Minutes of the Seventy-Fifth Annual Session First Oklahoma District Association, Free Will Baptists

Thursday, August 17, 1972—7:30 p.m. Worship Service

The Seventy-fifth Annual Session of the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists met at the Spencer Road Free Will Baptist Church, Spencer, Oklahoma.

The introductory service was opened with Rev. Homer Young leading the congregation in singing "Follow On" and "Since I Have Been Redeemed"; Phyllis McDougal, pianist; Rev. Waldo Young, organist.

After prayer by Rev. Donald R. Bieberdorf, the congregation continued the service by singing "All the Way My Saviour Leads Me."

Bro. Paul Hill brought the devotion of the evening, using John 14:6, followed by Rev. Waldo Young, host pastor, who extended a welcome to the churches with Bro. Gary Harper giving the response. Rev. David Sutton led the congregation in prayer.

MSC that report from the Credential Board be approved. (See Reports)

MSC that the Credential Board be given names and addresses.

MSC that the request from the Shawnee Northeast Church be acknowledged. Request as follows: That the association make void the credentials of Earl Dighton, ordained deacon. (Mr. Dighton has not attended a Free Will Baptist church for several years. He has said he would return his credentials if he ever found them. He also asked that the name of he and his wife be dropped from the church roll.)

MSC that report from the Budget Committee be approved. (See Reports)

Rev. Bill Jones gave a very encouraging report concerning Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. The enrollment is greater than ever, an extension class will be offered north of Tulsa this fall, and he expressed his appreciation to the association for all the help given to the college.

The message of the morning was brought by Rev. Clarence Bruce, Jr., using Luke 22:31-34 as his text.

Friday, August 18, 1972—1:30 p.m. Business Session

The business session opened with Rev. Homer Young leading the congregation in singing "Wonderful Words of Life"; Kathleen Sutton, pianist.

November

Credential Board

1. We recommend that Bill Greeson from the Noble church be ordained as a deacon.
2. We recommend that Pete Kirby from the Noble church be ordained as a deacon.
3. We recommend that Lewis Cox from the Southern Oaks church, a student at Hillsdale College, be licensed to preach the gospel.
4. We recommend that Jesse Youngblood from the Spencer Road church be ordained as a deacon.
5. We recommend that Don Hadley from the Edmond church be ordained as a deacon.
6. We, the credential board recommend that this body give us the authority to re-examine a licensed minister, and upon the approval of the board, ordain him when absolutely necessary upon his acceptance of a pastorate. Said action will be brought before this body at the earliest convenience for confirmation.
7. We have prepared a new questionnaire to be used in ordaining deacons, and have revised the questionnaire for ministers. We recommend these to this body to be accepted as the official questionnaires to be used by the credential board of this association.
8. We have examined Frank Wiley, and recommend him for ordination as a minister. He has recently accepted the pastorate of the Hawkins Free Will Baptist church.

February

Business Committee

1. Since the Executive Board has not received any applications for the \$100.00 scholarship for Hillsdale College from students in our area, we recommend that the young people be encouraged to make application and the selection be made by the Executive Board.
2. We recommend granting the request of the CTS Board for \$500.00 to cover expenses for CTS activities the rest of this year (competition, trophies, publication of camp literature, increased cost of camp). We further recommend this money be paid out after receipt of payment on youth camp property.
3. We recommend giving \$500.00 to the general fund at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. (To be paid out after receipt of payment on youth camp property, as amended)
4. We recommend giving \$500.00 toward the expense of the State Association that meets in Oklahoma City in October of this year.
5. We recommend that Article VII of the Constitution be amended by addition to read as follows:
When a church outside the association desires that one of its members be examined for license or ordination or a licensed or ordained minister join a church or be seated in this association, it shall be the duty of the council

in the examination to determine the candidates qualifications and doctrine.

Credential Board

The certificate of ordination of Gary Myers, the item which was given to this board by the body at the last Quarterly Meeting through the First Free Will Baptist Church of Norman, has been marked null and void, we are therefore deleting his name from all records as an ordained minister. Proper notification will be made to the Oklahoma County Court House, and/or other places that might be necessary. His Ordination Certificate was voluntarily turned in after he united with another denomination.

1. The CTS and Executive Boards of this Association, acting in accordance with a motion from the last meeting held in May, 1972, do hereby submit our recommendation on the CTS COMPETITION SCHOLARSHIP.

2. The Association will give the required amount to the COMPETITION SCHOLARSHIP FUND following each annual association meeting, beginning in August, 1972. These monies are to be deposited into a scholarship savings fund, with interest reverting back to the general fund.

3. The specific requirements and procedures for issuance of scholarship money is as follows:

a. REQUIREMENTS: Attendance of a Free Will Baptist College by age of 30 years old will be required to obtain the scholarship monies.

