches; or act upon any appeal that may be made at any of these meetings.

Section 2: All appeals coming before this association may be settled in any of the following ways:

(a) By this association when sitting as a committee as a whole; (b) By a special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

Section 3: No question shall be received by the association from any church unless it has been acted upon in said church, and cannot be settled, in which association shall take up same and act upon it.

ARTICLE VIII

Meetings

Section 1: This body shall meet quarterly, dates and places to be set by the association or its designated representatives.

Section 2: At each meeting of the association the body shall conduct all necessary business, receive reports, pass on credentials or persons who shall come before it, buy or sell property, and in general conduct any business which may come before it.

Section 3: The officers of this association shall be elected annually, but pro-tem officers may be elected at any sitting of the association in the absence of the regular officers. In the event any officers or board member moves out of the jurisdiction of this association he may be replaced at any sitting of the association for the unexpired term.

Section 4: Questions of deliberations shall be governed by Robert's Rules of Order, and parliamentarian shall be appointed for each meeting of the association.

ARTICLE IX

Amendments

This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of this association by a two-thirds majority of members voting.
