PROCEEDINGS

Minutes of the First Oklahoma District Asociational Meeting of Free Will Baptist September 8, 2001

Bro. Delbert Akin opened with "Footprints of Jesus" and Bro. Frank. Wiley led us in prayer. Pastor Ray Sanders gave a welcome and stated that the food and worship service would be provided by Amor Divino, the state Hispanic mission work, pastored by Dr. David Arteaga. It is housed in the Capitol Hill church. The devotion was brought by Bro. Steve Shaw of the Skyridge church. The clerk, Pastor Ray Sanders, read the letters and the delegates were seated. Linda Anderson, Dalaress Shaw, Connie Ann Sherry and Virginia Akin were accepted as delegates from First Oklahoma Association. MSC

Bro. Tim Eaton gave the financial report as well as a financial handout. Financially, we are doing very well with a record surplus. He did say a large number of churches have not sent their annual \$90 dues. MSC.

Bro. Frank Wiley gave a missions report. We are looking for land in Piedmont and plan to send a worker for at least one to two years. November 13th, there will be a lunch at Trinity Nazarene church. Dr. Tohler will be the speaker. Frank will send out letters later. MSC. Brad Hanna and Dennis Cariker gave reports on the Edmond and Heartland mission works. MSC.

Bro. Shelby Greeson gave the credential board report. Candidates for examination were: Kevin Bookout, Steve Keiffer, Jacob Ricker, Waldo Young, Jerry Banks, Wayne Bryant and Steve Shaw. For more information see the boards written report. MSC.

Bro. James Puckett, Director of the State Missions Board, gave a report on TSP. Along with a general report on the state of affairs which were good, he reminded us of the State meeting in Ada.

Tim Eaton gave his Hillsdale report. There are 120 students on campus. Hillsdale has a total of 371 students, with 332 being full-time. There are 142 freshmen. The last 5 Falls, Hillsdale had record enrollments. He did speak of the schools continuing financial needs. This also included the

desperate need for more housing. Wade Jernigan gave a Hillsdale report also. He spoke on the "Brick Sale Fund."

The C.E. Board report was given. Their balance was \$2,535. They mentioned several dates and places of upcoming events. Churches will be notified later. Riley Kern resigned and Steve Keiffer of Harrah was elected to replace him. For more details and information see the boards written report. MSC.

The Business Committee report was given by Bro. Earnie Deeds. It reads, "We recommend that the First Oklahoma Association make a commitment of \$5,000 per year for 10 years for a total of \$50,000 to the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Capital Investment Fund beginning with a \$2,500 gift today." A couple of revival announcements were made from the floor. There was a MSC to adjourn.

The September 8, 2001 First Oklahoma Association District meeting was a very historic one indeed! It was the first district meeting in Oklahoma history to have the worship service and refreshments provided by a non-English speaking Free Will Baptist group. Our joint Hispanic mission work, known as Amor Divino, pastored by Dr. David Arteaga, and located in the Capitol Hill church facility did the honors. They had a youth musical/drama presentation. Dr. David and his wife Dr. Dayma Arteaga both gave devotions and Dr. David baptized Luis Romirez, the first Hispanic convert in Amor Divino. Ray Sanders, pastor of Capitol Hill, also spoke on the origins of the Hispanic work and gave a special thanks to the missions boards in general and to Frank Wiley, James Puckett, Steven Earp and Mark Inscoe in particular. He also had the Hispanic girls draw for and present to the winning church a beautiful sombrero that has hung in Capitol Hill since the beginning of the Hispanic outreach known as Young Hispanics for Christ Club. Crossland FWB church won and pastor Wade Jernigan accepted it from the Hispanic youth.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists at Southwest Free Will Baptist Church of Oklahoma City March 9, 2002

The meeting opened with "Have Faith In God" led by Delbert Akin. A devotion was brought by Ben Parker, associate pastor of Southwest FWBC. It was based on Jude 24, 25. The welcome was given by the Moderator, James Murray. The reading of the letters was done by the clerk, Ray Sanders. MSC to seat all delegates.

Annual Treasurer's report was given by Tim Eaton. MSC. The Executive Board gave no report but re-elected Stan Konopinski to the 5-year

position on the board.

Annual C.E. Board report was given by Jeff Plunkett. Kyle Howell was elected to the board to replace Riley Kern. (Footnote: Added by Clerk Ray Sanders April 26. Records clearly indicate that at the September 2001 meeting Riley Kern was replaced by Steven Keiffer. Bro. Steven had NOT resigned the position therefore there was NO OPENING on the C.E. Board. The Association regrets the mistake and offers its apology to all for the confusion it may have caused.)

