MINUTES OF THE FIRST OKLAHOMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS SEPTEMBER 13, 2008

The First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists met with the Trinity Free Will Baptist Church in Oklahoma City on Saturday, September 13,

2008. Assistant Moderator Waldo Young presided in the absence of the moderator. He called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Curtis Ramsey led the congregation in singing "My Savior's Love." Windwood Pastor Tom Drake brought the morning devotion reading from Ephesians 1:3-9. The devotion was on "Spiritual Blessings." Earnie Deeds led in prayer.

The moderator's remarks were based on I Corinthians 14:40, "Let all things be done decently and in order."

The clerk read letters from the following churches: Clear Springs, First Lexington, First Moore, First Seminole, First Yukon, Harmony, Harrah, Northwest, Oak Hills, Pleasant Hill, Southern Oaks, Southwest, Spencer Road, Sunnyslane, Trinity, Westgate, Windwood, and mission church Epic.

After recognizing the standing delegates, a motion carried to seat the delegates, receive the letters, and refer the requests to the proper committee or board.

Host pastor Stan Konopinski gave a welcome to Trinity Church. Patrick Blaylock, Delbert Akin, and Tim Eaton were appointed to the Business Committee.

A petitionary letter from the Mountain View Family Church, Queen Creek, Arizona, was read by the clerk.

An Executive Board report dated May 15, 2008, was read in which the Executive Board voted to accept the letter and have the Credentials Board make an appointment to examine the ordained of this church.

A second report of the Executive Board dated August 12, was also read in which the Executive Board and the Credentials Board met with this church via video/computer hook-up, and Rick Morris the pastor, along with another ordained minister whose last name is Bilbey. The church and these ordained ministers were found to be acceptable in all things, thus the motion to recommend the acceptance of the Mountain View Family Church into First Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists carried.

The report of the Credentials Board was given by Chairman Dan Farmer. "We were saddened this year in the death of one of our board members Shelby Greeson," the report stated. "Shelby had served as clerk of the board." The board also asked that a letter from Jim Shepherd surrendering his ordination credentials be placed in the association minutes. A motion carried to adopt the report.

James Murray was elected to replace Shelby Greeson on the Credentials Board.

The treasurer's report was given by Jim Harris. A motion carried to approve the report.

A Finance Committee consisting of Jim Harris, Gene Reid, and Ken Wolf was appointed to serve for the annual meeting in March.

Earnie Deeds, Chairman, David Laukat, and Delbert Akin were elected to serve on the Audit Committee for the Annual Meeting.

Chairman Frank Wiley gave the report of the Mission Board. A motion carried to adopt the report.

Zach Archer gave the report of the Christian Education Board. A motion carried to adopt the report.

President Timothy Eaton gave a report on the work of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College.

The meeting was dismissed for a refreshment break.

The body met back for the worship service. Curtis Ramsey led the congregation in singing "Redeemed," and "Whosoever Meaneth Me." Delbert Akin led in prayer, then the congregation sang "Amazing Grace."

The Church Builder/Pastor of the Epic Church, a new church beginning in Piedmont, was introduced to bring the message. He read Deuteronomy 32:10-12, and brought a message titled "In The Wilderness."

At the close of the message the body resumed business.

A letter was read from the First Mission Association requesting that a letter of good standing be granted for Kenny Myers who recently accepted an associate pastor position in the Allen Free Will Baptist Church, Sapulpa. A motion carried to grant the request.

President Timothy Eaton gave the names of the two ministerial students who received the first Founding Father scholarships.

A list of the names listed on the church letters as state delegates was read. Seven were elected, with the possibility of others being named before the state association meets.

The report of the business committee was read by Delbert Akin. That committee recommended that \$500.00 be given to the Cuba Relief Fund. A motion to adopt the report carried.

Whereas, the elected moderator has moved, the question was asked if he did not attend the state association should the assistant moderator serve on the General Board representing this association? A motion carried that this would be the case.

