Rev. Bill Jones, President of Hillsdale College gave a very good report of the activities of the school.

MSC to adopt the CTS Board report. Youth camps to be July 23-28 and July 30-August 4. The cost per student to be \$25.00.

MSC to receive the Mission Board report and vote on it item by item. All items approved. (See Reports)

MSC to accept the Treasurer's report as read.

MSC that Doyle Hood be elected to the Executive Board to replace Rev. Ralph Hampton who submitted a letter of resignation since he had moved from the association.

MSC to bring the Executive Committee Report from the table concerning the item of organizing new churches.

MSC that this be referred to a committee for further study. This committee to be appointed by the moderator: Rev. Dan Farmer, Rev. Don Brewer, Rev. James Murray, Rev. Waldo Young, Rev. Frank Giles.

Rev. Dan Farmer presented the Sunday School attendance awards which were won by Edmond (Division A) and Newcastle (Division B).

Saturday, May 20, 1978—11:00 a.m. Worship Service

After prayer by Rev. Ed Warner the congregation continued the song service by singing *Send A Great Revival*.

MSC to receive the Business Committee report and vote on it item by item: Item 1—MSC to lay on table until August meeting; Item 2 carried (See Reports).

MSC to give the Sunnyslane church a standing vote of thanks for their hospitality during the quarterly meeting.

MSC to adjourn. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Joe Grizzle.

MISSION BOARD

The District Mission Board has met twice since the February Quarterly Meeting, with every member present for both meetings. As a result of these meetings we offer the following recommendations for your consideration:

1. Whereas, we feel that the Evangelism Ministry is a part of the responsibility of this board, we ask to be permitted to plan the program for the August Quarterly Meeting. For the program we hope to plan a program similar to an Evangelism Conference, or a seminar on reaching people. We hope to bring in two or three speakers, with the possibility of an offering being received to help defray the expense of the speakers.

Whereas, we anticipate a larger attendance than usual, and since both pastors have expressed agreement to the arrangement, we further recommend that the August Quarterly Meeting be changed to meet at the Capitol Hill Church rather than the Grace Church.

2. Whereas, one of the fastest developing areas within metropolitan Oklahoma City is the Choctaw area, and

Whereas, we do not have a church in the Choctaw-Harrah area,

Therefore, we ask your approval and support for the District Mission Board to establish a church there. The approval would include fund raising, purchasing property, employing a worker, and any other responsibilities falling within the establishment of a new church.

3. In conjunction with a Missions Conference at Hillsdale College, we are planning to have missionaries Doc Caton, Jerry Banks, and Lynn Miley in the area for several services in November. We are also considering the possibility of a giant missions rally on Wednesday night, November 8.

4. Our Treasurer's records show a balance of \$1,797.50 as of this date.

BUSINESS COMMITTEE

1. Due to the lack of interest in our Friday night services of our quarterly meetings, we recommend that these services be discontinued.

2. We recommend that \$1,500.00 of the balance in the treasury be given to the District Mission Board for its work.

MSC to adopt the Mission Board Report. (See Reports)

CTS Report given—66 average in Junior Camp, 59 average in Senior Camp. MSC to receive this report.

MSC to adopt the Treasurer's Report. (See Reports)

Woman's Auxiliary Report accepted as information.

The committee concerning the item about new churches did not meet. Instructions given to meet during the next quarter and report to body.

MSC to remove from table item concerning dismissing the Friday night service. MSC to discontinue the Friday night service.

MSC to recess. Dismissed in prayer by Jay Tilson.

Saturday, August 19, 1978—11:00 a.m. Worship Service

Rev. Jerry Dudley gave a report on the mission work which will begin soon at the Choctaw mission.

Rev. Connie Cariker, pastor of the West Tulsa Free Will Baptist Church brought the message from Isaiah 1:18.

Saturday, August 19, 1978—12:00 Noon Business Session

MSC to receive the Business Committee Report and vote on it item by item. Both items carried. (See Reports)

Rev. Frank Wiley gave information concerning the State Sunday School Seminar which was to be held in Tulsa September 22, 23.

MSC to give the Capitol Hill Church a vote of thanks for their hospitality.

MSC to adjourn. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Dan Harper.

REPORTS

BUSINESS COMMITTEE

1. That we adopt the statement on inerrance of the Scripture which was considered and laid on the table by the National Convention, which reads: "The First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptist believe in the plenary, verbal inspiration of the Bible. By plenary we mean "full and complete." We hold that all parts of the Bible are inspired and that inspiration extends to all its subjects. By verbal we mean that inspiration extends to the very words of the scriptures, not just to the thoughts and ideas expressed by human authors.

