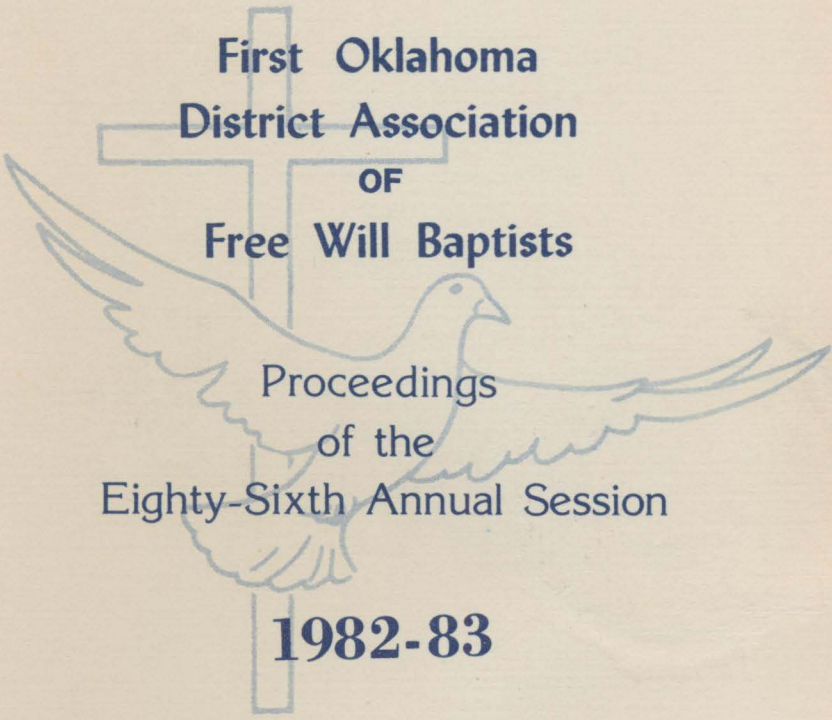

FIRST QUARTERLY MEETING

REPORTS

MISSION BOARD

We are still in the process of trying to sell the church property in Chandler. So far all offers received were lower than we are willing to accept. We will continue in our attempts to find a buyer.

The Westgate Church was organized on April 22, 1982, with approximately 40 charter members.

We are still in need of permanent financing on the loan at Shawnee. It is still with the construction loan, and interest is being paid as it is due. We have instructed the pastor to secure permanent financing.

The Choctaw Church is now assuming 70% of their pastor's salary, plus all other expenses including the payment on the two and one-half extra acres. We anticipate that this church will be free from all board support before the end of 1982.

Our funds in the General Treasury are depleted. We are still responsible for the entire pastor's salary for the Westgate Church, and for 30% of the salary for the pastor of the Choctaw Church. Our outgo is more than our income, and we have reached the bottom.

We appreciate the Choctaw Church, Sunnyside Church, Calvary Church, and the Spencer Road Church placing District Missions in their church budgets for the coming year. We hope other churches will follow their example.

We request the \$2,000 which was received from the telephone company for the privilege of setting a phone box on the property, be given to the District Missions General Fund to supplement our needs through the summer months.

SECOND QUARTERLY MEETING

Saturday, August 14, 1982—9:00 a.m. Business Session

The August quarterly meeting began with Rev. Terry Van Winkle leading the congregation in singing *I Will Sing the Wondrous Story* with Rev. Waldo Young, pianist.

After prayer by Rev. Joe Grizzle, Rev. Delbert Akin, host pastor, extended a welcome to the churches.

MSC to receive the letters, seat the delegates and give the recommendations to the proper boards. Churches represented were: Choctaw, Spring Hill, Lakeside, Straight Street, Brookside, Calvary, Western Avenue, Norman First, Westgate, Tecumseh, Southern Oaks, Pleasant Hill, Trinity, Southwest, Capitol Hill, Moore First, Earlsboro, Grace, Spencer Road and Northwest.

