FIRST QUARTERLY MEETING

May 21, 1994

Business Session—

Moderator Mike Wade extended the welcome and called the meeting to order. Bro. and Sis. Maynard led the congregation in singing "Amazing Grace." Host pastor Bro. Shelby Greeson also welcomed the group prior to bringing the devotional thought from Mark 1:35.

1. Assistant Clerk Waldo Young read the report of the churches of the churches, the list of delegates and the requests for business by the churches. A total of 17 churches turned in credential lists. MSC that the reports be received, the delegates seated and the requests forwarded to the proper committees. Assistant moderator Edwin Wade prayed the prayer of dedication as the delegates were recognized and seated.

2. TREASURY REPORT: Treasurer Garry Richey presented his report, showing a balance brought forward of \$2,159.79, income of \$78,053.64; expenditures of \$78,429.47, leaving a balance on hand of \$1,178.96. MSC the report be received.

3. MISSION BOARD REPORT: Frank Wiley gave the report showing a

beginning balance of \$8,728.23, expenditures of \$45,764.97, income of \$40,406.96 for a balance of \$3,370.22. Bro. Buddy Drake, pastor of First Oklahoma mission church at El Reno gave a report in which he said finances are improving, attendance is increasing and land is still a top priority. MSC to receive report.

4. Bro. Burton Perry of the State Mission Board gave updates on mission work at Hugo and Ft. Gibson and told the group the next project will be at Grove. He then yielded to Bro. Homer Young, pastor of State Mission project in El Reno, who reported an average of 52 in church. They have closed the deal for the land for their building.

5. Jeff Sloan, Hillsdale graduate who has pastored in Ardmore for the past four years, shared his burden to go to Ft. Wayne, Indiana to plant a mission church for the National Home Mission Board.

6. CREDENTIAL BOARD REPORT: Bro. Dan Farmer reported the credential board had met and recommended that Jeff Plunkett, pastor of Straight Street Free Will Baptist Church, be ordained to preach the gospel. MSC to receive the report. MSC to authorize Straight Street to proceed with ordination of Bro. Jeff.

7. CE BOARD REPORT: John Martin presented CE Report, listing the results of CE workshop at Southern Oaks, CE Board dinner with youth pastors, CE competition and plans for youth camp. Balance on hand in treasury, \$268.94. MSC to receive report.

8. Bro. Mike Wade was elected to serve as general board member to the state meeting.

9. Bro. Brad Utley again distributed copies of recommendations of task force to study resources and personnel of district area churches. MSC that moderator appoint members of task force committee to be called Cooperative Commission. Those appointed to serve on cooperative commission were Brad Utley, Tim Eaton, Reford Wilson, Dan Farmer and Colin Fitzsimmons.

10. Bro. Tim Eaton gave Hillsdale report in which he revealed enrollment had increased second semester, enabling the school to meet every criterion set down by the Regents of Higher Education in their evaluation/accreditation report last spring. The latest fundraising campaign is "Bridge the Gap" to raise the \$45,000 necessary to operate debt free the past year.

11. MSC to grant request of First Kansas Association to grant letters of recommendation for Bro. Tim Stringer and Bro. Bruce Thurman.

12. MSC to adjourn business meeting for refreshment break.

Following break, Bro. Paul Nelson led the group in singing, "Victory in Jesus."

MSC to return to business session.

Business committee make its recommendation to give \$1,000 to Jeff Sloan's account for the Ft. Wayne, Ind. mission; and \$1,000 to Bridge the Gap for Hillsdale. MSC.

Bro. Brad Utley dismissed the business meeting.

Worship hour was opened with Paul and Reva Nelson singing "I Can't Even Walk without You Holding My Hand." Then Bro. Lester Maynard, accompanied by his wife sang, "When God Dips His Pen of Love in My Heart."

The message was brought by Bro. Delbert Akin, pastor of First United Free Will Baptist Church of Choctaw on "Pentecost Sunday" using John 14:16 as his text.