We believe the Scriptures are infallible and inerrant. The Bible is without error and trustworthy in all its teaching, including cosmogony, geology, astronomy, anthropology, history, chronology, etc. as well as in matter of faith and practice. Being the very word of God, it is indeed our final authority.

2. We present for consideration the statement on the marriage and divorce of ministers and deacons which has been adopted by the State and National—Recorded in 1976 State Minutes, page 12, and 1976 National Minutes, page 85. (To Be Recorded in Annual Minutes)

Whereas,

There continues to be need to state the position of the National Association of Free Will Baptists on the proper marital status of ministers and deacons; and

Whereas,

Each body comprising said National Association is hereby encouraged to adopt the herein presented statement or a similar position on marriage for ministers and deacons; while not insisting that any new position be retroactive but rather established as a standard to be upheld for all new candidates for ministers and deacons; therefore,

Be it resolved:

1. That Paul's statements in I Timothy 3:2, 12 and Titus 1:6, namely "the husband of one wife," be looked upon as making ineligible as ministers or deacons anyone who has been divorced and remarried, regardless of the cause of divorce or the guilt or innocence of either partner.
2. That said persons, whose marital state disqualifies them to be elders or deacons, not be discouraged in the Christian service, but that they be encouraged to live faithfully for Christ and serve Him in the education, music, youth, or any other department or activity of the local church; and that such be reminded that deacons and elders are the only church officers for whom the "husband of one wife" prohibition is given (while certainly it is the ideal for all believers it is Biblically insisted upon as a requirement for deacons and elders).

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The Executive Board met via telephone conversation concerning a request by the Southern Oaks Church that Darrell Percy be sent before the Credential Board for examination for ordination since he had accepted the pastorate of Hall Church. The Board agreed to have the Credential Board examine Brother Percy and report their recommendation to this quarterly meeting.

CREDENTIAL BOARD

On July 7, 1978, the Credential Board of the First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists met at the Southern Oaks Free Will Baptist Church with four members present. The following action was taken:

1. At the request of the Executive Board of the association, Darrell Percy was examined for ordination to the ministry. Motion carried to have him present his written doctrinal statement before final approval.
2. Steve Klusemeyer was examined as a returning minister. Motion carried to recommend his acceptance into the association.
3. Cody Freeman was asked to return for an in-depth examination.
4. David Filkins was examined and motion carried to recommend his license to the ministry.

On August 11, 1978, the Credential Board met and took the following action:

1. Motion carried that although nothing was found against the doctrine or character of Tandell Hall, we recommend that he continue as a licensed minister until he has a work.
2. Motion carried that we ask Darrell Percy to complete his doctrinal statement and appear personally before the board before we recommend his ordination.

MISSION BOARD

I. THE EVANGELISM CONFERENCE.

We express appreciation to Connie Cariker, Dennis Cariker, and others of the West Tulsa Church for sharing with us in this Evangelism Conference in conjunction with this quarterly meeting. We also express appreciation to you for permission to plan and carry on such a conference.

II. PROGRESS ON THE CHOCTAW WORK.

1. We have agreed to purchase five acres of land located a quarter mile north of NE 10th on Henny Road. We have agreed on \$20,000.00 as the purchase price, and will be purchasing it from Bob and Sharon Williams as soon as the abstract is completed, probably within two or three weeks. We have at least 25% to put down on the land, and will be making a loan for the rest.
2. We requested, and were granted, a public hearing before the City Council of Choctaw for permission to build a church on this land which is zoned residential. The public hearing was required, and permission to build a church on the land was granted last Tuesday night, August 15.
3. Under the leadership of the Lord, Jerry Dudley approached the board about being the worker for this new church. The board met with Brother Dudley and agreed on him being the worker, and work out the salary, benefits, etc., with him. He will be resigning his pastorate in Stratford tomorrow, August 20, and will be moving to the Choctaw area within 30 days to assume leadership in establishing the work there.

We feel fortunate that a worker of his qualifications is available. Pastor Dudley has been preaching 28 years, has built two churches from the ground up, has had much experience in building buildings, and does establish sound programs in the churches he pastors. He has been accepted on every level of our denomination having served as an officer, member of the Executive Committee and General Board of the national convention, as an officer of the state, is presently a member of the Hillsdale Trustees, and has served in several capacities in this association itself.