The Annual Credentials Board report was given by Shelby Greeson and is as follows: A) Andy J Nichols, Steve M. Torrison, Ben Parker, Craig Thompson, Cory Thompson, and Kyle Howell to be set aside to be licensed. B) Guy Worth, Jeff Winters, Rusty Rosenfelt, Harlan D. Fipps, Jerry Wright, and Jerry Rice to be set aside as deacons. C) Bob Thompson to be accepted in as an ordained minister with a letter of credentials by his former association. D) Ken Harris to be received as an ordained deacon. Dan Farmer was re-elected to the 5-year position. The board was commissioned to study ordinations of ministers other than senior pastors. MSC to "date" licensing/ordination from the meeting of the credentials board to their approval.

The Annual Missions Board report was given by Frank Wiley. MSC. Bro. Frank was re-elected to the 5-year position and Steven Earp was elected to fill out Toby Youngblood's 2-year position.

State Missions Director, James Puckett gave an information report which included TSP. Bro. Ray Sanders, on behalf of Dr. David Arteaga, gave a brief report on Amor Divino, the Hispanic mission work housed in the Capitol Hill facility.

The Annual Business/Audit Committee was given by David Sutton. MSC. Co-op percentages to remain the same. \$1,500 - Hillsdale/Have-A-Heart Fund. \$1,500 toward the \$50,000 Chapel Fund ten year goal. \$1,000 to the Harvest FWB Childcare Ministries located in Virginia after a report given by Todd Tennant. The entire business committee was re-elected. They are David Sutton, Mike Wade and Shelby Greeson.

Mike Wade gave a Hillsdale report as well as Tim Eaton and Wade Jernigan. Bro. Wade spoke concerning the Have-A-Heart and the Brick Fund.

The Semi-Annual meeting in September will be at Northwest FWBC. The next Annual meeting will be hosted by Capitol Hill/Amor Divino and will be in March of 2003. All district officers remain the same except Waldo Young will serve as clerk.

The C.E. Board announced that the Senior Adult Retreat would be the next week.

Ray Sanders stated as clerk he had been asked by several pastors to have the Annual Letter updated to include cell phone, fax numbers and Email addresses. Bro. James Murray said he would ask the new clerk to look into updating the letter. With this, all business was concluded.

Worship was begun with "Since I Have Been Redeemed" page 302. It was led by Robert Sharry, host church pastor. Next we sang 541 "He Keeps Me Singing." Special music was brought by Sis. Ada. She sang "We Are Standing On Holy Ground." Bro. Waldo Young, pastor of Northwest FWB church brought our morning message. It was entitled "A Goodly Heritage" and the scripture was Psalms 16:5, 6.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1--This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2--The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, and ordained ministers and deacons actively serving in district mission works members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3--Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4--Each of the Association is to send \$90.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$25.00 for the District Association, \$30.00 for the State Association, \$15.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund.

Section 5--To be considered an active member of First Oklahoma District Association, a church must send in their annual dues and annual report to the annual meeting of the association on the second Saturday in March. A church that fails to do so would be considered inactive, but state and national dues would still be paid by the association.

After the second consecutive year of inactivity, the district will not pay the national and state dues for the church and will place the church on a non-participating basis.

A church is automatically placed on the roster of active churches in the association upon receipt of the annual dues and the annual report.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

· Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial reports of such. The Association books are to be closed on the 15th of each month.

The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the second Saturday of March, May, September, and the Tuesday before Thanksgiving in November. Business meetings: September, March. Missions: May. Thanksgiving Service: November. The March meeting will be the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1--Composition: The Executive Board of this Association shall be five members, elected to terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 years with one term expiring each year, plus the Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer of the Association.

Section 2--Duties: The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3--Meetings: Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have the power to collect funds as the means on hand my warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or

Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4--Powers: The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have the power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meetings or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel. This Board shall provide the churches of the district updated information regarding trends and materials in Christian education, to sponsor training sessions for the district, to assist individual churches in their training programs, and to seek ways to evaluate and enhance the educational ministries of the various churches of the district.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1--Finance Committee: A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget

budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2--Audit Committee: An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty is shall be to audit the treasurer's account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the first session until the second session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
- 5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.
- 7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
- 8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
- 9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- 10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

- 1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
- 2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in one personality, one in essence.
- 3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
- 4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Savior will be saved.
- 5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
- 7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.
- 8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.

- 9. The definition and condition of the backslider:
 - A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed an unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jeremiah 2:21; Jeremiah 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matthew 6:24; Hebrews 10:38-39; Hebrews 3:12-14; Ezekial 18:24; I John 1:9; Revelation 21:27.
 - (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
 - (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
 - (c) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. this we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
 - (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those whoteach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that be these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fail." II Peter 1:4-10.