Colin Fitzsimmons dismissed in prayer.

Next quarterly meeting is Aug. 13 at Westgate FWB Church. Bro. Jeff Plunkett will deliver the message.

SECOND QUARTERLY MEETING August 13, 1994

Service opened with congregational music led by Bro. Mark Kraeer. Bro. Shelby Greeson led in prayer. Welcome was extended by host pastor Rev. Colin Fitzsimmons and the morning devotional was delivered by Bro. Tim Dodson, youth pastor at the host church.

Meeting was called to order by Moderator Mike Wade. Assistant Clerk Waldo Young read the church letters. MSC to accept letters and refer requests to proper boards. Delegates were seated with Bro. Edwin Wade leading in prayer.

Churches present were: Kingsview, Straight Street, Choctaw, Harrah, Calvary, Grace, Trinity, Sunnyslane, Tecumseh, Southern Oaks, Oklahoma City First, Newcastle, Shawnee Northeast, Shawnee Westgate, Spring Hill, Southwest, Northwest. Also, mission churches at El Reno and Mustang were represented.

MSC to receive Treasurer's Report submitted by Garry Richey and presented by assistant treasurer Tim Eaton. Total receipts for second quarter were \$88,902.26 for a year to date total of \$166,955.90. Expenditures for the second quarter were \$89,300.41. Balance brought forward was \$1,783.96, leaving a current balance of \$1,385.81.

MSC to receive Credential Board's Report.

MSC to approve granting of license to preach the gospel to Steven Earp of the El Reno mission church.

Requests submitted to credentials board included:

1. Spring Hill church requested that Lynn Wood be accepted into association with full rights and privileges upon receipt of letter from Greater Tulsa.
2. Westgate church requested that Bro. Tim Dodson be examined for ordination for the ministry.
3. Northeast Church requested that Steve Mayhew be accepted into association as ordained minister upon receipt of letter from his home association in Arkansas.

MSC to accept report of Mission Board from Frank Wiley. Report showed beginning balance of \$5,797.77; receipts of \$13,313.16; expenditures of \$11,444.00 for a current balance of \$7,667.89

1. Yukon Church voted to deed property at 1400 W. Vandament to First Oklahoma and put Mission Board in charge of property. Property was

received and deeded over to the Executive Board and First Oklahoma Association. Bro. Buddy Drake has been holding services and board voted to give him oversight of the work under direction of mission board.

2. Board recommended that property of First United FWB Church in Choctaw be deeded over to the church with the final payment of the note which is expected in September.

3. Bro. Buddy Drake reported that Mustang work is averaging 32 on Sunday morning, 18 on Sunday night and 15 on Wednesday night with an average of \$1,854.58 per month. Yukon work is averaging about 10 with July income of \$600.

4. Bro. Homer Young gave report on state mission work at El Reno, which has been granted auxiliary status in First Oklahoma.

MSC all action items and others received as information.

MSC to accept Christian Education Board report as presented by John Martin. Report indicated only 57 young people attended District Youth Camp. Pastors and youth leaders will be polled in the next few months to give direction on the future of district camp. At least 100 campers are necessary to make it worthwhile for the district.

Rev. Tim Eaton gave report from Hillsdale College. Report was received as information.

Business committee made recommendation that district donate \$500 to the Lynn Midgett account.

Business meeting dismissed for recess by Bro. Dan Farmer.

Following recess Bro. Mark Kraeer led in congregational singing. Special music was given by Bro. and Sis. Fitzsimmons and Donna Kraeer. The morning message was delivered by Jeff Plunkett, pastor of Straight Street Free Will Baptist Church.

Following announcements, MSC that the host church be extended a standing vote of thanks for their hospitality. Next meeting will be Nov. 13 at Trinity Free Will Baptist Church. Dismissed in prayer in Ron Brown.

THIRD QUARTERLY MEETING November 12, 1994

Business Session—9:00 a.m.

