

PROCEEDINGS OF THE SEPTEMBER 8, 2007 MEETING OF THE FIRST OKLAHOMA DISTRICT ASSOCIATION

The First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists convened on September the 9th, 2007, at the Skyridge Free Will Baptist Church.

At 9:00 a.m. host Pastor Steve Shaw brought the morning devotion from the book of Philippians, chapter 4, verses 1, 6, 8, 11, 13, and 19.

Pastor Shaw led in prayer.

Moderator called for the clerk to read the church letters that he had received. Letters from these churches were read: Calvary, Clear Springs, First Moore, First Seminole, First Yukon, Grace, Harrah, Harmony, Northwest, Oak Hills, Pleasant Hill, Skyridge, Southern Oaks, Spencer Road, Spring Hill, Sunnylane, Trinity, Westgate, and Windwood.

A request from the Oak Hills church that Matt Wheeler be examined for license to preach.

A request from the Skyridge church that Jim Terry be re-examined for license.

A motion was made to accept the letters, seat the delegates, and send the requests to the proper boards, MSC. A call for visitors to be recognized was made, and there were none.

The Moderator apppointed Gary Curry and David Sutton to join the treasurer on the Finance Committee.

Funding for the new scholarship (the "First Oklahoma District Association Church Father's") was discussed. A motion to have the Finance Committee make a recommendation was made. MSC.

A "Pictoral Board" of Rev. Wade Jernigan's life was discussed.

Rev. Jim Harris gave the Financial report. MSC.

Rev. Frank Wiley was called to give the CE Board since no CE Board members were present. Rev. Wiley called for the Association to have a special prayer for the Burden family. CE Board report given. MSC. CE Board member Josh Phillips was replaced by Matt Wheeler, and CE Board member Dick Terry was replaced by Rusty Harris.

The Mission Board report was given by Rev. Frank Wiley. MSC. Mission Board member Rev. Mike Wade was replaced by Rev. Dennis Carriker.

The clerk read a letter from Rev. Dick Terry to the First Oklahoma District Association.

The Credential Board report was read by Rev. Dan Farmer. MSC.

There was no Executive Board report.

The Finance Committee had two recommendations: (1) That \$500.00 be donated to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College for the "Recruitment Department." (2) That \$500.00 be used for the First Oklahoma District Association Church Father's Scholarship. The procedure will be for the Hillsdale Campus Pastor, to select one ministerial student, one time a year, and introduce him at the September Business meeting. This is to be a continuing process. MSC.

A motion to adjourn for refreshments was made. MSC.

WORSHIP HOUR

Rev. Waldo Young led the congregation in "Near the Cross" and "Jesus is Lord of All" and sang a solo entitled "Till the Storm Passes By."

The new Hillsdale Campus Pastor, Rev. Jeff Sloan, brought a slide presentation of the work in Indiana, and then preached a message on "Reflections" from the book of Philippians, chapter 4, verses 10-20.

The clerk admonished the Association to be more diligent in completing the "Annual Report." This year 1/6 of our churches did not complete the "Annual Report."

Rev. David Sutton gave us some "food for thought." A lot of Associations have gone to a Sunday evening quarterly meeting, with good attendance results. He asked us to consider it, since our quarterly meeting attendance has been very poor.

A motion to give the host church a "standing vote of thanks" for their

hospitality. MSC.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made. MSC.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The First Oklahoma district received an income in the first half of 2007 of \$431,322.88 from our cooperating churches. This amount is over \$111,000 more than that received in the first half of last year. In May the District fulfilled its ten year pledge of \$50,000 for the Hillsdale FWB College Barber Conference/Chapel Building. Through June, the district has paid a total fo \$52,019.15 as the district agreed to keep sending money as it is available. This total includes \$8,000.00 paid in the first half of 2007.

SUPPORTING THE WORK OF CHRIST (summary attached):

- 1. The District received over \$123,000 into the Cooperative Plan.
- 2. Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College received designated funds over \$171,000.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, and ordained ministers and deacons actively serving in district mission works members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each of the Association is to send \$200.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$25.00 for the District Association, \$30.00 for the State Association, \$100.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund and \$25.00 to help host the National Convention in 2010. This section may be amended by the clerk to reflect any changes in the above figures, as such changes occur, without a vote of the body.

Section 5—To be considered an active member of First Oklahoma District Association, a church must send in their annual dues and annual report to the annual meeting of the association on the second Saturday in March. A church that fails to do so would be considered inactive, but state and national dues would still be paid by the association.

After the second consecutive year of inactivity, the district will not

pay the national and state dues for the church and will place the church on a non-participating basis.

A church is automatically placed on the roster of active churches in the association upon receipt of the annual dues and the annual report.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial reports of such. The Association books are to be closed on the 15th of each month.

The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the second Saturday of March, May, September, and the Tuesday evening before Thanksgiving in November. Business meetings: September, March. Missions: May. Thanksgiving Service: November. The March meeting will be the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—Composition: The Executive Board of this Association shall be five members, elected to terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 years with one term expiring each year, plus the Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer of the Association.

Section 2—Duties: The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be

subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—Meetings: Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have the power to collect funds as the means on hand my warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—Powers: The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have the power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meetings or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel. This Board shall provide the churches of the district updated information regarding trends and materials in Christian education, to sponsor training sessions for the district, to assist individual churches in their training programs, and to seek ways to evaluate and enhance the educational ministries of the various churches of the district.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—Finance Committee: A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—Audit Committee: An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty is shall be to audit the treasurer's account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the first session until the second session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
- 5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.

- 7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
- 8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
- 9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
- 10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.
