ARTICIES OF FAITH

- The BIBE: The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by inspiration of God, and are infallible rules of faith and practices.
- 2I. GOD: There is one living and true preserver, and righteous Governor of the universe; and in the Scriptures as Father, Son, and Holy Gheat, jet as one God infinitely wise and good, when all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- III. CHRIST: Christ is God manifest in the flosh; in His divine nature truly many. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified, and is our present Saviour and Lord.
- IV. THE HOLY SPIRIT: The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit ALL attributes of God.
- V. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD: Gcd exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all things by manifesting the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts, not otherwise provided for, as the welfare of men requires.
- VI. THE SHIFULNESS OF MAN: Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherit a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability ain, and become guilty before God.
- VII. THE WORK OF CHRIST: The Son of God by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death, and resurrection offered for all a redemption from ain that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- VIII. THE TERMS OF SALVATION: The conditions of salvation are:

 (a) Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and hearty renunciation of it, (b) Faith of the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of Gcd, (c) Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
 - IX. ELECTION: God determined from the beginning to save who sould comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.
 - X. FREEDOM OF WILL: The human will is free and self-controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perich.
 - II. SALVATION FREE: God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

- XII. PERSEVERANCE: All believers in Christ who through grace persevers in holiness to the end of life, have the proxice of eternal colvation.
- XIII. GOSPEL GRDINANCES: Raptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing an ordinance teaching humility, of universal chligation; and to be administered to all true believers.
- XIV. TITHING: God commended tithes and offerings in the Old Testament;
 Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the
 Apostlo Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one
 of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." (I Cor. 16:2)
- XV. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH: The divine law requires that one day in caven be not apart from secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities and for persoal communion with God. 29
- XVI. RESURRECTION JUDGEMENT AND FINAL RETRIEUTION: The Scriptures teach the recurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life and they that have done cyll unto the resurrection of demnation; then the wicked will "go away into eternal gunishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

BY-LAWS

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence the oldest minister present, shall call the association into conference.
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.

- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum.

 Less number may adjourn until such a quorum is present.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to sit as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflection shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and vote taken on separate parts.
- 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded, unless it is on a question previously tabled.
- 8. No one shall speak more than once on the same subject without special permission of the moderator.
- 9. The moderator shell not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.

- 10. The ruling of the mederator may be overruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. At each meeting of the association, arrangements shall be made to incure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercises, each day.

COMSTITUTION
OF THE
FIRST NEW MEXICO ASSOCIATION
OF
FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE

From experience, we the members of the churches of God and Christ, commonly known as Free Will Emptist, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group which desires to support and promote every phase of our State and National Enterprises, do hereby ordain this Constitution for our progress and to perpetrate better Association Government.

ARTICLE I

This organization shall be known as the First New Mexico Association of Free Will Baptist of New Mexico.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1: The purpose of this association shall be to bring into union such churches of New Mexico as desire the enterprises of the State of New Mexico and National Association.

SECTION 2: It shall not be the purpose of this Association to usurp suthority over the churches, but to recommend such measures as would promote the unity of action among the churches, to harmonize the efforts of individual churches among each other in their efforts to accomplish good, and make each other more proficient in their undertakings to advance the Cause of Christ.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1: This association shall be composed of churches commonly known as Free Will Baptist who maintain gospel order, and shall subscribe to the constitution and By-Laws and Articles of Faith as adopted by this said Association.

SECTION 2: Any church desiring membership in this association shall be examined and be found sound in it's doctrine, complying with the National Association in all its branches of labor, for the promotion of God's work and also will be expected to be found sound in the associational work. Showing a desire to promote our denominational work, for the cause of Christ in all different branches of our Association Meeting, Vacation Bible School, F. W. B. Bible College, Woman's Auxiliaries and Young Folks Meeting.

SECTION 3: All only constituted churches may be received into this Association by their messengers presenting a petitionary letter from their respective churches, if they chall be found orderly and erthodox.

Such reception shall be manifested by the mederator, or his assistant, giving the right hand of followship.

