We submit the following report for information concerning the work of the Board for the year 1965-66. We sponsored a Missionary Conference during the month of October 1965. Services were held at the Tecumseh Church and the Capitol Hill Church along with special services in all the churches of the association which requested them. Missionaries who participated in these services were Rev. Arthur Billow, Mexico, Rev. Wesley Calvery, Japan, Rev. Dr. Laverne Miley, Africa, and Rev. Dick Shade, Kansas. Results from the conference were very good. We express our thanks appreciation to the churches, missionaries, and all who helped to make these services a success

We assisted in the organization of the Edmond Free Will Baptist Church in cooperation with the State Mission Board The church under the direction of Rev. Milburn Wilson has pro-

gressed well.

Plans for the Missionary Conference this year are now being made. The conference will be held October 23-30. We are asking every church in the association to make plans for a missionary service during this time. complete program and announcement of services will be announced soon.

**Executive Board Report** 

The Executive Board met a number of times during the year, our first meeting was for the purpose of deciding on means or methods of offering the camp ground for sale. It was agreed we first try to sell it through classified ads in the Okla. City papers.

We met again Nov. 29, 1965 at Pleasant Hill. Since we had no offers on camp ground it was agreed we list the property with The David Mayne Realty Co. of Shawnee, with agreement for multiple listing with the Realty boards of Okla City,

and Norman

The board met Feb. 22,, 1966 at Central Ave. Church. This meeting was for the purpose of securing a \$1,000.00 loan for the Edmond mission, as directed by the quarterly meeting when convened with the Moore church. This was secured from Bro. Pexton and Bro. Hawkins. (\$500.00 each). It was agreed the loan would be repaid at \$25.00 per month to each plus any earmarked money for this project

The board met March 3, 1966 at camp ground to discuss the sale of camp ground to some people who had expressed an interest but who were unwilling to deal through a Realty Co. It was decided to remove it from the market a few days before relisting it. It was placed back on market April First with the

Shawnee Realty Co

May 23,. 1966 at Pleasant Hill it was agreed to rent camp ground July 12 - 13 and August 14 - 16 to the Penticostal people.

June 22, 1966 at camp ground Rev. L A. Yandell tendered his resignation as executive board member. The resignation was accepted. Rev. Major Followwell was elected chairman of the

board to fill the office vacated by the resignation

July 29, 1966 the board met at Norman with Bro. Louis Wickham, Bro. Thurman Jones and Bro, Ernest Stuckey who were representing the group now worshiping at the South Side Moore Church. Also present was Bro. Robert Craig representing the original membership of same church. Purpose of meeting was that they might be witnesses to a verbal agreement concerning Financial obligations of the property which was being assumed by the Bro. Wickham and his people until a new loan or some agreeable method to both parties could be worked out.

Our final transaction was the relocating the Annual Association. This was done upon the request of the Trinity Church. Capitol Hill church extended an invitation which was accepted.

The Paul Brooks Realty Co. of Tecumseh now have the listing on camp ground, however it can be removed at any date.

Constitution

Preamble: From long experience we, the members of the Free Will Baptist, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better Association government.

Name: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptist of the State of Oklahoma,

Membership: This Association shall be composed of Free Will Baptist Churches which maintain Gospel order and agree with denominational doctrine and practices; and favor the enterprizes that have been endorsed by the Association.

Articles III

Delegates: Voting members of the Association shall be ministers, deacons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the CTS Rally of the Association, Officers of the the Sunday School Convention of the Association. Officers of Woman's Auxiliary Convntion of the Association. Officers of the District Master's Men. Officers of the District Association Church clerks and three lay delegates from each local church in the Association, which shall be seated with proper credentials. There must be a majority of the member churches present for a quorum to be constituted. A written record shall be made of all transactions

#### Article IV

Officers: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and a treasurer which shall be elected at the annual session.

#### Article V

New Churches: Any regularly organized Free Will Baptist Church, (Treatise Page 42, 1957) who desired to unite with the First Oklahoma Association may be received by letter and selected delegates.

### Article VI

Boards: The following standing boards shall be elected in the annual session. Each Board shall consist of five members elected so as to have one member retiring each year.

Executive: To this Board is delegated power to act in behalf of and for the First Oklahoma Association from one meeting to another of said association, and shall have the power and authority to elect such officers as might be deemed best for its government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the First Oklahoma Association. The Board shall have to fill varancies that may occur in its own holy.

cancies that may occur in its own body.

To this Board is further delegates power to collect funds and employ and superintend such work for the field as may seem best, and the means on hand may warrant. They shall have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, money raised, meetings held, and make a full and complete report to the next regular meeting of this association and shall further receive, hold, manage (use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for any purpose in accordance with a purpose of the donor or donors and in case

divert it from its original object.

The Chairman and Treasurer of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc. and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma, Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary and any member absenting himself, from three successive meetings may be dropped from the board and his successor lected. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have power to call all the Association in conference by notifying each church to assemble ten (10) days prior to the conference and they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meeting or Association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings, and their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least three members are present.

Credential Board: The Credential Board shall examine ministers for license and ordination. They shall, also, examine deacons. sent to the Association by the member churches. This board will furnish report blanks to each minister of the Association appraised to the failure of ministers to make an annual report. Church Training Service: It shall be their duty to plan Church Training Rallies of the Association This Board shall also plan the annual youth encampment, appoint cooks, dormitory sponsors, and teachers at their conveniences for the encampment at the camp ground.