4. Banquets are planned for the purpose of raising funds for the Choctaw work. The first banquet will be in the Tecumseh City Hall on Thursday, September 7, at 7:00 p.m. The Ministers Quartet will be singing and Jack Richey will bring the message at this banquet. The meal is free, and funds will be raised for the Choctaw work. Since the meal is to be catered, we will need to know an approximate number who plan to attend the Tecumseh banquet. The second banquet will be at Hillsdale College dining hall on September 8, at 7:00 p.m. Roy Thomas, director of National Home Missions, will be the speaker. Special music will be on the program for this banquet also. Again, the meal is paid for by the district mission board, and funds will be raised.
5. Pastor Dudley will be available for a few weeks to be with you in your churches where he will also be raising his support. He will handle his own schedule, so make appointments with him.

III. MISSIONARY CONFERENCE IN THE AREA.

Missionaries Doc Caton, Jerry Banks, and Lynn Miley will be in the area for some services in November. They will be the speakers at the missionary conference at Hillsdale College, and will also be available for some area services.

THIRD QUARTERLY MEETING

Saturday, November 18, 1978—9:00 a.m. Business

The Saturday morning business session opened with the congregation singing *Glory to His Name*, followed by Rev. Joe Grizzle bringing the morning devotion from Philippians 4:13; Matthew 17; Matthew 19:26; Mark 9:23. After prayer by Rev. Waldo Young, Rev. Frank Giles, host pastor brought greetings to the churches of the association.

After the reading of the church letters MSC to seat the delegates and give the requests on the letters to the Credential Board. Rev. James Murray led in prayer to seat the delegates.

Business Committee appointed: Rev. Dan Harper, Rev. Jim Puckett, Rev. Homer Young.

MSC to accept the Treasurer's Report as given.

MSC to accept the Mission Board Report. (See Reports) (The moderator noted that money obligation and percentage not to be approved by the vote).

Rev. Jerry Dudley gave a report of the mission work at Choctaw and also presented to the association minutes from 1939 to present.

Report given by Rev. Buddy Drake from the Enid Church. Lawton and Bartlesville to be our next mission works,

Rev. Bill Jones gave the report from Hillsdale followed by Rev. Lonnie DaVoult giving a report on the work in the state.

MSC that the association authorize the mission at Choctaw to borrow \$100,000.00 to begin construction of a building for worship.

MSC that the Credential Board Report be received and voted on item by item. Items 1-5 carried. Item 6 to be referred back to the Credential Board and bring back a recommendation at the next quarterly meeting. (See Reports)

MSC to accept the Executive Board Report. (See Reports)

Rev. Louis Wickham gave the date of the state CTS competitive activities to be June 2 at the Northwest Free Will Baptist Church, Oklahoma City and the state youth camp to be June 11-15.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. James Cearley.

Saturday, November 18, 1978—11:00 a.m. Worship

The morning worship began by singing *I Will Sing the Wondrous Story* and *Tell Me the Story of Jesus*.

Rev. Dan Farmer presented the winning churches in the Sunday School campaign plaques. Division A, first place, Noble; Division B, first place, Grace.

Special music was presented by Rev. Homer Young, *It Is Well With My Soul*.

Rev. Jay Tilson brought the message of the morning using II Corinthians 5:18-20 as his text.

Saturday, November 18, 1978—12:00 Noon Business

The Woman's Auxiliary report was received as information.

MSC to receive Business Committee Report and vote on it item by item. Both items carried with the stipulation that concerning Item 1 the Credential Board check to see if Rev. Wilkerson's credentials are registered at the Cleveland County courthouse and if so exsponge them. Also the clerk of the association to write a letter to the Cumberland Association in Tennessee with a copy of Rev. Wilkerson's letter of explanation concerning his credentials.

The Committee report concerning the organizing of new churches was given. MSC that this be laid on the table until the annual meeting. (See Reports)

Budget and Auditing Committee appointed: Rev. Waldo Young, Rev. James Murray, Rev. Dan Farmer.

MSC to adjourn. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Dan Harper.

REPORTS

SPECIAL COMMITTEE

We feel that since some feel that the Executive Board should do the organizing of new churches and others feel the Credential Board should, that the article in question be changed to read both boards. This change can be done by adding the Executive Board's name to the original article, or, adding the Credential Board's name to the motion laid on the table.