A motion carried to give the host church a standing vote of thanks for their hospitality. The motion carried.

Southwest Pastor Gary Elder prayed the closing prayer.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

The First Oklahoma district received an income in the first half of 2008 of \$333,188.57 from our cooperating churches. This amount is over \$98,000 less than that received in the first half of last year. This difference is primarily due to a couple of large designated gifts to Hillsdale in 2007. Through June, the district has paid a total of \$62,019.15 to Hillsdale for the Barber Conference/Chapel Building as the district has agreed to keep sending money as it is available. This total includes \$6,000.00 paid in the first half of 2008.

SUPPORTING THE WORK OF CHRIST (summary attached):

1. The District received over \$112,000 into the Cooperative Plan.
2. Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College received designated funds over \$71,000.
3. Missions received \$122,208.23 being distributed to:

March 14, 2009

This 112th annual session of the First Oklahoma Association met with the First Free Will Baptist Church of Seminole, Oklahoma on Saturday, March 14, 2009. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. by Assistant Moderator Waldo Young.

Herman Wilson led the congregation in singing "My Savior's Love." El Reno Pastor Barry Clagg brought the devotion. He read 2 Peter 3:1 and brought the devotional thoughts on "Remembrance." He also led in prayer.

After moderator Young gave some remarks about conducting the meeting, host pastor David McDougal welcomed the delegates to the Seminole Church.

The Obituary Committee gave their report that 28 member of our churches died during the past year. A motion carried to adopt the report. After a moment of silence, Ken Wolf led in prayer.

The meetings for the next year were placed as follows: First Association meeting will be at Southern Oaks Church on Saturday, September 12, 2009. The Northwest FWB Church will host the Thanksgiving Praise Service on Tuesday, November 24, at 7:00 p.m. The annual association meeting will be at the Grace Church, Oklahoma City, on Saturday, March 13, 2010. These placements were approved.

The recommended constitutional change regarding Article VIII, was brought from the table. The change was approved unanimously.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a group of churches, do hereby ordain this constitution for our progress and to perpetuate better association government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This Association shall be known as the First Oklahoma District Association of Free Will Baptists of the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

OBJECT: The purpose of this Association shall be to coordinate and unify the works of the member churches, to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God, and examine for license and ordination prospective ministers and deacons.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP: Section 1—This Association shall be composed of area Free Will Baptist Churches that adopt the constitution and are accepted by the body.

Section 2—The voting body shall consist of: a) standing delegates composed of officers of the Association, ordained ministers, deacons actively serving on the deacon board of the local church, and ordained ministers and deacons actively serving in district mission works members of all standing boards, church clerks, full-time associates of churches serving as pastoral assistants and b) no more than three lay delegates selected by each local church who shall be seated upon presentation of proper credentials.

Section 3—Any area church wishing to unite with this Association upon presentation of a petitionary letter and examination by the Executive and Credential Board shall be accepted by a majority vote of this body. Churches coming from other Associations are expected to present a letter of recommendation.

Section 4—Each church of the Association is to send \$200.00 to the annual session of this association. This will be divided in this manner: \$25.00 for the District Association, \$30.00 for the State Association, \$100.00 for the National Association, and \$20.00 for the Wilford Lee Scholarship Fund and \$25.00 to help host the National Convention in 2010. This section may be amended by the clerk to reflect any changes in the above figures, as such changes occur, without a vote of the body.

Section 5—To be considered an active member of First Oklahoma District Association, a church must send in their annual dues and annual report to the annual meeting of the association on the second Saturday in March. A church that fails to do so would be considered inactive, but state and national dues would still be paid by the association.

After the second consecutive year of inactivity, the district will not

pay the national and state dues for the church and will place the church on a non-participating basis.

A church is automatically placed on the roster of active churches in the association upon receipt of the annual dues and the annual report.