Due to the moving of the Moderator, Rev. Bill Jones, MSC that the Assistant Moderator, Rev. Gary Dodson be elected as Moderator. MSC that Rev. Delbert Akin be the Assistant Moderator.

Rev. Mark Barnes, pastor of the Pleasant Hill church brought the devotion from II Corinthians 8:4 and led the congregation in prayer.

MSC to receive the letter from the Northwest church and their delegates seated.

MSC that the Chair appoint the Business Committee: Rev. Keith Woody, Rev. James Murray, Rev. Joe Grizzle.

Visitors recognized: Randall Williams, Arkansas and the new pastor of Shawnee Northeast, Steve Shaw.

MSC to accept the Treasurer's report as read.

MSC to accept the report of the Credential Board. (See Reports)

MSC to accept the CTS Board report. Youth camp tentatively set for last week of June and first week of August.

MSC to accept the Mission Board report. (See Reports)

MSC to honor the request from the Spencer Road Church that Dennis Tackett and Mark Hess be examined by the Credential Board for license to preach the gospel.

MSC to place Rev. Keith Woody on the Mission Board to replace Rev. Bill Jones who has moved from the association.

MSC to accept the letters from Straight Street and Lakeside churches and seat their delegates.

Rev. Edwin Wade gave the report from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College.

Rev. Lonnie DaVoult gave a report concerning the work Free Will Baptists are doing around the state and about activities which would be at the state association meeting October 11-14 at the Capitol Hill Church and Hillsdale College.

Request of a letter from the Canadian Association asking for a recommendation concerning William LaValley from the Mustang Church. MSC to advise the Canadian Association that his license had expired and that their association should take the responsibility of examining him.

MSC to recess until time for worship service.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Lonnie DaVoult.

Saturday, August 14, 1982—11:00 a.m. Business Session

MSC to receive the report of the Business Committee and vote item by item. All items carried.

REPORTS

CREDENTIAL BOARD

The Credential Board met August 10, 1982 at Westgate Church and offer the following recommendations:

1. Mark Barnes, Pleasant Hill Church be received into the Association from the Canadian Association upon a letter of recommendation from that association.
2. Robert Hobbs, Southern Oaks Church, ordained minister, be received into the association upon receipt of a letter from Fayette Conference, West Virginia.
3. William Duffield, Tecumseh Church, for ordination as a deacon.
4. Larry Capps, Westgate Church, recommend that he continue as a deacon on trial.

MISSION BOARD

The church property in Chandler, which was given to the association then delegated to the Mission Board to sell, has been sold. It was purchased

by April Wayland who will turn it into a day care center. We cleared \$17,000 from the sale of the property, plus \$500 from the sale of the pulpit and pews.

The loan for the Westgate Church, Shawnee, has been secured from the American National Bank, Shawnee. We applied \$13,000 from the sale of the Chandler property to this indebtedness, bringing it down to \$68,000. The remaining from the sale will be applied to the indebtedness on the land. We have funds to pay off the Westgate land, and plan to do this next week. The total indebtedness on the Westgate property and building is \$68,000. We continue to support the Westgate Church by paying the Pastor's salary.

The Choctaw Church voted last week to become self supporting. They reached this status in a little less than four years. Besides assuming all of their financial responsibilities, they have also assumed the payment on the extra two and one-half acres next to the church. The success of this work encourages us in other projects.

In a board meeting on June 28, 1982, the board adopted a motion stating that our next project in establishing a new church would be in Harrah. Don Guthrie, Associate Pastor at the Spencer Road Church, a 28 year old student at Hillsdale College, will be the mission worker there. As it looks now, this project should begin early in 1985, which should give us some time to build up funds to use in purchasing land, etc.

We have withdrawn our savings from First Western, which was placed there from the sale of the Shawnee First Church. This, plus other funds mentioned above, will be used in paying off the Westgate land. After this is done, and with all bills paid through August, we will have approximately \$3,000 in the treasury.