BUSINESS COMMITTEE

1. We received a letter from Herbert Wilkerson asking us to nullify his credentials due to his membership with another denomination. We request this be done.

2. Standing vote of thanks to host church for their hospitality.

EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Executive Board met with the Lakeside Free Will Baptist Church for the purpose of examination to be accepted into the First Oklahoma Association. The Board voted unanimous to accept the church as a member.

CREDENTIAL BOARD

The Credentials Board of the First Oklahoma Assn. of Free Will Baptists met October 6, 21, and November 10, 1978. We recommend the following be approved:

1. For renewal of license, Terry Van Winkle; 2. For recognition of license, Johnny Kruger, Joe Govreau; 3. For ordination as deacons, Marion Dale Reimer, Randy Lack; 4. For ordination to the ministry, Darrel Percy, Cody Freeman; 5. For acceptance into the Association as ordained ministers, Russell Johnson on recommendation from his former association; Charles Murphy with recommendation from his former association; 6. The Board examined Dusty Cooksey for acceptance into the Association as an ordained minister. Motion was carried to ask him to write in plain language answers to questions regarding statements made in his letters regarding inspiration, and that he denounce any leaning toward pseudonymity. October 21 the Board postponed action on his case until the meeting of November 10. Motion was carried by a majority vote (Rev. Dan Farmer voting No) to recommend that the Association not seat Dusty Cooksey as an ordained minister due to his failure to comply with the Board's request to answer in writing, questions concerning inspiration.

ANNUAL MEETING

Saturday, February 17, 1979—9:00 a.m. Business

AUDITING AND BUDGET COMMITTEE

Due to the absence of normal bookkeeping procedures, we are unable to determine the accuracy of the Church Training Service and the Mission Board books.

1. We recommend that the treasurer of each of these boards set up a book-keeping system that will show the source of revenue and the purpose and amount of expenditures more accurately.
2. We recommend a cooperative plan budget of \$40,000.00, showing the following percentages and amounts:

NOTE: Since the meeting of the Auditing Committee, the Mission Board Treasurer's books have been posted again, and now show every source of income, every expenditure, and are balanced with the bank statement.

MISSION BOARD

The Board recommended that a mission church be established in Choctaw with Rev. Jerry Dudley as Mission worker. Blue-prints are complete and building permits issued by the City of Choctaw. Approximately \$100,000 will construct a building of 5,000 square feet and furnish the building. (A condensed report).

Recommendations:

1. The Mission Board requested an increase in the cooperative allocation. This is needed to offset the initial load of payments on a loan, when secured, to allow the Mission growth time to become self-supporting.
2. We recommend that the associational churches support the Mission with continued faith promise giving and in supplying some of the special needs, i.e.: a good piano, road and parking area, curtains, educational materials-visual aids, tables, chairs, etc.
3. We recommend that all area churches conduct their mission conferences in November of each year to cooperate with our National Mission Boards in cutting cost of travel and better utilization of Missionaries time and energy. All churches desiring should attempt to schedule mission emphasis at this time.
4. We recommend that associational support for the Choctaw Mission be continued. We further recommend that the Mission Board be authorized to search for another mission location to be launched upon the completion of the Choctaw Mission Project.
5. We recommend that the August Quarterly Meeting be a conference type session with the program to be arranged by the Mission Board.
6. We recommend the adoption of the finance report and the proposed budget.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each church in the Association is to send \$30.00 to the annual

session of this Association (\$10.00 for Association Minutes and \$20.00 for State Association expense).

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and $\frac{3}{4}$ majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, and a treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Duties:

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial report of such. The Associational books are to be closed on the 20th of each month. The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the Saturday before the third Sunday in the months of February, May, August, and November, with the February meeting being the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—*Composition:* The officers of this Association shall constitute the Executive Board, along with five members elected by the body.

Section 2—*Duties:* The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—*Meetings:* Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have power to collect funds as the means on hand may warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—*Powers:* The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No

member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meeting or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—*Finance Committee:* A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—*Audit Committee:* An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty it shall be to audit the treasurers account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the morning session until the afternoon session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in personality, one in essence.
3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Saviour will be saved.
5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.
8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one

in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.

9. The definition and condition of the backslider:

A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jere. 2:21; Jere. 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matt. 6:24; Heb. 10:38-39; Heb. 3:12-14; Ezek. 18:24; I John 1:9; Rev. 21:27.

- (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
- (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
- (c) We believe that any individual living in the practice of sin (whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
- (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned, (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall." II Peter 1:4-10.