AFTICLE IV

REPRESENTATION

- SECTION 1: Standing delegates of this Association shall be ordained ministers, minister's wives, ordained deacons, church clerk, and church treasurers who are members of churches in good standing in this Association.
- SECTION 2: In addition each church shall represent by sending five (5) delegates to each meeting of the Association.
- SECTION 3: Each church shall send a letter to the associational clerk at least ten (10) days before the time set for the regular meeting of the association. These letters shall set forth the names of ministers and deacens belonging to the church. These letters shall be written on forms provided by the Association.
- SECTION A: The church may elect one alternate for each delegate, who will be scated in the absence of the regular delegate. Each church of this Association shall send church letters with their delegates. Also the church clerk send the nemes of their delegates and alternates to the church entertaining the Association.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS

The officers of this association shall consist of a moderator, an assistant moderator, a clerk, an assistant clerk, and a promotional secretary.

They shall be elected annually at the close of the yearly meeting, and shall act as a program committee to plan the progrems of all meetings of the association.

ARTICLE VI

SECTION 1: The standing boards of the association shall consist of three members each, having staggered terms, so that one member is elected each year at the close of the annual association.

THESE BOARDS SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS:

- a. Executive b. Credential c. Board of Trustees d. Superannuation
- e. Christian Education f. Mission.

The association shall pay travel expenses of members of these boards when engaged on associational business; the amount of reimbursement shall be set by the association.

SECTION 2: The Executive Board shall act for the association when the association is not in session, and render a report to each sitting on the association for approval or rebuke.

SECTION 3: The Gradential Posts chall exemine candidates for licensing or ordaination, and shall pass on all ministers coming into this association. This beard shall also review every minister belonging to this association for action.

This association shall adopt a set of rules for this board, and a set of cuestions for exemining candidates, and the clerk shall keep a file of all persons exemined.

- SECTION 4: The Board of Trustees shall receive and assign all accordational property as directed by the association.
- SECTION 5: The Superannuation Board shall plan programs for the egod ministers of this association and in cooperation with the state and national programs.
- SECRION 6: The Christian Education Board shall oversee the Sunday School, C. T. S., and other Christian education programs of the association, and shall ecoperate with the state and national programs.
- SECTION 7: The Hission Ecord shall be responsible for the extencion of the Free Will Beptist work in the state, and in cooperation with the state and national programs, sto the uttermost parts of the earth."
 - SECTION 8: Other boards and committees may be chosen as needed.

ARTICLE VII

DISCIPLINE

SECTION 1: This association shall have the right to settle any cusation of discipline, destrine, or practice that may properly come before it from any of the churches; to act upon any appeal that may be made at any of the meetings.

SECTION 2: All appeals coming before this association may be settled in any of the following ways:

- a. By this association when sitting as a committee as a whole;
- b. By a special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

SECTION 3: No question shall be received by this association from any church unless it has been acted upon in said church, and cannot be settled, in which the association shall take up same and act upon it.

ARTICLE VIII

MENTINGS

SECTION 1: This body shall meet quarterly, dates and places to be set by association or its designated representatives.

SECTION 2: At each meeting of the association the body shall conduct all necessary business, receive reports, pass on credentials or persons who shall come before it, buy or sell property, and in general, conduct any business which may be before it.

SECTION 3: The offices of this association shall be elected annually, but pro ten efficers may be elected at any sitting of the association in the absence of the regular officers. In the event any officers or board members move cut of the jurisdiction of the association he may be replaced at any sitting of the association.

SECTION 4: Questions of deliberations shall be governed by "Robert's Rules of Order", and a parliamentarian shall be appointed for each meeting of the association.

. ARTICLE IX

<u>AHENDMENTS</u>

This constitution may be amended at any regular meeting of the association by two-thirds majority of members voting.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God by faith in Christ, and the Word of God as cur rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another in this sclemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of cvil; to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, and from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good work a endeavor to "grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; not fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit: in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme, counting it cur chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational end denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the sucess of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace senctify us wholy, and preserve us blameless unto the coming our Lord Jesus Christ.