THIRD QUARTERLY MEETING

Saturday, November 20, 1982—9:00 a.m. Business Session

The business session began with Rev. Frank Giles leading the congregation in singing *The Rock That Is Higher Than I*. After prayer by Rev. Charles Wilson Rev. Steve Shaw brought the morning devotion from Luke 18: 9-14 and then led in prayer.

MSC to receive the letters from the churches, seat the delegates and refer the requests to the appropriate boards.

Churches represented were: Calvary, Capitol Hill, Southern Oaks, Lakeside, Earlsboro, Northwest, Shawnee Westgate, Spring Hill, Moore, Trinity, Choctaw, Western Avenue, Southwest, Noble, Spencer Road, Shawnee Northeast, Tecumseh, Grace, and Pleasant Hill.

MSC that the Moderator appoint the Business Committee for the day: Rev. James Cearley, Rick Vanderburg, Rev. Dan Farmer.

Visitors were recognized: Revs. Frank Breeden and Ken Riggs from the Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville. They spoke briefly bringing greetings from the college and sharing information concerning the activities at the school.

Rev. N. R. Smith, Public Relations Director, Hillsdale reported from Hillsdale and expressed the enthusiasm which prevails at the school. One of the needs at the present time is to replace the oven in the cafeteria.

MSC to accept the Treasurer's report as read by Bro. Steve Beam.

Motion and second that the Budget Committee set the annual fees at the third quarterly meeting so churches can be informed of the amount due at the annual meeting which meets in February. MSC that this be amended so that the Executive Committee would act as the Budget Committee.

MSC to accept the report of the Credential Board. (See Reports)

MSC to receive the report of the Mission Board. (See Reports)

MSC to receive the letter from the Northwest Church and seat their delegates.

MSC that letters of recommendation be sent for Rev. Bill Jones, Rev. Jerry McArthur, and Rev. Stan Konopinski, ministers who have assumed pastorates in other associations.

MSC to dismiss until time for the morning worship.

11:00 a.m. Worship Service

The morning worship began with Rev. Frank Giles leading in *Higher Ground* followed by prayer by Rev. Keith Woody. The congregation then sang *We're Marching to Zion*.

Two special numbers were sang *Because He Lives* and *The Longer I Serve Him* by Revs. Waldo Young, Frank Breeden and Ken Riggs.

Following a solo by Rev. Ken Riggs singing *Sheltered in the Arms of God*, Rev. Mike Wade brought the morning message from Luke 9:57-62.

12:00 Noon Business Session

MSC to receive the recommendation from the Executive Committee. MSC that this be laid on the table until the annual conference. (See Reports)

MSC to receive the report from the Business Committee and vote on it item by item. All recommendations accepted.

Motion and seconded to use an abbreviated form for our annual report. MSC that this be amended to use the new form which is being prepared by the National Association.

MSC to adjourn. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Frank Wiley.

REPORTS

CREDENTIAL BOARD

We examined the following and make these recommendations:

1. Dennis Tackett, Spencer Road—We recommend that he be licensed to preach the Gospel for one year.
2. Dave Filkins—Calvary—We recommend that his license be extended to preach the Gospel for one year.
3. Mark Hess, Spencer Road—We recommend his license be extended to preach the Gospel for one year.

4. Steve Guzman, Grace—We recommend he be licensed to preach the Gospel for one year.

MISSION BOARD

The Westgate Church in Shawnee will begin January 1, 1983, to gradually assume the responsibility of the Pastor's salary. We expect this work to be self-supporting in approximately 18 months. The board approved an increase in salary for the worker there. His total salary for 1983, including housing, insurance, and all other benefits, will be \$22,100.00 annually.

The board has signed a contract to purchase 5 acres of land on the southwest corner of East Reno and Dobbs Road in Harrah. The purchase price is \$50,000 with \$6,000 down. The owner will carry balance at no interest. The payments will be \$300.00 per month for 12 years and 3 months.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee offers the following recommendation:

That Article III, Section 4, of the Constitution be amended to read,

Each church of the Association is to send \$75.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$20.00 for the District Association, \$25.00 for the State Association, \$10.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

BUSINESS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that the association give \$1,000.00 to the State Office Building Fund.

