CONSTITUTION Constitution

PREAMBLE: From Long experience we, the members of the Freewill Baptist, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better associational government.

Article 1

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma Association of Freewill Baptist of the State of Oklahoma.

MEMBERSHIP: This association shall be composed of Freewill Baptist Churches who maintain Gospel order and agree with denominational doctrine and practices; and favor the enterprises that have been endorsed by this Association.

Article III

DELEGATES: Voting members of the Association shall be ministers, descons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the League Rally of Association, Officers of Women's Auxiliary Convention of Association. Officers of Sunday School Convention of Association, Church Clerks, and also three delegates from each local church in the Association, which shall be seated with proper credentials. There must be a quorum of at least five churches present and a written record shall be made of all transactions. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The board shall have the power to call all the Association in conference by notifying each church ten days prior to conference and they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings association if the place where said quarterly meeting or Associations is to meet is not able to care for the meetings, and their decisions shall be final. This must be done in to notify each church.

on tall the relation of the last and the las OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, Clerk, assistant clerk, tressurer, and Executive Board consisting of five members. The Board members to be elected so as to one to be elected each year. To this board is delegated power to act in behalf of and for the First Oklahoma Association from one meeting to another of said association, and shall have the power and authority to elect such officers as might be deemed best for its own government and to carry out the plans and undertakings of First Okla. Association. The Board shall have power to fill vacancies that may occur in its own body.

To this executive board is further delegated power to collect funds and employ and superintend such work for the field as may seem best, and the means on hand may warrant. They shall have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, money raised, meetings held, and make a full and complete report to the next regular meeting of the Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for any purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donor or donors and in no case divert it from its original object.

The Chairman and Treasurer of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc, and any other papers by which First Oklahomais to become legally held. It shall be the duty of this Executive board to meet at each regular or adjourned session and as often as may be necessary, and any member absenting himself from meetings three times may be dropped from the board and his successor elected. No meeting of the Executive Board be legal unless at least three must be present.

NEW CHURCHES: Any regularly organized Free Will Beptist Church, (Treatise Page 42, 1947), who desires to unite with First Oklahoma Association may be received by letter and elected delegates.

Article VI

QUESTIONS: No questions from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first considered in its own church.

Article VII

PROFERTY AND REAL ESTATE: Any church That is a member of the First Oklahoma Association that fails to have a pastor for two years become the property of said Association; however that at anytime during this two years it will be the business of the Executive Board to assist such a church in securing a pastor or if need be, in finance; or if a condition should arise that would not be advisable for this church to continue its work, it would be the board's duty to take charge of this property.

Article VIII

CREDENTIALS: When a Church desires that one of its members should be examined for license or ordination, it shall be the duty of the council in the examination to find out as nearly as possible if the candidate is qualified.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. We believe the scripture of the Old and New Testament are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice. 2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Teter 1:20-21.
- 2. That there is but one true and living God and in the God Head of Divine Essence, Father, Son and Holy Ghost. Gen 17:1; 1 John 5:7.
- 3. That we are fallen and depraved creatures and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature. Eph. 5:1-19.
- 4. That salvation, regeneration, santification, justification and redemption are by life death, resurrection, ascension and intercession of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ. Acts 4:12; Titus 3:7.
- 5. That the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the wicked shall be eternal. Matt. 25:46.
- 6. All believers in Christ, who through grace, perservere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation. Mark 13:13; Rev. 2:10.
- 7. Baptism (the immersion of believers in water), the Lord's Supper, and Feet Washing, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers at night, is followed by the ordinance of feet washing, which teaches humility, of universal obligation, to be practiced by all believers. Baptism: Matt. 28:19; Acts 8:36,39; Col. 2:12. Lords Supper: Mark 14:17; Matt. 26:34; I Cor. 11; 23,34. Feet Washing: John 13:4,7; John 13:12-13.
- 8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week or the Lord's Day, and that it

ought to be observed and spent in public worship of God, and thet on it, we should abstain from our worldly concerns except in cases of necessity and mercy. Ex.31; Deut. 5:12; Mett. 12:12.

9. We believe in the resurrection of body, both the just and the unjust, but every one in his own order; those who have done evil to the resurrection of damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which He will Judge the World in righteousness by Jesus Christ. I Cor. 15:34; John 5:28; I Thes. 4:16.

10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study happiness of the people of God in general to singly engage to promote the honor of God.

BY-LAWS

6. If any proposition or motion under debate

contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.

7. Motion made and lost shall not be re-

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of moderator.

9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian spirit.

10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by two-thirds vote of the members present.

11. Any minister appased to any of the enterprises endarsed by the sociation will not be entitled to a seat in conference and we will not seat any minister in this Association that teaches the Baptism of the Holy Ghast separate from regeneration or the Birth of the Spirit.

12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.

13. At each association arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent devotional exercies each day.

14. When a church has died (Hed No pastor for two years), the Association has the power to take possession of this church property to protect the Welfare of the denomination.

17. The voting body of the First Oklahoma Association of Freewill Baptists, shall be ordained ministers, ordained deacons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the Sunday School Convention of the Association, regularly elected delegates, which shall be seated only with proper credentials, and Church Clerks who are members of the Freewill Baptist Church of Said Association in good standing.

FREEWILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotion, and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the Church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one an other in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bond of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and the Gospel.
