FIRST OKLAHOMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

September 14, 1996

The First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists met in semi-annual session on Saturday, September 14, 1996 at Northwest Free Will Baptist Church, Oklahoma City.

Homer Young led the singing and Waldo Young accompanied him on piano leading the congregation in singing "Send A Great Revival." Welcome was extended by host pastor Ron Brown and devotional brought by Bro. Thomas Marberry using Luke 10 as his text.

Moderator Mike Wade called the meeting to order. Assistant Clerk Waldo Young called the roll of churches present and listed pastors, delegates and alternates. Those churches present were Capitol Hill, Southern Oaks, Yukon, OKC First, Choctaw, Northwest, Tecumseh, Harrah, Calvary, Spring Hill, Shawnee Northeast, Moore First, Windwood (Midwest City), Westgate, Morgan Road (Mustang), El Reno, Trinity, Sunnyslane.

MSC to accept reports and seat delegates. Assistant Moderator Edwin Wade led in prayer.

Action items included:

1. Christian Education Board report given by John Martin. The group conducted district competition for young people and paid the entry

fees for all those who qualified for state in Bible competition. There were three Bible Memorization, three sword drill and one Tic Tac Toe team. Plans call for assisting youth pastors group in sponsoring a Youth Revival in downtown Oklahoma City in October with Toby Youngblood as evangelist. Balance in treasury is \$1,327.16.

MSC to accept CE Board report.

2. Treasurer's report distributed and discussed by moderator in absence of treasurer and assistant. Balance on June 30, 1996 was \$3,704. Treasurer reported that approximately \$4,200 in current balance as of 9-14-96.

MSC to accept treasurer's report.

3. Business committee for September meeting: Roger Ballard, Frank Wiley, Shelby Greeson, appointed by moderator.

MSC to approve business committee recommendation for the following distribution of funds:

1. \$300 for Spanish work at Northwest FWB Church.
2. \$1,000 for Bill Phillips mission account.
3. \$1,000 for Have A Heart for Hillsdale.
4. FOR INFORMATION ONLY:
Hillsdale report given by Bro. Buddy Drake who reported enrollment steady and morale is high at the school. Urged pastors to participate in Have A Heart, Partner Church Program and other items in brochure he passed out.
5. Mission board report given by Frank Wiley. Gave report from state executive secretary Jack Richey that a record \$388,000 had gone through the state co-op account. Reported on district mission works at Mustang by Pastor Jim Harris and Windwood (Midwest City) by Pastor Tom Drake. Reported balance of \$10,770.24.

MSC to accept Mission Board Report.

6. For Information Only:
Bill Phillips, home missionary to Salt Lake City, Utah, reported on his itinerary and plans to get on the field by the first of the year. Requested prayer and support and an opportunity to visit in local churches.
7. For Information Only:
Bro. Thomas Marberry, a member of the Northwest FWB Church, told of a joint project with Capitol Hill FWB Church for Spanish speaking people. The program started at Northwest three years ago and expanded into the Capitol Hill church two weeks ago. All the work is being done by unpaid volunteers. They would like to buy uniforms and sponsor a team in the citywide soccer league.
8. Credential board report was presented by Bro. Dan Farmer.

MSC to approve the following recommendations:

- a. Todd Tennant of the Pleasant Hill Church, ordained to preach the gospel.

- b. Mark Brawley of the Newcastle FWB Church, accepted into First Oklahoma District Association upon receipt of letter from Central Association in Arkansas.
- c. Resolution to change procedure for examining candidates. (See below)

Resolution from the Credential Board to the First Oklahoma District. 9-14-96 at N.W. FWB Church:

Due to the fact that we have changed our district meetings to bi-annually, the Credential Board has experienced some difficulties in the area of examining Ministers and Deacons. If we continue with the current system, the process of ordaining and licensing ministers and deacons could take up to one year. Therefore, we submit the following resolution:

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Credential Board notify Pastors in our district by letter and communicate the following information: (1) who the Credential Board will be examining, (2) when the examination will occur and (3) if a Pastor would like to comment on an individual being examined, they would be instructed to notify the Chairman of Clerk of the Credential Board.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that after the Credential Board has examined candidates, the Credential Board will notify in writing Executive Board members concerning the Credential Board's recommendations.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Executive Board Members will be given ten days from the date of the letter to respond to the Chairman or Clerk of the Credential Board concerning the Credential Board's recommendations. If there is not a response within ten days, the Credential Board will notify Churches that submitted candidates to act on the Credential Board's recommendations.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that if an Executive Board Member does respond concerning a Recommendation from the Credential Board, the Executive Board and the Credential Board will work together to resolve any question concerning a candidate.

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Credential Board will be meeting once a quarter, therefore, each Pastor will be responsible for notifying the Chairman or Clerk of the Credential Board when they have a Minister or Deacon to be examined.

- 9. Centennial Celebration Committee report given by Waldo Young and Roger Ballard. Celebration will be held March 8, 1997 at Southern Oaks Free Will Baptist Church. Regular annual business meeting will be held in morning with 100th anniversary celebration in the afternoon.