2. We recommend that the Executive Board contact churches that have not reported in the past year, to encourage them to report in February.

ANNUAL SESSION

Saturday, February 19, 1983—9:00 a.m. Business Session

The Eighty-sixth annual session of the First Oklahoma District Association was opened with Rev. Homer Young leading the congregation in singing *Glory to His Name*, with Rev. Waldo Young, pianist. Rev. Don Guthrie brought the morning devotion from Acts 17:22-32 and led the congregation in prayer.

Rev. Delbert Akin, Assistant Moderator, was in charge of the meeting due to the absence of the Moderator. The deacons, ministers and church clerks (standing delegates) were asked to stand representing the voting body until the delegates from the various churches were seated.

MSC that the letters be received, the delegates seated and the statistics in the annual letters be entered in the printed minutes. Bro. Jams Puckett, assistant clerk, extended a welcome and seated the delegates.

Visiting ministers were recognized: Rev. Frank Breeden, Nashville, TN; Rev. T. W. Archer, Lakeside; Dan Deskin.

The Business Committee was appointed by the Moderator: Rev. De-Arthur Yandell, Rev. Mike Wade, Rev. Frank Giles.

The Obituary Committee was appointed by the Moderator: John Coley, Jerri Hollie, Virginia Van Winkle.

Rev. Frank Breeden brought greetings from FWBBC and gave some information about the new graduate school.

Frank Gregory, summer missionary to Panama spoke expressing his appreciation to the churches for their support on his behalf.

Rev. Edwin Wade, President of Hillsdale gave a report on the activities of the school: On Campus Days and the Bible Conference which would be in the near future.

MSC to take the item from the table concerning Article III, Section 4 of the Constitution. MSC to accept the recommendation from the Executive Committee: That Article III, Section 4, of the Constitution be amended to read: Each church of the Association is to send \$75.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$20.00 for the District Association, \$25.00 for the State Association, \$10.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

MSC to accept the Treasurer's report as read.

MSC to accept the report of the CTS Board. CTS competition, April 23; Youth Camp, Juniors, July 10-15; Youth Camp, Seniors, July 31-August 5. Board members elected: 1983-88—Bob Hudson; 1982-87—Don Guthrie.

MSC to accept the report of the Mission Board. Rev. Delbert Akin and Rev. Jerry Dudley expressed their appreciation for the support of the association in their work at Shawnee and Choctaw. (See Reports).

Mission Board member elected: 1983-88—Rev. Keith Woody.

MSC to receive the Credential Board Report and vote on it item by item. All items were approved. (See Reports).

The Executive Committee and Budget Committee met at the Southern Oaks Church February 11, and as a result of this meeting we offer the following recommendations:

1. We recommend that \$200.00 scholarships be given to David Filkins and to Frank Gregory, from Calvary and Spencer Road.

2. We recommend that \$100.00 scholarships be given to Mike Parrot, Moore First, Jim Tackett, Norman First, Don Guthrie and Annette Young, Spencer Road, Laura Harper and Joel Greeson, Noble, Kerry Gandy, Capitol Hill, and Terry Stafford, Southern Oaks.

3. We recommend a cooperative plan budget for 1983 of \$72,000.00, to be disbursed as follows:

4. We have looked over the financial records of the District Treasurer,

the CTS Treasurer, and the Missions Board Treasurer, and find that they keep accurate records, and that the figures are correct. We realize that this is not an audit as such.

5. We recommend that we go back to the practice of having a committee from the District audit the District Treasurer's books, thus saving the expense of a professional auditor.

MSC to recess until the 11:00 a.m. worship hour.

11:00 a.m. Worship Service

The morning worship began with Rev. Doug Little leading the congregation in singing *Victory in Jesus* and *I Am Resolved*, Rev. Waldo Young, pianist.

