Rev. Earnie Deeds, missionary to Brazil spoke concerning our work in that country.

MSC to recess until the 11:00 a.m. worship hour. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Shelby Greeson.

11:00 a.m. Worship

The 11:00 a.m. worship began with Steve Beam leding the congregation in singing My Anchor Holds with Rev. Doug Little, pianist. After prayer by Rev. Waldo Young the congregation continued the service by singing It Is Well With My Soul. Rev. Doug Little concluded the song service by singing a solo When He Reached Down for Me.

Rev. Mark Barnes brought the morning message, "Spirit and Truth," taking his text from John 4:20-25.

MSC to adjourn. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. Delbert Akin.

BUSINESS COMMITTEE

- 1. We recommend that we give \$500.00 to the Earnie Deeds account.
- 2. We recommend that we give \$500.00 toward purchasing choir robes for the Hillsdale choir.
- 3. That we give a standing vote of thanks to Calvary Free Will Baptist Church for hosting this meeting.

CREDENTIAL BOARD

1. George Naumann, a member of Calvary Free Will Baptist Church has accepted the pastorate of the Mustang Free Will Baptist Church, thus

the need for ordination becomes apparent. Having been licensed by the First Oklahoma Association and renewed annually, he is known in this association and requests ordination come from this association. The time required for normal procedure would require another three (3) months before ordination would be possible. The need for immediate ordination prompted the Calvary Church to request the Executive Board to hear the request. The members of the Executive Board consulted recommended that the Credential Board proceed to examine Brother Naumann and refer their findings with the request to the Association. We the Credential Board find George Naumann sound in doctrine and practice and recommend him as worthy of ordination.

2. Richard Frazier, Sunnylane Free Will Baptist Church, was examined for ordination as a deacon. We find him eminantly qualified and recommend him as worthy of ordination.

MISSION BOARD

The District Mission Board continues with the work delegated to it. We appreciate your confidence, cooperation, and continued support.

- 1. Westgate Church, Shawnee, is still on schedule in the program to become self supporting. If we stay on this schedule, that church will no longer depend on us for support as of the end of 1983. Continue to pray for this work.
- 2. We are considering the possibility of beginning the work in Harrah sooner than expected. We are presently paying \$300.00 monthly payments on the land there. Tentatively we plan to break ground for the new building in May of 1984, employ Don Guthrie then to help with the building while at the same time he can do itinerate work to raise support. We average approximately \$1,500.00 per month income now from co-op and designated gifts. The board will need approximately \$4,000.00 per month for a while when this new church begins. We will be paying a land payment, building payment, and pastor's salary for a few weeks until a congregation begins to be built. Please consider placing District Missions in your church budget soon.
- 3. We are again planning to sponsor the Missions Conference in November, following the conference at Hillsdale College. Along with the Foreign and Home Missionaries, any of our board members or workers (former, present, or future) will make ourselves available to present District Missions to your church. In no way do we want to take from Home and Foreign Missions, but we do want to push District Missions along with the other programs. Please consider scheduling one of us to present this program to your church.

Our only expenditures for the quarter have been for Harrah land payments and our support of the Westgate Church, Shawnee. Since we give a detailed report at the annual meeting, we will simply share with you now that our balance in the treasure is \$1,003.44, as of today. Recommendation:

The Choctaw Church is filled to capacity. They want to build. However,

the property is in the name of the First Oklahoma Association, so this association must approve and sign for any additional loans.

There are two choices they have. They can either borrow enough to pay off their indebtedness and build, thus have one loan, or they can borrow on a second mortgage to build. We are talking of \$25,000 to \$30,000.

We recommend that we authorize the officials of this association to sign for a loan in the amount mentioned above, which ever way the church chooses to borrow. (Amended that power be given to the Executive Board to turn the property over to the Choctaw Church. Amendment carried. Main motion carried as amended.)