ARTICLE IV

NEW CHURCHES: Any group of believers desiring to be organized, may present a petitionary letter and upon majority vote of the association, the Executive Board shall be instructed to examine for organization. Upon examination by the Executive Board, and a two-thirds majority vote of said board, a group may be organized into a local Free Will Baptist church. This church may then become affiliated with the First Oklahoma District Association by petitionary letter and majority vote of the body.

ARTICLE V

OFFICERS: The officers of this Association shall be a moderator, assistant moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, and an assistant treasurer, all of whom shall be elected at the annual session.

Moderator, shall preside at all sessions of the Association and shall have power to appoint special committees.

Assistant Moderator, shall preside in the moderator's absence or at his request.

Clerk, shall keep careful records of all business sessions and handle other correspondence as directed.

Assistant Clerk, functions at the discretion of the clerk or in his absence shall do the work of the clerk.

Treasurer, shall receive, and record all monies and distribute and make regular financial reports of such. The Association books are to be closed on the 15th of each month.

The terms of the officers shall begin at the close of the annual session.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS: This Association shall meet four times yearly, the second Saturday of March, May, September, and the Tuesday evening before Thanksgiving in November. Business meetings: September, March. Missions: May. Thanksgiving Service: November. The March meeting will be the Annual Session.

ARTICLE VII

EXECUTIVE BOARD: Section 1—*Composition:* The Executive Board of this Association shall be five members, elected to terms of 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 years with one term expiring each year, plus the Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer of the Association.

Section 2—*Duties:* The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of the Association between sessions. The Board shall be

subject to the recommendations of the Association and none of its acts shall conflict with the action taken by this Association.

Section 3—Meetings: Meetings of the Board can be called by the Moderator who serves as its chairman. The Board shall have the power to collect funds as the means on hand may warrant. It shall as directed by this association have power to convey or mortgage any real estate or Associational property. This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, monies raised, meetings held, and make a full report to the next regular meeting of this Association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said Association for the purpose in accordance with the purpose of the donors, and in no case divert from its original object.

Section 4—Powers: The Chairman and Clerk of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc.; and any other papers by which the First Oklahoma District Association is to become legally responsible. It shall be the duty of this Board to meet as often as may be necessary. No member of the Executive Board shall delegate authority to any other member of said Board to cast his vote for him in anything. The Executive Board shall have the power to call the Association into conference by notifying each church ten (10) days prior to the conference; and, they shall have the authority to change quarterly meetings or association if the place where said quarterly meetings or association is to meet is not able to care for the meetings; and, their decisions shall be final. This must be done in time to notify each church. No meeting of the Executive Board shall be legal unless at least five members are present.

ARTICLE VIII

BOARDS: The following standing boards shall be elected at the annual session. Each board shall consist of five (5) members, elected as to have one member retiring each year. Vacancies may be filled at any regular meeting.

Credentials Board: It shall be the duty of the Credentials Board to examine the church letters and recommend the seating of such delegates as are properly certified; to examine for license and ordination prospective deacons and ministers at the request of their respective churches and make recommendations to the Association; to examine deacons and ministers coming into this body from other associations and make appropriate recommendations to this body.

Ministers and deacons coming into this body from other associations who have previously held membership in this association in good standing may obtain approved recommendation by this board by signing a letter stating their standards and doctrines have not changed since previous membership and their answers to the ordination application remain the same.

Church Training Service: The Church Training Service Board shall plan Church Training Rallies and youth activities of the Association. This Board shall also plan the annual Youth Encampment with the authority to appoint and employ necessary personnel. This Board shall provide

the churches of the district updated information regarding trends and materials in Christian education, to sponsor training sessions for the district, to assist individual churches in their training programs, and to seek ways to evaluate and enhance the educational ministries of the various churches of the district.

Mission Board: The Mission Board shall be empowered to assist any worthy mission work within the bounds of the Association and supervise missionary activities of the Association.