Rev. Jim Shepherd, new Vice President of Student Affairs at Hillsdale brought greetings and informed the association as to what some of his duties would be concerning the students.

Rev. Doug Little sang a special number *The Ninety and Nine*.

The message of the morning was brought by Rev. David Archer, new mission worker at Glenpool, Oklahoma. His message was taken from John 15:7-11.

12:00 Noon Business Session

After the morning worship the business continued:

Executive Board member elected: 1983-88—Rev. Mark Barnes.

State General Board Member elected for 1983-84—Rev. Waldo Young.

MSC to receive the report of the Obituary Committee. The congregation was asked to stand for a moment of silent prayer and then Rev. Muril Wilson led in prayer in remembrance of those who had died during the past year.

MSC to receive the report of the Business Committee and vote item by item: 1. We recommend that \$500.00 be given to the state mission work at Glenpool where Bro. Archer serves as missionary. (Amended that this be earmarked to purchase a typewriter).

2. We recommend that we elect a standing Christian Education Committee of five members, to facilitate Teacher Training, Sunday School Growth, and Seminars within co-operative effort. This would engender help in completing the teaching ministry assigned us by the Scriptures, Church Covenant, and the Treatise of Free Will Baptists.

Members elected: Doug Little, Jerry Dudley, Frank Wiley, Tommy Allen, Donna Richey.

MSC to have the following churches host the quarterly meetings for 1983-84: May 14—Calvary; August 20—Shawnee Northeast; November 19—Newcastle; February 18—Southern Oaks.

MSC that a standing vote be given to the Sunnyslane Church for their hospitality during the meeting.

MISSION BOARD

The Choctaw Church, in just less than four years from its beginning, has become self-supporting in 1982, including payment on the extra two and one-half acres of land. Jerry Dudley is the pastor.

The Westgate Church, Shawnee, was organized, and its building dedicated. Beginning January 1, 1983, this church is gradually assuming its entire obligations and by the end of 1983, should be much less dependent on the Mission Board for support. Delbert Akin is the pastor of this church.

Five acres of land has been purchased for a future church site on Dobbs Road at Reno in Harrah. Plans call for the first building to be built there in 1984, and services to begin when the building is completed. Don Guthrie will serve as Mission Worker in Harrah.

CREDENTIAL BOARD

We recommend that Steve Shaw, Shawnee Northeast Church be received into the association as an ordained minister upon receipt of a letter from the Central Western Association of Missouri.

We recommend that Mike Wade, Calvary Church, be received into the association as an ordained minister upon receipt of a letter from Mission District Association of Texas.

We recommend that Steven E. Turner, Sunnyslane Church, be granted a license to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ for a period of one year.

We recommend that Kerry Gandy, Capitol Hill Church, be granted a license to preach the gospel of Jesus Christ for a period of one year.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each church of the Association is to send \$75.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$20.00 for the District Association, \$25.00 for the State Association, \$10.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Duties:

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial report of such. The Associational books are to be closed on the 20th of each month. The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the Saturday before the third Sunday in the months of February, May, August, and November, with the February meeting being the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—*Composition:* The officers of this Association shall constitute the Executive Board, along with five members elected by the body.

Section 2—Duties: The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—Meetings: Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have power to collect funds as the means on hand may warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—Powers: The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meeting or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any

worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—*Finance Committee*: A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—*Audit Committee*: An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty it shall be to audit the treasurers account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules or order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the morning session until the afternoon session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.

9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in personality, one in essence.
3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Saviour will be saved.
5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.
8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints

and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.

9. The definition and condition of the backslider:

A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jere. 2:21; Jere. 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matt. 6:24; Heb. 10:38-39; Heb. 3:12-14; Ezek. 18:24; I John 1:9; Rev. 21:27.

- (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
- (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
- (c) We believe that any individual living in the practice of sin (whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
- (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned, (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall." II Peter 1:4-10.