In the event of death, or permanent disability (which would not allow attendance) the scholarship may be transferred to any member of the immediate family; father, mother, brother, sister or if married, the husband or wife. Transferred scholarship must be used at a Free Will Baptist College. If transferred to father or mother, it must be used within five (5) years. Thirty-year-old age limit applies to any other transferee.

If scholarship is not used in the allotted time, the money will revert back to the FIRST OKLAHOMA ASSOCIATION General Fund.

b. *Issuance of Scholarship Money*: 25% of the total dollar value a person has accumulated in scholarships will be paid for each semester enrolled. This will be paid to the student at the beginning of each semester.

EXCEPTION: If the total accumulated scholarship amount is less than \$100.00, it will be paid to the student the first semester. One-half at time of enrollment and the remainder in the middle of the semester.

If any variance in issuance of scholarship money is required, the Association, or if not in session, the Executive Board would have to approve the exception.

MOTION:

That this body (The First Oklahoma District Association) present a plan to the State meeting in Oklahoma City in October, 1972, in the form of a motion recommending that the State Association adopt a plan for a *State CTS Competition Scholarship* in the amount of \$50.00 for each person winning first place at the State level of competition.

MOTION:

That this body (The First Oklahoma District Association) make a motion to the State Association, that they present a plan to the National Association in Macon, Georgia, July, 1973. The plan shall be in the form of a motion recommending that the National Association adopt a plan for a *National CTS Competition Scholarship* in the amount of \$100.00 for each person winning first place at the National level of competition to be funded from the National Association's General Fund.

CONSTITUTION

FIRST OKLAHOMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptist of the State of Oklahoma. It shall meet four times each year with the August session designated as the annual session. Each quarterly conference shall possess the same authority as the annual session except the election of officers and Board members.

ARTICLE II

MEMBERSHIP: This Association shall be composed of Free Will Baptist Churches which maintain Gospel order and agree with denominational doctrine and practices; and favor the enterprises that have been endorsed by the Association.

Voting representation, at any session, shall be as described in Article 14 of the by-laws.

There must be a majority of the member churches present for a quorum to be constituted. A written record shall be made of all transactions.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and a treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any regularly organized Free Will Baptist Church, (Treatise pp. 41, 42), desiring to unite with the Association may do so by presenting a petitionary letter and being examined by the Executive Board. A majority vote is necessary for their acceptance into the Association.

ARTICLE V

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected in the annual session. Each Board shall consist of five members elected as to have one member retiring each year.

EXECUTIVE BOARD: The Executive Board is delegated power to act in behalf of and for the First Oklahoma Association from one meeting to another; and, shall have the power and authority to elect such officers as might be deemed best for its government, and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the First Oklahoma Association. The Board shall have power to fill vacancies that may occur in its own body.

This Board is further delegated power to collect funds and employ and superintend such work for the field as may seem best, and the means on hand may warrant. It shall have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work

done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full and complete report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for any purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donor or donors, and in no case divert it from its original object.

The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary and any member absenting himself, from three successive meetings may be dropped from the board and his successor elected. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meeting or Association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least three members are present.

CREDENTIAL BOARD: The Credential Board shall examine ministers for license and ordination. It shall, also, examine deacons sent to the Association by the member churches. In case of discipline this board shall have the authority to labor with the ordained of this association.

CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual youth encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel.

MISSION BOARD: The Mission Board will assist any worthy mission work with in the bounds of the First Oklahoma Association. The Annual Missionary Conference of the Association will be planned and supervised by the Mission Board. The mission program of the denomination shall be kept before the First Oklahoma Association and special drives shall be presented by this Board.

MASTER'S MEN BOARD: The Master's Men Board will work in cooperation with the State and National Master's Men Organizations in the promotion of local Master's Men Chapters in the churches of First Oklahoma Association. It shall be the duty of this Board to promote and maintain a district Master's Men organization, cooperating with the officers of such said organizations.

ARTICLE VI

PROPERTY AND REAL ESTATE: Any church that is a member of the First Oklahoma Association that fails to have a pastor for two (2) years becomes the property of said Association; however, at any time during this two (2) years it will be the business of the Executive Board to assist such church in securing a pastor and helping it to maintain services that would prohibit the Board need to take charge of the property.

ARTICLE VII

CREDENTIALS: When a church desires that one of its members should be examined for license or ordination, it shall be the duty of the council in the examination to determine the candidates' qualifications. This Board shall also examine ordained ministers and deacons coming into this body from other associations.

The candidate is to be examined by a set of questions and if they are answered Scripturally and satisfactorily to the approval of the Credential Board, he will be recommended to the body for license or ordination. A majority vote of the body shall be the final authority.