MSC to appropriate funds (not to exceed \$3,000) to finance the celebration.

Bro. Tom Drake dismissed congregation for break.

Following break the following action items were considered:

1. MSC to approve business committee report.
2. MSC to appoint Bro. Steve Reeves of Blackwell to replace Bro. Colin Fitzsimmons on district mission board.
3. MSC to grant letters of good standing to L. D. Yandell to Dibble Association and Paul Hammons to Central Association Arkansas.

Bro. Buddy Drake dismissed business meeting following adjournment.

Worship service opened by congregational singing led by host choir. Special music by Bro. Robert Posar "Take My Hand, Precious Lord." Bro. Wade Jernigan brought the morning message entitled "A More Excellent Savior" from Hebrews 11:4.

Minutes of Semi-Annual Meeting of First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptist

Saturday, March 15, 1997

The semi-annual meeting of the First Oklahoma District Association was held Saturday, March 15 at Southern Oaks Free Will Baptist Church in Oklahoma City. The meeting also served as a Centennial Celebration for the district which was formed exactly 100 years ago.

The meeting was opened with Delbert Akin leading congregational singing of "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Waldo Young accompanied on the piano.

The welcome was extended by Moderator Mike Wade who introduced host pastor Kent Hubbard who welcomed delegates to his church, presented a devotional thought and led the congregation in prayer.

The moderator then called the annual business meeting to order for the 100th time in the history of the district association.

MSC to seat the delegates as presented by assistant clerk. Prayer by Ron Brown. Those churches presenting reports included Choctaw, Sunnyslane, Windwood (MWC), Northwest, Moore First, Pleasant Hill, Yukon, Southern Oaks, Morgan Road (Mustang), El Reno, Tecumseh, Victory, Shawnee Westgate, Blackwell, Norman First, Harrah, Lakeside, Trinity, Shawnee Northeast, Spring Hill, Capitol Hill, OKC First and Skyridge (Noble).

Action items considered by the delegates included:

1. A request from Victory Free Will Baptist Church, Moore, and pastor Ed Baine to join First Oklahoma Association was received from the floor. MSC to accept request and refer it to executive board for action.
2. Treasurer's report presented by Tim Eaton with recap of receipts and expenditures for the year. Report showed a balance of \$1,261.68 as of Jan. 1, 1997. MSC to accept report.
3. Christian Education Board report was presented by John Martin, detailing the activities of the group since the last quarterly meeting. Balance on hand in treasury, \$487.17 as of Jan. 1, 1997. MSC to accept report.
Elected to the Christian Education Board were Jim Harris, Morgan Road (1995-2000 replacing Tim Dodson); Jeff Jones, Sunnyslane (1996-2001, replacing Roy Copeland) and Greg Lewis, Skyridge (1997-2002, replacing Randy Lack).
4. Mission Board report was given by Frank Wiley, who reported that the board is still considering starting a mission church in the Edmond area. Jim Harris, pastor of current district mission church Morgan Road in Mustang, gave a report and a report was also given by Windwood (MWC) which receives some financial assistance from the board. Balance in the treasury as of Jan. 1, 1997 was \$16,616.25. MSC to accept report.
Mike Wade was re-elected to the Mission Board for a five year term through 2002.
5. State Executive Director Jack Richey presented his report for information only. He thanked the district for its continued financial support and for providing leadership and example for the entire state and the whole denomination to follow. He listed some activities sponsored by the state office and announced the FWB Book Store would close at its current location on April 18. Ordering of literature will now be done through the state office.
6. Election of executive board member to replace Waldo Young, who declined re-election. Mike Fields, Joel Greeson and Brad Utley were nominated and Brad Utley was elected to serve a five year term through 2002.
7. Hillsdale report was given for information only by Buddy Drake who reported that President Jim Shepherd had resigned and a steering and search committee has been formed to look for a replacement. New

degrees are being considered. Have a Heart collections have increased and second semester enrollment has increased. He asked prayer for the school's continued financial needs and upcoming enrollment for next year.

8. The following Credentials Board recommendations were presented by Dan Harper:
 - a. Mike Fields, Westgate, ordained to ministry.
 - b. Jerry Myers, Southern Oaks, ordained to ministry upon receipt of letter from First Kansas Assn.
 - c. James Murray, Yukon, ordained to ministry.
 - d. Joel Greeson, Spring Hill, ordained to ministry.
 - e. Wade Jernigan, Spring Hill, ordained to ministry.
 - f. Jeff Myers, Morgan Road, licensed to preach.
 - g. Derek Woods, Northwest, licensed to preach.
 - h. David McCasland, Capitol Hill, licensed to preach.

MSC to approve Credential Board's report.

Dan Harper was re-elected to a five-year term on the Credentials Board to serve through 2002. James Murray was elected to replace Jim Puckett, who asked to be replaced on the board, to serve through 1999.

Prior to the morning break, the moderator introduced several visitors attending the meeting. Delbert Akin dismissed in prayer.