SECOND QUARTERLY MEETING

Saturday, August 20, 1983—9:00 a.m. Business Session

The business session began with Steve Beam leading the congregation in singing Leaning On the Everlasting Arms, Rev. Waldo Young, pianist.

After prayer by Rev. Joe Blair the congregation continued singing There Is Power In the Blood.

Rev. Steve Shaw, pastor of the host church, Shawnee Northeast, extended a welcome to those present.

MSC to receive the letters as read and seat the delegates, referring the requests to the proper boards.

Bro. Johnny Conyers from the Westgate Church brought the morning devotion from Ex. 3:9-12; Jere. 1:6-7; I Cor. 15:10.

The moderator appointed the Business Committee: Rev. James Puckett, Rev. James Cearley, Rev. Gary Dodson.

Visitors were recognized: Rev. Frank Breeden, Rev. George Naumann. Rev. Edwin Wade gave the report from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College along with Rev. Jim Shepherd who encouraged pastors to come to the school and speak during the chapel services.

examined by our Credential Board and request a letter of recommendation from the Canadian Association.

MSC to dismiss business session and begin worship service at 11:00 a.m. Dismissed in prayer by Rev. DeArthur Yandell.

MSC to purchase a new seal for the association and the treasurer will keep it in the safe deposit box.

Dismissed in prayer by Rev. James Cearley.

The area Missions Conference featured eight foreign missionaries, one home missionary, and one service for our future District Missions worker. Twenty-two churches participated. We are in the process of collecting information which will indicate results from the conference.

Shawnee Westgate Church will be going self-supporting very soon. Over the next four months we will give them approximately \$1500.00 support and then they will be on their own.

Don Guthrie will be working for the association through the mission board on a part-time basis beginning March 1, 1984. For March, April, and May, while he is completing his education and working for the board part time, Don will be available for services in our churches on Sundays, Wednesdays, or any other night of the week. Please begin scheduling him for those services. He may also be having in home Bible studies in Harrah,

will be locating a suitable place to begin services, and may be doing some survey work in the area.

The Guthries will be moving to Harrah probably in May, and as a suitable place is found in which to worship, will be beginning services in Harrah. When they are moved to Harrah, probably the first week of June, Don will be a full-time employee of the mission board.

We are beginning to look for another suitable site for a church. We seem to be impressed to look in far southwest Moore area. Land is very expensive and our funds, or lack of funds, will determine what we do. Please pray for God's direction on our activities.

Our present balance, as of this date, is \$2,605.85.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and

unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each church of the Association is to send \$75.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$20.00 for the District Association, \$25.00 for the State Association, \$10.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Duties:

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make

regular financial report of such. The Associational books are to be closed on the 20th of each month. The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the Saturday before the third Sunday in the months of February, May, August, and November, with the February meeting being the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—Composition: The officers of this Association shall constitute the Executive Board, along with five members elected by the body.

Section 2—Duties: The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—Meetings: Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have power to collect funds as the means on hand may warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—Powers: The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meeting or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as

are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

Christian Education Board: The Christian Education Board shall be to provide the churches of the district updated information regarding trends and materials in Christian education, to sponsor training sessions for the district, to assist individual churches in their training programs, and to seek ways to evaluate and enhance the educational ministries of the various churches of the district.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—Finance Committee: A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—Audit Committee: An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty it shall be to audit the treasurers account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules or order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This Constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the morning session until the afternoon session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.

- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
- 5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
- 7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
- 8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
- 9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in personality, one in essence.
- 3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
- 4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Saviour will be saved.
- 5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
- 7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of

- Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.
- 8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.
- 9. The definition and condition of the backslider: A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jere. 2:21; Jere. 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 612; Matt. 6:24; Heb. 10:38-

39; Heb. 3:12-14; Ezek. 18:24; I John 1:9; Rev. 21:27.

- (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
 - (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
 - (c) We believe that any individual living in the practice of sin (whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
 - (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned, (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren

nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall." II Peter 1:4-10.