Service was opened by congregational singing of "To God Be the Glory" led by John Martin and Waldo Young. Bro. Roger Ballard led in prayer.

Devotional and welcome by host pastor was given by Bro. Stan Konopinski. Business Items Included:

1. Reading of letters by Assistant Clerk Waldo Young and seating of delegates. MSC.

Those churches presenting letters were Choctaw, Capitol Hill, Northwest, Calvary, Tecumseh, Spencer Road, Southwest, Norman First, Newcastle, Oklahoma City First, Southern Oaks, Harrah, Spring Hill, Moore First, Straight Street, Trinity, Shawnee Northeast, Westgate, Sunnyslane. Prayer of blessing on delegates by Bro. Joe Blair.

2. TREASURER'S REPORT by Garry Richey. MSC to accept report.

3. MISSION BOARD REPORT by Delbert Akin. MSC to accept report. District Home missionary Buddy Drake gave report on work in Mustang and

Yukon. Bro. Homer Young gave report on State Mission Work at El Reno. Bro. Reford Wilson gave report in behalf of Lynn Midgett, who is having difficulty raising funds to return to the field in Spain. No action taken. Item referred to business committee.

4. CREDENTIAL BOARD REPORT: Recommended the district approve requests for ordination of Steve Mayhew, Shawnee NE; Lynn Wood, Spring Hill; Tim Dodson, Westgate at the pleasure of each church. MSC.

5. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD REPORT by John Martin. MSC to accept report.

6. Moderator announced memorial service for foreign missionary Glenda Leatherbury on Nov. 19 at Calvary. Prayer requested for family of Glenda and also for her partner Jalayn Martens. Prayer also requested for Bro. Homer Young's wife, who is ill. Prayer led by Bro. Brad Utley.

7. Hillsdale report given by Bro. Tim Eaton, noting that enrollment has shown slight decline, Have A Heart campaign is coming up, very successful missions conference just concluded. Four students have answered call to preach since school started.

ANNUAL MEETING

Pleasant Hill Church—February 11, 1995

The First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists met in the Pleasant Hill Church, Norman, Oklahoma for the 98th annual session on February 11, 1995. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by moderator Mike Wade.

Delbert Akin led the congregation in singing "All That Thrills My Soul," with Jan Clay as pianist. Richard Terry led in prayer.

Host pastor Chris Clay gave a welcome. He read John 13:1, brought devotional thoughts and led prayer.

The names of delegates were read from the church letters by assistant clerk Waldo Young. A motion carried to seat the delegates and refer requests to the proper boards. The delegates stood for recognition. Joe Blair led in prayer.

Treasurer Garry Richey gave the Treasurer's Report for the quarter and the year of 1994. A motion carried to accept the report.

Stan Konopinski gave the report of the Christian Education Board. A motion carried to receive the report and consider it item by item. Item #3, recommending the discontinuance of the district camp, was adopted. The other items were for information only.

Tim Dodson, Westgate Church, was elected as a 5 year member of the Christian Education Board.

Tim Eaton, Vice President of Academic Affairs, gave the report of Hillsdale FWB College.

Chairman Frank Wiley gave the report of the District Mission Board. Buddy Drake, worker at Mustang, gave a report of the progress of that work. A motion carried to receive the report.

Dennis Cariker, Spencer Road Church, was elected to a 5 year term on the Mission Board.

Ron Brown gave the report of the Credentials Board. A motion carried to

accept the report, all eight items.

Jim Puckett, Harrah Church, was elected to a five year term to the Credentials Board.

The meeting places for the coming year were set as follows:

The May meeting was set for May 6, so as to avoid conflict with the State Competitive Activities, and will be at the Southern Oaks Church. The August 13 meeting will be with the Yukon Church. The November 12 meeting will meet in the First United Church of Choctaw. The annual meeting will be February 10, 1996 at the Calvary Church, Norman.

Kent Hubbard, Southern Oaks Church, was elected as a 5 year member to the Executive Board.