Not a novice, lest being lifted up with pride he fall into condemnation of the devil. ARTICLE VIII

Each church in the Association is to send a \$10.00 state delegate fee, and a minimum of \$10.00 for associational minutes, to be sent at the time of the annual meeting. If more minutes are desired by any church, such church should consult with associational clerk and pay estimated cost of additional minutes.

ARTICLE IX

PROVISIONS: This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present, provided amendment or alteration is presented in writing and laid on the table one day in advance.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. WE BELIEVE: That the Scriptures of the Old and New Testament are the infallible Word of God, and the only safe rule of faith and practice. (II Tim. 3:16-17; II Peter 1:20-21).
2. That there is but one true and living God in the God Head of Divine Presence, Father, Son and the Holy Ghost. (Gen. 17:1-4; I John 5:7).
3. That we are fallen creatures and cannot extricate ourselves from our fallen situation by any ability we possess by nature. (Ephesians 2:1-19).

4. That salvation, regeneration, sanctification, justification and redemption are the life, death, resurrection, ascension, intercession and the coming of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. (Acts 4:12; Titus 3:5; Romans 8:22, 23).
5. That the joys of the righteous, and the punishment of the world shall be eternal. (Matthew 25:46).
6. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation. (Mark 13:13; Rev. 2:11).
7. Baptism (the immersion of believers in water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost), the Lord's Supper, and the Feet Washing, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the gospel. The Lord's Supper, which is to be observed by all believers at night, is followed by the ordinance of Feet Washing, which teaches humility of universal obligation, to be practiced by all believers. (Baptism: Matt. 28:19; Acts 8:36-39; Col. 2:12; Lord's Supper: Mark 14:17; Matt. 26:34; I Cor. 11:23-24; Feet Washing: John 13:1-17).
8. We believe in the sanctity of the first day of the week or the Lord's Day, and that it ought to be observed and spent in public worship of God, and on this day, we should rest from our worldly concerns except in cases of necessity and mercy. (Exodus 31; Deut. 5:18; Matt. 12:12).
9. We believe in the resurrection of the body, both the just and the unjust but every one in his own order; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation, and God has appointed a day in which He will judge the world in righteousness by Jesus Christ. The Lord Jesus who ascended on high sits at the right hand of God, will come again to close the Gospel Dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. We hold that the foregoing statement is the amillenium view of the Second Coming of Christ. (Chapter XX National Treatise; I Cor. 15:34; John 5:28; I Thess. 4:16).
10. That it is our duty to be tender and affectionate to one another, to study the happiness of the people of God in general, and to singly engage to promote the honor of God. (John 15:35; Gal. 6:10).
11. We believe that Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man; yet none can partake of His divine benefit except by his repentance towards God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ; infants and idiots excepted. (Acts 20:21; I Tim. 2:5-6; John 3:4-16; I Peter 3:21).
12. We believe that the Lord's people are one in Him, and therefore should be one at His table. (I Cor. 1:1-11, 27-28; John 17:11).
13. The Definition and Condition of a Backslider:
A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following Scriptures explain: Jer. 2:21; Jer. 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matt. 6:24; Heb. 10:38-39; Heb. 3:12-14; Ezek. 18:24; I John 1:9; Rev. 21:27.
- A. We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord

Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.

B. We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust in Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.

C. We believe that any individual living in the practice of sin (whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that a man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim Heaven as his eternal home.

D. We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned, (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust.

"And besides this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge;

"And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness;

"And to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity.

"For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

"But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins.

"Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall."—II Peter 1:4-10.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call the association into conference.
2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is to start.
4. Visiting brethren are invited to seats as advisory members.
5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
7. Motion made and lost shall not be recorded.
8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator.

9. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in Christian spirit.
10. The ruling of the moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds vote of the members present.
11. Any minister opposed to the doctrine of the Free Will Baptist as set forth in the Free Will Baptist Treatise will not be entitled to a seat in conference.
12. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
13. At each association, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons, or their equivalent devotional exercises each day.
14. The voting body of the First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptist shall be ordained ministers, deacons who are actively serving a church, members of all standing boards, church clerks, officers of the Woman's Auxiliary District Convention, officers of the Master's Men District Convention, officers of the District Association and three (3) lay delegates from each local church in the association, which shall be seated with proper credentials.
15. These by-laws may be amended at any annual association by a two-thirds vote of the delegates present.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves by Faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the Will of God, in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearances of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanctions of use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotion, and social worship, and by self denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, (public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work).

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bond of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, to promote the success of the church and the gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprise supreme. Counting it our chief business in life to extend the influences of Christ in society constantly praying and toiling, that the Kingdom of God may come, and His Will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprise, the support of Missions, the success of Sabbath Schools,

and evangelistic efforts, for the salvation of souls and the conversion of the world. And may the Lord of Peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of the Lord Jesus Christ.
