BOARD AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The executive Board of First Oklahoma Association submit the following report to the annual meeting.

The board met in a joint meeting with the mission board early in February, to hear a report on the financial needs of the El Reno Church. We recommended the Association give them sone assistance, which was granted in the Eebruary meeting. In this meeting the board also discussed the possibility of obtaining a loan for the prupose of building dormitories.

Upon receiving a directive from the Feb. Quarterly meeting we met again and obtained a \$10,000.00 loan from Exchange National Bank of Moore Okla. This entailed some bit of time and expense as we had to have an ab -stract made.

In regular meeting the board agreed that Rev. L. A. Yandell be given the authority to negotiate with other groups who might wish to rent the Camp Ground.

The board met again July 28th to decide on a solution to the problem of paying some out standing bills incurred in building the dormitories, as the loan money had been depleted before construction was finished. The solution we agreed upon was to borrow another \$1,000.00 from the Moore Bank and report the same to the annual meeting.

We are happy to report that we have not been called on by any church to aid in a church problem of any mature.

CONSTITUTION

Phlamble: From long experience we, themembers of the Free will Baptist, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better Association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptist of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP: This Association shall be composed of Free Will: Maptist Churches which Maintain Gospel order and agree with denominational doctrine and practices; and favor the enterprises that have been endorsed by the Association.

ARTICLE III

DELEGATES: Voting members of the Associations shall be ministers, deacons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the League Hally of the Association, Officers of the Moman's Auxiliary Convention of the Association. Officers of the Sunday School Convention of the Association, Church clerks and three lay delegates from each local church in the Association, which shall be seated with proper credentials. There must be a majority of the member churches present for a quorum to be consituted. A written tecord shall be made of all transactions.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICEAS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and a treasurer, which shall be elected at the annual session.

ARTICLE V

NEW CHURCHES: Any regularly organized Free Will Baptist Church, (Treatise Page 42,1947)

who desires to unite with the First Oklahoma association may be required by letter and elected delegates.

ARTICLE VI

BOAKDS: The following standing boards shall be elected in the annual session. Hach Poard shall consist of five members elected so as to have one member retiring each year.

wer to act in behalf of and for the First Oklahoma Association from one meeting to another of said association, and shall have the power and authority to elect such officers as might be deemed best for its own government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the First Oklahoma Association. The board shall have to fill vacancies that

may occur in its own body.

To this board is further delegates power to collect funds and employ and superintend such work for the field as may seem best and the means on hand may warrant. They shall have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or associational property. This executive board shall keep a record of all work done, money raised, meetings, held, and make a full and complete report to the next regular meeting of the Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for any purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donor or donors and in mo case divert it from its original object.

The Cairman and Treasurer of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc. and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma A ssociation is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this board to meet as often as may be necessary and any member absenting himself.

from three successive mettings may be dropped from the board and his successor elected. No member of the executive spoard shall del-

egate Authority to any other member of said poard to east his vote for him in anything. The executive poard shall have power to call all the association in conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference and they shall have the authority to change cuarterly meetings or association if the place where said cuarterly meeting or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings, and their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the executive board shall be legal unless at least three members are present.

PLANNING BOARD: It shall be the duty of this board to review and supervise all future building programs and other improvement programs on the campground. This does not mean, however, that they they are the building committee in said programs. This board shall be charged with the responsibility of keeping the Association informed of the ne-

eds of the camp.

ckeDential BoakD: The Credential Board shall examine ministers for license and ordination. They shall, also, examine deacons sent to the Association by the member churches. This board will furnish report blanks to each minister of the Association appraised of the failure of ministers to make an annual report.

CHUNCH TRAINING SERVICE: It shall be their duty to plan Church Training kallies of the Association. This Board shall, also, plan the annual youth encampment Appoint cooks, dormitory sponsors, and teachers at their conveniences for the encapement at the

campground.

MISSION BOLKI: The Mission Board will assist any worthy mission work with in the bounds of the First Oklahoma -- sociation. The annual Missionary Conference of the --s-sociation will be planned and supervised by the Mission Foard. The mission program of the denomination shall be kept before the

First Oklahoma association and special drives shall be presented by them.

SUNDAY SCHOOL BO.MI: The Annual Sunday School Convention of the Association will be planned by the Sunday School Board. Sunday School Institutes will be taught by the board upon request by the churches of the Association. A record of courses completed by those enrolled in the institutes will be kept by this board.

MASTLA'S MEN LOARD: This board shall work in cooperation with the State and National Masters men Organizations in the promotion of Local Masters men Chapters in the churchs of First Oklahoma Association. It shall be the duties of this Loard to Promote and maintain a Listrict Masters Men organization. In cooperation with the officers of said organization.

PROPERTY AND REAL ESTATE: Any church that is a member of the first "klahoma association that fails to have paster for two (2) years becomes the property of said association; however, that at anytime during this two years it will be the business of the executive board to assist such a church im securing a pastor or if need be in finance; or if a condition should arise that would not be the boards duty to take charge of this property.

AKTICLE IX

ORLLENTIALS: When a church desires that one of its members should be examine for license or ordination, it shall be the duty of the council in the examination to find out

as nearly as possible if the candidate is qualified.

The candidate is to be examined by a set of cuestions and unless they are answered scripturally and satisfactorily to the approval of the board, they will not be licensed or ordained:

BY-LANS

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the Association into conference..
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is or sent.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak, shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all achates.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.

7. Motion made and lost shall not be re-

corded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of moderator.

9. The noderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian spirit.

10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by two-thirds vote of the members - present.

11. Any minister opposed to the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist as set forth in the Free Will Baptist Treaties will not be enti-

tled to a seat in conference.

12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.

13. At each Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons, or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.

14. When a church has died (had no paster for two years), the Association has the power to take possession of this church property to

protect the welfare of the denomination.

Association of Free Will Baptists, shall be ordained ministers, ordained deacons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the League Rally of the Association, Officers of the Woman's Auxiliary Convention of the Association. Officers of the Sunday School Convention fo the Association, three (3) lay delegates from each local church in the Association, which shall be seated with proper credentials, and Church Clerks who are Members of the Free Will Baptist Church of said Association in good standing.

16. These by-laws may be amended at any annual Association by two-thirds vote of the

delegates present.