Nominations were opened to elect the officers for the coming year. A motion carried to retain the same officers presently serving. A vote of appreciation was included in the standing vote to pass the motion.

Mike Wade was elected as the State General Board Member for 1996.

A motion carried that the district moderator serve as the State General Board member permanently. Whoever is the moderator of the association will serve as member of the General Board of the State Association.

A break was declared at 10:15 a.m. Lynn Wood led in prayer. The host church served refreshments.

The meeting resumed after the break. Delbert Akin led the congregation in singing "Joy Unspeakable". Garry Richey led in prayer.

The Executive Board report was given. Six \$100 scholarships were recommended for Hillsdale students. Those receiving the scholarships were Tamera Dimwiddie, Terri Hays, Jimmy Holbrook, Jodi Rice, Stephen Terry and Tina Wiley.

Item #2 of the Executive Board report was a resolution which reads,

Whereas, First Oklahoma Association has met 98 years, and Whereas, great plans require time to prepare, Be It Resolved that a committee be appointed to plan a centennial celebration for 1997, culminating in one giant rally, date to be planned also, with a history, goals, etc., to be written.

Both items were adopted. Waldo Young, Richard Terry and Roger Ballard were appointed as the Centennial Celebration Committee.

Shelby Greeson gave the report of the Business Committee. Item #1, recommended to give \$500 to the Have A Heart for Hillsdale Campaign. Item #2 recommended that no person serve on more than one standing board, excluding officers who may be serving on a board by virtue of office. Item #3 reported finding the financial records all in order. Item #4 recommended adopting the same percentage allocations in the budget as was set for 1994.

Those percentages are:

The report of the Business Committee was adopted.

A motion was made to amend the constitution by adding to Article V, Paragraph 2, the following:

He shall also serve as the General Board delegate to the State

Association of Free Will Baptists which meets annually.

A motion carried to table the motion because it requires a constitutional change.

A motion was made and seconded that churches who do not pay their annual dues lose their voting privileges. A motion was made and approved to table the motion.

A motion carried to refer the tabled motion to the Executive Board for study.

A motion carried to adjourn. Prayer was requested for the family of Mary Alice Bridgeman, WNAC State President. She passed away after a brief illness. Her funeral will be February 14.

The worship service was started. Joani Mosley from the host church presented special music, "A Crucified Heart."

Roger Ballard, Tecumseh pastor, brought the morning message. He read from Judges 6, and brought the morning message. He read from Judges 6, and brought the message on "A Mighty Man of Valor." He closed the message with prayer.

The moderator led in prayer to close the session.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, and ordained ministers and deacons actively serving in district mission works members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each of the Association is to send \$90.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$25.00 for the District Association, \$30.00 for the State Association, \$15.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial reports of such. The Association books are to be closed on the 15th of each month.

The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the second Saturday of February, May, August, and November. The February meeting will be the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—*Composition:* The Executive Board of this Association shall be five members, elected to terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 years with one term expiring each year, plus the Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer of the Association.

Section 2—*Duties:* The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—*Meetings:* Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have the power to collect funds as the means on hand may warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—*Powers:* The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive

Board shall have the power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meetings or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel. This Board shall provide the churches of the district updated information regarding trends and materials in Christian education, to sponsor training sessions for the district, to assist individual churches in their training programs, and to seek ways to evaluate and enhance the educational ministries of the various churches of the district.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—*Finance Committee:* A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—*Audit Committee:* An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty is shall be to audit the treasurer's account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules or order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the morning session until the afternoon session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator.
Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in one personality, one in essence.
3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Savior will be saved.
5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.
8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.
9. The definition and condition of the backslider:
A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jeremiah 2:21; Jeremiah 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matthew 6:24; Hebrews 10:38-39; Hebrews 3:12-14; Ezekial 18:24; I John 1:9; Revelation

21:27.

- (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
- (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
- (c) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
- (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fail." II Peter 1:4-10.