COMMITTEES: Section 1—*Finance Committee:* A finance committee composed of the treasurer and two other members shall be appointed by the moderator. It shall be the duty of this committee to prepare a budget for the calendar year and submit it to the Association at its regular annual meeting. The Finance Committee can from time to time submit supplements to the budget for the current calendar year.

Section 2—*Audit Committee:* An audit committee of three members shall be selected by the Association at the regular annual meeting whose duty is shall be to audit the treasurer's account at the close of the calendar year and to report to the annual meeting.

ARTICLE IX

PARLIAMENTARY: The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the Association in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this constitution and any special rules of order the Association may adopt.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution can be amended at any regular meeting of the Association by a two-thirds vote of the body, provided the amendment is presented in writing and laid on the table from the first session until the second session.

ARTICLE XI

DISSOLUTION: Should this Association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

BY-LAWS

1. The moderator or assistant, or in their absence, the oldest minister present shall call the association into conference.
2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
3. A majority of the churches shall constitute a quorum.
4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members without voting privileges.
5. Those who speak, shall rise and address the moderator.
Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken separately.

7. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without leave of the moderator, or more than ten minutes at a time.
8. The moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian spirit.
9. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the association unless it has been first discussed in its own church.
10. These by-laws may be amended at any meeting of the association by a two-thirds vote of the body.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. The Scriptures are the Old and the New Testaments, inspired by the Holy Spirit and are the only infallible rule of faith and practice.
2. There is only one true and living Triune God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, three in one personality, one in essence.
3. Man is a fallen creature and cannot save himself.
4. Jesus Christ, by the grace of God, tasted death for every man and all who repent and trust Christ as Savior will be saved.
5. All believers in Christ, who through grace, persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
6. It is the duty of every Christian to unite with a visible church where through association with others he may share in the observances of the ordinances and the perpetuation of the gospel. The Lord's day is the first day of the week, commemorating the resurrection of Christ and should be spent in public and private worship and rest from secular activities. Upon this day Christians should bring their tithes and offerings into the Lord's house.
7. The Gospel Ordinances: Baptism is the immersion of believers in water by an ordained minister, in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit; the Lord's Supper is a commemoration of the death of

Christ and is open to all believers and should be observed at night; feet washing, which teaches humility, follows the Lord's Supper and is the duty and happy prerogative of every believer.

8. There will be the resurrection both of the just and the unjust, every one in his own order, "they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation." The Lord Jesus, who ascended on high, sits at the right hand of God and will come again to close the gospel dispensation, glorify His saints and judge the world. Then the wicked shall go away into everlasting punishment but the righteous into life eternal.

9. The definition and condition of the backslider:

A backslider is a regenerated person who has degenerated to a state of living in unconfessed an unforgiven sin. Such a person is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and cannot enter into sinless Heaven in such a backslidden condition. The following scriptures explain: Jeremiah 2:21; Jeremiah 2:32; II Peter 1:9; James 1:13-16; James 5:19-20; Romans 6:12; Matthew 6:24; Hebrews 10:38-39; Hebrews 3:12-14; Ezekial 18:24; I John 1:9; Revelation 21:27.

- (a) We believe that salvation is a present possession by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and that a person's eternal destiny depends on whether he has this possession. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that salvation depends on human works or merit.
- (b) We believe that a saved individual may, in freedom of will, cease to trust Christ for salvation and once again be lost. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that a believer may not again be lost.
- (c) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), must be judged by that evidence to be lost should he so die in his sins. This we hold in distinction from those who suggest the pernicious doctrine that man may live in sin as he pleases and still claim heaven as his eternal home.
- (d) We believe that any regenerated person who has sinned (again, whether he be called "backslider" or "sinner"), and in whose heart a desire arises to repent, may do so and be restored to favor and fellowship with God. This we hold in distinction from those who teach that when a Christian sins he cannot repent and be restored to favor and fellowship with God.

"Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that

by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; and to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; and to godliness brotherly kindness and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall." II Peter 1:4-10.