Mission Board: The Mission Board will assist any worthy mission work with in the bounds of the First Oklahoma Association. The Annual Missionary Conference of the Association will be planned and supervised by the Mission Board. This mission program of the denomination shall be kept before the First Oklahoma Association and special drives shall be presented by them.

Sunday School Board: The Annual Sunday School Convention of the Association will be planned by the Sunday School Board. Sunday School Institutes will be taught by the board upon request by those enrolled in the institutes will be kept by this board.

Master's Men Board: This board shall work in cooperation with the State and National Masters Men Organizations in the promotion of Local Masters Men Chapters in the churches of First Oklahoma Association. It shall be the duties of this board to promote and maintain a district Masters Men Organization. In cooperation with the officers of such said organizatons.

#### Article VII

Questions: No questions from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first considered in its church.

#### Artcle VIII

Property and Real Estate: Any church that is a member of the First Oklahoma Association that fails to have pastor for two (2) years becomes the property of said Association; however that at anytime during this two (2) years it will be the business of the Executive Board to assist such church in securing a pastor or if need in finance; or if a condition should arise that would not be the boards duty to take charge of the property.

#### Articles IX

Credentials: When a church desires that one of its members should be examined for license of ordination, it shall be the duty of the council in the examination to find out as nearly as possible if the candidate is unlified.

Provisions: This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present, provided amendment of alteration is represented in writing and laid on the table one day in advance of the later of the Article XI

F. S.: Each church in the Association is to send a \$10.00 minute fee, \$5:00 State Delegate fee, annually.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. We believe the scripture of the Old and New Testament are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith pratice. (II Ti. 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21)

2. That there is but one true and living God in the God Headl of Divine Presence, Father, Son, and the Holy Ghost. (Gen. 17:1-4; John 5:7)

3. That we are fallen and depraved Creatures and cannot textricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we

possess by nature. (Eph. 5:1-19)

4. That salvation regeneration, santification, justification and redemption are by life, death, ressurrection, ascension and intercession of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. (Acts 4:12; Titus 3:5)

5. That the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the

world shall be eternal. (Matt. 25:46)

6. All believers in Christ, who through grade, perserves in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal sal-

vation. Mark 13:13; Rev. 2:11)

- 7. Baptism (the immersion of believers in water), the Lord's Supper, and Feet washing, are ordinance to be perpetuated under the gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers at night, is followed by the ordinance of Feet washing, which teaches humility, of universal obligagation, to be practiced by all believers. (Baptism: Mat. 28:19; Acts 8:36-39; Col. 2:12; Lord's Supper: Mark 14:17; Matt. 26:34; I Cor. 11:23-24; Feet Washing: John 13:4-5; John 13:12-13)
- 8. We believe in the Sanctity of the first day of the week or the Lord's Day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in public worship of God, and that on it, we should rest from or worldly concerns except in cases of necessity and mercy,

(Ex. 31; Deut. 5:18; Mat. 12:12)

9. We believe in the resurrection of the body both the just and the unjust, by every one in his own order, those who have done evil to the resurrection of damnation, and that God has appointed a day in which he will judge the World in right-eousness by Jesus Christ. The Lord Jesus who ascended on high sits at the right Hand of God, will come again to close the Gospel Dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. (We hold that the fore going statement is an a mill-enium view of the Second Coming of Christ). (Chapter XX National Treatise; I Cor. 15:34; John 5:28; I Thes: 4:16).

10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, and to study the happiness of the people of God in general and to singly engage to promote the honor of God.

(John 13:35; Gal. 6:10).

11. We believe that Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man; yet none can partake of his divine benefit only by his repentance towards God and Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; infants and indicts excepted. (Acts 21:21) [Tim. 2:5-6; John 3:14-16; I Peter 3.21).

- 12. We believe that the Lord's People are one in him, and therefore should be one at his table. (I Cor. 1:1-11; 27-28; John 17:11).
- 13. The Definition and Condition of a Backslider: A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and cannot enter into a sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The followig scriptures explain: Jremiah 2:21; Jeremiah 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matthew 6:24; Hebrews 10:38-39: Hebrews 3:12-14; Ezekiel 18:24; I John 1:9: Revelation 21:27.

#### BY LAWS

- 1. The moderator or assistant moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the Association into conference.
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is to start.
- 4. Visiting brothern are invited to seats as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak, shall arise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
- 7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.
- 9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present
- 11. Any minister opposed to the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist as set forth in the Free Will Baptist Treaties will not be entitled to a seat in conference.
- 12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- 13. At each Association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons, or their euivalent devotional exercises each day.
- 14. When a church has died (had no pastor for two years), the Association has the power to take possession of this church property to protect the welfare of the denomination.
- 15. The voting body of the First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptist, shall be ordained ministers, ordained deacons, members of all standing boards, officers and sponsors of the CTS Rally of the Association. Officers of the Sunday School

Convention of the Association. Officers of the District Master's Men, Officers of the District Association three (3) lay delegates from each local church in the Association, which shall be seated with proper credentials, and Church Clerks who are members of the Association in good standing.

16. These by-laws may be amended at any annual Association

by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present.

#### FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves by Faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the Will of God, in this solemn covenant.

We promise by his grace to love and obey Him in all things to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all Santions of use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotion, and social worship, and by self denial, faith and good works, endeavor to 'grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord' and Saviour, Jesus Christ".

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolient work).

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bond of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to speak to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and the gaspel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprise supreme; Counting it our chief business in Ife to extend the influences of Christ in society constantly praying and toiling, that the Kingdom of God may come, and His Will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprise, the support of Missions, the success of Sabbath Schools, and evangelistic efforts, for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world. And may the Lord of Peace sancitify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ.