Following the morning break, Waldo Young gave the report of the Centennial Celebration Committee. MSC to receive as information.

9. Ron Brown gave the report of the Business Committee who recommended these two items:
 - a. that the association pay all bills connected with the Centennial Celebration
 - b. that \$250 be given to Thomas Marberry to help with expenses for his trip to Russia.

MSC to approve both items.

10. Placement of association meetings: MSC to accept invitations to meet at El Reno church in September and annual meeting next March in Mustang.
11. Election of Officers. The following officers were elected for the upcoming year for the district:

12. The moderator appointed Roger Ballard, Joel Greeson and Jim Puckett to serve on business committee for September meeting.
13. Report of audit committee: Found that all books maintained by the association were in order. Recommended that all allocations remain at

the same percentage. MSC to accept report.

14. MSC to adjourn meeting. Benediction by Roy Copeland.

Worship Service, 11:30 a.m.

Delbert Akin led the congregation in singing "The Solid Rock." Waldo Young was the pianist.

Invocation given by John Smith, home missionary going to San Diego.

Special music presented by Jean Wilson, who sang "I Have Found A Hiding Place."

Message was delivered by Jack Williams, executive assistant for National Association of Free Will Baptists. He used Acts 11:14 and 17-18 as his text, challenging the congregation to use skills, commitment and courage in the Lord's work.

The congregation was dismissed for lunch at 12:20 p.m.

Afternoon Program

Delbert Akin led the congregation in singing "Victory in Jesus" and "Rock of Ages" with Waldo Young accompanying on the piano. Dan Harper led in prayer.

Special music was presented by the Ministers Quartet, who sang three songs.

Centennial Celebration committee member Roger Ballard presided over the program which began with a summary of the 100 year history of the association by Wade Jernigan who preserved his extensive research and writings in a booklet which was distributed at the meeting. Bro. Jernigan introduced several members of the audience who had played vital roles in the history of the association. James Murray led in prayer.

After singing "Wonderful Grace of Jesus," Jack Williams brought the afternoon message, entitled "Remove Not the Ancient Landmarks Which Thy Fathers Have Set" from Proverbs 22:28.

After further fellowship and visiting, the meeting was dismissed.

LOAN STATUS:

During the 1996 reporting year the District authorized the officers to secure a loan of \$10,000.00. The proceeds were to be forwarded to Hillsadle and the loan was to be paid in monthly installments. Two separate loans were

negotiated at a rate of 6% interest and are currently in repayment. The current principle for Loan One is \$4,279.57 and Loan Two is \$2,853.05. The total unpaid principle is \$7,132.62 and the March payments will complete the first year of these three year notes.

GIFT INCOME:

Income from our cooperating churches rose from \$359,215.10 in 1995 to \$368,671.67 in 1996. The increase of \$9,456.57 represents a 2.63% increase over the previous year.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, and ordained ministers and deacons actively serving in district mission works members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each of the Association is to send \$90.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$25.00 for the District Association, \$30.00 for the State Association, \$15.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

Section 5—To be considered an active member of First Oklahoma District Association, a church must send in their annual dues and annual report to the annual meeting of the association on the second Saturday in March. A church that fails to do so would be considered inactive, but state and national dues would still be paid by the association.

After the second consecutive year of inactivity, the district will not pay the national and state dues for the church and will place the church on a non-participation basis.

A church is automatically placed on the roster of active churches in the association upon receipt of the annual dues and the annual report.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial reports of such. The Association books are to be closed on the 15th of each month.

Assistant Treasurer, functions at the discretion of the treasurer or in his absence shall do the work of the treasurer.

The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet the second Saturday of March and second Saturday of September for business sessions. Meetings for fellowship or missions emphasis shall also be planned for two other dates, possibly late spring and late fall. Pressing business may be conducted at these fellowship meetings when determined necessary by the executive board.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—*Composition:* The Executive Board of this Association shall be five members, elected to terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 years with one term expiring each year, plus the Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer of the Association.

Section 2—*Duties:* The Executive Board shall have general supervision

of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—Meetings: Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have the power to collect funds as the means on hand may warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Association property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—Powers: The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have the power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meetings or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel. This Board shall provide the churches of the district updated information regarding trends and materials in Christian education, to sponsor training sessions for the district, to assist indi-

vidual churches in their training programs, and to seek ways to evaluate and enhance the educational ministries of the various churches of the district.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—*Finance Committee:* A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its semi-annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—*Audit Committee:* An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular semi-annual meeting whose duty is shall be to audit the treasurer's account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules or order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the first session until the second session.amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the first session until the second session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator.
Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in one personality, one in essence.
3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Savior will be saved.
5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.
8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.
9. The definition and condition of the backslider:
A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed and unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jeremiah 2:21; Jeremiah 2:32; II Peter

1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matthew 6:24; Hebrews 10:38-39; Hebrews 3:12-14; Ezekial 18:24; I John 1:9; Revelation 21:27.

- (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
- (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
- (c) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
- (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that be these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fail." II Peter 1:4-10.
